Dear Lieutenant Apalit:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter, dated 24 April 1947, in which you request information concerning the status of the TICA0 Courier and Transport Platoon, Intelligence Section, 6th MD.

A special press release from Public Relations Office, AFWESPAC, dated 1 February 1946, stated that no applications for recognition of guerrilla units would be accepted by this headquarters after 15 March 1946.

Your letter of 12 June 1946, which is on file in this headquarters with all attached substantiating documents, contained only your personal request for individual recognition; it did not make specific request for the recognition of the men who served under you.

Your request for recognition of the Ticao Courier and Transport Platoon, Intelligence Section, 6th MD, must therefore be regarded as a new unit request for recognition which does not comply with the closing date of 15 March 1946 and can therefore not be accepted for consideration.

For your information, the recent press release from Public Relations Office, PHILRYCOM, further announced the closing date of 15 March 1947 for the submission of individual claims for non-casualty recognition.

The evidence submitted with your letter of 12 June 1946 is being retained in the files of this headquarters, since this substantiating material was used in the consideration of your individual claim for recognition and formed the basis of the favorable consideration thereof by this headquarters.

1. On 12 June 46 I submitted answers to Guerrilla questionere of my command, TIC&O Courier and Transport Platoon, 6th MD, then under Gen. Peralta and Col. Serran (showing evidence of their legitimate service), and all other evidence of their guerrilla services. I handed this personally to Guerrilla Affairs Sec. which was then at Ayala Boulevard.


2. Upon my check in guerrilla Affairs Sec. on 6 March 47, I found out that while the boys in my command have respectively "Locator's Card" there was no contain or entry showing evidence of their service. Neither were those papers I stated in Par. 1 above can be located.

3. With the foregoing premise as stated above, I want to know:  
(a) The present status of my boys in my command. (b) Were those papers I innumerated lost? If so shall I need to reconstruct those records and files again.

4. I was made to understand that within 6 months from the date I filed those papers, I will be notified by that office of the status of my boys, but up to the present, I have not receive any. Upon my query however I found out that the progress was that as I stated in Par 2.

5. I am now confined in V. Luna Gen Hosp (AF) and have been recognized while my boys are still hanging and are not. It would be no less than a traitor of me being recognized while my boys are not.

6. I would appreciate it very much any consideration you could do me in this case.
