2. This unit does not fulfil the basic requirements for guerrilla recognition. This unit is a labor group. See attached Team Leader's Report.

3. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. All members worthy of compensation for their services are being referred to Claims Service.

4. This unit had no casualties.

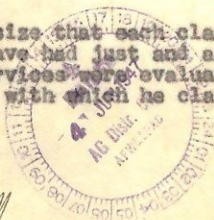
Dear Mr. Francisco:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "B" Company, 2nd Battalion, G-2 Command, Free Luzon Area, 6th MD, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. A definite organization was not established.
- d. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders.
- e. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

It is desired to emphasize that each claimant member of the unit is considered to have had just and adequate appraisal for recognition when his services were evaluated concurrently with this study of the unit with which he claims membership.

Report on

"B" Co, 2nd Bn, G-2 Command, Free Luzon Area, 6th MD

1. Lts Pete C. Breaz and Delfin Jaranilla Jr proceeded to Barrio Malabo, Polo, Bulacan on 27 May 1947, to investigate "B" Co, 2nd Bn, G-2 Command, FLA, 6th MD.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following named persons were interviewed, and their statements are reflected in the findings:

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The unit CO and unit members were unable to verify activities claimed. Nor were supposedly disinterested persons in the area able to convince the undersigned of same.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. During the occupation and liberation, members of this unit lived at home and were guerrillas on a part-time basis only. It was only during the liberation that this unit sought the enemy. At this time the enemy consisted only of stragglers who were attempting to inflict minor damage on unprotected towns and barrios. A roving patrol of 10 men was maintained around the barrio daily. These men slept at home and were rotated after one day's tour of duty. While they may have killed a few Japanese, the organization of the unit at the time is comparable to a homeguard group. The Commanding Officer of subject unit was in control of the barrio, and it was his respon-

sibility to protect its inhabitants. When asked why his unit had not sought the enemy previous to the liberation he replied that his unit was not strong enough. This unit also claims some intelligence, but there were no Japanese garrisons near Malaño. This barrio is well back from the road, and it is doubtful that these men went so far as to neglect their farms for the purposes of gathering such intelligence. Captains Salao and Trinidad, recognized guerrilla leaders from that area, knew nothing of the subject unit.

d. A definite organization was not established. This unit was organized as homeguards but not as guerrillas. This is substantiated by both occupation and liberation activities.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders. The unit members are well dispersed over the countryside, and gathering them together on short notice would have been difficult. The unit CO could have had adequate control over them only as a homeguard unit and not as a guerrilla organization.

f. The unit did not show satisfactory continuity of service and activity. It was only during the liberation that this unit was used as such. It was a passive organization before that. This unit was utilized as depot guards from 5 Feb 45 to 25 Mar 45. Only during this time was there continuity of service. Type of such service indicates a labor group, not a guerrilla unit.

g. From 5 Feb 1945 to 25 March 1945 this unit was utilized as depot guards for the Div Sig Supply Depot, 6th Div, XIV Corps. This depot was located on the national highway near the railroad station at Polo, Bulacan. Extensive interviews with members of the subject unit and disinterested persons in the unit's area of operation have convinced the undersigned that this unit was actually utilized as guards and that their note of certification (Incl 1) to that effect is authentic. The depot stretched along the highway for approximately 750 yards and extended back into the rice paddies 400 yards. The 2nd Bn, 61st Inf, ECLGA, guarded the highway side and were eventually recognized. However, the undersigned do not consider this as a criterion for recognizing the subject unit. The 6th Div supplied the subject unit with 10 arms for the purposes of guarding their side of the depot (rice paddy side). Each day this unit supplied 10 new men for this duty. These men stayed at the depot for 24 hour periods, were not paid, and received only their daily ration of food. They were not allowed to take any rations to their homes. Through the process of rotation, these men were utilized only once a week. The unit commander claims that practically all his men were utilized at one time or another. US Army troops served as interior

guards while the subject unit was the exterior guard. There were no clashes with the Japanese during the period of their service. Their duty was to prevent pilfering, whether by Japanese or Filipinos. The type of responsibility and duty assigned this unit automatically places its members in the same category as depot guards presently employed by this Headquarters. They were not utilized as guerrillas.

In addition to their guard duties, this unit claims to have maintained a 10 men anti-Jap patrol each day. These men lived at home and were rotated daily. The unit CO was responsible for the protection of Barrio Malabo, and this was his way of fulfilling his responsibility. While this group claims seven engagements with the enemy (stragglers) over a period of six months, they do not fulfil the requirements for guerrilla recognition. They are in the same category as homeguards.

h. Brig Gen Peralta knew of Pontino's (organizer and CO, 2nd Bn, FLA) activities but was not aware of the organization's activities.

Cols Gellidon and Dikit stated that they did not have enough knowledge of the FLA to make an official statement concerning the subject unit.

Col Adevosio and Lt Manzano both knew of Pontino's activities but not the unit's.

i. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. There are no members worthy of recognition. This unit fulfils only the requirements of a labor group and should be investigated by Claims Service. This unit had no casualties.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit has no apparent political aspects or affiliations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that this unit be not favorably considered for recognition. However this unit should be brought to the attention of Claims Service.


3. That Major Justiniano Pontino and his men had requested me to take command of the newly organized Company, which I refused.; and

 3. Particulars regarding ground forces: (1) Garrisons (2) Installations. (3) Units. (4) Unit Commanders. (5) Armaments. (6) Morale (7) States of training. (8) Supplies. (9) Resources available to the forces; (10) Depots. (11) Ammunitions dumps.
 4. Particulars aerial defense: (1) Aerodrome used. Including location, size, No. of runways, No. and size of rivetments. (2) Dummy airdromes location, size and other particulars. (3) Installations (Depots, Repair shops, Fuel and Bomb dump etc. (4) No. of airplanes and aircraft types in each base reported. (5) Unit and unit Commanders. (6) Location and No. of radio direction finders, searchlight batteries (including types and caliber of guns locations of and other details regarding fighter aces 24- Subject ground forces information desired.
1. Attempts should be made at all times to obtain the official Japanese Army designations of all ground units, However if this information unobtainable the following data should be procured. A- Code names and members of Units. B. Most Japanese army units are supplied with code names and numbers usually of four digits to denote the division and regiment in a division are generally known by the officers but not always of the enlisted men. MEMORANDUM:
TO ALL UNIT COMMANDER OF THE HQ. G-2 COMMAND (INTELLIGENCE ESPIONAGE
NET) FREE LUZON AREA, (In the field)

SPECIAL ORDERS:

1. Unit Commander will act as the Recruiting Officer of his area for inducting men into the service of the United States Army. By inducting men or women ad counter espionage, the Unit Commander, or any of the G-2 operatives assigned to operate to any Province and Districts should make proper investigations of applicants and must be qualified under the following qualifications below.

- (a) He or she must be a Filipino citizen.
- (b) He or she must be from the age of 18 and up with education or no education provided alert, healthy, wide awake and ready to meet any obstacles summon by orders of his superior.
- (c) That he or she must be verified by any Local authorities as testimonials for his or her personality, honesty, and integrity.

2. Any Unit Commander, G-2 Operatives and organizer of the Hq. G-2 Command, (Intelligence Espionage Net) Free Luzon Area (in the field) assigned to assume the duties as such in any District and Provinces should take the whole responsibilities of his musters of enlisted men, daily reports, sick reports, and activities of his men to be entered in their service records.

3. Any Unit Commander who is only authorized by the Commanding Officer of the Hq. G-2 Command, (Intelligence Espionage Net) with proper credentials papers, as authorized person, signed respectively by the Commanding Officer and the Finance and Supply Officer, who can make interview to any persons or person those who believes the Democratic System of ways and life; upon asking supplies for the maintainance of the said organization, or financial support. Any aid given to the authorized person, should be reported to the General Headquarters of the G-2 COMMAND; Any Unit Commander or any authorized person after getting any support or aid, for the organization should in turn give receipts signed by him to the person concerned.

4. Any persons or person subject to military law and not subject to this special order, No. 5 stated above, who violates or disobeys the same will be punished as the court marshall may direct.

5. Unit Commander are subject to give orders to his unit for commanding Arms and salvage ammunitions to anybody those who are not authorized by law or not a member of present set up of the Free USAFFE, in the field. Any piece of arms, commanded or collected from any places, should be reported to the General Headquarters for registration of its kind, and must be kept properly by the Unit concerned.

5. Any Unit Commander assigned should take the proper steps of prosecuting persons or misguided enemy cooperating with the Japanese, by proper court marshall procedure before on the steps of liquidation.

7. Unit Commander should take the deciplinary actions of his Unit under the Provisions of the Article of War, United States Army.

8. Any Unit Commander assigned to any Districts or Provinces, should take the responsibility of his men upon contacting the Philippine Constabulary and Puppet Police for cooperation of establishing peace and order of the District or Province.

9. Unit Commander should make report with the strenth of his men from time to time to the General Headquarters.

10. Any G-2 operatives of the Hq. G-2 Command, assigned to operates to any District and Provinces should immediately contact any Commanding Officers of Different Unit, if there is any for centralization of commands, and for mutual coordination of specific missions.

11. Unit Commander should make requisition of supplies for his Unit, to the Finance and Supply Officer of the Hq. G-2 Command (Intelligence Espionage Net) in due form.

4. That I do hereby surrender all secret orders, all acts, and procedure of the aforementioned party (Ganap or Sakdala) to all Free Military Units concerned.

That I will bear true faith and allegiance to the United States of America; and to the Commonwealth of the Philippines that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against their enemies whosoever; and that I will obey the orders of the President of the United States and the President of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, and all orders of the Free Military Units (in the field) appointed over me without any unlawfull acts, or purpose of evasion. 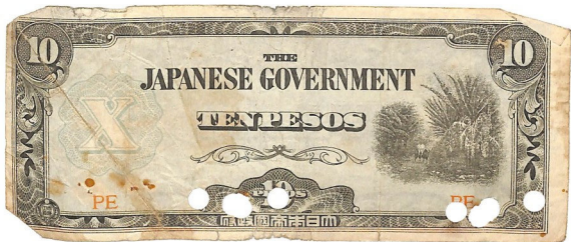


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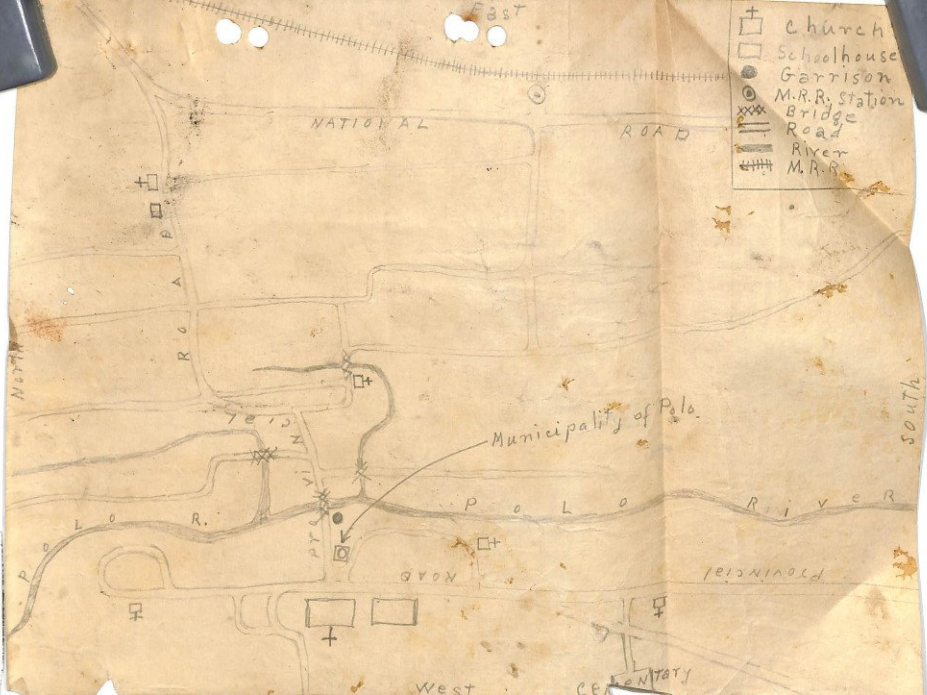
