

Report on "Magallanes Guerrilla Unit"

- l. After a study of the unit file, it was determined that a field investigation of the Magallanes Guerrilla Unit" was not necessary.
 - 2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file.)
 - 3. FINDINGS:
- a. No persons known to be members of the subfect unit have been interviewed.
- b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The unit file contains a letter requesting recognition and outlining the unit's history; a copy of a document from The Adjutant General, HPA, dated 5 Dec '45, to RPD, HPA, stating that all Philippine Constabulary were automatically inducted into USAFFE 17 Dec 41; and a unit roster. The unit history states in paragraph 2, line 4, that "Due to heavy enemy pressure in the locality we dispersed, but did not surrender." Line 6, same paragraph, says, "Our unit was a combat unit, harrasing and raiding enemy positions." This is an impossible situation. The remainder of the history deals with the various arrests of certain alleged members and the CO, but no definite instance of actual guerrilla warfare is specified. The other papers in the file submitted to this headquarters in no way support the subject unit's claim for recognition.
- c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. Alleged frequent arrests of the subject unit's CO and some of his men and constant change of locale adequately disputed any claim the unit may make as to satisfactory field maintenance.
- d. A definite organization was not established by the unit. The unit history is very hazy and makes not one specific claim.
- e. A studied perusal of the unit file reveals that the unit could not have existed as such. This is obviously a weak attempt at gaining a spurious recognition of a pseudo organization.
- f. No useful purpose will be served by further investigation of this unit.



- g. The unit suffered no casualties.
- 4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: This unit has no apparent political affiliations or aspirations.
- 5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the "Magallanes Guerrilla Unit" be not favorably considered for recognition. The unit suffered no Casualties.



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 68

DEMOBILIZATION OF CLEMENTS OF THE PHILIPPNE ARMY AND OTHER GUERRILLA UNITS IN THE FIELD

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Government has been advised by the Commander-in-Chief, United States Army Forces, Pacific, of the termination of hostilities and the surrender of Japanese forces;

WHENEAS, the Government has further been advised by the Commander-in-Chief, United States Army Forces, Pacific, that this termination of hostilities and surrender of the Japanese forces has rendered unnecessary the maintenance for further field service of clements of the Army of the Philippines in addition to regularly activated units and of those guerrilla units already recognized;

WHEREAS, continued assembly and maintenance of headquarters is not a prerequisite to recognition of guerrilla units; and

will not projudice the continuance of recognition of such guarrilla units as can produce evidence showing that they have maintained organized military forces in the field in effective opposition to the Japanese, which will be the basis for award of such benefits as may be authorized of such units;

NOT, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSHEMA, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the Philippines, do hereby order:

- 1. That all unrecognized guerrilla units be disbanded and that all members thereof return to their homes and engage in their normal civilian pursuits.
- 2. That all arms, amounitions, and milit ry supplies and equipment in the possession of unrecognized guerrilla units or of individual members of such units be immediately turned in to the Commander of the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Army of the Philippines.
- 3. That all records of unrecognized guerrilla units disbanded in conformity herewith, together with any request for recognition and evidence in support of such request, be assembled and turned in to the Commander of the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Army of the Philippines for forwarding to Headquarters, Philippine Army.

- 1. Request information as to the outcome of the Request of Recognition of Guerrilla of Capt. Eugenio F. Magallanes which is known as MAGALLANES GUERRILLA UNIT.
- 2. This Unit had been organized on 1942 by Capt. E. F. Magallanes, former Provincial Inspector and Commanding Officer of the then Philippine Constabulary stationed at Easco, Batanes, before the outbreak of the war.
- 3. The above mentioned Unit composed mostly of the former EM of Philippine Constabulary stationed at Basco, Eatenes before the war and had remained in that Island up to the liberation. The request for Recognition had been submitted on February 1946. Up to the present time nothing has been heard of any action taken with regards to this request.
- 4. The pertinent papers or roster of troops has been submitted personally to the Commanding General AFWESPAC, Guerrilla Affairs together with the request for Recognition on February 1946.
- 5. In view of the foregoing, it is hereby requested that any steps taken in consideration with this Unit be informed to the undersigned for transmittal to Capt. E. F. Magallanes, who is now assigned in the MPC at Sorsogon as Provost Marshal.

- 1. Recognition of my guerrilla unit is hereby requested as per activities of same submitted for your consideration. That at the outbreak of the war on 8 December 1941, the Batanes Company PG, stationed at Dasco, Batanes withdrew to the mountains to continue resistance movements against the snew. I told my men that we shall consider ourselves a guerrilla unit, "Magallanes Guerrilla".
- 2. When the great portion of the Jepanese troops in Basco, Batanes, left for Luron, I end the rest of my men left Basco for Ithout, Batanes, on 27 September 1945. There we organized our guerrilla unit, as year roster, hereto attached. Due to heavy enemy pressure in the locality we disperse, but did not surrender. We went into hiding. We had to depend on civiliens for help in matters of food. Our unit was a combet unit, harrasing and raiding enemy positions. We were supported by diviliens.
- 5. I was operating a radio receiver and we used to hear news from KZEI, SaniFrancisco. We used to transmit news to Basco, Batanes for the information and guidence of another guerrilla unit under Capt Teofilo Balones, Lt Geronimo Cabal and the Provincial Governor Juan Agudo. On 23 July 1944, I was captured by the Japanese together with Sgt. Silvino Lasem, CPls. Florentino Ywaga, Henry Tanagan and Pvt. Isidro Antivo. We were court martialed for operating arradio receiver and for datageminating allied propagandae. Fortunately, we were only sentenced to one year imprisonment with hard labor. On 13 October the Japanese Garrison released us because they were recalled to Basco, Batanes. They were relieved by another company of Japanese. After our release, we rejoined our outfit to continue our resistance movements. On 2 February 1945, to 4 February 1945, it with Sgt. Silvino Lasem, Od. Henry Tanagan and Prt. Isidro Antivo were arrested by the Japanese. We were suspected as the master minds of sabotaging the Japanese. nese Army Food supply in their bodega. The sabotage work was done by civilian sympathizers of our guerrilla unit who received instructions from me to employ themselves as laborers of the Japanese. However, we managed to clear ourselves as having connection with the sabotage work, hence our release again on 4 Feb. 1945.
- 4. On 17 May 1945 a boatload of guerrilla unit, "The Bisumi Fighters was drifted to Itbeyat. The unit was under Capt. T. Balones. On 19 May 1945, this unit made contact with me through L. Inocencio Castillo. No exceed to coordinate our activities in our resistance movements. On 20 May 1945, the Japanese attacked the outrit of Capt T. Balones which resulted in the death of Prt. Bonifacio Castellon and the capture of Lite. Inocencio Castillo, Jose Gavilon, Francisco Culture and Sgt Ruben Gebilo. These men were later on executed by the Hipponese.
- 5. On 23 May 1945, I was again captured by the Japanese together with 5gt. Silvino Lasam, Opl. Henry Tamagam, Mr. Simeon Tolentino and Angel Barcelona. We were all able to acquit ourselves and we were cleased on 3 June 1945. After our release we egain rejoined our governile unit and retreated to the mountains and began to intensity ourself ance movement, until the Americans surject on 8 October 1945 in ourselfance movement of the Japanese who were later evacuated from Ibbayat, Batanes to Manila where they are concentrated as PON We returned to Basec, Batanes on 9 October 1945.

Due to the infrequency of transportation facilities between Batanes and Manila, the undersigned could not communicate with the AFWESPAC APO 70%, for the recognition of my guerrilla outfit, "Magellanes Guerrilla". That a great portion of the members of my guerrilla unit are USAFFE personnels. That we were automatically inducted into the service of the United States Army Forces in the Ear East on 17 December 1941, certified true copy of Induction hereto attached for your information.
- 7. In view of the foregoing facts, it is earnestly and respectfully requested that my unit, "MAGALLANES GUERRILLA", be recognized effective the date of automatic induction into the service of the USAFFE. That the delay of submission for recognition be considered due to the inherent difficulties of transportation facilities between Batanes and Manila.

MEMORANDUM for-Chief, Recovered Personnel Division, HPA, APO 501

The entire Philippine Constabulary was inducted into the service of the United States Army Forces in the Far East on 17 December 1941. 
