The Commading General has directed that you be inferred that the Southern Barra Bei je Guerrille Whit, purporting to be a guerrills erganisation under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition on an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guarrille recognition, established by General Meabribur during the liberation of the Philiprines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After coreful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testinony of sitnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guarrills unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

s. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient accoptable evidence.

b. The unit was not maintained astisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.

e, satisfities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy,

d. A definite organization was not established.

e. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlighment of joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).

f. Renk of numbers was considered to be too high for the setual size of the command maintained in the field.

g. The number of officers, completioned and non-possissioned, was expossive and not resomably proportionate to the United States arey or to pre-cer Philippine Army teblos of organization.

It is desired to emphasize that each claiment member of the unit is considered to have hed just and adequate appraisal for recognition when his services were evaluated concurrently with this study of the unit with which he claims membership. Individual requests were not appropriate them, or now, as their acceptance would in effect constitute unjustified duplication of consideration of one individual by this headquarters. However, this does not proclude subsission for assuably recognition by these individuals who are qualified and fool justified in entering such claims. Upon request by interested individuals, appropriate forms will be forwarded.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 68, Commonwealth of the Philippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 68

DEMOBILIZATION OF ELEMENTS OF THE UNTLIPPME ARMY AND OTHER GUERRILLA UNITS IN THE FIELD

UHEPEAS, the Commonwealth Government has been advised by the Commander-in-Chief, United States Army Forces, Pacific, of the termination of hostilities and the surrender of Japanese forces;

MHENEAS, the Government has further been advised by the Commander-in-Chief, United States Army Forces, Pacific, that this termination of hostilities and surronder of the Japanese forces has rendered unnecessary the maintenance for further field service of elements of the Army of the Philippines in addition to regularly activated units and of those guerrille units already recognized;

WHEREAS, continued assembly and maintenance of headquarters is not a prerequisite to recognition of guerrilla units; and

THEREAS, the domobilization of guerrilla units in the field will not prejudice the continuance of recognition of such guerrilla units as can produce evidence showing that they have maintained organized military forces in the field in effective opposition to the Japanese, which will be the basis for award of such benefits as pay be authorized of such units;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSMEWA, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the Philippines, do hereby order:

- 1. That all unrecognized guerrilla units be disbanded and that all members thereof return to their homes and engage in their normal civilian pursuits.
- 2. That all arms, assumitions, and milit ry supplies and equipment in the possession of unrecognized guerrilla units or of individual members of such units be inseddately turned in to the Commander of the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Army of the Philippines.
- 3. That all records of unrecognized guarrilla units disbanded in conformity herewith, together with any request for recognition and evidence in support of such request, be assembled and turned in to the Commander of the nearest unit of the United States Army or of the Army of the Philippines for forwarding to Headquarters, Philippine Army.

Done at the City of Manila, this 26th day of September, in the year of Our Lord, mineteen hundred and ferty-five, and of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, the tenth.

REPORT ON " SOUTHERN NUEVA ECIJA GUERRILLA UNIT"

- 1. 2nd Lt William D MacMillan and 1st Lt Leon J Sonders attempted to locate the commanding officer of the subject unit in Cabanatuan, Nueva Ecija, on 17 February 1947. No one knew of him, and the investigation was made thru the persons listed below:
- 2. ALLEGED HISTORY: No history is included in the unit file, and the members of the unit could not be found who could submit one.

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements constitute the basis of this report.

Lt(c/. Bernard Anderson Major Robert B Lapham Lt Jaime Mansano CO Anderson's Guerrillas CO LGAF (Guerrilla Col) Ex O, Anderson's Guerrillas

- b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The unit file contains no evidence. The request for recognition bases its plea on "the benevolent policy of that headquarters" rather than presenting the actual accomplishments of the unit. It Mansano stated that he knew of Major G Llanera, who, according to the appointment of Bancuyo (Incl #1) estensibly authorized the subject unit's organization, but Llanera was Meither the CO, Cabenatuan Sector, nor was he authorized to appoint officers; and furthermore, he was not permitted to use the "Gommand line" for Col Anderson. The appointment is totally false. Major Lapham did not know of Llanera of Bancuyo, although he is quite familiar with the area surrounding Cabenatuan.
- c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
 - d. A definite organization was not established.
- e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by the commanding officer.
 - f. Unit did not show any continuity of activity or organization.
- g. No useful purpose will be served by further investigation of this unit. There are no members worthy of recognition and there were no casualties with this unit.
- 4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: The unit has not apparent political affiliations or aspirations.

 RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that "Southern Nueva Ecija Guerrilla Unit" be not favorably considered for recognition.
