Dear Mr. Cabaddu

The Camalaniugan Bolo Unit, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all available substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

a. Application for recognition was received subsequent to 15 March 1946, the date announced as the deadline after which such applications would not be accepted.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

S i r :

I have the honor to request information whether our Camalaniugan Loyalists organized sometimes in the later part of September, 1944 deserved recognition. This organization was initiated by Ex-Usaige Men (Bataan Boys) of this town. It had about 300 men. When these Bataan boys joined the Guerrilla in the early part of March 1945 in Allacapan, Cagayan; I was left to continue and reorganize same. I reorganized it and named it the CAMALANIUGAN BOLO UNIT. We continued our activities.

Our Headquarter was located in the forest about six kilometers from the plain. Posts were located in several places and guards permanently detailed in each. This was done so that we could accomplish our aims.

Our accomplishments were:

1. We boycotted the forced labor of the Japs thus only those caught by the enemy were their laborers.

2. We furnished information of enemy Ammunition dumps, foodstuffs, and others. To get these things accurately, we had to send boy scouts as some labor or salt cakes, wine, etc. inside their concentration camps;

3. We protected, fed, and transported Guerrilla officers, men, and S-4 Agents who came to our sector.

4. We saved one American Aviator who met an accident in our sector but landed about 5 kilometers away from the enemy's line. Said American Aviator had to pass the enemy's line. Although the Japanese were guarding and watching day and night the roads, we succeeded in spite of the risks. His name is Lieut. Henry John. This happened in the later part of January in 1945.

5. We saved the Guerrilla Unit in Allacapan from a surprise attack by the enemy sometimes in March, 1945 by informing them of the approaching enemy on an early morning;

6. Our men were used as carriers, guards, and others by the Guerrilla Units;

7. We helped civilians in their evacuation and informing them of actual situations and news of the war;

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o. we did many others to help win the war.

Because o f our ACTIVITIES, some o f our men were captured and killed by the Japs. Some died of sickness contracted because o f their services.

I earnestly pray/a an a hope fo r whatever is good for our organization and what steps sh bld I do to help my men especially the se that died. Our re sters can be sent to that Office if needed.
