I have the honor to request that the <u>Civilian Intelligence</u>
Division organized by the undersigned by virtue of the appointment herewith enclosed be recognized.

This organization consisting of 200 members scattered all over Bobol, (cbu, Layte and Northern Mindanao concentrated its sork in the accomplishment of the instructions commercated on page 3 of my report to the 00 of the '10th Division, 10th Military District, submitted on January 11, 1943, as follows:

- To collect arms and assumitions from civilians and soldiers unable to fight not by force but through proper explanation regarding their duties to help our patriots fighting in the field.
- To wage a compaign to secure the cooperation of the civilians with the guerrilla force.
- 3. To campaign against banditry and lawlessness.
- 4. To apprehend spies and check pro-Japanese activities.
- To report to the army the positions of the enemies, their strength, their arms and all other information which would be useful to our army in fighting our enemies.
- To solicit contributions of food and other supplies needed by the army.
- To provide transportation facilities and serve as couriers for the army and to do any other things which will assist in any way our armed forces in the prosecution of this war.

Most of the records of the organization were either destroyed or lost during the invasion of Buenavista, Aguesn by the Jage but efforts are now being made to get a complete list of all members and gather as many records available in the hands of agents now in Mindaman so that the undersign ed will be able to submit another reports in detail of the activities of the organization including its easualties as soon as possible, wities of the organization including its easualties as

In presenting to you my mission as representative of the provincial board of Bohol, I desire that the following report on my activities for the year 1942 be placed on record:

Prior to my assumption of office as member of the provincial board of Bohol, I was mayor of Garcia-Hernandez for two terms, during which I was elected every year for four years as Speaker of the Assembly of mayors of the Province of Bohol. After the out-break of the war I became a member of the emerboard and member of the staff of the Bohol Legion of Liberty with a membership of about twenty thousand men, all pledged to defend the rights and liberties of the Boholanos in particular and the Filipinos in general. Since January 1942, up to May of the same year besides doing my duties as member of the provincial board, Emergency Board and Commander of the Bolo Battalions of the 3rd Corp of the Bohol forces of the USAFFE especially in the procurement of supplies, transportation of the same from place to place, construction of beach defenses and the apprehension of spies and pro-Japanese working against our common cause.

During April, the pro-Japanese activities and pronouncements of the then Governor of Bohol, Agapito Hontanosas, were such that no freedom loving Filipinos with unquestioned loyalty to the United States of America could bear to tolerate. I took up the metter of checking his activities believing that the effect was demoralizing, with Senator Garcia, Provincial Fiscal Borromeo, the Commander of the Bohol Forces, Capt. Blancas and the Provincial Inspector but all of them chose to defer action until a riper time. Sensing that the invasion of the province by the Japanese was imminent, and convinced that the riper time has already come, I preferred charges by radiogram against Gov. Hontanosas to Brigadier General Manuel Roxas who was at the same time representing President Quezon in the Commonwealth Government of the unoccupied territories of the Philippines. In my radiogram, I charged the Governor as a pro-Japanese with activities already bordering treason and demanded his immediate expulsion recommending my co-member of the Board, Atty. Corrado Marapac to take his place. Heneral Sharp, by radiogram, appointed Representative Viscarra and Clarin and Senator Garcia as members of the Investigation Committee with the Senator as Chairman. My charges were confirmed and the Governor was recommended for expulsion by the Committee and my co-member, Atty. Corrado Marapac recommended as Acting Provincial Governor. The results of this investigation together with all pertinent papers are now in the possession of Capt. Achacoso, a ranking Filipino officer of the USAFFE in the province of Bohol.

As soon as Governor Hontanosas realized his plight, he immediately exerted efforts even to the extent of intimidating the Commander of the Bohol Forces to surrender. Informed as I was of the critical situation, I immediately set out on foot through the mountains from my town Carcia-Hernandez to the interior Headquarters of the Bohol "orces at Sierra-Bullones with a determination to prevail upon the Commanding Officer to fight to the last man to which idea I was able to make Commander Blancas promise. But I learned at the same time from my agents as Chief of the Civilian Intelligence Division to which post I was appointed simultaneously with the order of the investigation of Gov. Hontanosas that he (Gov. Hontanosas) was already negotiating with the Commander of the Japanese Imperial Army in Cabu to occupy Gohol at once promising his full cooperation. Consequently, Gohol was occupied without resistance and

the Provincial Sovernor. To received the following orders from the supreme command of Bohol which altered everything that we agreed upon in the conference as respect to the administration of the civil affairs. The Covernor was not even consulted in the appointment of revors, councilors and barrio lieutenants. That made the attention the more astonishing was the complete disregard of the rights of certain loyal Commonwealth officials, like ma ors and councilors to hold their offices, who swake to find that their places for no reasons whatsoever were filled by foreign persons. Some of his officers incharge of torn detachment as-sured of the force belind then proclaimed thems lives heads of the municipal governments even to the extent of announcing that there was no civil government a firing squad scering then to death; barrio licuterants were forced to work as confidence to failure to bring supplies for the arms; civilians projects which wer organized to hilp the army such as the sear factory, show shore, blacksmith shops and tailor shops at Gercia-Herrandez which were bucked u the provincial board and the Civilian Intelligence Division were all broken up by the Army for no reasons other than their being projects helping the soldiers through the leadership of civilians whom they consider to be their enemies Even the provincial murds organized by the Governor were ordered broken up an communication lines established through the efforts of the Provincial Board were confiscated without the consent of the prov neigl authorities: campaings were purposely started with designs to humiliate the provincial officials and orders were made by certain detachment commanders not to res ect and obey instructions coming from any Camponwealth civilian official. Officers under Engeniero are tolerated to strike peaceful civilians and civilian officials for practically no reason but to scare people into sub-All these things are going on in the province inhabited by over half million peace-loving people who know how to respect our laws and above all are ready to make any kind of sacrifice to help win this war. A province where banditry is unknown, is now under a government purely dictatorial in form and practice under which people are forced to live hoping praying that any minute their sad plight be redeemed by certain Americans now in

About Dec. 18, a party of two Americans (Lt. Maters and Lt.
