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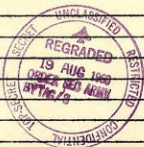

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

Col Gerald F. Lillard:

1. The 438th Squadron, LGAF, consisting of approximately 159 members, has not been favorably considered for recognition. Approximately 752 members of the 403rd Squadron (subject unit's parent organization) have previously been recognized. This is an initial investigation.
2. This unit does not fulfil the requirements of the five basic points for recognition. See attached Team Leader's Report.
3. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit.
4. All worthy members have been recognized and there is a separate casualty roster, the worthy members of which will be taken care of on the LGAF's composite roster.
5. Those previously recognized members meriting revision of the initial recognition date will be handled through the LGAF's composite roster.

Dear Mr. Aganon:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Squadron 438, LGAF, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. A definite organization was not established.
- e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders because of the desertion of some of its personnel to join other units.
- f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- g. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.

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It is considered that the previous recognition of approximately 752 officers and men from the 403rd Squadron, LGAF (your parent organization), who were recognized by the Commanding General, Sixth Army for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgement of military service.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 66, Commonwealth of the Philippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

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## Report on Squadron 403 LGAF

1. 1st Lt J. C. Altman proceeded to Tarlac and vicinity on 27 May 1947 to investigate Squadron 403 LGAF.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The 403rd Squadron LGAF is a composite Squadron consisting of Squadron 403, 404 and Squadrons 431 through 440, a total of twelve Squadrons, allegedly operating in the East Tarlac Sector under the command of the late Diosdado Aganon. A total of 752 men representing all Squadrons with the exception of Squadrons 431, 433, 436, 438, 439, and 440 have been recognized for various periods of attachments. Special order #21 dated 26 December 1944 signed by Capt Albert S. Hendrickson specifically states that the east sector of Tarlac under the command of Diosdado Aganon shall have as active Squadrons numbers 403 & 404 and reserve Squadrons numbering 431 to 440 which would prove the inactivity of Squadrons 431 to 440 due to their being designated as reserves. After careful consideration and evaluation of the evidence submitted the units claim of considerable activity on the part of the claimant members listed in the supplementary rosters could not be proven. All pertinent information presented to substantiate the requested recognition of the claimant members is based on the activities and exploits of the recognized personnel of the subject unit. Individual Squadron commanders were unable to convince the investigating officer as to the great extent of their activities and organization to merit the additional recognition of the claimant members as active participants in the accomplishments of the recognized portion of the unit. The original Squadron 403 was the nucleus of the alleged reorganization and consolidation of the East Sector of Tarlac into one efficient and well organized Squadron. However, approximately fifty percent of the original Squadron 403 are listed as claimant members on the supplementary roster. Major Tirso U. Aganon, brother of the original organizer of the 403 Squadron and present commanding officer, claimed that due to the limited need of guerrillas by the U.S. Army using forces the claimant members on the supplementary roster were not attached to U.S. Army units, although they were physically present, actually encamped near the units headquarters and willing to be of active service. Upon examination of the recognized rosters of the 403rd Squadron it was noted that approximately 200 men joined the Squadron in 1945. It is believed that, had

the unit been as well organized as claimed by the commanding officer, the additional numbers of men needed by U.S. Army units could have been obtained from the alleged abundance of members not previously attached, who were supposedly awaiting call, rather than resort to the recruiting of personnel during the year 1945.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. The majority of the claimant personnel as listed on the supplementary rosters of the 403rd Sqd LCAF originally were in the reserve Squadrons of the Tarlac East Sector with Squadron designations ranging from Squadron 431 to Squadron 440. These units were not engaged in combat operations nor did they at any time create opposition to the enemy. The commanding officer of Squadron 432 (Ramos Squadron) submitted a separate request to Headquarters AFMESPAC for the recognition of the unit under his command. In the history of Squadron 432 it is stated that the unit could not boast of any encounters with the Japanese Army but in effect that it was a unit organized to combat the lawless elements in Ramos and the maintaining of peace & order in neighboring barrios. Squadron 438 commanded by Teofilo Tusanon was allegedly organized on 10 July 1944. The unit makes no claim for actual engagements against the enemy other than intelligence activity the nature of which the commanding officer and the men of his command could not verify by written document of any description as to how information was acquired and as to its disposal. Cresencio S. Arenas, commanding officer of Squadron 437 stated that the men of his command never participated in actual skirmishes against the Japanese forces at any time during the occupation or liberation. The activities of Squadron 437 were confined to combatting the Hukbuhap forces and the maintenance of peace & order in La Paz, Tarlac. Lack of arms possessed by the reserve squadrons indicates the non activity of the units in armed conflict with the enemy.

d. A definite organization was not established by the claimant units because many of the officers were unable to give accurate information as to the exact localities in which the purported engagements against the enemy took place nor could they indicate their complete area of operations. The commanding officers of the reserve squadrons as well as the personnel of their command remained at home, worked at their normal civilian occupation and in no way contributed to or helped in the resistance movement in a measure which would warrant their recognitions in a guerrilla status. The non-existence of four squadrons is indicated by the failure of Squadron 431, 433, 436, and 440 to represent themselves as a unit or in part at the time of the designated investigation for proper interrogation in regards to the overall commanders request for recognition of a guerrilla unit.

e. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy. Activities as claimed by the individual squadron commanders and subordinate officers of their commands are of small material value and are not deemed to be sufficient to warrant the additional recognition of the claimant members on the supplementary roster. Statements from the alleged commanders of various units and evidence in unit histories presented

in no way portrayed active resistance to the enemy but purports the maintenance of peace and order in the municipality of the individuals concerned. All activities as claimed by the personnel listed on the supplementary rosters are based on the activities performed by the recognized portion of the composite squadron presently designated squadron 403 LGAF. There were no activities claimed by some of the squadron commanders due to the non-existence of a Japanese garrison, in the barrios in which the headquarters of their units were located and in the majority of cases due to vigilance of the Japanese in the municipality in which a large garrison was stationed.

f. Performance of the units did not indicate adequate control by its leaders because of the desertion of personnel to join other units. Of the twelve Squadrons allegedly under the nominal control of the Tarlac East Sector commanded by Capt Diosdado Aganon prior to his death in Cagayan Valley and at present commanded by Luiso V Aganon, all squadron commanders concerned stated that they lost a substantial number of personnel due to desertion to other guerrilla units.

g. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization because the claimant members of the unit could not show any outstanding achievement accomplished or show any supporting evidence. When interviewed, Squadron commanders and subordinate claimant members of their commands could not submit proof which would substantiate claims as to their having opposed the enemy in effective resistance operations during the occupation or liberation. Major Tirso Aganon presented rosters of various Districts, Regiments and Detachments allegedly organized in the Tarlac Area in the years 1942 and 1943 in behalf of his contentions that the names of many of the claimant members on the supplementary roster appear thereto. The appearance of names of claimant members on alleged original rosters does not preclude the assumption of fact that they were actively engaged in resistance operations against the enemy. As is proven by statements in the alleged histories of the unit and interrogation and statements from person obtained during the investigation there were many periods of inactivity due to the anti-resistance measures applied by the Japanese, the capture of the overall commanding officer and the hesitancy of actual contacts with the enemy for fear of retaliation against the civilian populace in the vicinities concerned. The complete organization of units in an active & reserve status in the Tarlac East Sector during the occupation as claimed by the commanding officer is doubtful due to the necessity of inducting members unto the unit in 1945 to fill the needs of the using American units.

h. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupations and family obligations. Many members apparently lived at home supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits and in no way actively participated in the field as guerrillas.

i. No useful purpose will be served by further investiga-

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tion of this unit.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that, with the exception of the 752 members previously recognized, Squadron 403 LOAF be not favorably considered for recognition.

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
