Dear Major Chiang:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Philippine Chinese Anti-Jap Stern Troops, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. A definite organization was not established.
- d. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders.
- e. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

It is considered that the previous recognition of approximately 70 officers and men from Squadron 399, USAF who were recognized by the Commanding General Sixth Army for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgment of military service.



Col Gerald F Lillard:

1. The Philippines Chinese Anti-Jap Storm Troops consisting of 350 men, has not been favorably considered. 70 members have previously been recognized with Squadron 399, IGAF.
2. This unit does not fulfil the requirements of the five basic points for recognition. See attached Team Leader's Report.
3. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit.
4. All worthy members have been recognized and a casualty roster has been submitted as a part of the Chinese Volunteers in the Philippines (CVP) by Vicente Lopez. No recommendation is being made on this roster because the overall roster is being handled as one unit.
5. It is recommended that the revision of dates of the recognized members of the unit be handled through the Luzon Guerrilla Armed Forces (LGAF) with which they were recognized.

1. Lt Raul Diaz de Rivera proceeded to 616 Alvarado, Binondo, Manila, on 2 May 1947 to investigate the Philippines Chinese Anti-Jap Storm Troops.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following named persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

Vicente Lopez	CO, Chinese Volunteer in the Phil
Lee Hai Jo	1st Col, COWHM
Tan Koc Tong	2nd Lt, Phil Chinese Anti-Jap Storm Troops (A Co, Pekek)

Uy Kiam Hong	Cpl, Phil Chinese Anti-Jap Storm Troops

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The unit presented letters of commendation pertaining to the activities of a previously recognized portion of the same unit, now attempting to use the same evidence to enhance recognition of a supplemental roster.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. The unit claims to have been active in intelligence activities. However, it was learned that such activities were on a small scale. Their operatives spent most of their time in the city and lived with their families. It is believed that this intelligence was never more than just talking about the activities of the Japanese. Lopez, present CO of the US Chinese Volunteers in the Philippines, stated that the unit in 1944 was able to send intelligence reports to Major Miller in Marling's headquarters.

d. A definite organization was not established. Maj Lepham, LGAF, was contacted and he stated that one Lim Lam Beng, a member of the subject unit together with a small band of Chinese nationals joined his organization in September 1944. Lim Lam Beng and his men were attached to the 161st Inf, 25th Division and recognized as Squadron 399, LGAF. Major Lepham further stated that Lim Lam Beng joined him presumably because of the Japanese Military Police, who were hot at the trails of Beng in Manila. The subject unit was well-known to the Kempitai on account of the killings of Chinese nationals who definitely had pro-Jap leanings. However, Major Lepham believes that all worthy members have been recognized and that rest of the members were most of the time in Manila and inactive.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders. Vicente Lopez, alias Lee Hai Jo, claims that subject unit falls under his overall command. The contact team believes otherwise. The results of the investigation shows that

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- (1) It is apparent that during the occupation, chinese resistance consisted of independent units which Vicente Lopez, with the help of Lt Col Lee Hai Jo, CO, of the COWHM and Col Shih I Sheng, CO, 1st Regt, Chinese Volunteers in the Philippines, united in 1945 in order to present a solid front for political and monetary reasons.
- (2) It is intimated by Lopez that if he fails in his mission to get a fair and just recognition for chinese guerrillas in the Philippines, he will ~~turn~~^{submit} all necessary papers to the Chinese National Government thru the Chinese Minister in the Philippines. He further stated that the Kuomintang (Chinese National Party) with the help of the Chinese Government will present these claims with the United States Government.

f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization. The unit history alleges that the unit's activities consisted of liquidating collaborators, gathering intelligence and propoganda. After a careful study of the unit file and the TIR of Lt Middleton on the Chinese Volunteers in the Philippines, it could be assumed that the bulk of the men seeking recognition did not serve in a capacity to justify recognition. As a matter of fact all of the men appearing on the roster, with the exception of those recognized with Sqdn 399, stayed at home and had jobs. The leaders were active for a short period of time and remained idle for a long stretch, or attended to their families.

g. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of the unit.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: "It is believed that Chiang Kai Shek, through his ministers, is directly interested in guerrilla recognition plus his interest in obtaining a large body for political backing and prestige". (Taken fr TIR, Lt Middleton, dated 24 Jan 1946, Chinese Volunteers in the Philippines).

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended with the exception of approximately 70 members recognized with LGAF (Sqdn 399), that this unit be not favorably considered. It is further recommended that the revision of dates of the recognized members of the unit be handled through the LGAF, with which they were recognized.

SUBJECT: ARREARS IN PAY, REQUEST FOR
TO: THE ADJUTANT GENERAL, PA

SIR:

1. Since the Philippines were invaded by the fascist Japanese, we, a group of local Chinese youth who are unwilling to be slaves, organized ourselves into an anti-Japanese party to carry out all sorts of underground activities. In the past three years, we never rested ourselves for a moment in the work to wipe out our common enemy and to fight for our common freedom. Indeed, we had given heavy blows after heavy blows upon the enemy.

2. The Philippine Chinese Anti-Jap Storm Troops was inaugurated on September 18, 1942. It consisted of three units: A. Special Service Unit to liquidate collaborators and traitors, B. Information Unit to gather military secrets of the Japanese troops and report them to the Allies, and C. Propaganda Unit to receive the news from the broadcast from San Francisco and Chungking and other Allied broadcasting station then publish them. All our three units had performed great tasks.

3. Around September, 1944, more than thirty members of our party were arrested and executed one after the other by the Japs.

4. In September, 1944, our party sent Captain Lim Lam Beng to meet USAFFE-LGAF Major Robert B. Lapham and Major Harry McKenzie in Nueva Ecija. As a result, our units were then inducted into their force. Those conducted by Captain Lim Lam Beng, that stationed in the Nueva Ecija province was known as SQUADRON 399.

Meanwhile, all our members in Manila made their best efforts gathered Japs military secrets and pave the way for the Allies in the coming liberation of the Island.

5. During the liberation of the City of Manila in February, 1945 our armed forces fought the enemy troops stationed in the city in response to the Allied forces. We also supplied military information to the liberating forces, extended help to CIC, extinguishing the fires set by the retreating Jap troops, organized first aid squadron, and established a refugee center.

6. On February 6, 1945 the Squadron 399 was attached to 161st Infantry, 25th Division, U. S. Army and fought with them against the enemy along Northern Luzon.

7. Complying with the request of the U. S. Army, we again inducted a Company (from the Manila members) of one hundred thirty one persons to Squadron 399 on March 3, 1945. They were attached to 161st Infantry, 25th Division, U. S. Army and fought for the Allies at Palete Pass, Santa Fe, and other places of Northern Luzon. For their courage in the battlefield, they were decorated with five silver and bronze stars, besides other forms of encouragement.

8. On July 12, 1945, having completed all our works at the front, our ~~PHILIPPINE~~ SQUADRON 399 was recalled to Camp Murphy to arrange the retirement from the service.

9. In the last three years, some of our members had died for the freedom of the people in the Philippines, while others had contributed their money and properties for the underground works. Moreover, most of our members had lost all their belongings in their contribution and in the big fore which of that took place in Manila at the time when they were busily serving in the street-fighting to drive the Japs devils out of the city. Consequently, they have found it difficult to make a living now.

10. Now that victory had finally arrived and the Philippines is already liberated, we would like to report to your good office the story of our struggles in the past and the works we had accomplished in the last three years and the names of our members with the hope that you will extend to us the favor of arrears in pay.

The Chinese Pekek (Squadron 399) and COWHM units have been attached to this regiment since 31 March 1945 and 6 May 1945 respectively, and have served in the front line during the entire Balete Pass - Santo Fe Campaign.

Initially these troops were given a refresher course in basic tactics and use of weapons which subjects they absorbed so rapidly and with such zeal that within four days of the start of the course I considered them qualified for front line duty. They were first assigned security and patrolling missions along supply routes until their willingness and adoptness proved to me that they were capable of assault missions. For the last three weeks, the 1st Battalion 161st Infantry, to which they were attached, has used them consistently as assault troops and the results have been most gratifying. Their leaders are well schooled in infantry tactics and most cooperative. The troops themselves are brave, hardy, and as well disciplined as any troops I have seen anywhere. On one occasion, while under attack by a determined Jap infiltration group at night, the commander of a COWHM platoon called Battalion Headquarters asking permission to reinforce Company B, 161st Infantry, some 300 yards away and also under attack, feeling that the situation on the B Company front was more critical than their own. On another occasion, a 20 man COWHM patrol on a reconnaissance mission engaged 50 Japs in a three hour fire fight, killed at least twelve and withdrew only after running out of ammunition. During an attack on a Jap fortified cave area by the Pekek Company (Squadron 399), one of my infantry company commanders assembled his company at an OP to use the attack as a demonstration of proper use of concealment and infantry tactics.




