HISTORY OF THE ORGANIZATION OF LUPI-SIPOCOT SECTOR

1. DATE OF THE ORGANIZATION

War was unexpectedly declared on December 8, 1941 and four days later the Jepanese landed at Leganj. Before the ensmy occupied Sipocot on Dec. 18, it came to my mind to organize ways of resistance against the invaders. By this reason, I hastly gathered my personal belonging that I could courry and with my nearest of kins and their families who were liberated as the forest of Barrio Baggama, Lupi Cemarines Sur without sufficient arms except my personal revolver and shotgum. I bought a hundred sakes of paley from some friends and had these paley hauled to our hideout, to saure sufficient food supply for my few symphatizers who were willing to John with me in the forest. Such were the nucleus of my organization in the early part of 1942.

2. HOW ADHERANTS GROW IN NUMBER:

As soon as the Japanes arrived in this region the first thing they did was to abuse and reps our women. 3. INDUCTION OF OFFICERS AND ENLISTED MEN.

The first adherants to this organization were my immediate or kins. the Japanese committed abuses and severe cruelties, so that our fear developed into bitter hate and then determined for final revenge, This revenge necessitated our taking up arms thus finally bringing to light our major objectives resisting to drive away and to over throw the ornel invaders.

5. HOW ARMS WERE SECURED BY THE ORGANIZATION:

Our first arms were my personal revolver and shot gun which I took with me to the forest at the approach of the Japanese invaders, Others of my few companions had long sharp bolos, dasgers, bunting spears and bows and arrows. The inventive genious of some of us had produced home made shot guns and revolvers and a little later occount bomb shells were also made, Our arms encreased as fast as erms could be wrettled or snatched away from our Japanese adversaries.

6, WHY AND HOW I LEFT THIS UNIT TO ORGANIZED A NEW ONE N IN MANILA.

Soon after the fall of Bataan and Corrigidor the bulk of the Japanese soldiers enesged in taking these places were distributed in the provinces to exterminate the Cuerilles. 7. ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE ORGANIZATION:

It was herd to valuate in words the accomplishments of the organization, the individual exploits of some, the unbeareble punishments suffered by others and the oruel deaths met by a few at the hands of the brutal enemy. Resistance both passive and ermed were resorted to the first then the organization had no sufficient arms to meet the enemy and the second when arms were already secured as was the case during the later part of the occupation.

HISTORY OF THE ORGANIZATION Continued Page No. 3

Our resistance was made not only by the members of the organization but likewise inc cooperation with the members of other or-genizations. During the later part of the occupation, sabotage and active armed resistance were resorted to, bridges were blown up to disrupt transportation and communication thus critipling the movements of troops and materials. Enemies were ambushed on the way resulting in the distructions of trucks and the deaths of many Japanese soldiers.

All movements of the enemy were keenly watched out and the necessary information transmitted to the proper heads of the organi-zation or to other similar organizations so that proper actions could be attended to. Booby traps were placed along the road bads blowing to places several enemy trucks. The information furnished by Captain Sabando of this organization to Major Barrows resulted in the total destruction of the enemy's store of fuel and amunitions hidden among the lumber piled up along the Sipcot Railroad Station when this place was mercileasly bombed by the American Plenes sometimes in Merch, 1965. A similar information to Major Barrows by Lieut. S. M. de Luna of this organization resulted in the wiping out of the enemy's frotifications in Bahi Bridge also, the complete destructions of their fuel and ammunition stored in the place envolving considerable deaths of many Japanese Soldiers when the place was successfully bombed by the American Planes in the middle part of March of 1945,

Also another case in our activity when Three (3) Japanese Strugglers pretending to be a chinese civilian suddenly appeared in the barrio of Villazar, about fifteen kilometers from the town in the barrio of thises, would first a relative that he piece, assning the civilians, wounding a barrio lieutenant on the left leg, then they rushed and fled to the mountain thick forest but Lt. S. M. de Luna chased them with his barrowed Carbine killing two of them Lurs chased them with his barrowed Garbine Killing two of them and capturing one with a breast wound, after almost four hours of hot chasing in the thick woods, on the later part of September, 1945. He recovered the map of the Blood Regions, two head grandes and a pistol Cal. 38; The prisoner, the grandes and the map were all turn over to Major Mirands of the FC, Commandent, New, Committees, Sur, while the Fistol Cal. 35 was turned over to the Mayor Mirandes Sipport for safe Keeping, These were only a few of our accomplishments.

The members of this organization have done their duties at the sacrifice of the lives of some of them as may be seen in the attached list of casualties. They have done their share of the fight to drive away the enemy without the least anticipating to be rewarded for their sacrifices. Their sacrifices did not end until to the present watching Japanese strugglers still roaming in the nearby forest.


