



Dear Br. Clemente:

The Commanding Coverel has directed that you be into nod that the Counter Propaganda Unit, purporting to be a guarrilla organisation under your nesimal control, is not favorably considered for recegnition as an element of the Philippine army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After caroful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of mitresses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned

a. The unit was not saintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.

b. Activities of the unit did not contribute esterially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.

c. A definite organization was not established.

d. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and recessary related informar tion).



- 2. With a PHILC O Radio receiving set No. 116FZ whose short wave was not cut, as our in trum the we had received news daily from San Francisco and from the Voice of Freedom. We had disseminated this daily news to our people as a means to counteract Japanese propaganda michine Philippines. We thought of operating this counter propaganda michine in view of the reconditioning (cutting of the short wave) of all receiving sets in the Philippines by the Japanese Army. Inspite of this and inspite of the Japanese Military procadmation punishing to death any one in whose possession an unreconditioned Radio set is found or any one found listening to allied broadcasts, my unit have by all means continued on this venture up to the end until the electric current in Manila had been cut in the first week of February 1945. Plenty, there were, who were found with "short wave" that were killed on the spot, but inspite of this my unit continued on this mission.
- 5. And so we heard every day the daily commentaries of William Winters, until he left San Francisco for an unknown destination only to reappear at the Voice of Freedom from Leyte and those also of Syney Rogers. We heard "Mariano" broadcasting from San Francisco the latest news of the day into his listeners in the Philippines, we heard Julio Vamenta and Jose Guerrero talking to us every day, we heard C armen Ligaya and the "Girl Friend" bringing entertaining Latin-American music and Hollywood siggers for the Filipinos, we heard Admiral Nimitz broadcasting from Pearl Harbor encouraging the building of more ships and Gen. Eisenhower spoke from his Allied headquarters in Europe telling "that complete victory is ahead if the Allies don't relax", we heard Gen. Romulo speaking before C ongress to report that your foothold at Leyete is secure, we heard Gen. Valdes spoke at Leyete in his capacity as Secretary of Public Works and C ommunications, we heard of the flashing to RCA and its radio network of the rescue of 506 PW all veterans of Bataan and C orregidor by the Ranger Battalion.
- 4. Thisunit was organized without attaching to our names such military titles as other Guerilla bands, we organized our selves without the intention of charging the US our salaries. We are not after privileges or ranks—we only want the people of the US and its brave Offi cers and men to know that here in the Philippines we united as one manfor the ideals you have been fighting for.

- 1. This is to bring to your attention and for your cognisance and recognition for whatever it may be worth a dounter Propaganda Unit which was trained and operated under my direction among men whose stamina for truth and whose bravery, tenacity and parietism had been tested and proven:
- 2. With a FHILCO Readio receiving set No. 116FZ whose short wave was not cut, as our instrument, we had received news daily from San Francisco and from the voice of Freedom. We had disseminated this daily news to our people as a mens to counteract Japanese propaganda in the Fhilippines. We thought of operating this counter propaganda machine in view of the reconditioning (cutting of the short wave) of all receiving sets in the Fhilippines by the Japanese Army. I, JUAN V. FRANCO, married of legal age, at present residing in Comp Murphy, after having been duly sworn to according to law hereby depose and say:

That I am a Commission Officer of the Philippine Army, with the rank of lat Lieutenant, SigC, and inducted into the USAFFE in 1941.

That I never have worked under the dapanese deverment nor am I convered in any way by 60 135.

That I know personally let Lt ARTURO & CL MEMTE.

That in the year 1942 he passed to me in a written form the radio commentary of WILLIAM INTER from San Francisco, USA.

That the gist of the commentary was that "the Japanese are virtual prisoners of war in their vast conquered territories the moment the Japanese Navy is annihilated as there will be no more means of sumply and communication between them"

That Lt ARTURO J CLEMENTE in about 1943 atypewritten copy of the letter of TOMAS CONFESSOR in ans/or to the offer of surrender of RAFAEL ALUMAN and his party.

That in said letter, TOMAS CONFE OR, then a guerrilla leader in Pamay, refused to surrender and branced ALUMAN and his party as "PUPPETS" and attacked the ideology of the Japanese Imperial Army.

That subsequently thereafter, Lt ARTURO J CLARENTE had been furnishing me news which he claimed to have come from the short wave concerning allied advance in all fronts.

That I distintly remember that he always emphatically told me often times that "No where in the world is the axis winning except in CMMa"

That we are all members of the COUNTER PROPAGANDA CUERRILLA UNIT of sen ruan, sizal, that our membership dates back to october 15, 1944.

That 1st It ARTURO J CLEMENTE is the leader and commanding officer of that guerrilla.

That an order signed by lst it ARTURO J CLEMENTE called us to active duty with the counter propaganda querrilla unit on october 15, 1944, and that we signed and subscribed to an eath of office on said date.

That since then we actively participated in guerrilla activities as our organization demands, that is that we had been receiving short wave news from allied broadcasting stations particularly gen prancises and the voice of preedom which we had disseminated to firends and to the undergound movement.

That even before 15th october 44, we had been hearing short wave news already and performing the same counter propaganda work against the Japs with 1st Lt Arturo J Clemente as our companions This happened as early as August 1942.

That we are ready to testify before any investigation board on this matter.

I, MARIANO STA ROMANA, married of legal age and residing at HPA, PARPD, after having duly sworn to according to law hereby depose and say:

That I am a CAPTAIN of the Philippine Army and as such processed with the USA WORLD WAR VETERAN GUERRILLA, a unit recognized by the AFPAC on 2m May 1945.

That since 1942 to 1944, I have been operating a short wave Radio and from it received news from allied broadcasting stations and relaying same to my friends and to my guerrilla members. That all of these actuations of mine and of my guerrilla unit were reported to AFPAC and have recognize same.

That in my effort to enlarge the membership of my unit I intended to get Lt ARTURO J CLEMENTE whom I know to be a USAFFE man.

That one time in 1943 I pirposely visited him in his house at 13 Andres Soriano St, San Juan (Manila) and there I made the proposition to him to join my unit. He answered me that he will just coordinate with me as he has also a shortwave set from which he is listening news to relay to friends and to the underground movement.

That during this visit, I was in his house at 6:00 in the evening and because it was time for the broadcast he invited me to the place where the set wave set was at No 11 Andres Soriano St, just next door to him and there we listened to the news from San Fancisco.

That on two or three occasions my shortwave have become out of order and it was to Lt Arturo Clemente where I go to hear the short wave news.

That I did not work under the Jap government nor am I covered by GO 135.

That Lt ARTURO J CLEMENTE even invited to his place to listen to short wave news, but because it was far, being in San Juan, I had no opportunity to go.

That I did not serve in any capacity under the Japs nor am I covered by GO 135.

That I am ready to testify before any board on the truthfulness of this affidavit.
