Upon orders of the Chief of Section, Guerrilla Affairs Section, this Headquarters, Contact Team "D" composed of Captain Huebsch and T/Sgt Victorio proceeded to the Headquarters of Company "C", 1st Bn, 39th Infantry, American-Filipino Forces, Philippine 4th Army Corps, Manila Division, located at 436 Legarda, Sampaloc, Manila to determine the feasibility of it be recognized and eventually inducted into the Philippine Army.

(HISTORICAL DATA)

This organization begun by Alejo Santos in 1942 gradually gained members until in 1943, after Santos and Justo Capili, its first two commanders had been captured, it had a strength of about 120 men and officers. In July 1943, Diego Garcia Francisco, the present commander, assumed command.

The unit at first fell under the control of Ramsey's unit, but contact was lost in 1944.

The activities of the unit were slight in 1944 although members claim to have tried to submit intelligence reports to Ramsey, but their couriers were always caught. Some 22 men and officers hid in the barrio Kadakan, Rizal in 1944 where they claimed to have had some action against some small Jap patrols.

When the U.S. Troops arrived in the area, most of the members, by their own admission took their families to the hills. Some individuals joined other Guerrilla units such as Marking and PQOG. No organized aid was given to any U.S. Army unit by this guerrilla unit.

When men and officers were questioned individually, it was found that there was no sign of any organization.

(POLITICAL ASPECTS)

It is not believed that this unit is involved in politics, local or national.

(RECOMMENDATIONS)

Since this unit shows no sign of organization or organized activities, it is not recommended for recognition.

Unit organized 1942 with 120 men unarmed. Unit organization was first affiliated under Capt. Alejo Santos who was then C.O. in charge of Manila Division. After a short time of distributing appointments duly signed, he was arrested at his office in Manila. This unit then was shifted under the command of one Justo Capili as his successor in the Manila Division. Again appointments were distributed now signed by one D. B. Silang as authorized by Col. Penguin and Col. Edwin Ramsey about the end of 1943. This time unit commander Diego B. Francisco was also arrested, detained for about 3 months and released about Dec. 20, 1943. Under these circumstances, all papers pertaining to the unit were burned but the organization continued underground activities as usual, only to find later on that Justo Capili og the Manila Division was also arrested about the end of 1943. This time the unit came to be under Capt. Boncan believe to be the C.O. of Manila Division. Misfortune overtook Capt. Boncan who was also arrested and met his death in prison. This time this unit having no more other officer to consult continued to

functioned on its own initiative believing that the roster and other papers of the organization were already submitted by D.B. Silang the unit C.O. waited for orders from any higher officer of the Manila Division until the entrance of the liberation forces in Manila on Feb. 1945. Having not received any order nor information as to where this unit shall be connected, some members of the unit enlisted at the Marking Guerilla unit while others are still waiting for any further development.

1. This unit, 39th Infantry, Co. 'C' IHD, is being claimed under Major Ramsey's command. No previous files in this headquarters under Ramsey's units.

2. The above-named officer was interviewed at 0945 hours this date and the following information was noted:-

The organization was initiated on April '43 and that same was receiving direct orders from Major Ramsey. Activities performed were mostly of intelligence work but such activities were never reported to higher headquarters. During the coming of the Liberating Forces, this unit ceased to function, lost contact with its parent unit and consequently disintegrated. Further, the above-named officer stated that most of the men were shifted to POC and the rest joined their families about 3 months ago.

3. FINDINGS: (1) That the organization comprises a few number of men.
(2) That the unit was disintegrated due to lost contact of higher headquarters.

(3) This unit did never go out of Manila for further intelligence work.

(4) That when four (4) members of this unit were already processed by virtue of their USAFFE status, the commanding officer of the same unit desires the whole or part of same to be activated.
