
1. That I know personally Gen. Miguel Acosta (Guerrilla) of the Army of the Agno.

2. That sometime in the month of May, 1942, Gen. Acosta went to see me in my evacuation place in Tayug, Pangasinan, for the purpose of interesting me in joining the underground movement which he was then leading in East Pangasinan. I joined his guerrilla unit as a civilian adviser in the month of May, 1942, helping him in the investigation of suspected collaborators, among whom was then member of the Provincial Board of Pangasinan, Mr. Enrique Santa Maria, who was taken by the men of Gen. Acosta and investigated at the foot of the Mocudan Hills in San Nicolas, Pangasinan.


3. That on August 26, 1942, I was formally inducted Chief, Intelligence Division of the Luzon Guerrilla Forces, East Pangasinan, under Capt. Charles Cushing who ~~devised~~ his authority to operate a guerrilla unit from Lt. Col. C. A. Thorpe. As such Chief of the Intelligence Division, I have had ample opportunity in contacting various guerrilla units operating in East Pangasinan, among them being the Army of the Agno which was very active in that area in the year 1942 until it transferred its headquarters to Central Pangasinan in the early part of 1943.

4. That the Army of the Agno was instrumental in maintaining the faith of the people in East Pangasinan of the coming of the American Forces, and in that way cultivated among the people therein hatred and dislike for the Japanese. It has eliminated most of the early collaborators in that area, which, if they were not eliminated, would have caused a great harm to the cause.

That during the occupation by the enemy, dispersed members of several units and companies of the USAFFE including abled civilians, young and old male citizens in this neighboring towns formed a secret organization went out to the hills and mountains and have joined themselves as GUERRILLAS for the noble cause of defending their sacred land of their births and to their spirited loyalty to their benefactor, the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. These organizations were either lead by ex-service USAFFE, American or Filipino Officers or the intelligent civilian patriots.

That one of the most organized and active Guerrilla Unit which was well known in this locality as well as in the neighboring towns, barrios and sitios, is the ARMY OF THE AGNO, existed way back in May 1942, under the personal supervision of Chieftain Miguel R. Acosta whose rank was Major at that time.

That Having closed secret connection with the organization thru its officers and men, some of whom were employed in the different civil capacities in the Government in this municipality, doubled with the sacred duties as members of the Guerrilla organization to combat, ambush, sabotage or spying the movements of the enemies as chances permitted. ACTIVITIES

- (1) March 9, 1942, Officers and Enlisted Men took oath of enlistment and induction into the service of the United States of America officiated by General Miguel R. Acosta, USAFFE.
- (2) March 9, 1942 to April 15, 1942, we were ordered by our overall Commander, General Miguel R. Acosta, USAFFE to kept watch and on the alert taking the secrets of the Japanese Army and Installations in the municipality of Tayug, Pangasinan;
- (3) April 14, 1942, we ambushed the Headquarters of the Japanese Garrison at Tayug, Pangasinan, and (2) our men killed in action, namely, Lt. Antiporda and Sgt. Palma. (7) Japanese soldiers were killed and one was taken prisoner of War who was caught alive and brought to the HQ. for further questioning;
- (4) April 14, 1942, just after the ambushed of the Japanese Army at Tayug, Pangasinan, we returned to our HQ and reported the result of the mission to the Commanding Officer;
- (5) April 16, 1942, our Captain ordered us to kept watch of the Japanese Installation in San Quintin, Pangasinan besides their dugouts at night time;
- (6) April 16, 1942 to May 25, 1942, a secret plan to attack the Japanese Garrison at San Quintin, Pangasinan and on May 26, 1942, we submitted our report to the HQ;
- (7) May 27, 1942, we ambushed the HQ of the Japanese Garrison at San Quintin, Pangasinan and we got some firearms and ammunition;
- (8) May 28, 1942, we attacked the Japanese Garrison at Balungao, Pangasinan, Philippines and (4) Japs were killed and none on our side;
- (9) May 28, 1942, just after the ambushed we returned to our HQ and reported our mission;
- (10) May 28, 1942, our Commanding Officer ordered us to patrol the barrios whether there are arms or ammunition kept by civilians and confiscate said arms for use of the Army;
- (11) June 8, 1942, we attacked the Garrison at Sto. Tomas de Arango, Pangasinan, and disarmed the Police Force and arms were for use of the Army and in this fight one Sgt. Alejo was wounded in action; and in the barrios we search arms and found (3) for shooting animals and 1 box of ammo. and 10 hand grenades for army use;
- (12) January 2, 1943, we submitted these arms and ammo. to the HQ and reported our mission's results;
- (13) January 3, 1943, we cleaned our arms and ammo. that we got.
- (14) January 4, 1943, we were ordered by our CO to kept watch over the installations of the Japanese nearby and we found out that there is no permanent HQ and dugouts of the Japs, so we thought of constructing our camp near the town in order that we can attack the Japs at any time;
- (15) February 7, 1943, we ambushed the Japs between the Tayug-San Quintin Road, and one enlisted man was caught and one

killed during the encounter. The number of Japs killed was uncertain by us, in view of their great number and we ran short of ammunition.

- (16) April 20, 1943 we arrived at our HQ together with (2) platoons who were separated from us during the ambush at Tayug-San Quintin Road and reported the results of the mission to the Commanding Officer;
- (17) April 21, 1943, we constructed our HQ at Lawak, Tayug, Pangasinan, and trained our men in the manipulation of arms, gave instructions in principles of combat, tactics in ambushes, lectures on articles of War, lectures to keep faith on the United States of America, and lectures assuaging the morale of the civilians and contacting the civilian population to help maintain peace and order and especially the food problems of the guerrillas in order that resistance movement must be carried on until the we can wait for the Liberation Forces to come on our places;
- (18) April 23, 1943, we received an order from the CO that we must take Balungao, Pangasinan at any cost, and that we did so, and we found out that no Japs is at that town, and we made contact with the Chief of Police and the Police-man threat, and they surrendered (3) arms shotguns and this arms were submitted to the HQ for Army use;
- (19) May 2, 1943, the Japanese Forces began their mopping out operations in the nearby barrios searching guerrillas and arms, and at this time the Japanese reached our HQ at Sto. Domingo, Tayug, Pangasinan, and burned the HQ to ashes and caught one of our enlisted men Pvt. Abdon Patero, who was tortured and maltreated and even went into the extent to maltreat him applying inhuman tortures; and inspite of of this scene the Japs had applied, our co-soldier Pvt. Patero did never tell the secrets of the HQ nor pointed any member of this command;
- (20) May 10, 1943 we were informed the Japs sent patrols in the far distant barrios and including our place of encampment and we were forced to return to the mountains to seek a better place for our HQ;
- (21) May 17, 1943 to July 2, 1943, we constructed the CHQ at Samsagan, San Nicolas, Pangasinan, and when July 4, 1943 was reached, we celebrated the INDEPENDENCE DAY OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA in said camp and a festival to honor the day was held. That due to the rigid mopping out operations in this part of this province by the Japs some of our men joined the other units to other provinces in order that they be not bothered by the smooth work of the increasing spy ring who were even invading our places. That the joining of these enlisted men to other units was acknowledged by our CO and when time for mutual resistance may come we can act again side by side, with the expected coming of the Liberation Forces.

HISTORY OF COMPANY "B"

1. Organization of Co. "B"

The men of this Company were under Lt. Antiporda. His death made these men astray for awhile, not until Captain Miguel R. Acosta took the command of all guerrillas in the Agno Sector.

Reorganization of the Regiment commanded by Captain Acosta was created as a result of the meeting at San Isidro, San Nicolas on May 12, 1942. Our outfit was then attached to the said Regiment in that day.

2. Our Area

We were ordered to take Tayug, Natividad, San Quintin, Umingan and the neighboring barrios. Our activities were mostly done in the sector carrying all orders coming from our Regimental Headquarter.

3. We harassed the enemy more than dozen times specially in the month of May, June and July when the strong force of the enemy came to occupy Tayug. The morale of the people was upheld and help them keep their faith to the Government of the United States and the Commonwealth of the Philippines of which our belief that Americans shall come to rescue us from the barbarous enemy. Collaborators, spies and other bad elements of our sector were being advised to have their faith for General MacArthur had promised to return. These acts were checked up so that peace and order were easily secured. The activities of ours continued until the liberating forces came to our sector. We continued performing our duties even if the destiny of our Brigadier General was no longer known to us.

4. Accomplishment of Co. "B"

(a) On April 14, 1942, we attacked the Japs Detachment in Tayug, Pangasinan headed by Lt. Antiporda which causes his death and Sgt. Palma. Complete text of the fight was submitted to the Regimental Headquarter.

(b) July 4th, 1942- We declared this date as a sign of our loyalty to the United States which was held in Barrio School of San Felipe, San Nicolas, Pangasinan. Our Chief Commander Miguel R. Acosta was our speaker, Lt. Montijo comes the next and others. At this period we were in a critical moment for the Japs in Binalonan, Asingan, San Mamel, Tayug, and Umingan had spied so that they came to attacked us. Due to the overflooding of the Agno River and Banila in San Quintin we were not notified in the celebration. The Japs could not go across these rivers. Other members of the Unit who were not able to attend the said occasion have celebrated in the Barrio of Lawak, Tayug. Mr. Emilio C. Naraval District Supervisor for Tayug and Santa Maria was the Guest speaker.

(c) During the last part of the year 1942, our men kept on reporting the activities, movement, and strength of the Japs to the Regimental Headquarter. Guns and ammunications were gathered from the civilians and submitted to the Head quarter at San Felipe, San Nicolas, Pangasinan.

Activities in the year 1943

(a) Sgt. Elias Caldana cut the telephone wire between Kilometer 2 and 3 to San Quintin thus cutting the communications between these town, Tayug and San San Quintin. That was February 10th, 1943. This was done to help other outfit in Umingan and San Quintin when they ambushed the tract of the Japs.

(b) Somewhere in April 1943, we help Captain Palaroan fought the Japs at San Narciso, Natividad where he was wounded and captured by the enemy.

(c) In May and June, 1943, we had to continue performing our duties to take the place of Captain Palarean as per the order of the Headquarter including Panganiban, San Narciso and Tulin which are a part of Tayug, and Natividad respectively.

(d) On August 12, 1943, our patrols killed two Japanese Patrol in Sitio Barongobong, Tayug. Upon seeing them from forcing the civilians to give them food staff our patrols with no consideration killed them.

(e) In October 1943, plans were prepared to strike the Japs in Tayug but Mayor Pedro F. Kagacan prayed to us not to continue for the sake of the civilians.

(f) During the rest of the year we campaigned for food from the loyal and rich civilians. Clothings belonging to the Army were taken from them (civilians) and were given to our men.

Year 1944.

(a) During the year 1944, we laid low as per the order coming from the General Headquarter, Australia. However reports of the activities and installations of the enemy were submitted to the Head quarter from time to time.

(b) On December we helped in the preparation of D-Day as per the instruction received from the General Headquarter,

Year 1945

(a) On January 31st, 1945 we meet the 25th Division of the 6th Army in Santa Maria. We guided American Patrols headed by Sgt. Tiger Ben Lion and company to the places of our enemies. We furnished them sketches penning the correct places of the Japs Installations, so that not long after shellings come over them which forces them (Japs) to flee in the Mountains.

(b) When the Liberating forces were fighting in Villa Verde Trail in January and February, March and April and June our men joined the Labor Bn. needed by the 32nd Infantry Division.

BRIEF H I S T O R Y.

FORMERLY NATIONAL VOLUNTEER.

1. Name of Guerrilla Organization.-- FIL-AMERICAN GUERRILLA FORCES NORTH LUZON AGNO AREA, 30th NATIONAL VOLUNTEER INFANTRY DIVISION. (FORMERLY ARMY OF THE AGNO).

2. That I being an ex-Philippine Constabulary man when the war broke out on December 8, 1941 was called to active service in the army and at the same time joined the National Volunteer with the rank of 2nd Lieut., which was already organized in Tayug under the command of F. A. Fontanilla with 384 men.

3. That during the month of December 25-26, 1941 our Army could not impede the rush advance of the enemy from the west towards east of Pangasinan and our forces retreated south up to Bataan. The said organization was demobilized and each of us joined his family and looked for shelter.

4. That on May 18, 1942, FIL-AMERICAN GUERRILLA FORCES NORTH LUZON (AGNO) AREA was formerly organized in San Isidro District, San Nicolás, Pangasinan. Earlier detachments were already organized in the most of the eastern part of the province in March 1942.

5. ORGANIZER:-- Brigadier General Miguel R. Acosta, formerly Major. I joined his command with others on 4 July 1942 carrying the same rank as I had, at the same time took oath of allegiance to the United States of America and the Commonwealth Government of the Philippines and continued resisting the enemy. On July 24, 1942, Captain Santiago Cabanizas formerly Lieut. and I, received instruction from General Acosta to organize a guerrilla unit at Guinaygayan, Tayug, Pangasinan with 200 able bodied men under our command. The following day one of our member, Abdon Fatero was tortured by the Japanese but did not reveal our movement in the place and was released after five days.

6. In August 1942, I received a written order from Major Acosta to arrest some one in Cabaritan, Umingan, Pangasinan and gave him to Lt. P. Benito, Provost Marshal of the unit at Natividad, Pangasinan for investigation.

7. On August 8, 1942 at 8:00 a. m. Lt. Santiago Cabanizas and I with others of my command proceeded to Dalupirip with ammunitions and arms for safe keeping.

8. In September 1942 at 8:00 pm, I presented my credentials to Major Charles Cushing of the 3rd Bn. 14th Infantry NL. He requested me to cooperate with him sabotaging the Japanese means of communica-

tion and impede the enemy moving troops from San Quintin and Sta. Maria to Tayug.

9. Purpose of the organization:- It aimed to demoralized and harassed the enemy and to fight for the cause championed by the United States and the Philippines and at the same time to minimize collaboration of the civilians with the Japanese Puppet; helped kept people's faith to the United States; helped maintained peace and order in the community.

10. Some members of my unit attached temporarily to other organization with the permission and fought in the front lines of the remaining members joined the liberation forces as labor battalion, delivering ammunitions and foodstuff at Villa Verde Battle area, until May 30, 1945.

11. Since then and during the duration of the Liberation campaign, men of this command had worked hard and many are still rendering services up to the present time to the different military outfits.

BRIEF HISTORY OF COMPANY "D"

As members of the Unit, we performed intelligence sabotage and mopping up operations against the enemy. Now and then, we had to hold secret meetings with the civilians since the arrival of the enemy in Tayug, Pangasinan, just to keep them in good faith with America. We had to make it clear to them by illustrations and explanations the possible meaning of the last words of General McArthur "I shall return".

From May 1942 to February 1945 we always made contact with Major Robert B. Lapham, overall Commander of all Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces, Captain Ray C. Hunt Jr., Captain Felipe T. Ortiz, Division Officer for Pangasinan Military Area, LGAF, Captain Feliciano Nobres, C.O. of 168 squadron, LGAF. We helped in furnishing these officers intelligence report and maps of Japs garrisons. We had to give them aid in the procurement of foodstuffs needed in their respective headquarters which were then transferred from place to place in San Nicolas, San Manuel, San Quintin, Matividad, Tayug and Umingan, Pangasinan. All of these activities were carried with all sincerity and good faith as we were following religiously all orders from General Miguel R. Acosta, then a Captain at that time when he took command of all guerrillas in the Agno Sector.

On 8 December 1942, when Captain Felipe T. Ortiz, liaison Officer for Pangasinan Military Area, LGAF was captured and tortured after his engagement with the Japs at Nocodan Hills in San Nicolas, Pangasinan, and where he miraculously escaped death, we brought him to our secret camp in the middle of the rice fields of barrio San Narciso, Matividad, Pangasinan, where we administered first-aid treatment. He stayed with us for a month until he had recovered from his swollen body and broken bones.

Many times during the Japanese occupation, we had to render helps to Major Robert B. Lapham and Captain Ray C. Hunt Jr. by escorting them to other places where there were no enemies.

When the American Liberating Forces landed at San Fabian on 9, January 1945, we went to meet them and it was there where we submitted our first report concerning the enemy installation and Japs movement in Pangasinan. We reported to General Swift, Commanding General of the I-Corp 6th Army and gave assistance to Captain Victor Cook, C.O. of the CIC to identify guerrilla leaders who were then sending contact men to the liberating forces.

In February 1945, we helped the 32nd Division in Tayug, Pangasinan, by carrying foodstuffs for the soldiers who were fighting against the numerous hiding Japs in the Villa Verde Trails. This was in compliance with the understanding made with Major Games of the PECAU No. 18 which was stationed in Tayug, Pangasinan. This activity persisted until the time when the Japs did not any more offer any amount of resistance.

(b) Cutting off the communication lines connected to Binalonan and Umingan (c) Destructions of bridges on the main road leading to Sainga, San Quintin and Santa Maria. (d) Chopping down the big trees along the roads as blockade to any reinforcement of the enemies coming from Binalonan Headquarters. (e) Killed one Japanese soldier fleeing from the COJUANGCO RICE MILL just at the main road to the Cadere of the Philippine Army Reservation (f) Captured a Japanese soldier alive at the Agno rice field coming from the place where they were attacked and brought him to the Villaverde Trail Camp on the same date. (g) Captured 3 Japanese trucks left by the Japanese soldiers loaded with sacks of rice, particularly (one) at the Agno Rice and (two) in the Cojuangco Rice Mill. The said trucks were later utilized for transportation facilities and loading supplies of the Guerilla force. (h) Finding out that the civilians outside the town who evacuated were very much disturbed and suffered hunger due to the lack of food, they were being advised as per order of the High Command to get their food supply either palay or clean rice in the captured granary of the Cojuangco rice Mill, free no pay!!!





BRIEF HISTORY OF "F" COMPANY

I. Organization- May 1, 1942

The members of this company were ex-service men, and civilian volunteers. The organization was effected after Captain MIGUEL R. ACOSTA, USAFFE, contacted Lt. Colonels Moses and Noble, in the house of a native by the name of Carifio, in Anzagan, Mt. Province, in March 1942.

Memo was issued by the two Colonels to Captain Acosta, that he will organize an outfit to offer a resistance movements against the Japanese. A memo was issued by the General Headquarters to all officers of this command to report immediately to the Headquarters without any further delay. After the conference we all returned home and organized our Companies. So I did.

II. Our Sector.

Our sector comprised two towns, Tayug and San Quintin. All orders coming from the General Headquarters were executed and complied by officers and men of this command.

III. Our Mission.

- a. Gather S-2 information about movement of troops, disposition, and strength of the enemy.
- b. Counteract Japanese propaganda published in the Tribune.
- c. Counsel the people in our sector not to lose faith in the UNITED STATES, and THE COMMONWEALTH GOVERNMENT, now in exile.
- d. Check the spread of collaborators, spies, and the bad elements that might create trouble, and disorder.

IV. Accomplishments.

- a. Helped procure arms and ammunitions from the civilians for the use of the unit and for the attack of the Tayug Garrison.
- b. Burning of bridges and cutting of telephone wires between Tayug and San Quintin at the eve of the attack of the Tayug Garrison and the burning of the two bridges in barrio Magallanes on the way to Sta Maria.
- c. Independence day celebration (July 4, 1942) at barrio San Isidro, San Nicolas, Pangasinan. All members of the unit were ordered to attend. Programs containing speeches and the reading of the Radio flashes were read by different members. The American and Filipino flags were unfurled, the first celebration of this kind during the occupation which commemorated the resistance against the Japanese. The Japs spied it but due to the swelling of the brooks and rivers going to San Isidro the Japanese attack failed, and the celebration succeeded. It was a two day celebration. Lieutenant Gregorio P. Montejo of the "G" Company, 14th Infantry was also present.

Our men continue to harass the enemy in our sector by burning the bridges and cutting the telephone wires.


e- These activities continued until November 1, 1942, on November 5, 1942 I transferred to the 14th Infantry.

On November 8, 1943 Lt. RUSTICO PAJELA ASSUMED THE command as acting CO of the company. The activities continued and the officers and men were intact.

SEVERIANO P, ESPERANCILLA

On October 29, 1947 1st Lt. a Bataan veteran joined our outfit. He assumed the command as acting CO of the Company and at the same time continue the work began. During the D+Day he moved out his men and executed the orders. The activities continued up to the liberation of the province and other places, NO original roster and special orders can be presented in view of the danger of holding communication that might fall into the hands of the enemy.

After my discharge from the 14th Infantry on November 30, 1945, I rejoined my company and assumed the command. Our overall commander arrived and gave us instructions, make our roster of troops, So I did.
