Lt Col Hugh L Carnahan:

1. The "2nd Blue Eagle Brigade" consisting of 5,979 members under the command of Mr. Eduarde D. Alabastro has not been favorably considered for recognition. Approximately 329 members have previously been recognized under this command, having been recognized by using U.S. Forces.

2. BASIS FOR NON-RECOGNITION:

a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. Unit operated as an intelligence unit, and their activities were slight.

b. A definite organization was not established. This was indicated by the fact that the unit originally consisted of 3 regiments and was reduced to only 2. Also personnel were inducted in the unit in late 1945.

c. Adequate records were not maintained, (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).

d. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because of desertion of personnel to join other units.

e. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.

f. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.

g. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. Commendations submitted as evidence were either individual cases, or use for the recognized portion of this unit, or were commendations of employment

3. There was no overall commander in this region and the 2nd Blue Eagle Brigade operated independently.

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "Malungay and Silangan Regiments, Malakas Division, 2nd Blue Eagle Brigade," purporting to be guerrilla organizations under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

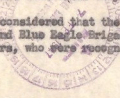
A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. A definite organization was not established.
- d. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information.)
- e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because of desertion of personnel to join other units.
- f. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- g. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.

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It is considered that the previous recognition of active combat units from the "2nd Blue Eagle Brigade," consisting of three hundred twenty-nine (329) members, who were recognized by the Commanding General, Sixth Army,

for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines, constitutes adequate and just acknowledgement of military service.

This decision on the proposed unit roster does not preclude submission for casualty recognition by those individuals who are qualified and feel justified in entering such claims. Upon request by interested individuals, appropriate forms will be forwarded.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

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REPORT ON THE MALUNGAY AND SILANGAN REGIMENTS,
MALAKAS DIVISION, 2ND BLUE EAGLE BRIGADE

In accordance with Special Order 131, U.S. Army Training Group, AFPAC, lieutenant R.L. Morton contacted the Malungay and Silangan Regiments of the Blue Eagle Command on or about 22 October 1945, in an effort to determine the desirability of recognizing these units. The undersigned officer spent the period from 22 October 1945 to 30 October 1945, in the province of Camarines Sur, investigating each battalion and headquarters of this unit separately. Further investigation was made during the period of 19 January 1946 to 18 March 1946, while the undersigned was investigating other units in this region. Contact of the Regimental Commanding Officers have recently been made in the City of Manila. The following report is a summary of the findings of the investigation and is the basis for the recommendation.

ALLEGED HISTORY

The "Malakas Division, 2nd Blue Eagle Brigade" was organized in December 1943, in the town of Naga, Camarines Sur. It originally consisted of one regiment, called the Malungay Regiment under the command of Jesus A. Villasenor. In February 1944, a representative was sent to Manila to contact Edward D. Alabastro, Military Commander of the Blue Eagle, who ^{allegedly} had contact with GHQ, STPA. After a conference with the Manila Headquarters in July 1944, the Malungay Regiment became the Blue Eagle Malungay Regiment, and continued its operations under the Blue Eagle Headquarters. In view of the fact that the organization had no arms the activities

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were confined solely to intelligence, of which periodic monthly reports were submitted to Manila.

Later in the year 1944, the Blue Eagle in Camarines Sur expanded, and two more regiments were formed, namely, the Ibarra and the Silangan Regiments. The Silangan Regiment was made up of railroad employees, and their activities were devoted to intelligence and sabotage.

In December 1944, the Blue Eagle contacted Major Russel D. Barros (now Lt. Col) and they coordinated their activities with Barros. Barros had given the Blue Eagle fifty (50) rifles, and demolition equipment, and thus the activities of the unit had expanded to include demolition, sabotage, intelligence and harrasing the enemy.

Upon the arrival of the United States Army Forces in the Bicol Region, the Blue Eagle claims to have given support to the 158 RCT, and to the 1st Cavalry. For their assistance, three companies were recognized with a total strength of three hundred twenty nine (329) officers and enlisted men. After the recognition of the mentioned units the remainder of the Malakas Division, ^{2nd} Blue Eagle Brigade was disbanded.

FINDINGS

a. The "2nd Blue Eagle Brigade" was originally investigated during the period from 22 October 1945 to 30 October 1945, and a report was rendered, but was misplaced along the channels for approval. The undersigned was again assigned to investigate units in Bicol, during the month of February and March 1946, and while in the region a further investigation of the 2nd Blue Eagle Brigade was conducted. Upon returning to Manila, the undersigned contact-

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ed Captain Villasenor, ~~regimental commander~~ ^{Commanding Officer} of the Malungay Regiment; Mr. Serranilla, Commanding Officer of the Silangan Regiment; and some ~~of the~~ ^{of the heads} ~~members~~ ^{of this unit.}. Again a report was submitted on or about 25 July 1946, but again the report was mislaid. All in all approximately three hundred fifty (350) persons, ~~of which were~~ ^{including} regimental commanders, battalion commanders, the overall commander, key officers and enlisted men, civilians, and members of other guerrilla units were contacted and questioned.

To comply with the Table of Organization, the Malakas Division, ^{2nd} Blue Eagle Brigade, had been reduced to two regiments, namely the Malungay Regiment, and the Silangan Regiment. The members of the former Ibarra Regiment ~~were~~ ^{were} absorbed by both regiments.

Upon investigating the Malakas Division, ^{2nd} Blue Eagle Brigade, it was found that the various regiments making up the unit operated more or less separately. There was also a verbal conflict and misunderstanding between the Regimental Commanders of the two regiments, for each claimed that the other had done very little work.

Upon interviewing Captain Jesus A. Villasenor, who was appointed the Commanding Officer of the 2nd Camarines Sur Sector, by Major Barros, he stated that the Silangan Regiment had not participated in sabotage or harrassing activities, and that the intelligence submitted by them was not reliable nor was it submitted periodically,

A definite organization was not established and ~~but~~ many members of the unit were also members of other guerrilla units operating in this territory. This fact was also indicated and

~~the~~ the investigating officer was informed by reliable sources that the Blue Eagle Command in the Bicol~~x~~ was inducting personnel into each unit as late as September 1945.

Upon investigating the members of the unit it was found that the members had not devoted their entire efforts to military activity in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations. A rotation system was used by the most active members, ~~and~~ *It was disclosed that* approximately thirty-five percent of the members continuously ~~stayed~~ *stayed* at home, ~~until called for a special assignment~~ *on a so called "pull-over" and where activities were null, where as the remainder were employed on a part time basis and of the same time carrying on their* ~~ment~~ *business projects*. Many were employed in the buy and sell ~~and others~~ *projects* and others were employed by the Japanese. Most members of the Silangan Regiment were former employees of the Manila Railroad and they continued their ~~employment~~ *paid* during the Japanese occupation.

The Silangan Regiment claims to have been attached to the 1279th Engineer Combat Bn for operations, (Inclosure 1), but upon questioning the regimental commanders ~~of both regiments~~ *of both regiments*, the investigating officer obtained signed statements from them in regards to the status of this claim. The Regimental Commander of the Silangan Regiment states that the members were employed by the Luzon Military Railroad and were paid from 1 May 1945 on, ~~whereas~~ *whereas* the Regimental Commander of the Malungay Regiment states that the members employed by the 1279th Engineer Combat Battalion were the same members as those recognized and inducted into the Philippine Army. Other letters of commendation were received from the 1279th Engineer Combat Battalion, but these concerned individuals and of their employment with the Engineer Battalion, ~~for which they were paid, and do not constitute a claim for recognition.~~ *for which they were paid, and do not constitute a claim for recognition.*

part time basis and of the same time carrying on their civilian occupation.

b. There is no doubt that some of the members were employed by the 1279th Engineer Combat Battalion, but the recognition of three hundred twenty nine (329) members constitutes adequate and just acknowledgement of military service.

Jesus A. Villasenor, regimental commander of the Malungay Regiment, and an ex-USAFPE Officer, was quite active as an individual, for not only was he the regimental commander of this regiment, but was also appointed Commanding Officer, 2nd Camarines Sur Sector, by Major Russell D. Barros, on 14 March 1945. Major Russell D. Barros was assigned, by Col. Anderson, to the Bicol Region in April 1944, to contact and unify the guerrilla in this region. His mission failed, and he began intelligence operations for the USAFFE. Again, on 12 March 1945, Barros was ordered to unify and command the guerrilla units of Camarines Sur, and in his attempt he divided the province into two sectors, and appointed Jesus Villasenor as Commanding Officer, 2nd Camarines Sur Sector. Again Barros' mission failed, for there was never unification of guerrilla units in Bicol or in any of the provinces of Bicol Region. Villasenor, was more or less a liaison officer, in his attempt to coordinate the guerrillas. In a meeting with Major (now Lt. Col) Barrios, he highly recommended Jesus A. Villasenor, but had little to say for the Blue Eagle.

The supporting papers presented, consisting of intelligence reports to Barros, commendation from the 1279th Engineer Battalion, which have been previously explained, information papers

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from Barros, addressed either to "all guerrilla units,"
or Jesus A. Villasenor; Commanding Officer, 2nd Camarines
Sur Sector; and orders to the various units from Villasenor
when he was acting Commanding Officer, 2nd Camarines Sur
Sector.

*There was no overall commander of the guerrilla units
in this region, for there was never a successful unification*

In that insufficient evidence was presented in support
of any further recognition, and also that the members of this
unit had not devoted their entire efforts to military activity,
it is concluded that the members of this unit worthy of re-
cognition have been recognized with the above mentioned re-
cognition, with the exception of Captain Jesus A. Villasenor,
~~and~~ *It is recommended* that he, Villasenor be recognized as a major, and includ-
ed in the roster of the United States Philippine Island Forces,
Guerrilla Headquarters, Camarines Sur (Kalayaan Command). This
recognition is based on his activities as a guerrilla coordin-
ator and a liaison officer for Lt. Col. Barros, and his activi-
ties as Commanding Officer of the 2nd Camarines Sur Sector.
It must be kept in mind that the 2nd Camarines Sur Sector had
not existed as a unit, but was the name given to a certain
sector in which Villasenor commanded. The United States Phil-
ippine Island Forces, Guerrilla Headquarters, Camarines Sur,
(Kalayaan Command) was a unit directly under the control of
Lt. Col. Barros, and the recommendations are for ^{Villasenor's} ~~his~~ activities ~~for Barros~~ rather than the activities of the Malungay Regiment,
Malakas Div., 2nd Blue Eagle Brigade. The period of recognition
should be from 12 March 1945, the time in which he was appointed

of the various guerrilla units.

POLITICAL ASPECTS

The unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or as aspirations, but Edwardo D. Alabastro, Blue Eagle Military Commander, is ~~greatly~~^{deeply} involved in politics, and when the members of the subject unit were assembled for the investigation he used such opportunities for political speeches.

RECOMMENDATIONS

After careful consideration of the statements made by the present members and an analysis of the documents presented, it is recommended that, with the exception of those members previously recognized, the "Silangan and Malungay Regiments, Malakas Division Blue Eagle Brigade," be not favorably considered for recognition, ~~But~~^{that} Captain Jesus A. Villasenor, O-1277 be recognized as Major from 12 March 1943 to 14 May 1945, and be included in the roster of the United States Philippine Island Forces, Guerrilla Headquarters, Camarines Sur, (Kalayaan Command).



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

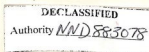
