Dear Mrs. Abila:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Givillan Operatives (MIS), purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition an attenuate of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General Meachthur during the liberation of the Fhilippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After coreful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of winesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- e. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of emiliates of joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- e. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- f. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- a. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part the basis only.

#### REPORT ON " CIVILIAN OPERATIVES (MTS)"

- 1. On 30 January 1947, 2nd Lieut. James R. Benton, exemined the request for recognition and the records of Civilian Operatives (MIS).
  - 2. ALLEGED HISTORY: See attached unit file.
  - 3. FINDINGS:
- a. It was not necessary to interview any persons during this investigation.
- b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. It is true that there is contained in the attached unit file a letter from Major General R, Jelandoni, PA, recommending favorable consideration for Mrs. Raymunda Abile's unit; however, it must be noted that this is all of the supporting evidence that was submitted to this office along with the subject unit's request for recognition and the attached rostems, the opinion of the investigating officer that the above mentioned letter is not, within itself, sufficient acceptable evidence to substantiate the unit's record of service.
- c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy because they were not organized for that purpose. It was a citilian organization.
- d. A definite organization was not established because this was a civilian organization and was never organized for military purposes.
- e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its commanding officer because she was errested by the Japanese on 19 July 1942, and was confined in Fort Santiago for the subsequent eight (8) months and thereine widence to the effect that her unit conformed to the five besic points/required for recognition either before, during or after she was in prison.
- f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization because neither the commanding officer nor her subordinates ddd showed any outstanding achievement accomplished during the occupation or submitted any definite evidence tending to establish resistance against the Japanese.
- g. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. There are no members worthy of recognition and the unit suffered no casualties.
- 4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: The unit apparently has no political affiliations or aspirations.
- 5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Civilian Operatives, (MIS), be not favorably considered for recognition.
