Mendaluyong, Rizal Dear Mr. Garcia:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Maybunga Unit, Fil-American, Hunters ROTC Guerrillas, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine arms.

- A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:
- Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. Rank of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained.
- e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders because its commanding officer was emplayed by the Japanese authorities.
- f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- g. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.

h. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of civilian pursuits, and assisted the guarrilla unit on a part time basis only.

It is considered that the provious recognition of approximately 3,760 officers and men from the Higuel-Ver Regiment, Hunters ROZD, who were recognized by the Commanding General, APUMDPAC, for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgment of military services.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 68. Commonwealth of the Philippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

1. The Maybungs Unit, Fil-American, Runters ROTC Guerrillas, consisting of 35 men, has not been favorably considered, 3,750 men have previously been recognized with the Miguel-Ver Roginant, Sunters ROTC a composite unit of the overall command. This is an initial investigation.

This unit does not fulfil the requirements of the five basic points for recognition. See attached Team Lander's Report.

4. All worthy members have been recognized, and casualty rosters have been submitted. It is recommended that the casualties in this unit roster be not favorably considered for recognition.

Report on "Maybunga Unit, Fil-American Hunters ROTC Guerrillas"

- 1. 1st Lt Kenneth H Neubauer proceeded to Mandaluyong, Rizal on 20 May 1947 to investigate the Maybunga Unit, Fil-American Hunters ROTC Guerrillas.
 - 2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached Unit File)
 - 3. FINDINGS:
- a. The following person was interviewed and his statements are reflected in the findings:

Honorio A. Garcia Unit C. O.

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The Maybunga Unit, Fil-American, Hunters ROTC was nothing more than a group of "Homeguards" (Incl #1, page 3) who claim to have rendered aid to active guerfila units. The alleged activities engaged in by this unit were to gather information on Japanese activities in the barrio of Maybunga, Rizal, to inform residents of this barrio about the progress of the war against the enemy, and to bolster the morale of the local population. Capt Honorio Garcia, the organizations alleged CO, stated that his unit engaged in these activities on a "part time" basis during the occupation. Their main efforts were employed in their civilian occupations. These alleged are the civilian occupations. These alleged evidence do not consist of bona fide guerrilla action. None of the members of the unit were armed therefore they were at the mercy of the Japanese garrison in the area. When Capt Garcia was asked for the original copies of affidavits in the unit file he stated they were stolen from his home. It seems very strange that copies of orders and affidavits from guerrilla leaders should be taken from Garcia's home. Capt Garcia was employed by the Japanese government in March 1943 to work for the "Manila Shinbunsya", a Japanese propaganda publication. This job was taken in order to increase his "espionage" activities according to Capt Garcia. It is the opinion of the investigating officer that this affiliation with the Japanese authorities would decrease Garcia's efforts in the guerrilla movement since he was under surveillance at all times. It also is a clear indication he could not devote his entire effort towards the guerrilla movement. Throughout the entire unit history, Capt Garcia refers to "I" and "ME" (Incl 1). Apparently he was the only active member of this unit. It is apparent to the investigating officer that Capt Garcia is primarily interested in gaining recognition

for himself, and simply added some names to a roster to have some semblance of an organization. When asked about attachment to American forces, Garcia said his unit had never been attached to the liberating forces. No evidence of any type could be submitted to substantiate the claims of guerrilla activity during the liberation. When questioned about his affiliation with Hunters ROTC he stated that they had joined the Hunters ROTC in January 1944. He also stated, that many men in his unit are in the composite unit of Hunters ROTC. Two members marked by an "X" (Incl 3) have been recognized with the Miguel-Ver Regiment. Members marked by a "check" mark (Incl 3) are included in the casualty rosters of Hunters ROTC. When asked about other casualties of his unit, Garcia stated he didn't know if they were on the composite roster of Hunters ROTC unit or not. It is believed that this unit is not a guerrilla organization, but simply a group of civilians who call themselves such. The claimed activities of the unit, even if true, would not warrant the unit guerrilla recognition. It is also apparent that the unit CO. Honorio Garcia, is mainly interested in gaining recognition for himself. Since this unit is a part of Hunters ROTC, their overall commander, Col Adevoso, has already retracted any claim they may have had for recognition. The recognition of the Miguel-Ver Regt. took care of the deserving members of the Hunters ROTC. (See Incl. #2).

- c. Unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field. The members of this unit lived at their homes in the barrio of Maybunga and did not engage in activities against the Japanese in the field.
- d. Activities did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy. The activities of this unit which consisted of propaganda and intelligence work were strictly passive in nature and do not warrant guerrilla recognition.
- e. A definite organization was not established. The CO was employed by the Japanese so was unable to devote his time to guerrilla activities.
- f. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders. The commanding officer as an employee of the Japanese government did not have the opportunity to retain control of his unit, nor engage in guerrilla activities.
- g. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization. Activities claimed by this unit are not guerrilla activities. None of the members of the unit were armed therefore they could not actively engage the Japanese.
 - 4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: This unit does not appear to have

5. BECOMMEMATIONS: It is recommended that with the exception of those 3,760 members previously recognized, in the Miguel Ver Regisent, Hunters 8070; that the Marybus Tutt, Filaberican, Hunters 8070 Geerfillas consisting of 35 members be not favorably considered for recognition.

1. History of Organization

It was in the mid part of 1943 that the first step which ultimately terminated in the combination of the members of the Fil American Guerrillas and the R.O.T.C. Hunters in Barrio Maybunga, Pasig, Rizaltook place. The working as the Tribune provincial Correspondent am circums times forced me to live withing family in Pacing Barrio Maybunga which was my birth place. It was at that time that gettin contact with the victorio Montejo, which was at that time only a corporal in the Hunters. (His appointment shown to me by him certify to that.) The confidential intercourse between Montejo and T) was an out growth of the friendship which sprang between his father, Eulalio Montejo, a Naval Veteran of World War I and pensioneer of the US Navy, and at that time appointed District President of the Jap-sponsored Neighborhood Association. The Older Montejo appointed a district secretary and his righthand in the association. Cpl. Montejo was likewise appointed leader of a neighborhood group in the barrio. It was our frequent contacts regarding the N.A. affairs that sowed the seed which bore the fruit of our fast ing the N.A. STATES that sowed the seed which Date She First to Gut friendship and bound us together on our common effort for the guerrillas sake. After Cpl. Norteje knew that Twas a Cartain of the Fil American (I showed him my appointment paper) he frequently seeked my advices regarding him and the rest of his companions underground activities. Likewies it was thru Cpl. Norteje that Tjeans to know and come in contact with the sest of the members of the N.O.T.C. Hunters in the in contact with the Pest of the Emenders of the M.U.T.C. Hunters in the barrio. It was those mutual understandings and confidentialities between the R.O.T.C. Guerrillas and myself that made those guerrillas members, of the berrio to regarding as their virtual leader. (It is probably due to the fact that (I) he is the Highest rating among the guerrilla in the sector and the R.O.T.C. Hunters immediate superiors, Capt. Ben Isagani and Capt. "Baggie" were xixxxx most of the time in the mountain.

This position of leadership in the barrio combination was further strenghtened when a circular from the Hunters-Fil American Guerrillas Field HQ dated 26 January 1944 came to our hand thru 1st Sgt. Arsenio Cruz, Hunter, deceased, and signed by Col. Terry Magtanggol, the perti-ment portion of which is as follows:-

"5. For your information the Fil American Guerrillas has fused unconditionally with the Hunters. Its news isn't it? Amd that is adding some 50,00 officers and men to our rosters more than that we are now the biggest guerrilla organization in the whole of Luzpn. Danding Manahan fused with us too. They really are coming to us. "(I have in my position the original copy) (riginal, attached)

It was the member of this barrio guerrilla combination that gave a futile battle against the Japanese that rape and burn Barrio Maybunga on February 13, 1945 resulting the death of 2 Japanese soldiers, the same unit that helped ferry the refugees of the barrio on the other side of the Marikina River, and guided them to the Macrican lines, Indukastin the control of the co 14, 1945. III. Activities from Period covering Sept. 1943 to January 1945

About March, 1943, after Major L. Edyisca of my plan which he duly approved attach myself with the TVT Publications, then renamed by the Japanese Military Administration, The Manila Shinhymaya, for the purpose of acquiring the personal identification pass which would help me very greatly in my movements around Manila and in Rizal Frovince, (Dwas employed by the publication as Frovincial Correspondent to cover the Frovince of Rizal upon the strength of my previous pre-war connection in the same capacity and recommendation of Roberto Villanueva, pre-war Provincial Editor and during the Japanese regime, an associate editor of

On the early part of September, 1943, Major L. Edyisca handed me my new appointment dated September 1, 1943 raising me to the rank of Captain with orders to intensify the campaign for membership and to wark on <u>earlonage</u>.

The identification pass supplied me by the Editorial Office of the Manila Simbunsya helped me very much in my movemovements and allow me to retry plenty of strictly guarded places and military installations. The informations () gathered in my undegground activities were duly reported to Major L. Edyisca, verbally.

Outstanding among my accounter-espionage works were !-

(1) Reports on the Japs Military works being done at

Nelson Airfields at Makati.

(2) Reports on the transfer of aviation parts, foodstuffs, and ammunition from the Wise Bidg. and Bagaar Siglo XX Bidg. in Binondo to places in San Juan, Rizal and the Laloma Cabaret which were later successfully destroyed by American warplanes. (These informations were supplied to me by 5/Bgt. Dominador Santos of my Command.)

(3) Helped Col. Pamintuan of the Ramsey Guerrillas to enlightened the people of the news being published by the

Free Philippines, and underground publication.

(4) Personal counter-propaganda by convincing the people of the lies being daily published by the Manila Sinbunsya regarding Japanese military and naval victories. (The identification pass again proved to be very good instrument in these conter propaganda works.) Eack up by the papers showing me to be a member of the editorial staff, (1) can easily convince

about of the said Sergeant for the whole day and reached up to Grace Park, Caloocan, in search of him, but failed. We returned to Barrio Maybunga, the same night. At about 3 0' clock in the morning of February 13, the Japanese Forces begin the Rape of Bario Maybunga and the burning of Pasig. Without arms, all that we could do was to guide the barrio folks from Rosario, Maybunga and Caniogan of the route to take in the evacuation and to help them in their plight. Bancas and anything that float were used by the guerrilleros to ferry the people to the other side of the river.

Upon reaching Wak Wak behind the American lines, we were told by the American soldiers to herd the refugees at the Argneta Bldg. and to stay there for the night.

In the morning of February 14, my unit arrested two Taiwanese deserters moving freely among the barrio folks and they were turned over to the Mandaluyon guerrillas. A member of my command (Pablo de Guzman) turned over to me) identification papers and Japanese writings which he took from a dead Japanese officer in Barric Maybunga, and these (I)turned over to the sentry guarding the Hq of Major Davies at Wak Wak Golf Club.

That same morning while (I) was in the process of investigating 3 men, charged by Lt. Victorio Montejo of being pro-Jap in the private chapel of the Aranets Bldg., a bobby-trap exploded right inside the chapel where (I) was conducting the in investigation, causing the death of Lt. Victorio Monteio. Pvt. Pablo de Guzman, and the burning of myself and the burning and injury of almost the members of my command as well as many refugees which the Emergency Hospital in Mandaluyon can verified in their records.

It is my injury that compel me desist in meactivation in the Army. I recovered partly from the burn on April and on the 1st mf May I was employed in the 313th Gen. Hospital. U. S. Army Medical Corps and stayed there until them I resigned on October to open a photographic studio.



Dear weeks

However, if she's really and actually 'a phantom of delight', why I won't blame you, and by the way reports are coming in... and preally must be a peach. Good Luck to you buddy... and more power to you!

How about you coming up and seeing me sometime? How I teng to see your familiar mmg again. and if you can tag the pretty one along...why, I wont have any objection. I really am dying to see you..first for sentimental reasons...and secondly..for official reasons. There are plenty of thigs that we should talk about.

You pretty well know the proximity of the much awaited hour. We've got to step up with o'r plans of operations...intelligence and combat...so the zero hour will not find us cock-eyed. At this hour of near triumph, what we need is more action and more results. At present, I am getting headway in the organization of a Hunters Central General Staff that shall plan and administrate over the Hunters and the Marking's Guerrillas as well.

In Marking's Guerrillas, they need officers with broad vision and technical knowledge to do the reorganization of the outfit for them and also plan their zero hour actions. I unselfishly offerred the help of the Eunters Staff in this matter during our conference. I am also due for a conference with the Eukhalahaps with Andersons, and the rest of the Fil Amers. I have the wistful hope of seeing all these different units geared together before zero hour. Now, the Marking's and the Eunters stand side by side, each a separate organization and maintaining its own organizational integrity...but the Eunters Staff acting as a cort of a bond between them.as Yay says... The Hunters shall inject the quality that is his in his own right...into the quantity of "arking's... We have only 15,000 men while they have 36,000 men (they say). We had tried to put down our cultistments to a low number but a quality one.

In the past, guerrilla actions the enemy was almost feelhardy and swicidal. It represented the fighting qualities and determination of the Filipines. Now these unification moves stand proof to the maturity of the Filipines as a distinct nationality.

'I shall be waiting for you on or ore New Year's day.
I shall answer for all your transportation exponess by the time you arrive in camp.'

Well, well ... this is a big war we are fighting ... a war

that requires total effort ... if victory is to be achieved.

Finally...Brother Hunter...here's a bit of advices No matter how good or bad news come to you...no matter how logically or palpably false they are....what m. rs is that we are THOUSANDS...INDIVISIBLE...UNCONQUERABLE! Sit tight...and do something still. Sometimes contacts may be brokens..Do not get discouraged! Remember always that you are there somewhere.and that we are always here somewhere. No matter what happens....
CARRY ON! As the world rolls on to its cleaner future...we shall roll along with it..and stay longer a while yet. Let us stick around and enjoy the fun. When sometimes, the sufferings is to hard almost not to be endured anymore...! just look at yourself in the mirror.and marvel, "My God..so I'm still alive! If I had lasted this longs...I can last a little longer yet". Let us all be among the present at the Luneta at Victory Parade...looking back at all that happened.

Well, darling...here's Good Lack to you. I need your younger brother here at HQ as ...well...anything. Gould you take along anybody who can devote their whole time in this work of ours? We are forming this outfit now into an army...shaping it as an army and..then whipping it into discipline.
