Dear Mr. de Dios:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Engineer Corps. Bulacan Military District, ECLGA, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned belows

a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.

b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.

c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.

d. A definite organization was not established.

e. Adequate records were not maintained (names. ranks, dates of enlistment of joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).

f. Rank of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained in the field.

The number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, waitempessive and not reasonably proportionate to the United States Army or to pre-war Philippine army tables of organization.

h. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders.

i. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of acti-

It is desired to emphasize that each claimant member of the unit is considered to have had just and adequate appraisal for recognition when his services were evaluated concurrently with this study of the unit with which he claims membership. Individual requests were not necessary nor appropriate then, or now, as their acceptance would in effect constitute unjustified duplication of consideration of one individual by this headquarters. However, this does not preclude submission for casualty recognition by those individuals who are qualified and feel justified in entering such claims. Upon request by interested individuals, appropriate forms will be forwarded.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 68, Commonwealth of the Phillippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

## REPORT ON THE ENGINEER CORPS, BULACAN MILITARY DISTRICT, ECLGA

29 May 1947

- 1. Lt Bruce Bromley Jr, after a thorough study of the unit file of the Engineer Corps, BMD, ECIGA, deemed a field investigation unnecessary and submits the following report herewith for approval.
  - 2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)
  - 3. FINDINGS: .
- a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

- b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. Evidence submitted to this head-quarters consists of a roster and a certification from 1st lt W. M. Jackson, CE, C Co., 117th Engr. Bn. to the effect that de Dios, the commanding officer, and another from his unit "cooperated with the 117th Engineers in the areas north of Manila". No other records were forwarded by the subject unit to this headquarters.
- c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the problem of the died in opposition to the enemy. The presence of other, recognized units in the area precludes the possibility of active maintenance in the field of the subject unit. From the BhD, under the overall command of Col Ramsey, three battalions out of each ofganized regiment have been recognized, including the command staff of this particular area. It is not possible that another deserving unit in the same area remains unrecognized with the present condition of recognition.
- d. A definite organization was not established by the unit. The roster submitted for consideration contains the names of 19 members conforming to no existing tables of organization, past or present. The ranks of the members are not commensurate with the actual size of the command.
  - e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate

control by its commanding officer. There are no allegations that might possibly support any rejutation of this statement.



- 1. The undersigned was the Deputy Commander of the East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area in 1943 and as such had the power and authority to organize guerrilla units and appoint officers and enlisted men under the over-all command of them Major Edwin R. Ramsey.
- 2. That in December 1943 the undersigned was the Commanding Officer of the Combat Fores in the Province of Bulacan with the aggregate strength of approximately three combat battalions.
- 3. The following officers, namely, Lt Col Jose de la Rosa, Lt Col Ulpiano Trillana, Lt Col Maráno Exaltacion, Lt Col Narciso Garcia, Lt Col Sebstian Tomacruz, Col Pedro Viudez, Lt Col Enriques Viudez, Lt Col Virgilio Enriques, Lt Col Adonais F. Maclang, Major Servendo Santos were all inducted by the undersigned and further, Major Manuel Vergel de Dios, an engineer and others under his command, were inducted for guerrilla service in Bulewan.
- 4. This is to certify what the unit of Major Manuel Vergel de Dios was an element of the combat forces under the undersigned and that they had stayed in the mountains of Bulacan fighting the enemy.
- 5. That in February 1945 when Bulacan was liberated the unit under Major Manuel Vergel de Dios was attached to the 117th Engr Combat Bn, Co "A", and subsequently released 26 March 1945
- 6. That in view of the services of the above named officers and the enlisted men under them, they have all been recognized except the unit of Major Manuel Vergel de Dios which, in justice to him and his men, should be recognized.
