REPORT ON "COMPANY G, STA CRUZ
SECTOR, MAGSAYSAY'S FORCES, ZAMBALES
MILITARY DISTRICT (ZMD)

In accordance with verbal instructions from Chief of Section Guerrilla Affairs, G-3, AFWESTPAC, Lieutenant Morris S. Flory on 6 July 45 proceeded to Sta Cruz, Zamboales to contact the "Sta. Cruz Sector, Squadron A, Magsaysay's Forces, Zamboales Military District (ZMD) in order to determine whether or not this organization should be recognized by the United States Army. The following report is a summary of the investigation and basis for the recommendation.

ALLEGED HISTORY

The following history is actually a report of the Malona Sector since all members of Company G, Sta Cruz Sector are from Malona and were formerly a part of the Malona Sector. The unit is in no way connected with the Sta Cruz Sector.

The Malona sector was first organized in 1943 under Hunter's ROTC with Captain Manuel Barretto as Commander. The unit at the beginning of the organization consisted of approximately 165 members, their activities at this time being primarily concerned with the protection of civilians and helping American, English and Dutch refugees. In 1944 the unit had engagements with rustlers and also originated an intelligence unit, relaying reports to the Headquarters of "Hunters ROTC" at Subic. About the middle of 1944 they came in contact with Col Merrill of the Luzon Guerrilla Forces (LGF) coordinated with his unit and from then on their reports were relayed to Merrill.

In October 1944 when news reports of American Army progress reached Merrill he gave orders for units to harass the Japanese and to fire on them outside the barrios and towns.

After the landing of the American Forces 29 January 1945 in Pangasinan the Japs retreated South toward Malona and were there contacted by part of the Malona Sector. Parts of the unit became attached to the 151st Infantry in Bololan, while other members of Malona Sector were assigned their areas for patrolling.

When the 595th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion returned to Sta Cruz Zamboales they took with them 1 officer and forty eight (48) enlisted men from the Malona Sector and used them as security guards at Sta Cruz for the 15th Reporting Platoon, Company, G, 595th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion from 7 April 1945 until 25 August 1945 at which time the men were released from duty.

Except for their attachment to the above named unit, the Company, G, Sta Cruz Sector, was not active as a military unit, either before or after the American landings on Luzon.

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FINDINGS

Upon investigation it was found that, according to letter of certification signed by 1st Lieutenant Carl F. Kohl, of the 595th Signal AW Bn, Company G, Sta Cruz Sector, Squadron A, Magsaysay's Guerrilla Forces, Zambales Military District consisting of 1 officer and forty - eight (48) enlisted men was attached as a security guard to the 15th Reporting Platoon, Company "C" 595th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion from 7 April 1945 to 25 August 1945.

Although members of subject unit are from Maloma and were formerly part of the Maloma Sector they went with the 595th Signal AW Bn to Sta Cruz and remained on duty with that unit until disbanded.

When 1st Lieutenant Carl F. Kohl made letter of attachment he referred to subject unit as Company G, Sta Cruz Sector, because that is where they were located.

It is believed that outside of the time Co G was attached to the 595th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion at Sta Cruz for the period from 7 April to 25 August 1945, they were not actively engaged against the Japanese.

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POLITICAL ASPIRES

It is apparent that there were many aspirants to political jobs in this territory and members changed units frequently according to where ever the best deal was promised.

RECOMMENDATIONS

After careful consideration of the statements made by the present members and an analysis of the documents presented, it is recommended that one (1) officer and forty eight (48) enlisted men on the roster of Company G, Sta Cruz Sector, Nagayway's Forces, Zamboles Military District be favorably recommended for recognition for their period of attachment to the 5th Reporting Platoon, Company "C", 595th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion for the period from 7 April 1945 to 25 August 1945.
