REFERENCE YOUR SPECIAL NR 12:

ALL EMERGENCY CURRENCY PRINTED PRIOR TO 01 SEPTEMBER 1943 IS COVERED BY COMPLETE RECORDS MAILED YOU IN NOVEMBER THAT SAME YEAR. BETWEEN 01 NOVEMBER 1943 AND 30 SEPTEMBER 1944, 11,321,475 PESOS ONLY WERE PRINTED IN LANA O AND AGUSAN. OF THAT AMOUNT, 10,862,031 PESOS AND 20 CENTAVOS WERE ADVANCED TO USFIP. 1,459,443.80 PESOS WERE EXPENDED BY COMMONWEALTH GOVERNMENT.

SINCE 01 OCTOBER 1944, 4,166,650 PESOS ONLY WERE PRINTED IN ZAMBOANGA. 3,730,165 PESOS WERE ADVANCED TO THE USFIP. 435,000 WERE EXPENDED BY CIVIL GOVERNMENT.

**To: The Commander in Chief, Japanese Military Forces in the Philippines,
Field Marshal, Count Teruzuki.**

On the 26th day of December 1941 to the end that the City of Manila, as an open and undefended city and its civil population right, under the rules and customs of war, be spared the violence and destruction of air bombardment, as Commander in Chief of the forces engaged in defense of the Philippines, I withdraw from the City all military personnel and removed therefrom, neutralized, or destroyed all military installations, munitions and other stores requisite to the prosecution of war.

The Japanese forces now occupying the City of Manila have extensively fortified the same. They have killed therein military personnel in large numbers and have established storage depots throughout the center of the city for the deposit of ammunition, fuel, and other military supplies, utilizing for such purpose churches, schools, office buildings, and private dwellings. Such military dispositions are in complete disregard of the historic practice among military commanders to afford the full measure of protection to such civil edifices and surrounding non-combatants as the military situation reasonably will permit. All such installations are legitimate military objectives of our offensive action and yet due to the location thereof their destruction is impossible without accompanying disaster to surrounding civil communities.

That the City of Manila, its historic and cultural monuments and civil populace may be spared the destruction inevitably to result from our direct attack upon such military objectives, I now call upon you to take action paralleling that taken by me in reference. Acceptance by you of the humanitarian principles

involved shall cause me to suspend operations against your military installations in the City of Manila for such reasonable period as may be necessary to permit their removal, neutralization, or destruction, and the evacuation of your military forces to without the city limits. Its rejection will compel me, from considerations of military necessity, to subject such military installations to attack with maximum violence until their complete destruction has been accomplished. In such eventuality you shall bear full responsibility for the unavoidable loss of civilian life and destruction of surrounding public and private property incident to such military operations.

Failure to state your position on this matter within _____ days from and after issuance of this call upon you shall be construed by me as its rejection and offensive operations will proceed accordingly.

1. Recommendation contained in attached message from the C.C. 6th Military District appears to have merit.

2. With each medical supply shipment to the Philippines instructions have been dispatched concerning the use of such drugs as those of the sulfa group, but the proper dissemination of such instructions throughout the areas concerned is impossible. It is believed desirable that all available means of communication be utilized with a view to bringing at least the doctors in the several areas of the Philippines reasonably abreast of modern medical progress in the treatment of diseases common to the Philippines, i.e. dysentery, malaria, beri-beri, worms, tropical ulcers, etc for most of which specific medicines are being sent in in increasing quantities.

3. To accomplish this purpose a few minutes on the broadcast and a page or two in FREE PHILIPPINES might be devoted to great advantage. To be effective such instructions as are given should be simplified.
