- 1. Fertig on the spot, recommends promotion of Lt. Col. Manzano. Col. Manzano is a regular army officer and is favorably known in this Headquarters. We expect to use him for LUZON developments. I recommend his promotion.
- a. Re Para 2: The extent of comrage of friendly organizations and of enemy activity in Luzon is only generally known to us. It is certain that anti-Jap units are operating there. Manzano knows them. Manzano's contacts with ROXAS and LIM further indicate his usefulness to us on Luzon. Major Villamor's reliable information on airfields, installations, etc, came from Manzano,
- b. Re Para 3: Fertig has decentralized his intelligence activities to his regimental commanders. Fertig and Manzano are now on the Agusan River. Manzano's contribution to Mindanao intelligence activities would be slight compared to what he could do on Luzon.
- c. Re Para 4: G-2 Revised General Intelligence Plan recommends strongly that Manzano be placed with Major Smith. Major Smith is now on Samar but it is likely that he will move to Luzon when necessity dictates, and Col. Manzano would move with him. There is no question about Col. Manzano's or his agent's ability to move about. Major Cruz went into Manila even after the Japanese knew of his presence in the islands.
 - d. Re Para 5: Same as Para 4 above.
- e. Re Para 6: Col. Manzano had done considerable work, according to both Major Villamor and Col. Fertig, and his Bataan performances would entitle him to promotion. The fact that he is now an emissary from Roxas and Lim further has established his bona fides.
 - 2. Recommend that Lt. Col. Manzano be promoted to grade of Colonel.
- 3. Col. Manzano on 14 April in message to Fertig was appointed to direct procurement of intelligence on Luzon. If the General Intelligence Plan is approved, the appointment of Manzano as director of intelligence procurement on Luzon will be implemented and he will be instructed substantially according to the message proposed as Enclosure 5 to the General Intelligence Plan.

1. Attached message recommends that Lieut. Colonel Narcisco L. MANZANO be promoted to the grade of Colonel.

- 2. MANZANO arrived at FERTIG's headquarters on 18 March. He submitted an interesting report on general conditions in Central IUZON but nothing of any great value from an intelligence standpoint. (Fertig's messages 795-799). He was sent to MINDANAO, presumably for ultimate dispatch to this headquarters, by "ROXAS AND GENERAL LIM, WHO WAS NAMED BY ROXAS TO UNIFY GUERILLAS IN IUZON." (Fertig message 796).
- 3. I believed that Colonel MANZANO could most profitably be employed on FERTIG's staff in charge of intelligence, particularly in the DAVAO area where we are very weak. My views, however, were over-ruled by approval of a G-2 recommendation (G-2 C/N of 27 March) that MANZANO be appointed to "direct procurement of intelligence and extension of intelligence net in IUZON." He was so appointed but to this date has made no move to undertake the responsibilities of that appointment presumably because we have not thus far indicated the manner in which he was to do it.
- 4. FERTIG believes that MANZANO should remain in "10th M.D. OR BOHOL SINCE HE CANNOT RETURN TO LUZON SINCE WHOLESALE ARRESTS" (Fertig message 796). Yet MINDANAO or BOHOL is as far removed from LUZON, to all intents and purposes, as is this headquarters. The most effective place from which to "direct procurement of intelligence and extension of intelligence net in LUZON" is in LUZON itself. We have had to heretofore maintain our leaders (SMITH and PHILLIPS) at points adjacent to LUZON because of the impossibility of their assimilation among the Filipino people but such difficulty does not exist in the case of Colonel MANZANO.
- 5. G-2 has commented on this point: "To actively take over IUZON work will require MANZANO to be closer to LUZON (possibly PANAY or NEGROS)." (G-2 note to PRS 12 April). I believe, however, that for such purpose there would be little distinction between the VISAYAS and MINDANAO. He would, in either case, be too far removed from LUZON to do an effective job inside of LUZON.
- 6. In support of his recommendation of promotion for MANZANO Fertig states "HIS SERVICES IN MANILA AND WITH ME HAVE BEEN INVALUABLE" (message attached). While MANZANO is recognized as a splendid officer (General Casey) prior to the

surrender we have no evidence to disclose the nature of his service since the surrender nor the manner in which he obtained his release as a POW if he fell into that category which presumably he did.

7. I recommend:

- (a) That the promotion of this officer be held in abeyance pending the availability of information concerning his post surrender activity and service and the opportunity to accurately appraise the same. (Policy in this matter should be shaped to the realization that in the post re-occupation era claims to distinguished services in the post surrender period will spring up like mushrooms from every corner of the Philippines. Hastily conceived precedent is therefore to be carefully avoided); and
- (b) That as Colonel MANZANO is to direct the procurement of intelligence in LUZON he should be ordered to LUZON for that purpose, under a plan that has reasonable chance for success; or if this headquarters is unable to devise such a plan (and none was included in the G-2 recommendation for appointment) he should be directed to submit such a plan for the consideration of this headquarters. (It is now many weeks since Colonel MANZANO was given his appointment and yet, as far as is known, no action whatsoever has been taken toward the discharge of the responsibilities incident thereto. The campaign is moving too swiftly to permit of delay in such vital matters).

- Mindanao Station: NR 785 19th Mar/44 (Weekly Coast Watcher Report) General or Special Comment: Shipping south coast staying further from shore line. Total targets this week 60. Nips patrol Davao Gulf dawn to dusk by seaplane.
 - NR 762 13 Mar/44: Transport arrived on 27th February with many wounded. Japs alarmed by reported presence of American planes on 25th Feb.
 - NR 763 13 Mar/44: Enemy withdrawn from 120 Area and our forces are intact. Enemy landed at Lamalama night of 8th March, strength 300. Matar bursts among four barges of Binoni Point Lanao set one barge afire. 1500 soldiers in Iligan.
 - NR 764 13 Mar/44: CHOJO MARU was 2600 tons. Lieutenant Kuwdo Sato only officer survivor; fought in Bataan, Corregidor, China. Sgt Tara Kawama served Rabual as Radio Operator. Twenty two bodies have washed ashore at Batulaki, Sugal Coast.
 - NR 765 13 Mar/44: Radio report from Luzon: Last shipment of equipment and radio arrived safely in Batangas.
 - NR 767 14 Mar/44: Capt. Itoh Jap Naval Construction chief in Cebu has called for 5 thousand carpenters and laborers to build wharf there. Zamboanga Navy Dock construction needs 11000 peros to complete concrete work which is pushed night and day.
 - NR 770 15 Mar/44: Leyte: Enemy in Sough Leyte reinforced by 700 either from Cedu or Tacloban in small wooden ships. Concentrations are at Babay, Hilongos, Bato, Matalom, Malitbog, Sogod and Kabalian.
 - NR 771 15 Mar/44: Cebus Mid February. Akatuji Heikan, about one division commanded by Lt Gen MONOROBI consisting of Butai 6142 at Lilosn, 6146 at Mandaue, 6194 at Opon, 2912 at Talisay together with 6167 already reported and all Infantry. 2950 Army Transport Unit. Jidosha Sho 10,681 at Provincial High School, Heiki Sho 10,680 at intermediate school. Simisutai 15,311 at Lahug. Watari Units, 10,630; 10,635; 10643; 16,650; 15319, all infantry and commanded by Taisho KONO. Total strength of Watari about one regiment. Six thousand gallon aviation gasoline dump in former Galtex Area at Opon. Airfield on Mactan Island now 3 kilometers long between barrios Look and Marigondon. Wooden barges under construction by Taio Sangyo in their shops on Tupas Street. Are of same type, size formerly used by petroleum companies.
 - NR 772 15 Mar/44: Cebu: Heavy concentration troops in triangle formed by Mandaue, Liloan and Opon. Defense works, pillboxes and light artillery positions with barracks for 3 thousand men nearing completion at Naga. Undercover agents increasing.
 - NR 773 15 Mar/44: Butuan, Agusan, bombed this morning at 0620 with attempted landing vicinity of Nasipit.
 - NR 774 15 Mar/44: Manila, Mid Feb: Agent returned from Manila on Inter Island vessel named Ohmi Maru. Similar to Prencessa, 400 tons. 200 Jap soldiers to Iloilo to fight guerillas came from China. Philippine shipping association issues passes and flags to bancas registered with them. These seldom molested by patrol launches. Many 50 men capcapacity barges in Cebu, Iloilo, Cavite and Bacolod.
 - Dewey dry dock visible from blvd lying between Manila and Cavite. Pan-American clipper base not used. 200 AA guns recently installed behind Arellino High School in Intramuros. Motor ship Surigao refloated and now under repair.
 - NR 775 15 Mar/44: Butuan, Agusan reported occupied at 1400 Mar/15/44. No details.
 - NR 776 16 Mar/44: One SC off Nasipit. Another with one barge 5 miles west effected landings on 15 Mar. Four launches from Cagayan, Misamis Oriental and three planes also used. Scattered landings along Lanao North Coast.
 - 16 large hospital wards filled in Army Recup. Hospital at Phil Long Distance Tele Compound at Los Aanos. Airfield installations on Alabat, Polillo.
 - NR 778 16 Mar/44. Cavite Report. Jap utilizes undamaged parts of Yard, lightly garrisoned. Filipino labor battalions at oil and gasoline stores on Sangley Point 350. Canacao garrisoned by 318 marines. Five Navy flying boats at our former apron.
 - NR 781 17 Mar/44: Enemy supported by 3 planes bombing Amparo and attempting to force river defenses. Radio equipment and codes safe. East Coast Watcher station reports no activity.
 - 782 NR 728 - 17 Mar/44: Sigutation worse. Enemy captured defense position below Amparo. Cabadbaran bombed this morning. Cagayan, Misamis Or., sending more troops to Agusan.
 - NR 783 18 Mar/44: Enemy occupying coast in strength. Planes bombed every barrio along coast of Agusuan Province, and up river to my C.P. Few casualties in Cabadbaran, none elsewhere. Planes and troops from Cagayan, Misamis Or.
 - NR 50 14 Mar/44: Jurado reports Japs landed in force at Abra de Ilog, Mindoro and general area capturing a certain Captain Wise and eight soldiers about 26th Feb.

 NR 53 15 Mar/44: About 20 vessels seen Manila Bay Feb.28. Convoy eight medium ships four big motorboats, seen Mar/4
 - going south between Marinduque and Tayabas, heavily leaded.

 NR 98 17 Mar/44: Enemy constructing bamboo rafts on Negros. Rafts were seen at Dumaguete loaded on enemy vessels
 - NR 96 12 Mar/44: Nip Squadron commander at Bacolod is Captain Kanatoranoshior. Fabrica airfield now three times original size with four large barracks and secret dumps around.
 - NR 23 17 Mar/44: One MV torpedoed by allied sub near Calupag Island North Tawitawi about Larch 6. Ship abandoned by Japs. No ship movements for past few days only aerial bombing six KM from Batobato including Young's former residence repeated. Another follow up party by sea route to locate unlocate buried packages arriving within two days. CHQ will be informed immediately if radio sets received or not.

Attached message confirms from different source OZAMIZ' and ELIZAIDE's detention - for the first time advises of the dention of ROXAS and Mrs. JURIKA. There is no means of evaluating the basis for the enemy action. It may be due to a leak in one of PHILLIPS' contacts, to betrayal by one in ROXAS! confidence, or due to any of several other causes. Speculation as to the cause is unprofitable. 2. I doubt that the enemy would care to martyrize ROXAS at a time, as at present, when all indications are that the people are ripe for open revolt against the enemy occupation. There is no indication that his detention was incident to an escape attempt. ROXAS was incarcerated in Fort Santiago last August and I believe that he will survive this test just as he did that one. 3. Mrs. JURIKA (Katsy PARSONS' mother) has had no part whatsoever in our secret intelligence activity in MANILA. Due to her relationship to Capt. Tom JURIKA (her son) and Comdr. PARSONS (her son-in-law), both of whom have taken a prominent part in the resistance movement, the enemy has a definite and malicious interest in her detention, however. I reluctantly informed Comdr. PARSONS of this phase of the development (we have to face facts in this effort). His comment: "Knowing Mrs. JURIKA as I do I feel sorry for the Japs."
