PHILIPPINES COAST WATCHER MET

Comment by Lt Comdry Parsons USE

At present the following points are covered by Coast Watcher stations:

- 1. Surigae Straits: Station is located on east coast of Banson Island and is equipped with 15 watt Telradio and with a small ATR battery set for standby use. Lt Hemmingway is in charge. He has one American assistant, two Filipine operators, and two soldiers in his party.
- 2. Bagilan Straits: A coast watcher station is located on a hill about 5 kilometers east of Zamboango City. Equipment is the same as indicated in par. 1. In charge of station is Lt. LeCourve with Lt Hall as assistant (WAB station No. 13 in 10th MD)
- 3. <u>Davae Gulf</u>: The station is located on the western coast of the Gulf. Lt Johnson is in charge. He has one officer and 10 men with him. He has recently been supplied with an additional Telradio and an ATR battery set with which to install a watcher station on the eastern coast of Davae Gulf and one near Sarangani Straits (both of which to work as sub-stations and communicate only with Johnson's station) With the additional equipment for the Davae area, the coverage will be more complete.
- 4. Cotabato: At Port Lebak is a useful watcher station. In charge is a Filipino Officer and six men. The eup equipment has recently been replaced with a Telradio and an ATR.
- 5. Western Zamboanga: Just south of Sindangan on the western bulge of Mindanso a watcher station has recently been placed. Observation of ship movements toward the Mindanso Sea from Borneo should be practicable at this point. Am American officer has been placed in charge. He has a Tel radio and also emergency equipment.

Stations 1 to 6 are within the 10th Mil District (Fertig) Mindanso.

- 6. Mindanao Sea: On the North coast of Camiguin Island to the west of Manbajao. Lt Thomas has installed and operates a watcher station. He has a Telradio and also emergency equipment.
- 7. San Bernardino Straits: Captain Jurika installed a watcher station at this important site in Nov/42. He placed an American officer in charge and left a party of Filipino operators. His equipment there consists of a Telradio an no standby equipment.

Major Smith is now enroute to the site with a large party and ample equipment to install further radio sets and arrange for a more complete coverage (both sides of the straits.)

- 8. <u>Verde Island Pessage:</u> Ape East Passage: Party headed by Major Phillips recently established coast water control and sub-stations in area of Northern Mindore, to cover these two strategic points. His equipment consists of an MEI set capable of reading SWPA and three smaller sets with which to establish a net of stations in the area. He is in regular contact with the USMavy control stations ZAE and ZAV.
- 9. Sibutu Passage: This entrance to Philippine waters until recently was covered by a party in charge of Capt Hammer. Due to enemy action the coverage has been lost. Plans are now underway to re-establish the coverage. When this is done, coverage of the strategically important Balabee Straits will be included.
- 10. Plane are underway for sending partices to Bjeador Light, East Coast Luson, Bondoc Peninsula for the purpose of establishing additional Coast Watcher Stations.
