Joe Rauh is living in Washington and so far has not decided what he is going to do. I never received the Legion of Merit which I understand was awarded to me. Joe Rauh said that he had a copy of the order. Unless you can persuade General MacArthur to approve the other award for which you recommended me, I should appreciate being sent the Legion of Merit and the citation either directly or through channels, whichever is easier. Colonel EDGAR G. CROSSMAR, 0130875, Army of the United States. For exceptionally maritorious conduct in the parformance of outstanding services in the Southwest Pacific Aron, from 21 August 1944 to 9 Jump 1945. Given the tank of assisting in the planning of Civil Affairs Operations for the Philippines, Celevel Crossman applied himself with a determination, onthusiasm and perseverance which was largely responsible for the availability of thirty trained, equipped Philippine Civil Affairs Units when the invesion took place in Cotober. Subsequent to the initial landing, Colonel Grossmen performed responsible and important duties in the coordinstica of the work of Philippine Civil Affairs Units operating under various headquarters; in the discomination of diroctives and operational notes to units in the field; and in commention with the overall responsibility for the Army's part in civil administration and relief in the Philippines.
