WISE, BRAYNARD L.

Upon my arrival in PANAY with Lieutenant Colonel JURADO, we went directly to Colonel PERALTA's headquarters. We were asking for gadio equipment to re-establish the ship watcher station in Northern MINDORO, also guns, ammunition and other supplies, if possible.


Colonel PERALTA stated he did not have any of these available. It was decided that, with the permission of GHQ, I would return to AUSTRALIA on the next transportation to ask for these supplies.


We left the headquarters of Colonel PERALTA about May 15th and went to the Headquarters of Lieutenant Colonel GARCIA in Northern PANAY. I was told to stay at Lieutenant Colonel GARCIA's headquarters, and Colonel JURADO left for MINDORO about the 20th of May. Colonel GARCIA told me to go with Captain RUIZ, his executive officer; the wessel was expected at any time.

There was an evacuation camp of several Americans and other nationals. Due to a pending Japanese penetration, this was broken up the first part of June. Lieutenant Colonel GARCIA assigned all servicemen to some unit; I was assigned with Lieutenant AMES' radio station. Later he assigned me to his secret station in the mountains, with a Lieutenant DONESA. I stayed there waiting for an answer to my messages to GHQ, asking for further instructions. About the 15th of June a Lieutenant LIM came from MINDORO to Lieutenant Colonel GARCIA's headquarters, asking for me. I was sent for and went there. It was only a message from JURADO about the guerrilla activities in MINDORO. While I was there, a message came from Colonel PERALTA saying "WISE IS TO GO". I went back to the radio station and waited. Later I received a message to come to GARCIA's headquarters on the 18th of June. When I arrived there he told me of a message that had come in. It simply said: "MESSAGE FROM KAZ RPT KAZ SAYS STAY IN CONTACT WITH ME BY RADIO PD STAY WITH GARCIA".

There was no meaning to this message. It was not known if I was to stay behind or go on the vessel. GARCIA had decided to send only the servicemen out. It was decided I would go to the vessel







and see if there were any orders for me there. On the evening of the 20th the vessel arrived; GARCIA was not there at that time. Captain RUIZ, Lieutenant TALBOT and myself were the first to go out for the contact. Once aboard, I asked the Captain of the vessel if he had any orders for me. He said that he had none he knew of. Later I met a Master Sergeant from Camp TABRAGALBA I had known there. He had no orders for me. About 10:00 P.M. Colonel GARCIA came aboard and we had a big long talk. I had no orders at all. Colonel PERALTA had refused to give any equipment to MINDORO. Colonel GARCIA told me to do as I pleased; if I wanted to go, it was all right with him. We decided I might be able to help more by coming back to GHQ and try to help with the supplies needed up there and to explain the general situation. Issked the Captain of the vessel if I could come. He said: "That is for you to decide"; I said I would go. When we were forced to leave early the next morning, the gun crew was on top side firing the big guns, when one of the officers on the after-gun found a letter for me laying on the deck. It was one from my mother mailed in January. For any further information regarding this statement, I refer to Lieutenant Robert S. KRAMER or Pfc. Nathan TALBOT. braynard L. Wise WO(jg), AUS - 2 -
