1. Staff Memorandum No. 18, this Headquarters, announces that PRS will be disbanded effective at 1200 hours today. Thus PRS, viewed as saint by few and sinner by many, yields to progress and becomes but an historical incident to a great military campaign.
2. PRS, before its voice is thereby silenced, urges continued adherence to the simple policies which have guided development of the preparatory phase of Philippine operations with which it has been charged -- policies realistically attuned to spiritual as well as material and practical considerations -- policies which have led to the vigorous and relentless forging of new channels for communication that the direct personal leadership of General MacARTHUR might be restored to the people and the means provided for the transmission of vital information on enemy activity; that the truth concerning military developments might be disseminated as the sole instrument with which to counter false enemy propaganda; and that the supply of material aid essential to sustain the guerilla movement and fortify the spirit of the people to continued resistance to enemy efforts at pacification might be effected -- policies both dictated and implemented by audacity and courage designed to outmatch the enemy and fire the will, the spirit, and the imagination of the people.
3. PRS unhesitatingly leaves assurance that there was no over-statement in the C in C's advice to the Secretary of War on 10 October last that he need "have no fear. The Filipino people will remain loyal at heart and the day we set foot on the Islands they will rally as a unit to our call." The Filipino people, 18,000,000 strong, in all walks of public and private life, whether now characterized as loyal or puppet, await General MacARTHUR's return and are poised to do his bidding.
4. PRS retires from the campaign but its guiding spirit, infused in the hearts of many, will carry on.

TO : Commanding General, USAFFE, APO 501

1. Under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved 9 July, 1918, (Bulletin 43, WD, 1918), it is recommended that the Distinguished Service Cross be awarded to Major Lawrence H. Phillips, 0916722, Corps of Engineers, Army of the United States:

"Major Lawrence H. Phillips, 0916722, Corps of Engineers, Army of the United States, is cited for extraordinary heroism and outstanding gallantry in the presence of the enemy during the period 23 October 1943 to 15 March 1944, when as a volunteer for service of extreme hazard he established a radio and observation post in Northern Mindoro and transmitted therefrom to this Headquarters important information concerning enemy movements and dispositions. In addition to such service he was able, in the face of grave danger, to give encouragement and material aid to Americans and Filipinos still resisting the enemy on the Islands of Ison and Mindoro. In the conduct of this mission Major Phillips demonstrated exemplary courage and devotion to duty."

1. In re your desire (communicated to me late yesterday) to visit the Philippine Training Camp at Beaudesert this morning in company with a group of other officers to select personnel for Colonel Thorpe's purposes, I hope that I made the position of this Section quite clear.

2. This camp is not a replacement center but rather a training camp dedicated to the preparation of men for special Philippine service. Many of the men have already been selected and assigned to parties whose departure on approved missions is on early schedule. All are under a carefully thought out program of training.

3. You will realize that under such conditions the intervention of others than those directly responsible into the selection of personnel for projects, neither fully planned nor approved, would be prejudicial to the good order with which it is desired this activity be conducted.

4. I should be pleased at any time to have you or any other members of the staff visit the camp for the purpose of looking it over -- possibly giving suggestions of value toward its ~~improvement~~ -- but I should not like to see the routine of the camp, developed to serve a specific purpose, disturbed unless it be upon constructive considerations.

5. If Colonel Thorpe, or any other staff officer, has any plan in mind for the utilization of this personnel, or any part of it, the correct procedure would be to submit such a plan for study to determine its feasibility and the place it should occupy on the agenda of already approved projects. Thereafter, if such a plan is approved, this Section, or its successor, with the assistance of the Battalion Commander and his Training Officer can best determine the personnel available who meet the qualifications essential to its implementation.

6. I am confident that you will fully agree with the soundness of this position.

1. I am pleased to advise that the **NARWHAL** made contact with Colonel **BOWLER's** forces in Western **MINDANAO** in accordance with plan on 1 June at 1800 hours. Unloading was completed in four (4) hours and vessel departed.

2. The following personnel were discharged at this point:

Weather detachment (W.O. and 4 men)
Signal detachment (10 Filipino operators)
POW officer

3. The following cargo was discharged:

500 carbines
300,000 rounds ammunition
2,000 hand grenades
10 81 mm mortars with 300 rounds ammo
1,000 rifle grenades with 50 launchers
2,400 gallons 100 octane aviation gasoline
250 gallons aviation lube oil
Signal equipment
Medical supplies
Currency, etc, etc, etc.

4. With this shipment adequate equipment is now on hand in Western **MINDANAO** to implement plans to strengthen the communications system of the 10th M.D. by a series of alternate controls to automatically take over when the main control station is knocked out by enemy action.

5. As before reported we are throwing in the first full load of the **NAUTILUS** at the same point on 5 June on the theory that even if the enemy gets word of the cargo discharged on the 1st, he does not yet know that we are operating the **NAUTILUS** and probably will not be alert to so rapid a re-entry into that area. I consider it a secure tactic. I hope that I am right. Thereafter, the overall situation in **MINDANAO** should be quite strong from the standpoint of communications and supply. Thereafter **FRS** will be relieved of further responsibility incident to these operations.

AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS

Major Lawrence H. Phillips, 0916722, Corps of Engineers, Army of the United States, is cited for extraordinary heroism and outstanding gallantry in the presence of the enemy during the period 23 October 1943 to 15 March 1944, when as a volunteer for service of extreme hazard he established a radio and observation post in Northern Mindoro and transmitted therefrom to this Headquarters important information concerning enemy movements and dispositions.
