1. When the LEYTE beachhead has been secured:

a. All FILIPINO Forces of the 9th Military District (LEYTE-SAMAR Area) will pass to the control of the Commanding General SIXTH ARMY.

b. The Commanding General SIXTH ARMY will control the FILIPINO Forces according to the policies established by the Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area.

c. The entire 9th Military District radio net, including the net control station will pass to the control of Commanding General SIXTH ARMY, upon the establishment of the SIXTH ARMY radio station in LEYTE.

d. Supplies for FILIPINO Forces of all districts will be air dropped, delivered by surface craft, submarine, or otherwise, according to the means available.

e. Commanding General SIXTH ARMY will continue to retain liaison officer with G-2, GHO.

2. This headquarters will:

a. Retain operational control of all FILIPINO Forces outside of the 9th Military District and will continue to receive all messages from all FILIPINO Forces and continue to evaluate, publish and disseminate PHILIPPINE intelligence.

b. Retain operational control of the PHILIPPINE message center, GHO, and station KAS.

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3. ALLIED NAVAL Forces will continue to receive all pertinent messages from the 9th Military District through SIXTH ARMY and from all other districts through the PHILIPPINE Sub-section, G-3, GHQ.

4. ALLIED AIR Forces will continue to receive all weather and aircraft warning reports direct.

5. As operations progress, Commanding General SIXTH ARMY OR EIGHTH ARMY will assume control of the FILIPINO Forces in other areas as later announced by this headquarters.

6. In order to familiarize members of the staff, SIXTH ARMY with current operations of the FILIPINO Forces, Commanding General SIXTH ARMY will designate the following personnel to report on 28 September 1944 to sections of GHQ as listed below. This personnel and the signal personnel that have already reported to this headquarters will remain attached to GHQ until released by this headquarters:

LAUREL'S PROCLAMATION



"THE FILIPINOS HAVE ALREADY WAGED WAR TWICE IN ORDER TO GAIN FREEDOM AND INDEPENDENCE FROM FOREIGN DOMINATION AND EXPERIENCED CEASELESS REVOLUTIONS BUT ON OCTOBER FOURTEENTH LAST YEAR THE LONG HOPED FOR FREEDOM AND INDEPENDENCE WERE WON AND THEREFORE THE PRESIDENT REQUESTED THE US NEVER AGAIN TO DESTROY AND DISTRESS THE PHILIPPINES. IN SPITE OF THIS REQUEST THE USA AND BRITAIN HAVE PENETRATED INTO SOME PARTS OF THE PHILIPPINES FROM THE AIR AND HAVE DESECRATED THE SOIL OF THE REPUBLIC AND MOREOVER HAVE DESTROYED FILIPINO LIVES AND PROPERTY. NOW THE PHILIPPINES ARE COMPELLED (WORDS MISSING) THEIR INDEPENDENCE AND INTEGRITY OF TERRITORY THEREFORE UNDER THE TREATY OF ALLIANCE BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE PHILIPPINES I, PRESIDENT LAUREL OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES HEREBY PROCLAIM THAT AS FROM 10 AM SEPTEMBER 23 1944 WE ARE IN A STATE OF WAR WITH THE U.S.A. AND GREAT BRITAIN. IN FACE OF THIS GRAVE SITUATION I REQUEST AT THIS HISTORICAL HOUR THAT THE ENTIRE POPULATION SUPPORTS THE GOVERNMENT BY DEMONSTRATING ITS FIRM DETERMINATION. THUS WE ARE PROTECTING THE FREEDOM AND INDEPENDENCE OF THE PHILIPPINES ... SIGNED:
P. LAUREL, PRESIDENT"

"AT THIS MOMENT WHEN THE WAR OF GEA IS GROWING STEADILY IN SEVERITY AND IS ABOUT TO REACH THE DECISIVE TURN THE 18 MILLION PEOPLE OF THE PHILIPPINES HAVE RISEN RESOLUTELY TO PRESERVE THEIR GLORIOUS FREEDOM STOP THEY HAVE TAKEN UP THE SWORD OF RIGHTEOUSNESS FOR THE DEFENCE OF THEIR FATHERLAND STOP THIS ACTION OF THE REPUBLIC FOR WHICH THE REASONS ARE CLEARLY SET IN THE PROCLAMATION ON THE STATE OF WAR BY THE PHILIPPINES GOVERNMENT IS REGARDED TRULY AS A MANIFESTATION OF ORIENTAL MORALITY STOP AS SUCH ITS FIND READY SYMPATHY AND RESPONSE IN THE HEARTS OF THE JAPANESE NATION STOP SINCE ITS ACHIEVEMENT OF INDEPENDENCE LAST AUTUMN THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES UNDER THE PERSONAL LEADERSHIP AND GUIDANCE OF THE PRESIDENT HIS EXCELLENCY JOSE P LAUREL HAS MADE INTERNALLY SPEEDY PROGRESS IN PERFECTING ITS ADMINISTRATIVE SYSTEM WHILE EXTERNALLY IT HAS MAINTAINED UNSTINTED COOPERATION WITH JAPAN AND ALL THE OTHER COUNTRIES OF EAST ASIA STOP NOW THE REPUBLIC HAS RESOLVED TO JOIN THE FRONTLINE AGAINST THE U S A AND BRITAIN STOP IT IS A GRAND SPECTACLE NEVER BEFORE WITNESSED IN THE HISTORY OF GREATER EAST ASIA SHOWING THAT THE NATIONS OF THE REGION ARE UNITED IN A COMMON WAR STOP THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT DESIRES TO EXPRESS THEIR SINCERE AND CONFIDENT HOPE THAT THE PHILIPPINES NATION WILL SUCCESSFULLY GUARD ITS INDEPENDENCE AND THE HONOUR OF ITS HOMELAND AND TO STATE ITS FREE DETERMINATION TO RENDER EVERY ASSISTANCE TO THE REPUBLIC AS PROVIDED IN THE JAPANESE PHILIPPINES PACT OF ALLIANCE AND FURTHER MORE TO WIN TOGETHER THE WAR OF GREATER EAST ASIA BY CRUSHING THE U S A AND BRITAIN AND THIS TO GO FORWARD WITH THE TASK OF CONSTRUCTING THE GREATER EAST ASIA CO-PROSPERITY SPHERE"

1. Advise that direct supply of GEBU has been effected.
2. As the submarine NAUTILUS went aground upon a reef just outside of the rendezvous point, all supplies consigned to PERALTA and ROWE were unloaded at GEBU to lighten the load - an expedient found necessary to save the vessel.
3. As a result of the foregoing CUSHING is now adequately supplied with arms, ammunition and signal supplies to equip a much larger force than presently organized in the GEBU Area Command.

1. Soldier referred to in attached report of delinquency (Docket No. 21158) was driving me at the time reported. He drove carefully and at moderate speed throughout.

2. The reporting constable at the intersection concerned suddenly appeared in front of the car waving his arms. Had the driver's speed been excessive the constable would have been run over or the car swerved to the side to avoid doing so. The driver however came to an immediate stop.

3. The constable was arrogant to the point of insolence. I told him that I was responsible for the car and he could address his remarks to me. He admitted that he had no means of gauging the speed.

4. The driver was self-contained and courteous at all times. I do not believe that during the entire trip he exceeded a speed of 30 miles per hour and I consider him entirely blameless of any charge of excessive speed or reckless driving.

5. Recommend that the matter be dropped.

1. Due to the necessity for discharge of all supplies consigned to ROWE at CENU it is believed that the P50,000 Philippine currency approved by you for allocation to ROWE (MINDORO) was likewise discharged.

2. As it is contemplated to immediately dispatch the NAUTILUS to complete her mission to PERALTA and ROWE upon her return to her base at WINDI Island, authority is requested to allocate a new sum of Philippine currency in the amount of P50,000 to ROWE and that CUSHING be permitted to retain that overdelivered to him.

3. It is impractical to shift supplies from one area to another once delivery has been effected.

MEMORANDUM: To Colonel Whitney

SUBJECT : Minutes of Conference with Chief of Staff, 0740 hours,
27 September 1944.

PRESENT: Chief of Staff
Major General Chamberlin
Brigadier General Chambers

1. General Stivers will organize FILIPINO Forces but will not be concerned with the operations of guerrillas in objective areas of SIXTH ARMY.

2. SIXTH ARMY will control guerrilla forces in objective areas as provided in approved memorandum for the Chief of Staff, dated 21 September 1944, Subject: "Proposed Plan for Transfer of Certain Functions of the PHILIPPINE Sub-Sections, G-3, to SIXTH ARMY".

3. G-3, G-3, G-3 Planning Section and SIXTH ARMY will prepare plans for utilization of guerrilla forces - SIXTH ARMY for utilization in objective areas, G-3 for utilization outside objective areas. Sub-stage plans and other plans for utilization of guerrillas to be closely integrated with operational plans so as to further, not hinder them. Plans will not be disclosed to guerrillas in advance of operations because of danger to security.

4. As SIXTH ARMY is relieved in objective areas, General Stivers will take over control of PHILIPPINE Forces.

5. General Stivers will organize the military forces of the PHILIPPINES in areas of the PHILIPPINES as our forces gain control. After the PHILIPPINE Forces have been organized, trained and equipped they will be allocated to Army commanders as the situation dictates.

6. General Stivers will work closely with Colonel Whitney and PHILIPPINE Sub-Sections of G-3 in order to become familiar with present status of all PHILIPPINE matters.

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7. General Stivers and General Fellars will accompany the Commander-in-Chief to the PHILIPPINES and remain with him.

8. Training of SIXTH ARMY personnel on duty with PHILIPPINE Sub-Sections of G-3 will continue as approved.

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 25



PROMULGATING RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CURRENCY, BOOKS AND ACCOUNTS OF BANKS AND THEIR BRANCHES AND AGENCIES IN THE PROVINCES, PROVINCIAL, CITY AND MUNICIPAL TREASURIES AND OTHER GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABLE OFFICERS AND DEBT MORATORIUM

WHEREAS, it is essential that the financial and monetary structure of the Commonwealth of the Philippines be maintained on a sound basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSMEÑA, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, do hereby promulgate the following rules and regulations concerning currency, books and accounts and debt moratorium for all areas free from enemy occupation and control throughout the Philippines.

I. CURRENCY

1. The new Victory Series of Philippine Treasury Certificates (Victory Pesos) and the Philippine coins identical to pre-war issues now in circulation will be legal tender.

2. All pre-war Philippine Treasury Certificates and coins will continue to be legal tender and may be exchanged at par for the Victory Pesos if so desired by the holders.

3. The rate of exchange will be two Victory Pesos for one United States dollar. Transactions at any other rate are prohibited.

4. For each province liberated from the enemy, an Emergency Currency Committee will be appointed by the United States Army and the Commonwealth Government to study, investigate and report on the bona-fide emergency currencies issued by duly authorized currency boards. The Committee will ascertain the extent of the authority given to such boards, the amount of emergency currency actually printed and issued, and will recommend as soon as possible the redemption of the currencies found to be legally issued. In case it is found out that in a given province more emergency currencies were in circulation than the amount actually authorized to be issued, the Committee will recommend what action shall be taken: Provided, however, that counterfeit emergency currencies will not be redeemed.

5. The printing and issuance of additional emergency currencies are hereby prohibited.

6. Japanese currency, Philippine National Bank Notes (except duly authorized emergency issues), Notes of the Bank of the Philippine Islands, New Central Bank Notes and unauthorized emergency currencies are not legal tender. Transactions in these currencies are prohibited.

II. BANKS, TREASURIES AND OTHER
ACCOUNTABLE OFFICERS

1. The books of banks, their branches and agencies in the provinces, provincial, city and municipal treasuries and other government accountable officers will be sealed forthwith and existing accounts frozen, as of the date the province, city, or municipality is liberated from enemy occupation and control, pending further action by the Government. All books, accounts and previous records as closed shall become inactive, filed and preserved for reference and other purposes as may be required.

2. Provincial and municipal treasurers and other accountable officials will open new books of account as soon as their respective offices are duly reconstituted, observing strictly the existing accounting laws, rules and regulations pertaining to accounts and accounting system of the Commonwealth of the Philippines.

3. Provincial treasurers will accept for safekeeping new savings deposits in pre-war Philippine Treasury Certificates and Victory Pesos. Withdrawals in cash only of not less than one peso may be made from each savings account upon presentation of the deposit book. No interest will accrue on such deposit. In addition to opening new savings accounts, provincial treasuries will provide facilities for exchanging United States dollar for Victory Pesos.

III. DEBT MORATORIUM

1. Payment of all debts and other monetary obligations contracted after December 31, 1941, except debts and other monetary obligations entered into in any area after declaration by Executive Order that such area has been freed from enemy occupation and control, is temporarily suspended pending action by the Commonwealth Government.

Done at the Seat of Government in the Field, this 18th day of November, in the year of Our Lord, nineteen hundred and forty-four, and of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, the tenth.

Monthly Combined Situation Report, 15 August. FEAF, 5th and 13th AF receive copies of this report.

2. Obviously, this information should not be carried in writing in aircraft flying over enemy territory, but should be made part of the pilots' briefing. Another point is that indiscreet inquiries by downed aviators, mentioning persons by name, may jeopardize the guerillas in any given locality.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHIEF OF STAFF.

I. THE PROBLEM PRESENTED.

EMERGENCY CURRENCIES - Information available concerning outstanding bonafide currencies is very meagre. It is necessary to secure more data before plans for currency redemption can be made.

- (c) To make monthly reports thereafter by radio to show any additional report.

2. Air space allocation to sections for movement of personnel and cargo is as indicated in Incl "B" attached hereto.

3. a. Each staff section, GHQ, SWPA, concerned, will submit to the Hq Commandant (Rear Echelon) the following information:

- (1) The name, rank, serial number and weight of each person selected for each plane as allocated in Incl. "B", not later than 24 hours prior to time of departure.
- (2) A list of equipment with description and approximate weight of each piece to be moved by air transportation and desired date of movement, not later than 24 hours prior to time of departure.
- (3) A list of equipment and approximate weight of each piece to be moved by water transportation leaving BRISBANE on or about 3 October, not later than 29 September.
- (4) A list of officers' personal baggage to be moved by water transportation, with location and time the baggage may be collected, not later than 0800 hours 27 September.

b. The Headquarters Commandant (Rear Echelon) will:

- (1) Submit to the Chief Regulating Officer a loading sheet for each plane, showing the following information:
 - (a) Name, rank, serial number and weight of each individual.
 - (b) A list of cargo showing number of pieces, description and weight.

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- (2) In so far as practicable, allot equipment of sections to the same planes assigned members of sections.
- (3) Detail an officer and detachment at the airfields in BRISBANE and HOLLANDIA to assist in the loading and unloading of the planes.
- (4) Furnish the necessary transportation at BRISBANE and HOLLANDIA for the movement of personnel and equipment.
- (5) Notify the Headquarters Commandant, HOLLANDIA, of the time of departure and estimated time of arrival of each plane.
- (6) Arrange with the Chief Regulating Officer for the necessary water transportation for movement of equipment not moved by air.

4. Personal baggage accompanying officers will not exceed 65 pounds and that accompanying enlisted men 50 pounds. Additional baggage of officers and enlisted men may be shipped by water transportation.

5. Office equipment and officers' personal baggage to be moved by water transportation will be collected by the Headquarters Commandant not later than 1200 hours 27 September.

6. All aircraft involved in this move will rendezvous over NADZAB and proceed to destination over a specified route with escort or in groups of 2 or more (in accordance with special instructions issued ATC) for security.

1. Rear Echelon GHQ Motor Pool, effective this date, has been reduced to an operating minimum of 10 day taxis and 6 night taxis. The reason for the reduction is that the northern contingent of GHQ is in urgent need of manpower and the need for official transportation here has been greatly reduced by the movement of some 250 officers.

2. In spite of the reduction of officers there has been numerous violations of GHQ Motor Pool regulations and it is requested that all officers be notified of the existing conditions and observe the following regulations:

a. Where trips are to be made requiring the use of a vehicle for more than one-half day, cars will be made available by telephoning the Headquarters Commandant, Extension AMP 365, 48 hours prior to the time of departure.

b. When requesting transportation, the Dispatcher will be informed as to the approximate time the car will be required. If the business to be transacted requires a considerable length of time, the driver should be dismissed with definite instructions as to time of return. If the exact time required for the completion of the business is not known, the driver should be dismissed and a new call submitted to the Dispatcher when the officer is ready to make the return trip. The driver upon reporting back to the Motor Pool will advise the Dispatcher as to what instructions he has received.

c. Cars will be used for official business only. The use of government transportation for organized recreation of officer and enlisted personnel is authorized when such requests are approved by the Headquarters Commandant. When a vehicle is employed for recreation the trip ticket will clearly state this fact and the authority for using the vehicle for this purpose. Cars will be assigned to regular drivers and normally will not be driven by any other person. Cars will be exercised by every officer to whom a car is assigned, and by every driver, to see that the proper care of the vehicle is taken at all times and there is strict compliance with traffic regulations.

d. CARS WILL NOT BE USED TO TRANSPORT OFFICERS BETWEEN THEIR BILLETTS AND PLACES OF EMPLOYMENT, except when no other appropriate means of transportation are available, or when official duties necessitate overtime work beyond the hours when other available means of transportation are readily available.

e. Officers abusing the above privileges will be dealt with by the Headquarters Commandant with chiefs of sections.


