(Jurika for action) Recommend to General Whitlock early establishment of forward base here for reloading Philippine supplies. (G-2 and G-3 combined operations) if okay start movement, secure exclusive use of vessel with DW capacity about 2,000 tons to load out all signal supplies on hand Brisbane plus any quartermaster, ordnance, medical and signal equipment obtainable there, then proceed Darwin load out all supplies there, thence to forward base or bases to complete load to vessels capacity and proceed to Cabalian where excellent facilities including warehouses can be made available shortly for Philippine supply base. Try for Brisbane loading first half November. Advise situation yours.

Inginiero was advised to get his supplies 18 July through Fertig. But until now Inginiero is unheard of. Info from Fertig revealed Bohol entirely occupied and Inginero reported to have gone to Panay. Enemy is active and delay disposition of supplies for Bohol is dangerous. Request authority to issue Bohol supplies to Leyte soldiers or give ~~me~~ instructions what to do with them.
