demolitons supplies to morthern area. Request answer as
to whether or not this will be done. Problem of supplies,
serious, any supplies sent in will help situation.

Enemy has been trying to retake Sibulan since Dec 11th, fighting still going on late December 15th. Urgently request dropping of supplies for replenishment of ammunition or else most of units will be forced to withdraw from contact.

Due to diversity of frequencies and lack of standardized

SUPPLIES Negros.

Urgently request another shipment of supplies to include as many complete sets as possible intelligence guides, training and basic field manuals for infantry, staff and all service; field surgical units, engineer office and field equipmentand supplies, office units, mimeograph machines and handcuffs. We are in dire need for plenty of calibre 30 and 45 ammunition, automatic pistols, more automatic rifles, light machine guns and infantry mortars. For signal equipment, please refer our number 213. Although enemy has garrisoned Tolong Viejo, we can safely and efficiently handle 60 tons of Vital supplies.

Some items signal equipment June delivery missing. For next shipment request same items and quantity as in last delivery and in addition include following extras:

- A) Field telephones, switchboards, wires and portable batteries.
- B) Batteries for telegraph and walkied talkie radio.
- C) Extra crystals for types 3BZ and ATR4-A radio.
- D) Radio electricians tools (Pliers, screw drivers, drills, punches, hammers and knives).
- E) six volt exciter lamps for projector and soldering irons.
- F) 110 volt electric plant and soldering irons.
- G) Electrolyte for storage batteries.

H) Signal corps typewriters, field manuals, message out pads for weather teams.

J) Flashlights, watches, compasses, binoculars and

plotting aids for aircraft observers.

Technicians with complete individual equipment and tools. Aircraft warning greatly handicapped by lack of identical and standardized equipment necessary for immediate flashing.

We can handle again another shipment of supplies by mid september when we shall complete distribution of supplies received last June. June shipment badly short calibre .45 ammunition. Our priorities same as before with increased proportion of automatic rifles, light machine guns and infantry mortars. This party (demolition party) requests shipment of 500 pounds of plastic explosive.

By 7 Nov we can handle again another shipment of 80 tons. Same priorities as before modified as follows: A. we need more automatic rifles, machine guns and mortars with ammo. B. Include field surgical sets and medical supplies for civilian relief. C. more clothing and shoes. D. More portable radio sets for combat use and supplies for wire communications. We do not need any more tommy guns.

Turning over to Cushing's representatives of all arms and other supplies intended for Cebu continues. We have no intention to hold any of arms allotted to Cebu. Cebu representative here is fully acquainted with all the supplies received including all discrepancies noted.

We can handle supplies for Cushing. Will ask him for two Liaison officers who will handle job with us here. These su plies may be slow in reaching him but same will surely reach his area.

Have completed distribution of all arms, ammunition, grenades and medicines to units up to Capiz in North Negros. We are ready **KERENCE** receive another shipment.

Contact mission with supply vessel and evacuation of American citizens accomplished. List of 28 evacuees with CRUZ later.

We need ammunition badly to attract them to unproductive areas by sporadic raids.
