4. We undertake to repatriate at the earliest opportunity the crew of any merchant ship which is found to be unsuitable for the voyage to Japan. The administration of the crews could be taken over by the British Sea Transport Service in Singapore and Kure if this would be assistance to you.

5. We agree that we have no claim on the use of 3 Japanese auxiliaries. Please cancel final paragraph of SACSEA signal SAC 17563 of 30 Nov. If, however they could be spared on completion of their repair we would be most grateful for the use of them for a period. They are faster and more seaworthy than the merchant ships which as you know are in pretty poor shape.

Following from Commander in Chief SEAC. Subject is repatriation JSP from SEAC ref your CX 68208 of 16 Dec.

1. British Chiefs of Staff have been consulted and explain that term "British shipping" was intended to include British controlled shipping which covers Japanese ships at the disposal of Com in Chief South East Asia. On the basis of maximum assistance being afforded by these Japanese merchant vessels British government was in Oct 1946 able to inform US Government that no request for assistance by American shipping would be necessary in order to repatriate remaining JSP during 1947. Your request for the immediate repatriation of crews of 4 Japanese merchant vessels places us in a most difficult position. We are quite unable to provide British controlled crews for the Japanese ships and even if we had been able to do so the carrying capacity of the vessels as approved by West Zone Fleet would not be applicable if crewed by Allied Personnel. Carrying capacity in these circumstances would be extremely small.

3. We are anxious to continue JSP repatriation at a reasonable rate during the early months of 1947 and would very much appreciate a reconsideration of your decision and that you agree to supply crews for the Jap merchant ships. Only thus can we continue to make use of these ships. We suggest that Japanese crews would react favorably in the knowledge that they would be bringing home their countrymen.

Organized Agrarian revolt against Zamindars and absentee landlords and in peasant districts of Bombay Province under control. Possibility this might be connected with Agrarian revolt in Travancore last month. This is not confirmed. 5,000 Delhi district school teachers on strike for higher pay and better conditions despite Congress Party efforts to prevent strike. Estimated 2,000,000 tons grain will be required from outside India during 47. Government forced to order jute growers and processors to load Argentine ships in Calcutta so that Argentina will comply with recent reciprocal food-jute agreement India. One bright spot in the economic picture is start of work on an irrigation project in Punjab which will eventually put 2,000,000 acres under irrigation. Increased demands by press and others for hastening of Indianization of Army has resulted in many units losing all but 1 or 2 European officers with consequent loss of efficiency in the unit. Plan to immediately put available Indian Senior Officers to understudy top British military personnel at GHQ and in various commands. Troops engaged in unloading food ships in Karachi to strike off dock workers now in 10th day. No reaction from strikers or labor leaders on this policy. GHQ feel present British strength in country adequate to handle internal security problem until such time as turnover of Government is made. This office agrees if Indian Army remains loyal. However should dissatisfaction break out in Indian ranks British would be required to reinforce Indian garrisons from outside.

Ref WARX 88988. Congress acceptance of missions interpretation causing further dissension among Congress Nationalist Moslems, Sikhs and other minorities who fear that Congress interpretation of compulsion with regard to grouping is not sufficient safeguard of minority interest- Jinnah Calling League Working Committee to get here Jan 29 to discuss latest developments.

This precludes League attendance at reconvening Constituent Assembly Jan 20. This alone not important as though League will concur with Congress and sit in Constituent Assembly but probably not until members are sitting in section and not for general discussion. Jinnahs physical condition causing apprehension in League circles. In the event of his death League would probably split wide open with factions headed by Hidayatulla, Suhrawady or liquidate Ali Khan fighting for leadership. Of the 3 the latter might carry field for the moment but ultimate result of inter-League squabble probably see Suhrawady or Aylels this faction gaining control. Sarat-Boses resignation from the Congress working committee indicative of Bengal Hindus distrust of Congress policy of compromise. Expect present Congress leaders to hold party together as unified force until League is in assembly. Then reasonable that Inter-Congress squabble will break out anew with increasing part played by Left Wing Socialist and Sikh minority. Chandhis walking tour proceeding as scheduled. Malayan. A recent growth of Malayan political organization activities in opposition to the new federation plan is indicated by the establishment of a Malayan Council of action, sponsored by the Malay Nationalist party. This is entirely separate from similar organizations formed by Chinese pressure groups and bases its opposition on insufficient self govt. The leading and largest Malay organization, The United Malays National Organization still holds that the proposed federation is sufficiently liberal for the present and that the Malays are not ready for self govt. Little interest is displayed by foreign groups except Chinese. Strike by municipal street cleaners in Singapore now going on and may lead to further strikes. Only coal mine in Malaya shut down by strike with rumored offers by British Govt to buy coal from SB Quarry 3 delegates from Malaya to conference of British Empire. Communist party left Jan 21 for London for conference on 26 Feb. Japanese general commanding surrendered personnel reported to British Army he could not be responsible for actions of his troops if repatriation not effected by March. All A 1.

New subject. Hoey departs Singapore 29 Jan for Batavia returns Singapore 4 Feb. Purpose to arrange better liaison with Dutch intelligence and to plan longer trip April.

Burma. On 18 Jan 20,000 Burmese marched on govt offices in Rangoon and stopped all govt activities. Police and troops fired on crowd which dispersed. This crowd represented followers of Aungsans Anit-Fascist Peoples Freedom League plus many other unorganized protesters. On 22 Jan a crowd of about 5,000 repeated act in name of Burma Communist Party. Press reports 260 casualties when police and troops attempted to break up. There now appears a possibility that these 2 organizations may merge to present a united front to British. Order of battle still 4 English Battalions in all Burma with others in India and Malay altered but not moved.

Nei. Scattered fighting continues in Batavia as well as Sumatra. Conferences between Dutch Commission Gen and Indonesian Cabinet to sign draft agreement possibly 27 Jan. Van Hook has announced plan to retire after completion of arrangements for Republic of Borneo completed in Feb.

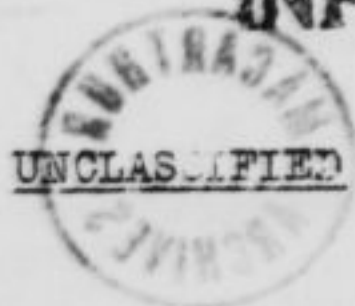

4. It would of course be possible ease our position if we were also able to use some American shipping and your offer is much appreciated. It is not however possible at present to state how much of this shipping we should wish to ask for.

5. We would therefore be grateful if:

(A) You will confirm that British controlled Japanese merchant ships can be released with crews to make an immediate start on repatriation conjunction with British ships already programmed.

(B) You will agree to the employment of the Japanese naval auxiliaries as requested in para 5 of our SEC 1216 of 17 Jan.

(C) That you will keep open your present offer of American shipping.

6. If you are able to reply favorably to para 5 above we will furnish you proposed programme for the repatriation of JSP making use with your approval of a proportion of your offer of American tonnage.

7. We are very reluctant to put forward these proposals both on account of the great help you have given us in the past and because we appreciate your difficulties. Our position here is however so critical that after careful examination we find there is no other course open to us.

Following from C-in-C SEAC. Subj is repatriation of JSP from South East Asia during 1947. Reference your signal CX 69465 of 25 Jan.

1. You will appreciate that the removal of JSP from South East Asia will seriously effect the economic recovery of the countries in which they are now employed and the standard of service accommodation and management. The position is such that we have to replace a high proportion of the 83000 remaining JSP by labour imported from other territories. We are having great difficulty in obtaining any of this imported labour.

2. In view of the labour problem it has already been agreed that repatriation of JSP cannot be completed before end of 1947. Your proposal which involves completing repatriation by 1 June 1947 presents difficulties which we can see no way of overcoming. We were forced therefore to inform London that we could not accept this earlier date.

3. With the use of 4 Japanese merchant ships and 3 Japanese naval auxiliaries it will not be possible for us to find sufficient British tonnage to complete the repatriation during 1947.

1. Plan for release of JSP from SEAC during 47 has now been made and details now being worked out. Regret this has been delayed. Phased program will allow us to release a further 15000 JSP in May beyond the nbrs scheduled for repatriation in the Japanese vessels which you have already allotted.

Cotton incidents, Patel's return to activity, resignation of Joshi from Hyderabad Cabinet and border incidents contribute to increased tempo of developments. 





Delete word "policies" after word regulations in article 2. Add following as clause (E) after clause (D) in article 3 "To the understanding that in the event of failure on the part of either party to supply goods and commodities in the quantities mentioned in schedules A and B the other party shall have the right to effect a proportionate reduction in the goods and commodities to be supplied by it".

2 In schedule B value shown against item one (repeat one) should be reduced to rupees two hundred and forty lakhs or seven million two hundred thousand dollars. Items six thirteen and fourteen (repeat six thirteen and fourteen) valued at rupees forty lakhs in all should be deleted. Value shown against item eight (repeat eight) should be reduced to repeat to rupees fifteen lakhs or four hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

3. Reductions mentioned in paragraph two necessary to balance reduction in quantity jute suggested by SCAP. Arrangement is otherwise in conformity with our sterling balances agreement commitments. It is not necessary to refer revised arrangement.

4. Please confirm if modifications suggested are acceptable. On receipt of your confirmation fair copies will be sent to SCAP for signature after obtaining Government approval. Words "holding plenary powers" in second paragraph of preamble to April agreement were inserted because we understood from Blatchley that Mission had full powers from SCAP Comdivis

In Schedule B value item one (cotton piece goods) reduced to rupees 240 lakhs or \$7,200,000; items six (rayon weaving plant) thirteen (enamelware) and fourteen (padlocks) valued at total of rupees 40 lakhs or \$1,200,000 all deleted; value item eight (hydro-electric plant and equipment) reduced to rupees 15 lakhs or \$450,000.

2. Acceptable that formal document incorporating above changes be prepared and signed by Government of Pakistan. Request form of signature on behalf of SCAP in formal document read as follows:

Additional quantities of Government stockpile coal may be available in future.

3. FOB prices on stockpile coal available for immediate shipment subject to negotiation. Indications are that overall average price is under \$9.00 per MT FOB Japan. Estimated freight via SCAJAP vessels Japan to Karachi \$5.60, Japan to Chittagong \$5.21 per metric ton. These freight estimates are made on assumption that SCAJAP vessels will have return cargoes; if not, freight charge will be higher.

Offers for Japanese Government stockpile coal should be made to Kodan Liquidator, Resources Agency, Ministry of International Trade and Industry, Tokyo.

4. Re export availabilities of privately owned fresh mined coal, suggest that Pakistan request its mission in Tokyo to publicize request for bids from private dealers in Japanese coal.

5. Re par 5 burnsg, specification requested by Pakistan for Japanese telephone cord machinery, data being compiled by interested manufacturers and will be forwarded promptly to Director General Post and Telegraph Dept., Ministry of Communications, Karachi, Pakistan.



three parts.

1. Cotton - Prefer that quantity stated in trade plan remain unchanged. If procurement of greater quantity proves advantageous, more can be bought as trade plan figure is considered minimum and is not binding. However, unless Pakistani prices become more reasonable Japan cannot afford to buy much Pakistani cotton as Pakistani and other buyers of yarn are already saying that prices for Japanese yarn are too high. Greater use of Pakistani cotton would drive prices even higher. Unless current buyers of Pakistani cotton are using "free market money" or unless they have reserves of Pakistani money and fear devaluation cannot understand how they can afford to pay present prices. Japan interested in buying Pakistani cotton but prices must be reasonable when compared with prices of comparable cotton from other sources. Except for small quantity Japan recently bought, offers of Pakistani cotton have been considerably higher than prices currently being paid for comparable American cotton. Under circumstances considered unwise to force procurement sterling cotton.

2. Jute - Prefer that quantity stated in trade plan remain unchanged as figure is not binding. Considering attitude that India might take if total Japanese jute procurement were shifted to Pakistan and universal feeling that settlement of present controversy between India and Pakistan may force jute prices down, cautious policy is being followed here. Reports are that U.S., U.K. and Europe are abstaining from operating in jute market at present. In regard to processing contracts, consider this a matter which should be worked out with individual mills. Since surplus capacity exists suggest that Pakistanis approach mills individually as proposal is not feasible on government-to-government basis. Matter is being investigated and every assistance will be given Pakistanis in consummating such contracts.

MEMO FOR RECORD (Cont'd)

2. The Nippon-Kokan, Tsurumi Shipyard, the builder, has been negotiating with the Thai Government Trade Representative here in Japan and through their agent, the Hedemann and Evers Company in Bangkok for the sale of this vessel. The original price asked by the Company was \$1,110,000 which was later reduced to \$1,040,000. After the pound was devalued, negotiations were entered into which further reduced the price to \$965,800. It is believed that this is a fair and reasonable price.

3. The above message is being sent to Mr. Snell at the request of ESS/IND (Mr. W. A. Thurman) informing him of the status of negotiations and the condition of vessel and that it is necessary to dispose of the vessel as soon as possible. The message requests Mr. Snell to inform the Thailand authorities that dredge is available only from one shipyard and that no other dredge could be built in such a short time at such a low price.

1. Information has been submitted to ESS/IND Division indicating that Mr. Snell suggested to the Siamese Government that bids be requested for the construction of a dredge to be used for the harbor at Bangkok. Negotiations for the purchase of this dredge have been in progress for a period of over three years. The dredge in question is one that was being built for the Siamese Government during the war and was launched but not completed prior to the end of the war. This dredge is at present 60 per cent complete and it is imperative that the construction be completed and the dredge sold as soon as possible to prevent further deterioration of the hull.
