1. Radio, DA 31009, 3 Apr 51 referred to their ltr dtd 8 Mar 51 Subj: Ocean Bill of Lading for SUN 60-0-620, stated that British Embassy advises that yeast program SUN 60-0-620 loaded SS Glenearn, ETA Yokohama 10 May and requested info on state of packing on arrival Japan.

2. The ltr ref to in DA msg was fwd by 1st Ind, GHQ, FEC, AG 552 (8 Mar 51)FO, Subj as above, 22 Mar 51 to CG JLCOM for info and nec action.

3. The DA ltr, subj as above, inclosed an original signed B/L for 2000 cartons of dried food yeast shipped from Jamaica BWI to Yokohama via London on SS LOMBARDY. - M/R: 1. CINCFE cited msg directed JLCOM to take action to proc fol monthly rgmt for the manuf of cans in Korea: Tinsplate sheets 85,000; solder 1.25 Mtons; Lids 2,000,000 and Shoya Sauce 12,000 gals.
2. Cited 8th A msg listed revised quantities required for the manuf of cans in Korea for the remainder of FY 51 and stated that sweetened Shoya Oil is suitable substitute for Shoya Sauce which is not considered sat in canning fish. The revised monthly rgmts are as follows: Tinsplate sheets 200,000; Solder 2 short tons; lids 4,800,000 and Shoya Oil sweetened 1,800 gals.
3. The initial rgmt listed in para 1 above was based on informal info that the production capacity of canning plants in Korea was 35,000 1-lb cans per day. QM 8th A (Lt Col Shields) stated by phone that the prod capacity of the 4 plants in Korea is aprx 2,000,000 cans per month.
4. This msg directs JLCOM to sup items based on revised quantities listed in cited 8th A msg and to sup sweetened Shoya Oil in lieu of Shoya Sauce.

M/R: 1. C/N, G4 to QM, subj: Civ Rel Sups - Diversion from Mil stks in Japan, 6 Mar 51, rqsted auth to secure from DA to trf 800 tons of DDT, 5% spray & 25 power dusters (outfit, delousing, GED Stk Nr 66-0-800) from A stks in Japan to Civ Rel stks to meet a rqmt submitted from 8th Army.

2. Shpmt of DDT 5% spray is not considered feasible, because of the space required to ship. A 5% DDT spray can be made by mixing DDT powder with kerosene. Lt Col Hardin, G4 (KEAD) advised adequate quans of kerosene were in Korea to prepare a 5% DDT spray. On the basis of this info, the DA is being rqsted to auth trfing 100% DDT powder from A stks to meet this rqmt. Aprx 17 lbs of 100% DDT powder is required to make 55 gals of 5% DDT spray. It is ested that 70,000 lbs of 100% DDT powder will make aprx 800 tons of 5% DDT spray. Mr. Sargant, JLCOM QM Sec, on 10 Mar 51, advised that there was aprx 267,000 lbs of 100% DDT powder on hand in Japan with curr additional 63,000 lbs enroute. Further advised that there were 218 outfit, delousing GED, Stk Nr 66-0-800 on hand. Mr. Sargant, JLCOM QM Sec further advised that baring an unforeseen emerg there was on hand and due-in to Army stks adequate quantities of 100% DDT powder to permit the trf of 70,000 lbs of subj powder to Civ Relief without having to immed rqn from the ZI.

3. DA msg cited above advises that the proposed transfer of 100% DDT from Army stks to Civ Relief stks would be approved provided replacement of subj DDT from ZI not immed required.

4. CINCFE msg Z-45944, 26 Mar 51, advised that there are adequate stks of DDT on hand to trf to Civ Relief without having to rqn more from ZI.

5. DA msg DA 29120, 28 Mar 51, advised that Approved Part Program SKO-60-0629 were being issued to cover 70,000 lbs 100% DDT and 25 power dusters to be tited from Army Stks to Civ Relief. Lt Col Hatter, G4 (KEAD) advised by telephone on 29 Mar 51 that the rqmt had been reduced to 35,000 lbs.

6. Purpose of this msg is to advise JLCOM:

- a. To trf the items listed in msg above to civ relief stks.
- b. To ship on first aval lift and furn shipping and marking instrs.
- c. To furn 8th A with name of vessel and ETA.

M/R: 1. Materials for manufacture of cans have been rqsted by 8th A ltr AG 400.38 KCAC, subj: Additional Rqmts for the ROKA for the last half of FY 1951, 19 Feb 51. These materials are nec for manufacture of cans for 12,000,000 lbs of fish for the ROKA. By providing ROKA with these materials for canning purposes, there is less likelihood of the US assuming the burden of supplying this food item to the ROKA. At the present time, production of cans in Korea is halted by lack of materials.

2. Capacity of can manufacturing plants in Korea (aprx 35,000 cans per day) is such that rqmt of 12,000,000 cans represents about 1 year supply. Since materials rqsted are in short sup it is recommended that 1 month sup be procured and a 1 month sup be maintained until further notice.

3. 8th A (Maj Gonzales) has agreed to substitute shoya sauce for oil, cottonseed or soybean. Shoya sauce is aprx 1/3 cost of above oils.

4. Total cost of materials for 12,000,000 cans is estimated to be \$375,000.



3. Re part A, JLCOM msg. JLCOM indicates future planning for Korea will exclude AF and Marine Corps welfare requirements, obtained thru local proc and ZI rqs. JLCOM is logistically responsible to both services and is the only auth proc agent for local proc in Japan, therefore must plan on procuring for other services using their funds. JLCOM is also responsible for forwarding rqs from other services to their respective supplying agency in the ZI.

4. Books and mag received as donations from clubs, units and individuals cannot be classified along with those proc from Army funds, therefore should continue to be issued to all services on a percentage basis.

5. Clothbound books and library sup presently in the JLCOM Distribution library were proc from app and n/app fund sources and from donations, therefore it is impossible to determine what portion belongs to each service. Recommend that these sup be allocated on a troop strength percentage basis.

6. This msg advises CG JLCOM that the issue of SpS rec sup and equip will be in accordance with policy established by CINCPAC msg ZX 31766, 2 Jan 51; that sup planning will include, not exclude, wel sup for AF and Marines proc locally when proc with AF or Marine Corps funds and for sup rqs and received from AF and Marine Corps ZI stocks; that books and mag received as donations will be shipped to all services; that clothbound books and lib sup presently in the Distribution Library will be allocated on a percentage basis between Army and AF; and that AF rqs will be filled from existing stocks or stocks received from the ZI and that future rqs will be honored in accordance with existing policy.

1. DA msg WCL 31229, 8 Dec 50, in reply to CINCFE msg Z 27850, 1 Dec 50, advised that issue of welfare sup and equip from Army stocks in Korea to AF and Marine Corps will be on a reimbursable basis only.

2. In conference between representatives of G1, COM, SS and FEAF on 22 Dec 50 concerning welfare funding and sup of AF and Marine Corps in Korea the following conclusions were reached:

a. AF requirements should be obtained from AF sup agencies in ZI and sup of AF and Marine Corps from Army stocks on reimbursable basis would deplete Army stocks.

b. Sup of AF and Marine Corps by Army on a replenishment in kind basis would obviate depletion of Army stocks and cross-servicing procedure.

c. Because of limited quantity of appropriated fund welfare sup which have been dispatched to Korea and the fact that these cannot now be identified as such, reimbursement by AF and Marine Corps for supplies issued on or before 31 Dec 50 should not be required.

d. To implement DA policy, separate stock record accounts must be maintained for Army, AF and Marine Corps and separate requisitions must be placed for each service.

e. Sup of each of the three services should be on an independent basis after 1 Jan 51 with 8th Army responsible for warehousing, and inter-service issues should be made only in emergencies.




