KMAG Opns Summary No 27 for the period 231800 Dec 49 to 301800 Dec 49. (Reports Control Symbol OGC-04).

1. Location of troops: No change.
2. Opns fr the period: Korean Army: 5 widely separated engagements with small patrols along the parallel. Due to extremely low temperatures guerrilla activity has decreased.
3. Results of Opns: Korean Army Hqs reports 15 North Korean soldiers killed, 3 wounded and 2 captured; 183 guerrillas killed, 2 wounded and 171 captured. South Korean casualties; 4 killed and 9 wounded. In addition to the above the South Korean Army Units in the Chiri-san Area had 8 frozen to death and 191 hospitalized with frostbite.

MDAP for Korea is subject. Ref ROB 708 dtd 16 Dec 49
This radio in 4 parts.

Part 1. Revision subject MDAP dtd 21 Oct (less dollar costs) presented 17 Dec to President Rhee and certain Korean cabinet and Military officers by MDAP survey team in presence of Amb Muccio, Gen Roberts and other Embassy and KMAG officers. Program as summarized below agreed to with one relatively minor change insisted upon contrary to KMAG recommendation. Apparent here that Koreans consider MDAP inadequate and that additional equip all types will be requested.

Part 2. Korean program dtd 21 Oct, revised and agreed to by ROK 17 Dec, is summarized as follows:

A. Ammunition category remains unchanged (\$5,698,305) delivered cost, but several types eliminated to permit increase quantities of calibre .30 carbine and M-1 ammunition.

B. Delivered cost spare parts Ord equip on hand reduced to \$3,146,787 and resulting savings applied to request for replacement items including machine guns, mortars, carbines and rifles. Replacement items total \$384,798. Total Ord delivered cost unchanged from \$9,229,890.

C. Signal category wire and communications (Class 1) equip no change; Radios (Class 2) limited to 3 SCR 188, 32 SCR 193, 64 SCR 694, 4 SCR 506 and 200 SCR 300 with estimated delivered cost \$480,350; Class 3 no change; Class 4, reduce EE-8 telephones to 500 bringing total estimated delivered cost Classes 1, 3 and 4 to \$466,338; Class 6, deleted reel equip and substitute 8575 batteries (BA-48) for SCR 694 and 44,770 batteries (BA-70) for SCR 300 with estimated delivered cost \$305,787; spare parts for equip on hand \$348,798 bringing

1. Embassy in receipt of letter from Pres Rhee dated Dec 20 requesting permission to send 33 Korean Army officers to serve as observers with US Army Forces in Japan for period of 3 months. Letter states Korean officers would be carefully selected, would all be field grade and graduates of Korean Army Service School. Each officer selected would have fair command of English language. Rhee further request additional groups be sent at termination of each 3 months training period. In order that Korean Govt may proceed with plans, Rhee also requests receipt of estimates as to costs of transportation, living and incidentals.

2. I have referred Rhee's request to Chief KMAG who gives it his approval. KMAG feels that objection interposed by CINCPAC in Reference (E) above not insurmountable. Korean Army officers would be observers only and would not be fitted

into T/O positions. Only senior Korean Army officers would be sent in initial groups. Korean Army officers need not be exposed to classified documents or equipment. Korean officers have already been oriented on all weapons common to US Inf Divs except medium tanks and medium artillery thus reducing security problem involved. KNAG can supervise screening to ensure all officers sent have working knowledge English. Intensive screening here would render nil possibility of trouble with dissident elements in Japan. It not felt here that dangerous precedent is being established since Rhee's request is fully in keeping with US policy toward Korea. Korea already receiving bulk of its military support and advice from US. This project is felt to be in furtherance of such effort and could logically be limited to those nations having US Advisory Groups.

3. Project is regarded here as valuable aid in training Korean officers up to US standards of discipline, tactics and administration. It is felt here that results obtained from program would be at relatively negligible cost to US in money and effort. Strongly urge Dept give its full support in obtaining approval this program.

Korean Army:

The 25th Regiment moved from Taejon (1043-1493) to Andong (1168-1524) 1 November.

Part 2. Operation for the period:

A. Korean Army: On 2 November an element of the 22d Infantry was ambushed at Chichon-Dong (1194-11428) by approximately 70 guerrillas. After a short skirmish, the guerrillas disengaged and fled. Elsewhere within South Korea operations against guerrillas continue. A minor engagement with guerrillas occurred on Cheju-Do (951-1116) the first in approximately 3 months. 9 minor border incidents were reported during the period.

Part 3. Results of operations:

Korean Army Headquarters reports 8 North Korean soldiers killed and 1 wounded; 227 guerrillas killed, 3 wounded and 65 captured. South Korean casualties; 24 killed and 29 wounded.

Korean Army: At 0100, 27 Oct, A reported 100-300 armed rebels, wearing Army uniforms, attacked Chinju (1108-1355) within the Naval Zone of responsibility, but were soon repulsed by the Navy and police.

Elsewhere within South Korea: no change.

3. Results of operations: Korean Army Hq reports 22 North Korean soldiers killed and 1 captured; 25 guerrillas killed and 18 captured; 21 South Korean soldiers killed, 40 wounded and 2 captured. During the Ongjin engagement (Operations Report Number 17) Korean Army claims 400 North Koreans killed, 600 wounded and 8 captured.

At weekly conference with Foreign Correspondents this morning, Pres Rhee was asked about closing of Korean Schools in Japan by Jap Govt. Rhee remarked this was "serious situation." He intimated SCAP seemed powerless to ease situation. He said he has instructed Korean Rep in Japn to "find out what is going on." Rhee said it reported schools in question were supported by Communists, so "we want to find out the truth." Rhee added: "If the Japanese Govt or SCAP shows discrimination against Korean there, we will have to consider it a serious situation. We have endured the anti-Korean attitude long enough."

Rhee also termed Ongjin clash "a very serious situation." He said it largest scale attack thus far made in that area and it might be beginning of trouble, adding he had it from three different sources, Korean, Chinese and American; that North Korea "is getting ready to come south." He went on to say "large numbers of Chinese Communists already are in North Korea. Soviet authorities are encouraging them take action now. According reports that come to me, it seems that Chinese Communists and Korean Communists in the north are concentrating their forces to come south and take all Korea." Continuing, Rhee said: "We will not let up on our preparedness. Our friends in Washington, realizing the critical situation we are in, should help us materially as much as they can. The trouble is it takes time. It is difficult to decide. Our people are clamoring for weapons. Our police are not too well equipped. Reports indicate that the US has given us large sums of money, but most of it was spent on military government. The large quantity of weapons and munitions left here by the US Army was turned over to the Korean Govt. It looks big to a small country but our Army is not sufficiently equipped. Everyone wants weapons to protect themselves, their

homes and their villages." Rhee then went on emphatically to state: "I would be willing to sell anything we possess to get some weapons. The US is doing much but it is for economic aid-hiatus buildings, industry, etc."

Rhee said he did not feel his program for 100,000 standing Army and 200,000 National Guard was strong enough." We are not a mil nation and anyone knowing our situation could not call us a mil nation," he said. "We think our needs are most urgent. We need arms." Rhee then added he did not ask the US to fight for Korea, but he wanted Korea to fight for itself and clean up local situation. Continuing, Rhee said: "We cannot move without starting an international situation. We need weapons. Men and women both want to prepare so when our enemies come in we can resist and you'll see some fighting. Korean people will not yield. They'll resist." Indicating he felt it would be easier to defend Yalu River boundary than 38th parallel, Rhee deplored fact that Korean in north and south could not get together to settle their troubles by themselves without danger of starting world war. He then expressed hope UN could do something to help keep peace. Addressing correspondents, Rhee then said: "Please have faith in us. We will do it if we have aid. We can clean it up in the north. But you say it will mean world war, so we keep quiet."

The situation remained static over the 15th of October and a counter attack, launched by Korean Army troops at 160530 October, regained the lost positions. The situation at present is quiet with brief exchanges of artillery fire. Elsewhere along the border; only minor patrol action. Within South Korea operations to eliminate guerilla activity continues.
3. Results of operations: Casualties at Ongjin: North Korean killed or wounded (unknown) 5 captured South Korean 30 killed 300 wounded, casualties within South Korea; guerrillas 201 killed 23 captured.

In general, representatives agreed to recommend to respective governments:

Para 1. Reorganization plan establishing Korean Air Force as separate from Korean Army approved by Cabinet and President. Request through diplomatic channels for United States Advisors and aid will no doubt follow. strength and potential of Korean Air Force is over 1800 officers and enlisted men which is adequate to support the above strength of aircraft after proper transition training. Personnel could be increased to support 100 fighters within 6 months.

B. Consideration has been given to procuring civilian instructors at no cost to United States which is a feasible solution for transition training only. Necessary concomitant proficiencies in gunnery, tactics, field operations and other strictly military matters could be provided best by military instructors.

C. Future demands against the United States for support for Korean Air Force should not exceed the following,

(1). Two officer pilot instructors and 8 enlisted men as outlined in OURAD Number 380 should be sufficient to support proposed strength of 40 fighters. Any future expansion by the Korean Air Force would be gradual enough to allow such a staff to cope with additional demands for training.

(2). Weapons demands should include those integral to the original aircraft plus a 10 per cent pool.

(3). There is sufficient stockpile of calibre 50 ammunition here to handle all requirement short of all out combat operations.

(4). Signal equipment above that integral to the original aircraft and above a normal supply of spare parts can be manufactured locally.

(5). Normal replacement parts should be provided with the original issue of aircraft. All items over and above would have to be manufactured locally.

Question: "Concerning the Japanese gov't's dissolution of Korean Leftist Organizations and some Rightist organizations, you told us the other day that it was very unreasonable and that you would take some countermeasures. How is it going? And it is said all the Korean people in Japan will be registered. Thus some people are afraid that the registration system will provide an opportunity to oppose the Korean people. What do you think?"

Answer: "As for the registration, the gov't ordered all the diplomatic agencies in the world not only in Japan to have all the Korean people registered in order to know the number of people and to protect them."

As for the Japanese oppression of the Koreans in Japan, I have never received any further news, and I think the problem is being settled smoothly."



Defense Ministry announced morning 3 Oct Maj Gen Chae Byung Duk relieved as Chief of Staff Korean Army. No reason given yet though Chae disliked by President and recently subject sniping campaign. Chae refuses reassignment pending results self requested investigation. Final decision by President expected next few days. At full cabinet meeting 4 Oct Brig Gen Shin Tai Yong appointed Acting Chief of Staff from previous assignment Asst Chief of Staff for Civilian Components. Shin formerly administrative officer under Japanese and prior to last assignment was Asst Chief of Staff for Administration Korean Army. Considered Shin lacking qualifications for new assignment and will probably be stooge. Brig Gen Chung Il Kwon, considered outstanding officer on General Staff, remains Deputy Chief of Staff charged with direction of operations. Brig Gen Kim Suk Won, CG 1st Div, also relieved and may be tried for alleged involvement highjacking and smuggling operations across 38th Parallel. Kim previously high in President's favor but his allegedly crooked activities possibly caused estrangement. His relief regarded beneficial Korean Army due past reluctance to obey orders, particularly with regards proper tactical distribution his troops. Cabinet 4 Oct also appointed Col Kim Chung Yul Chief of Staff for Air, marking inauguration separate Air Force. He ~~was~~ formerly captain fighter squadron leader Japanese Air Force, and considered very capable.
