Subj is summary of turnover arrangements between Army and ECA as approved by Draper and Hoffman. Arrangements between Army, ECA and State will be subj of separate msg. This msg in 10 parts.

Part 1. Executive order providing for transfer of functions in Korea now under review by bur of budget and Attorney General. All working towards Jan 1 effective date. Will advise you as soon as date is firm.

Part 2. Basis for transfer unallocated funds. ECA estimate of requirements as of 29 Nov 48. Relief activities \$25,942,207, rehabilitation activities \$22,684,899 and administration activities \$2,775,000 or total \$51,402,106. GARIOA program adjustments (food) \$6,963,870 thus making revised ECA reqmts total \$44,438,236. Against these reqmts avail Army assets 1 Jan 49 are: Cash \$26,618,208 and rehabilitation commodities (pipeline purchase now under procurement) \$6,169,173 or a total of \$32,787,381, thus indicating ECA deficits as of Jan 49, of \$11,650,855. As offset against deficit Army guarantees \$5,000,000 from already appropriated funds after Feb program review. Remaining deficit would therefore be \$6,650,855.

A. Estimated unallocated balance GARIOA Korean apportionments. Cash position of \$26,618,208 may be reduced by procurements made at request ECA during Dec 48 but increase credit for goods would mean no net change. Of this amount \$2,775,000 will be needed for ECA administration expenses. Present estimates indicated

Army, within its \$55,000,000 limitation for administrative expenses for total GARIOA program, can make available approx \$1,330,000 for administrative needs of Korea program leaving deficit of over \$1,400,000. If, after Feb program reviews, deficit cannot be covered from available funds, Army will seek with approval bureau budget, congressional approval for an increase of this required amount in administrative ceiling limitation. This action will be supported by ECA in whatever manner bureau budget may recommend.

B. Pipeline purchases of \$5,169,173 are being committed pursuant ECA request.

C. If after Feb review GARIOA program and after simultaneous review of Korean program by ECA, a deficit shall appear, Army will endeavor cover such agreed deficit from already appropriated GARIOA funds. In case Army finds it has insufficient funds to cover such deficit and recovery requirements for Japan, Army, with ECA support for Korea portion deficiency, will seek deficiency appropriation from congress.

D. In event so called turnover stockpile administrative goods cannot be effected on nonreimbursable basis, Army will appropriations must be reimbursed from GARIOA funds for value stock pile, and amount thus reimbursed will be added to \$6,650,855 deficit and covered as provided for in Par C above. The value of reimbursable items of stockpile is estimated at approx \$1,500,000.

E. Division residual GARIOA cash between State and ECA will be as specified in Presidential Order transferring respective functions to State and ECA.

Part 3. State has under consideration possibility turnover "operation 38" stockpile to South Korean Govt.

Part 4. Power ship "x Jacona" will be available to ECA for use in Korea at nominal expense and on conditions determined by separate memo of understanding between Army, Navy and ECA. It is understood power barge "Electra" can be made available ECA at nominal expense.

Part 5. At request ECA Army issuing ltr intent to KOSCO, agreeing reimburse KOSCO for out of pocket expense incurred by sending its pers and equipment to Korea. Should contract with KOSCO fail to be consumated.

Part 6. Goods obligated under FY. 48 funds, as yet undelivered but expected to be delivered between 1 Jan and 30 Jun 49, will be considered in Feb review of programs. Transp costs these goods

delivered between 1 Jan and 30 Jun 49 will be borne by ECA. Understood such cost if they arise may require revision ECA requirements.

Part 7. Programmed requirements under Project 123 for Korean Fishing Industry will be procured by Army. It is expected that large share requirements will be available from Army surpluses at reduced costs and savings thus realized will be applied against deficit.

Part 8. Following takeover by ECA, Army will maintain and operate terminal facilities in Japan for relay of rad teletype communication between Korea and Wash under State Army arrangement existing for other areas (non reimbursable).

Part 9. Transp persons and things from Yokohama to Inchon will be arranged in field on space available basis at no cost to appropriated funds.

Part 10. It is understood that services of certain Army officers now assigned in Korea who are essential to continuation of Korean Aid Program by ECA and who are willing serve with ECA in Korea will be loaned on request to ECA until replacements may be recruited by ECA but in no case beyond Jun 30, 49.

West Java. Dutch meeting strong opposition and inflicting heavy casualties mooping up area bounded by Serang, Keragilan, Pandeglang, Rangkas Bitoeng.

Central Java. Siliwangi troops from Magelang Area infiltrating westward. Some reaching Tasikmalaja Area. Siliwangi Div Chief of Staff captured. Strong concentration of Tni in Japara Area, north-west of Semarang.

East Java, Dutch column from Ploso took Djombang via Modjokerto. Unable reach Djombang from Ploso direct. Tni troops out of Malang trying to reach mountains northeastward.

Sumatra. Bengkalis and other points along selat (strait) Pandjang occupied by Amphibious troops against stiff opposition. Pakanbaroe not yet captured. About 150 paratroops dropped 1400, 29th, occupied points near Djambi including air strip. About 2 companies river borne troops approaching Djambi from east. Few fires and little opposition so far met. Ground forces from Palembang approaching air fields near Babat (may be south Babat). Many large fires observed. No news of operations against Teloek Beoeng or Benkoelen. Above from Dutch via Naval Liaison.

Mil observers still immobilized. During discussion at Milez of provisional plan for redeployment of mil observers if called upon by GOC or consular commission, Mayer Strongly emphasized this paper was not to be transmitted to Dutch until after approval by GOC, whereupon all French mil observers angrily walked out of Milez. Later French absence for the 1st time from Dutch briefing to recognized intelligence officers noted.

News med report very few people on normally crowded Jogja sts. Early curfew imposed. Much shootings still going on. Soerakarat (Solo) much destruction of buildings.

total FY 50 nitrogen requirements.

"Figuring that ammo sulphate is indicated fertilizer for  
rice lands and that approx 65% of Korea's nitrogen requirements  
should be in the form of ammo sulphate, FAOA was requested to  
schedule quantities above for FY 50."

"Dutch opened campaign 29 Dec against Tellekbetoeng and Djambi South Sumatra and against Pakanbaroe North Sumatra. Latter reported captured. No details avail. Fr Naval Liaison confirmed by ~~all~~ sources here. No info on Java opns.

"Local Dutch determined not to have mil experts operate in field. SC resolution 28 Dec calling on foreign consuls to check Dutch complaint with SC resolutions, if confirmed apparently ends GOC and with it mil experts. US Army mil observers are asgd and AF mil observers attached to AMADJA. USN are asgd to Navy Liaison Office for dy with GOC.

"With end of repls schedule in Jan there will remain in Java (exclusive of repls halted en route) fol officers:

Army 3 and 1 WO.

AF 4.

Navy 3.

"If any are to operate with Consular Commission or as add liaison officers proper orders should be issued. Mayer leaves for Tokyo and PI on 7 Jan. Sgd Mayer."

West Java: Column from Pandelang reached Malingping and is approaching Pangrangan. Operations practically ended.

Central Java: Small drive Djocja southwest to Wates going on.

East Java: Marine units reached Madioen from Ngawi. Djombang taken by column from Babat. Toelroengagoeng south of Kediri also captured 2 Dutch planes, type not mentioned, shot down by "Jap" operated antiaircraft in mountains west of Madioen. Still mopping up Siliwangi division remnants in mountains between Wonosobo and Magelang. Large TNI groups in coastal areas south of Wonogiri. Others south of Toeren East Java. Dutch will contain and starve these pockets. Total Dutch casualties to 27 Dec, 41 killed, 99 wounded. Deputy Chief Staff says Java operations practically over. Next moves in Sumatra. Also Dutch will no longer accept military observers under GOC, but might under Consular Commission. Three French military observers present at Dutch briefing. All above from US Naval Liaison.

Military observers still immobilized by local high comd despite statement Dutch delegate in Paris that military observers "will be allowed to visit all places." Close fraternization by French military observers with Dutch command at this stage, while all info to other military observers or military experts banned by Dutch, a serious embarrassment to military experts. Dutch press in large Indonesian cities starting smear campaign against GOC and military observers.

C 3 report that Sukarno and family, Hatta, and 8 or 10 others were flown to Semarang 19 Dec, thence possibly to island south of Java. So far Dutch have not mentioned prisoners.

Part 1.

West Java. Pandeglång and Rangkasbetoeng occupied AM 25 Dec. Small force moving south from Pandeland intending junction near Malingping with force moving west from Pelaboehanratoe (latter has reached Bajah and presumably occupied only Java gold mine at Tjikotok).

Central Java. Mop-up of Siliwangi troops continues.

East Java. Madiown and Maospati air field occupied by colm from Solovia Paaosan over Lawoe Mountain. Armor from Solovia Sragen reached Mantingan. Colm from Babat reached Ploso. No news of colm from Ngaji. TNI reported retiring to prepare defensive positions south of Malang as well as position reported earlier. Djombang and Toeloengagoeng only maj centers not yet taken.

Sumatra. No news of progress. Gen Spoor states no military action against Atjeh contemplated. Also states campaign has reached mopping up and consolidation state. Dutch daily intelligence handout stopped and will be called only when situation warrant. All above from Dutch. In newly occupied areas, Dutch continuing to pass out food, textiles, other supplies kept from Republic by blockade. This in line with original Dutch plan, see AMADJA WEEKA 2-17 May 1948. Dutch report all but 3 Republicans placed in house arrest in Batavia have been released. No info on Republican leaders arrested in Djocja. Announcement by Sjafruddin Prawiranegara, Republican Economic Minister now somewhere in Sumatra "Acting for emerg govt," stated 24 Dec Republic conditions on cease-fire order are:

1. Release of Republican govt;
2. Dutch withdrawal to old status quo line;
3. De Facto and De Jure recognition of Republic's sovereignty over Java, Sumatra and Madura;
4. Formation Indonesian govt on democratic basis without Dutch interference;
5. Withdrawal of all Dutch forces in Indonesia.

Part 2. Comment on Republican resistance and scorched earth activities only fragmentary reports difficult to confirm are avail. Practically all info comes from Dutch. They report considerable road and bridge destruction, delaying and forcing rerouting of troop movements. Many bridges are over very deep gorges. Partial destruction Kalikonto Power plant, Taepoe oil installations, and buildings and utilities in many towns also reported.

Batavia-Candoeng railway sabotaged night 26-27, but service expected restored 27. Dutch comd has ordered all military observers remaining in field, except Cemarang, into Batavia.

If Dutch accept present SC Resolution, military observers can rapidly observe and report on release of political prisoners, but observation of cease-fire order without status quo line, with Dutch generally considering main routes and cities in central and west Java, and with Republican leadership confined and their forces scattered in pockets throughout area, is an impossible task, even with Dutch cooperation which at best will be half-hearted. If and when military observers are withdrawn, recommend 1 Army and 1 Air Force officer be retained here and detailed as Liaison Officers to observe situation in conjunction with US Naval Liaison Officer. It will be a long time before situation stabilizes. Signed Mayer.

Johja, many fires started after occupation now burning. Scorched earth also at Magelang and Tjepoe and some fires reported near Djambi Sumatra. Batavia very quiet Spoor's Staff officer officially informed Mayer 22 Dec that HRC Beel directed all mil observers be returned to Batavia. Same orders issued Dutch field forces 2 days ago. Dutch apparently believe GOC and mil extended and mil observers soon depart. They do not want any outsiders observing mil action. With Republicans under arrest, few if any, independent information sources available. Dutch information now given only to recognized foreign liaison and intelligence officers not MILEB. To avoid repetition recommended US Naval Liaison situation messages be made available by Navy to Alacja addressees and they be so informed.

"A. Nicotine sulphate requirement reduced to 10 tons instead of 100 tons shown in estimate. 100 tons figure assumed to be clerical error.

"B. Potassium sulphate (50 per cent K 20) 68,560 tons.  
"Re potassium sulphate it is strongly recommended that you concur in reduction this requirement for FY 1950 to 40,000 tons. (50% K 20).

"Table 3, Project 123 FY 50 budget estimates shows historical usage 58,900 M/T, 100% K 20 and proposed rate of allocation 1947 as 12,920 M/T.

"FY 49 application could not exceed proposed FY 47 rate, therefore, 3 time increase on FY 50 would appear indefensible.

"World shortage K 20 leads to belief that Korea would be fortunate to secure as much as 20,000 M/T 100% K 20. Request your views on reduction requirement for budget presentation to 20,000 M/T." Advise soonest.

Dr Pattabhi Sita Ramayya, President-elect of Congress, probably will lead opposition to report at Jaipur Congress session in Gandhi Nagar where he will assume office.

Comment: Despite protest by Pattabhi and other vigorous advocates Linguistic Provinces embassy believes leadership Nehru and Patel will prevail and subject will be postponed indefinitely or at least 5 years. Indian Natl Congress session in Jaipur begins Dec 16 at Gandhi Nagar.

Comment: Session will afford opportunity for reiteration high ideals of Congress, exposition principles of party, tributes to Gandhi and development feeling among rank and file of membership that they too are part of great organization. No significant changes in Govt internal or foreign policy are anticipated as result session agreement to establish diplomatic relations with Rumania.

Comment: Embassy believes initiative for recent test of diplomatic relations with various satellite states comes from them, not India end of General Assembly session Paris.

Comment: Little notice taken locally, although returning India delegates give lip service accomplishments. Underlying attitude bit aloof because of east-west stalemate and disappointments re SC attitude Kashmir, Hyderabad issues.

**Economic:**

Addressing associated Chambers Commerce at Calcutta Dec 13, GOI Finance Minister Matthai mentioned anomalous marked inflationary trend coupled with low level investment and business activity. Said immediate GOI objective to stabilize rather than deflate prices. Also, that GOI proposed nationalization certain industries would require long time owing inadequate pers and finances, and that full scope should continue for private including foreign business interests.

Comment: Good speech, and should help counteract Governor General's recent remarks that in democracy such as India business must count on uncertainties in govt policy. Certain lack of confidence still prevails in commercial circles and GOI obviously concerned over weak response re private and govt financing.

Recent Indo-Pakistan agreement (see above) calls for stepping up exchange of essential commodities.

Comment: Neither side has delivered commodities at rate previously agreed upon, and future implementation to full extent remains questionable.

Counsellor Brit Emb called on State Dept Nov 26 leaving fol memo for info US Govt UK views re National Public Service Bill. Brit Counsellor also requested views his govt be transmitted SCAP for his consideration.

"The bills now before Jap Diet which contain various proposals amend existing labor legislation appear to His Majesty's Govt in UK, on basis their existing info, to be defective in several important respects.

"In re Natl Public Service Bill, it is view HMG that Article 98 should include provision for independent arbitration in case of failure to agree on questions wages and conditions of work. It follows from this that HMG consider that this article should not contain prohibition collective agreements.

"In re Public Corp Bill, it is view HMG that legislation this kind, which is apparently intended to be permanent, should not contain an unqualified provision banning strikes by employees in govt enterprises. The FEC policy on 'Principles for Japanese Trade Unions,' empowers SCAP to prohibit strikes and other work stoppages which would directly prejudice objectives of needs of occupation. An absolute ban on strikes by employees of govt enterprises in all circumstances appears, however, to go far beyond this provision of FEC policy. It is suggested, as a

"In view HMG, an unqualified prohibition of strikes by employees in govt enterprises not necessarily calculated to shake any hold Communists may have on unions but might, on contrary, strengthen it. If genuine grievances remained unremedied widespread illegal action might occur, with result that law would either not be enforced (with resultant discredit to Jap Govt) or that there would inevitably be an increase in subversive activities. A further consideration is that it is difficult to see how an unqualified prohibition strikes would be confined only to employees in govt enterprises, many of whom are engaged on work similar to that in non-govt enterprises. There would almost certainly be pressure from private employers to extend the provision."

Counsellor state orally his govt feels real difference opinion exists between some members your staff and his govt on certain underlying principles of rights of govt employees for which reason his govt feels it necessary present its views to US and ask that they be brought officially your attention. Counsellor made it clear that, altho his govt feels that absolute ban in permanent legislation on right govt enterpriese workers to strike would be undesirable, his govt has no objection your stating in advance that strike by any particular group or groups of govt employees would be contrary interest occupation and would not be permitted. He stated he was instructed by his govt to make a statement (set out below) to FEC because in its opinion the proposed bill does not include right ordinary govt workers make collective contract with govt. "His Majesty's Govt in UK would regret enactment any permanent legislation which failed provide independent arbitration machinery.

"I do not propose, Mr Chairman, to comment on proposed legislation re other workers in govt enterprises, but my govt will no doubt instruct me to make observations when there is a little more info available as to underlying intentions of relevant legislation."



it represents fairest and most generally satisfactory solution.

B. In case of Libya we have great sympathy for expressed desires of local inhabitants for independence. In considering our position on this territory however we have found it necessary to give weight to 2 important factors.

First is fact there is not sufficient community of interest between Cyrenaicans and Tripolitanians to make practical a united Libya at this time.

Second is fact neither Cyrenaicans nor Tripolitanians ready for independence at this time, fact recognized by 4 Power Commission of Investigation which was sent to territories in accordance terms Italian Peace Treaty. Both Cyrenaica and Tripolitania will require guidance and assistance before they are able stand on own feet. Since trusteeship system devised to meet just such situation, we feel both territories should receive guidance and assistance which they will require by establishing trusteeship.

C. In case of Cyrenaica, Great Britain is, in our opinion, admirably and best suited to be trustee. Relations between Brit and Cyrenaicans are cordial, and we believe Brit have given abundant evidence their good faith in leading dependent peoples toward selfgovernment and independence. Further, more security than Communist world depends in large measure on Brit maintaining strong position in Mediterranean Middle East area, and importance in this regard of Brit trusteeship for Cyrenaica is obvious by reason of geographic position of area. This govts sympathy with the present Italian Govt is well known. We have exerted every effort since war to strengthen present Italian regime and ensure that new Democratic Italy assumes proper place in family of nations. In line with this general policy this govt looks with favor on principle of participation of Italy in administration her former colonies in Africa and for that reason is advocating Ital Somaliland be placed under Ital trusteeship. For similar reasons and in recognition of problems imposed on Italy by demographic pressure we feel most strongly that former Italian residents of Tripolitania should be permitted return their homes.

In case of Cyrenaica however violent hostility of local inhabitants towards Italy coupled with Gr Brits wartime pledge that area would never again be placed under Ital Administration precludes in our opinion any consideration of Italy as trustee for Cyrenaica.

D. As regards Tripolitania this govt has rejected possibility immediate independence for much same reasons as in case Cyrenaica. We have discarded possibility multi-lateral or direct UN trusteeship as administratively impractical and

politically dangerous in light of world situation as it has developed since end World War II. We believe single power trusteeship most desirable but have been unable decide which power best fitted assume responsibility and because of wide divergency opinions this subject and complexity problem we consider additional year study by UN fairest and most just approach to problem.

E. Re Somaliland, we feel Italian Trusteeship most desirable solution. Administration this territory will afford govt of new Democratic Italy chance it so earnestly desires to demonstrate its ability take share in task of educating and assisting backward people.

F. Our proposal for cession of greater part Eritrea to Ethiopia is based on Ethiopias claim for access to sea (only port worthy of name is Massawa), economic ties between 2 countries, and fact that large proportion is kin to Northern Ethiopians by race and religion. We have proposed outright cession this territory to Ethiopia because it is obvious that Eritreas economic and political future lies naturally with Ethiopia. We are not advocating cession of west Fiji province to Ethiopia since problems raised by its predominantly Moslem population seem to us to make postponement and further study advisable.

You will note that many of above comments are designed for countries which may favor return of Ital administration to other of her former colonies that Somaliland and such arguments will not be needed or at any rate probably should not be emphasized in those countries which have little or no pro Italian sentiments.

Report immediately reactions to your approach and repeat your replies to Paris for US delegation and to London.

"We are reliably informed that Generalissimo has expressed intention continue fight against Communists as long as he remains alive. He expresses confidence in his ultimate victory and insists that present military situation not beyond repair and that Hsuehou Garrison will check further Communist advance toward Yangtze. Similar confidence expressed today by Cheng Kai-Min to Military Attache and same views have been indicated to us by others close to Generalissimo.

"This confidence in victory and desire to fight is not shared by any except those who by long and close association with Generalissimo could not survive Communist dominated govt, and their confidence is not deep. It is true that there are some officials who believe govt armies can temporarily hold defense line along Yangtze and Huai Rivers and that American intervention will allow govt to build base in south China wherein govt will be secure and from which govt can reconquer north. Those holding this view count on American intervention and are encouraged in this delusion by Generalissimo. Subj matter of latter was given United Press by Foreign Office Press Office and published Nov 7, and stories indicating immediate increase of American Aid are regularly appearing in govt-controlled vernacular press.

"Bulk of populace and virtually all officials except Generalissimo and immediate entourage appear to hold views contrary to above, are resigned to early Communist victory, and believe that immediate cessation hostilities would be in best interest to all

concerned. In past week Chang Chih-Chung telegraphed Generalissimo advising peaceful solution present conflict. Generalissimo summoned him Nanking and since arrival, presumably with Generalissimo's knowledge, Chang has conferred with Soviet Ambassador, seeking means to peaceful solution. He has indicated that results conversations not altogether satisfactory but that they will continue. Liu Chih, Vice Pres of Control Yuan, has held similar talks with Soviet Embassy. Vice Pres. Li Tsung-Jen also advocates cessation hostilities, and states Generalissimo is sole stumbling block negotiated settlement. So far as we are aware, peace group has no plans forcing their views on Generalissimo, and it is likely that they are at least partially deterred in this by reiterated propaganda of resistance group that American intervention will yet save the day.

"In general, stalemate in govt now obtains, with most officials seemingly paralyzed and incapable action. For example, local military commanders are hesitant approach Generalissimo for purpose concrete planning defense Nanking and they fear to consult him to plan for flight of govt. Also, whether still hopeful of American intervention, fearful of Generalissimo's wrath or from some other motivation, none of more important proponents of peace move appear able or willing translate their desire for peace into effective political action. Meanwhile, apprehension mounts within city. Some ranking officials, among whom is Minister National Defense, are making individual preparations for flight to Canton or elsewhere. Refugees from Pengpu are pouring into city with rumors Communists are attacking that city. Communist currency today quoted on black market, and on north bank of rivers is preferred to gold yuan.

"In this situation, we believe crux of matter is whether there will be orderly transfer of power from present to successor govt. Those favoring peace apparently have no means making views prevail except by some such method replacement Generalissimo through coup, for there does not appear any likelihood that he will give up struggle of own accord. On contrary, he is, in his present temper, much more likely to attempt defend his capital, and, as battle finally goes against him, to commit suicide. Thus, there appears little likelihood of formation temporary caretaker govt comprised of persons able and willing to negotiate with Communists. Should present govt end in death or unplanned and disorderly flight of Generalissimo and his entourage, there is every prospect of breakdown of auth in that part of country still under Natl control, with attendant high incidence of civil disorder. Under these conditions, whatever military resistance is still maintained will be sporadic, generally ineffective and

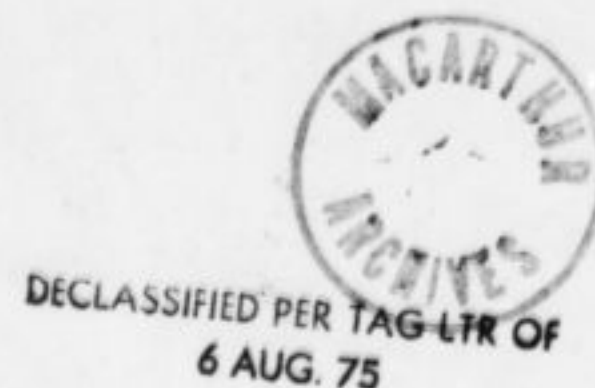

"I have today conferred with representatives of Pan American and Northwest Airlines and of American President and US lines. We are agreed that sufficient people desire immediate evacuation to fill at least 1 passenger ship sent emergency basis. I recommend Dept give urgent consideration to sending such a ship to Shanghai. I do not know whether this can be done in view of west coast shipping strike but feel due to emergency special arrangements might be made or alternatively a ship might be sent from east coast.

"Failing such arrangements and in view of pertinent deterioration of military and political conditions, I believe that consideration should be given to orderly intermediate evacuation to points in Japan or other neighboring safe points. Pan American and Northwest representatives indicated they believed their companies would cooperate in running a shuttle service to such points.

"Airlines point out there is insufficient gasoline in Shanghai to handle an emergency evacuation. I believe this should be immediately remedied.

"Failing measures such as those outlined above, I am afraid of a stampede if and when it becomes evident Shanghai going to change hands. Under best circumstances an emergency evacuation would cause serious hardships and losses; and I feel it important

Stikker-Hatta talks in Jogja in seemingly friendly atmosphere and apparently were achieving some results until sudden recall Stikker staff, which seemed cast gloom in Jogja. b. Lines to be secured by normal deposits with Hong Kong Shanghai and Chartered of sterling plus dollars of 25%. We cannot go above this in cash and we would run into legal problems if we back with an additional 25% OJEIFF indorsement as U.S. banks would then be entitled to an equivalent 25% cash deposit on OJEIFF cotton loan.

c. Exchequer as alternative willing to grant budlee facilities over and above present 6,000,000 line for a cover period of approximately six months.

Dutch patrol clashed with armed group in village of Bitingan (Central Java). Mil observers believe this clash may be result of misunderstanding on exact location of SQL. 22 cases of banditry reported by Dutch in central Java between 14th and 24th Oct.

TNI troops crossed SQL without Dutch knowledge at Trejej. (Central Java) to capture Communists.

No further reports on Communist activity in Republic Central Java. Republic forces presumably still slowly conducting clean up action.

Abdul Kadir resignation position as Deputy Lieutenant Governor General accepted 1 Nov. He is now at Hague and may possibly take post in interim USI. Foreign Minister Stikker arrived night 31 Oct. Dr L J M Beel appointed High Commissioner of Crown in Indonesia 30 Oct and due Batavia this week.

Part 2. Comment. Probability of early renewal Dutch Republic negotiations again fast fading. Dutch maintain cessation truce violations prerequisite and also have begun implement banishment of, "undesirable" Republicans. Republicans insist on immunity guarantees of persons comprising their delegation, some of whom have already been listed on Dutch Banishment orders.

Dutch allegations of truce violations fall into 2 main categories.

1st. Mass infiltration primarily into areas of former pockets in west Java, where some hold-outs and probably buried arms exist. Difficult to see how this process could progress without Republican Govt knowledge and preclude tacit approval. Plans probably initiated during May (see 2-17th May and subsequent WEEKAS) as result stalemated negotiations plot planned reprisal for feared new police action. Possibly that Reds primarily responsible for these tactics, but many demobilized and "deserting" TNI also took part. Infiltrates also included persons who merely wished to return to homes because of poor economic situation in Republican areas. Movement reached peak in Aug-Sep but completely subsided after start of Red coup. Dutch claim over 11,000 now return their territory, many intact and well armed. Dutch make occasional contact causing casualties and capture of personnel and arms.

2d. Category, crossings and firing across SQL by armed groups usually bandit gangs bent on loot but sole instances of TNI and DMZ police. These, especially bandit activities, are increasing. Dutch now freely cross SQL Central Java in claimed hot pursuit, returning upon completion mission. This seriously menaces truce agreement. Mil experts urging GOC call special security committee meeting to discuss means of terminating truce violations but doubtful this can be implemented in present situation.

Dutch manifesting increased resentment presence mil observers. This indicated by slurring news articles, semi-official and even official digs. Some resentment due to British and French mil observers dependents permitted here while Dutch dependents severely restricted. Dutch consistently hold Indonesian settlement internal matter. While Hague accepted GOC and mil observers (denying, however, UN jurisdiction), local authorities at times have been bitter by what they consider unwarranted interference in purely domestic and easily settled issue.

Dutch circles here regard Republic's reply to proposals for renewed negotiations unsatisfactory and expect Stikker to take strong stand with Republic, requiring proof Republic can fulfill truce requirements before negotiations can start. Recent resignations Van Mook and Abdul Kadir, arrival Stikker and Beel, actions Netherlands Parliament passing Interim Indonesian Bill again makes apparent Dutch determination to soon create Interim USI sans Republic. Position of Republic has deteriorated considerably since Irenville due to stalemate negotiations, economic blockade by land and sea, internal unrest due to degeneration economic situation, and finally Red abortive coup which still has lasting results. 2. Multi-lateral discussions leading toward the adjustment of the Japanese economy in light of the economies of ECAFE countries is believed to be useful and highly desirable. However, view the use of ECAFE for actual multi-lateral negotiations regarding Japanese trade agreement is premature. Problems sure to arise regarding ultimate level of Japanese economy which would involve FEC directives and which problems might better be dealt with on a bilateral basis. Trade arrangements looking towards a higher level of trade now negotiated with a number of ECAFE countries and others are in prospect.
