Department confirmed today "2/27) Supreme Court request for stay of execution death sentences 7 German war criminals to give their counsel opportunity to apply for "writ of certificate." McCloy and Handy have been instructed accordingly. It is understood counsel will be allowed 30 days to apply for writ, which, if issued, will bring case before Supreme Court. As opportunity offers, media shid point out this further stay of sentence is strictly procedural and in accordance with traditions of Angle Saxon Law. It shid be noted that this action does not substantively alter decisions made.

3. "Peace Council."

Pending further clarification and guidance, media shid avoid speculation and comments on proposal of Communist sponsored "World Peace Council" at recent Berlin meeting to send delegation to UN "to demand the UN return to its original purpose of preserving the peace."

As exception to above principle Brit will not agree to Jap participation in GATT even as non-voting observer.



1. Having briefed Comwith PRIMINS in Jan on UK views on question Jap Peace Treaty, FONOFF has passed on to Comwiths substance Dulles-Gascoyne discussions in Tokyo. FONOFF is now attempting put its recent thinking on paper from informal communication to Dept thru Brit Emb.

these views represent thinking of UK It will be stated

only and not necessarily those of other Comwiths.

2. FONOFF remains strongly in favor multilateral treaty and is attempting work out formula which wld postpone indefinitely decision as to what govt wld represent China. With this in mind it is now drafting an "accession clause" which wid be to effect that as signatories not in agrmt as to who shid represent China accession of China to treaty shild be delayed until this question is decided among other signatories. Similarly, another clause sld recognize that Japan cedes Formosa to China but the interpretatin of manner it wid be ceded and identity of Govt to acquire Formosa wld have to await later developments.

3. FONOFF much impressed by Dulles suggestion that US-UK bickering over China question shid not be permitted color negotiations over Jap Peace Treaty and present thinking as indicated in immediately preceding Para is motivated by

serious attempt meet Dulles half way. Signed Gifford".

1. Morocco: Media should report political situation in French Morocco factually, with strict attribution to sources, avoiding obviously irresponsible reports. Above all, Media should avoid stories or comment that might even remotely suggest that US is taking sides.

2. Stikkers Media should give good play to current visit of Netherlands Foreign Minister Dirk U Stikker, who as Chairman of OEEC is in Washington conferring with officials on Western Europe's need for raw materials. Media should not give indication that he will engage in any US-Dutch discussions, but should emphasize that he is here as Representative of OEEC. Where appropriate, Media should mention that he is accompanied by Robert Marjokin of France, who is Secretary-General of OEEC. Begins FYI: Objective of department is to increase Stikker's international standing. Ends FYI.

3. German assets: Media should give minimum factual coverage to upcoming Quadripartite meeting in Berne, Switzerland, redisposition of German assets. Speculation on who will get how much of such assets should be avoided.

4. Reynaud: Media should give only minimum play to any meeting between President Truman and Former French Premier Paul Reynaud. if and when such meeting occurs.

"The Korean Delegate has informed US that problem of the Sino-Russian frontier will have a happy solution thanks to increased aid. Korean material has been considered augmented. The Sino-Russian Army Will win enormous successes during May 1951".

Surete mentions fol Vietnamese residents in Japan suspected of Commie activities: Hoang Dinh Luong born 11 July 1920, Hanoi arrived Japan 19 Dec 1943; Pham Xuan Ngan born 15 Feb 1919 Hanoi arrived Japan 19 Nov 1941; Nen Dr Dang Van Ngu born 4 Apr 1910 at Thien. MD. Travelled to Japan in 1943; and Ngu Yen Dinh Thiet and Pham Van Phuong both not identified. Surete would be particularly grateful for any information on VM movement in Japan or on results any investigations VM suspects conducted.





Loose or ill considered use of terms "forced labor" or "slave labor" might well convey idea that prevailing conditions in USSR justify invoking Section 307 against all USSR exports to US, and attitude which media should not promote directly or indirectly.





Over all tone this review should reflect following thinking: Since Soviets have consistently attempted put Western powers on defensive by charging them with responsibility for remilitarization of Germany and for aggresive rearmament in US, it is particularly important that we avoid any defensive or argumentative tone in our presentation of causes of world tension. We are not submitting a brief for the defense -- on contrary, we take attitude we are the plaintiffs in case, and our record stands for itself. What should emerge from our review is that US UK and France have initiated long series constructive proposals in all major area friction which add up to coherent, reasonable program for improving international relations and advancing cause of peace. In contrast, USSR has ateadfastly pursued an obstructionist and reactionary policy based on deception, aggression and suppression of freedom. Positive, nature US UK and French policy for "peace freedom justice" should be our primary point of emphasis.

In building up our propaganda campaign, it is obviously undesirable to "tip our hand" with respect to detailed lines our approach to possible 4 power meeting or give away our tactical plans. (over)



Following is summary of report supplied FONOFF by UK Liaison Mission Tokyo on situation in Japan in light of Amb Dulles visit:

1. Japs uppity and confident. They feel US, frightened by events Korea and impressed with Jap efforts toward recovery, is safe bet and ready give Japan everything it wants.

2. Following are contributing factors to Jap optimism:

A. Recent UN successes in Korea.

B. Jap economic recovery astounding, superficially at least. Ban on trade with China not necessarily as serious as feared. Jap traders relieved over approval by SCAP of barter deal involving Kailan Omdiedg exchange for cotton yarn.

C. Internally nation is quiet and govt relatively stable.

D. There is general satisfaction in knowledge that

occupation is soon to end.

3. Nevertheless situation in Japan remains essentially volatile. If Dulles mission unsuccessful there will be inevitable reaction and widespread hositility toward US. A severe military defeat in Korea would result in scuttling and efforts obtain re-insurance elsewhere.

We should leave it to Russian people to conclude they have in fact succeeded only in exchanging one set of masters for another.

2. Trade Agreements: Media should report factually and soberly House of Representatives approval of Reciprocal Trade Agreements Act, with restrictive "peril point" "escape" clause



In interpreting House action media should distinguish between Reciprical Trade Concept and Administration of Act.

Soviet orbit clause demonstrates feeling of Congress that trade agreement concessions should not be extended to Iron Curtain Countries. In its present form, Price Support Clause could have far reaching negative effects, and we should not attempt to explain them away. In brief references media should merely indicate difficulty of reconciling Domestic

Price Support arrangements with imports.

(A) British inventory of civilian type goods at war's end was\$780,000,000; Soviet inventory was 2,600,000,000. British paid 472,000,000-60%. US is asking Moscow to pay Eight Hundred Million, or 30% of depreciated cost of peacetime utility goods.

(B) In negotiations so far, US has come down from 2.6 to 0,8 Billion; Soviet has come up from 170 Million to 240

Million.

(C) US asks no payment for Lend Lease items destroyed, lost, consumed in war effort; asks payment only for fair value of items of use in Soviet Post War Economy.

(D) 18 is still attempting to reach a reasonable settlement, Soviets in current meetings have indicated no willing-

ness to negotiate.

(E) Under Lend Lease agreement, USSR obligated itself to return any residual items of use to US. Ships Lend Leased by the US to USSR are now urgently needed by the US. However, USSR is now arbitrarily utilizing as peace time assistance ships and other materials Lend Leased as war time aid.





1. Eisenhower: In initial phase of straight reporting, media will want to give widest play to tonight's (2/2) Eisenhower Broadcast textually or in condensation, as with yesterday's (2/1) congressional speech. Problems of emphasis and interpretation will arise in secondary follow up phase of origination and selection of comment. In this phase the 2 speeches shid be treated as part of single whole, of Eisenhower reporting to American Congress and American people on his mission to build defense of Atlantic Community. This mission cannot succeed unless he has wholehearted support of Govts and peoples of all NATO Allies, to which US can make greatest overall contribution in terms not only of material str and resources but freshness, morale and leadership. By taking 2 statements together for this purpose, media can avoid any comparisons between them, or attaching any significance to omissions from briefer prepared broadcast to points made in earlier extended extemporaneous congressional address. Wherever possible, media shid remind audiences that both statements addressed primarily to American rather than world public opinion in general, and for all areas, major emphasis shid be on overall tone of confidence: Confidence that peace can be kept; confidence that European peoples have will and determination to resist; confidence that "resistance power of Europe can be built in time to detect atks. Couple with this his repeated assertions "our purpose entirely defensive" from interpreting his references to "modest preparations" of NATO as showing we are building defense adequate to resist ath but inadequate to intimidate or to undertake aggression. 43291 PRIORITY

For Europe, especially, his confidence in European will and determination to resist shid help to create greater confidence in US determination to spt Europe and honor fully US commitments under NATO Treaty. Counterpart to this is his emphasis that US cannot carry whole burden alone, that only thru cooperation among

all Allies can task be accomplished.

By his insistence on priority urgency of equip for European forces rather than on troops from US, Eisenhower puts whole problem of defense on new plane, in which first priority is not on deployment of forces, but creation and training of forces and putting weapons in their hands. His insistence on time factor in this ("There is no time to waste") shid be treated as encouragement to urgency, but without contributing to impress on either that US is being precipitate or that Europe's case is

hopeless because time is too short.

On specific pnts, his reference to Germany may be taken as sufficient formulation of pnt of view which may be expected increasingly to influence policy discussions on Germany's relation to Western Defense. But his references in same speech to lend lease, and to need for prolonged 20 to 30 year defense effort, night be subj to adverse interpretation and contribute further both to war wariness and war weariness in Europe, and may be played down in further comment finally, to lay ground work for theme which may become more prominent in time, media shd find ways to Eisenhower phrase: "The defense of freedom, exactly like the appreciation of freedom, is in the heart".

2. War criminals: Commutation of sentences of certain German war criminals sold be treated only if reaction makes it necessary for US media to explain measures taken. In commenting, media shid make clear that action taken was designed primarily as judicial review of sentences and that clemency was exercised where individual cases warranted it. Make clear that review of cases has been in process for over year and is not influenced by US Policy towards Germany, except that it intends to "close the book" on Nazi era wherever possible and give Germans new terms of reference for their future political status

of reference for their future political status.
Use McCloy and Handy statements extensively to explain

D. Achieve moral stature and respected leadership thru force of good example. Note in connection with B that opportunity to share in collective security measures is in form of an invitation. Decision on whether to join in such measures or not will depend entirely on Japan-it will not be imposed.

Caution: Avoid any comment or interpretation implying that Dulles speech foreshadows final form of any peace treaty. Saw Gen Salan today to see if he shared optimism his G-2 reflected CONTEL 389 this date. While cautious he seems sanguine, feels VM missed boat before US aid became felt and does not feel GHI will invade for present. Reverted to VM atk having spent itself 2 days before real fog arrived; if had waited, Fr wld have been in bad way, wld have held somehow but without inflicting vicious aviation punishment. By time Saigon reinforcements came worst was over. Said VM seem well commanded at bn level but higher strategy is faulty despite reputed foreign advisers.

With Feb bad weather still ahead anticipates more fighting but probably on harassment scale. Such atks have cost VM dear in past few days and if large scale attempts are made during present clear weather he will bring heavily armed B-26s from under wraps. Expects atks during New Year holidays Feb 5 to 10 more likely within Delta than in north. Re surmise of fld commanders that VM had recoiless weapons at Vinhyen, Salan said investigation locate had not confirmed this.

In Niemoeller: Paster Nartin Niamoeller, who is 1 of World Presidents of World Council of Churches, has been invited to visit US to meet with and address various member groups of council. Niemoeller, accompanied by his wife, is expected to arrive in New York Feb 1. They will spend about 3 weeks in US. Background on Niemollers present position is given in upcoming special guidance.

. In light of this background, Media should:

(A) Give only minimum coverage to Miemoeller visit and

speeches by him or his wife.

(B) In event Niemoeller publicly champions "neutralism" for Germany, wherever possible carry balancing comment indicating folly of this policy.




