1. CINCFC has auth sale of relief supplies in South Korea to individuals requiring relief but who can pay. Proceeds from sale to be utilized by ROK for further relief but not for normal adm costs other than transportation of relief supplies within Korea.

2. ECA requires ROK to deposit funds to cover cost of supplies furnished by ECA. ECA retains authority over expenditure of these funds. ECA does not have authority to expend funds in North Korea.

3. The difference in procedures in South Korea between ECA and Army presents undesirable complication in ROK accounting. Further complicated by lack of govt in North Korea and lack of ECA authority to operate north of 38 Parallel.

4. Request coordinated ECA-Army recommendation with respect to para 4 DA msg W 96716 and detailed information as to present procedures in effect.

This is CIVROK 59. Subject is economic and relief aid to Korea. In the matter of supply of POL products to Republic of Korea this headquarters feels this can best be accomplished by present military petroleum supply organization. It is understood here that the Korean Oil Storage Co which is an American Corp formed by three major oil companies has entered into a contract with ROK for the distribution of POL products in the Republic of Korea. This organization had a similar contract with the Republic of Korea Government prior to present hostilities and was operating with the approval of the Korean Military Government and later the ECA. Such an arrangement appears to be highly desirable to insure proper distribution. It is understood that ECA is willing to monitor and supervise the operation of this company for the CG Eighth Army to insure that the interests of the UNC are protected. In view of the fact that the CG Eighth Army represents the GINCUNG in the matter of relief and support of Korea as well as arrangements require his approval. Suggest you investigate this matter and if such an arrangement appears desirable tender your approval to the proposed contract with the understanding that the contract is between the Republic of Korea Government and ROKCO and that such approval does not constitute any obligation on the part of the United Nations Command insofar as the terms of the contract are concerned.

Subject: Economic and Relief Aid to Korea

1. The Sub-Area Petroleum Officer, ECA, and the Manager of KOSCO have encountered some difficulty in securing Eighth Army approval for the establishment of KOSCO as the distributing agency for POL products for the Republic of Korea. It appears that Eighth Army is not quite sure as to whether or not their responsibilities include approval of such a contract.

2. The purpose of this message is to inform the Eighth Army that the distribution of POL products in the Republic of Korea can best be handled by using KOSCO and, further, Eighth Army's responsibility covers the approval or disapproval of such contracts without in any way committing the United Nations Command to the terms of the contract.

Remaining in a standby position to take advantage of any improvement in the military situation which would tend to insure a secure hold of United Nations on North Korea and especially its northern borders, seems at the present to be the limit of potentiality of the Interim Committee's action. It is rendering a great service under most adverse conditions in continuing its state of preparedness.

It is requested that the following communication be transmitted to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Republic of Korea: Subject is Radio Frequencies for Reactivation of Former International and Internal Radio Communication Facilities of the Republic of Korea.

"It is recognized that as more and more of South Korea is liberated and returned by the United Nations Command to the Republic of Korea for Civil Administration, the Ministry of Communications may wish to re-establish essential domestic and international radio communications at the earliest possible date. In this respect, reactivation of the former Seoul-San Francisco radiotelephone and radiotelegraph service is already in process. Frequencies formerly used on this circuit have been protected by General Headquarters, United Nations Command to allow reactivation when the military situation permitted.

"Also in process is the establishment of Seoul-Tokyo radiotelephone and radiotelegraph service. Frequencies for this circuit have been provided by the Commanding General, United Nations Command on a temporary basis pending such time that a suitable complement of frequencies may be selected and cleared by the Republic of Korea.

"In view of the fact that the overall military effort in Korea continues to require a large number of frequencies to provide essential radio communications for the United Nations, ground, air and Naval Forces and considering the congestion that exists in the radio spectrum due to worldwide expansion of radio communications and in the interest of providing interference free communication to the greatest extent practicable, it would be mutually beneficial that the Republic of Korea coordinate with General Headquarters United Nations Command, any frequencies proposed for reactivation by the Ministry of Communications, Korea.

The conduct of surveys, the determination of requirements, the submission of such requirements to CINCUNC and the supervision of the distribution and utilization of such supplies and equipment are the responsibility of the CG Eighth Army.

3. The CG Eighth Army will establish the necessary staff organization within his headquarters and the necessary field organizations for the accomplishment of this mission as appropriate, considering the different conditions existing in both North and South Korea, from sources within his command. For planning purposes, a table of distribution unit to provide approximately 132 personnel for PH&W functions has been approved in principle and will be assigned to CG Eighth Army upon approval of the detailed organization. PH&W Sect, GHQ, UNC, personnel now in Korea and attached to Eighth Army for administrative and logistic support, are available to CG Eighth Army until withdrawn or replaced by CINCUNC. Requests for additional personnel and spaces necessary to accomplish Civil Affairs mission will be submitted to CINCUNC.

4. The CG Eighth Army is authorized to utilize the assistance of the ECA insofar as the present mission of ECA will permit.

5. The CG Eighth Army is authorized to utilize such agencies of the Republic of Korea Government and of the North Korean officials as in his judgment he decides is desirable.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

Subject: Clarification of Responsibility for Surveys of  
Damage and Relief Measures in Korea

1. It appeared that since CG Eighth Army was passing messages for many different agencies such as State Department, ECA and PH&W Section personnel in Korea, that messages addressed to the CG Eighth Army were not in all cases considered direct directives to him.

3. CIVROK 32 addressed to the CG Eighth Army and to the CG X Corps gave the first indication to the CG Eighth Army of their new responsibilities but did not specifically charge the responsibilities to the CG Eighth Army. CIVROK 42 addressed to the CG Eighth Army and the ECA in Korea specifically directed that the CG Eighth Army conduct a survey and submit current immediate requirements. This message further requested that the CG X Corps pass the message to General Sams. Although CIVROK 42 was more direct than CIVROK 32, it is possible that some doubt might exist as to who had the overall responsibility. KORDIV 39 establishes the new responsibilities of the Department of Defense and ECA. Paras 3 and 4, Annex I (Civil Affairs) to Operations Order #2, 7 Oct 50, directly charges the CG Eighth Army with relief responsibilities but refers only to North Korea.

4. Instant message to the CG Eighth Army clarifies the responsibility for surveys of damage and relief measures in Korea.

5. Completes action on G-4 Journal No. 15047. This action relates to G-4 Journal No. 14997.

Instant message to Ministry of Communications through American Embassy at Seoul, Korea, forwards frequencies and call sign information concerning proposed commercial radiotelephone circuit between Seoul, Korea, and Tokyo, Japan. Frequencies for use from Tokyo will be the same as those used formerly. Frequencies for use from Seoul are temporarily assigned pending clearance of suitable complement by the Republic of Korea. This message requests call signs proposed for use by Seoul and informs Republic of Korea that Japanese terminal in readiness and that Tokyo should be advised when crystals have been received for the Seoul terminal. Crystal holders have been received in Tokyo and will be shipped to Seoul soon as new crystals have been ground.

2. It is understood that the transmitter at Seoul is a Japanese type, 500 watts, and will be powered by emergency Diesel in view of the fact that commercial power will not be available for one or two months. Also in the final arrangement, Coliniar Array Antenna will be used. Insofar as concerns the Tokyo Terminal, Mr. Cherrigan, CCS and Mr. Sasaki, International Division of Telecommunications advised that the terminal is in readiness.

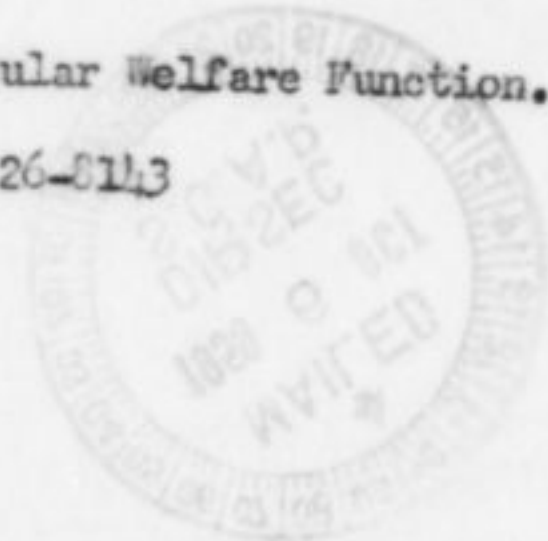

The quality of this product is so poor that potency testing has been discontinued. Recommend immediate destruction of all typhoid vaccine produced by Pusan laboratory.

The Commander-in-Chief, United Nations Command, has requested that the following message, in which I strongly concur, be transmitted to you.

"It is envisioned that as large segments of the enemy become prisoners of war, and as towns, villages, and cities occupied by North Korean troops are liberated, problems will arise in assuring that all persons, both military and civilian, are at all times granted the full measure of protection to which they are entitled under the rules of civilized warfare. Necessity for immediate indoctrination of all military personnel of the United Nations Command in this regard has been recognized and field commanders have been instructed to take the necessary action without delay. It is suggested that representations be made to Republic of Korea Government by you, or by Colonel Katzin as representative of the Secretary General, United Nations, in your discretion, on the necessity of like indoctrination and control of the civilian police and other authorities not under United Nations Command, it being incumbent on all nations in the current conflict to prevent commission of all atrocities, illegal treatment, and wanton and hasty disposition of those in or taken into custody."

In conjunction with the above radio, command letter has been prepared, addressees CG Eighth Army, COMNAVFE, CG FEAF, and CG X Corps. Said letter directs that immediate measures be taken by field commanders of UNC to control and restrain all UNC personnel so as to preclude commission of violations of the laws of war by UN forces.



This radio to MUCCIO, American Ambassador to Korea, indicates the necessity for effective control in the same respect over South Koreans not within the UNC and suggests that representations be made to ROK Government by Muccio or Col. Katzin, as representative of the UN, on the need of indoctrination and control of civilian police and other civilian authorities to the end that those in custody are protected by the laws of civilized warfare.

Concurrences have been obtained from G-1 and DS. Above actions approved by CofS on 23 Sep 50.

Following KORCIV 25, 15 September priority, is quoted.

"Subject: Offer by UN member state.

"Philippines has offered through UN to unified command following for Civilian Relief requirements:

A. 500 units fresh blood.

B. Philippine Red Cross has scheduled mass donation of blood to take place Sept 14 to 18. Philippine Government offers airlift to Tokyo Sept 20. Philippine Government has informed SYG/UN that it is imperative have immediate indication of acceptance offer by unified command. UC requested give decision by Sept 12 or 13.

C. Note from SA 89-370-1010-1016 that procurement of blood from Japan now underway. In view generosity Philippine offer, including airlifting, and their need urgent reply, unified command, Washington, informally accepted Philippine offers A and B above so that drive could be started. Request from you CIVROK priority reply as to quantity of blood you will require from Philippines so that collection goal for UN can be set by Philippine Red Cross. Request by priority statement time and place delivery and if 20 Sept airlift unacceptable, will endeavor keep open offer of airlifting. Designate Consignee."

The acceptance by the Unified Command USG without prior notification to this headquarters complicates the issue. Is fresh blood required in Korea for civilian relief and, if so, in what amounts? Are facilities available for storage at 4-10 degrees C? We do not know Philippine requirements reference blood donors and this raises the question as to quality of blood particularly in view of high incidence of malaria in Philippines. To be considered is the possible effect of refusal of blood contributions. Normal human blood must be transfused within 21 days of date of collection from donor. According to KORCIV 25 at best blood will be usable less than 14 days after arrival in Korea.

GHQ Engineer Section planning extensive use Bailey type highway bridge (Army's standard portable sectional pin connected box type light steel trusses capable of assembly many sizes and different capacity spans). Ketchum concurs in Colonel Barnes estimate South Korean roadnet will need hundred feet bridging per mile. Maximum from one bridge set is fifty ton capacity bridge one hundred twenty feet long. Initial planning provides for two thousand bridge sets. Current requests from stateside army stocks may produce two hundred sets. GHQ arranging for Japanese manufacture. GHQ requests HGA procure two hundred sets to be left in place wherever erected for permanent use ROK. Can utilize Japanese producer. Estimated cost one million five hundred thousand dollars. Ketchum analysis follows: Bailey bridge has high utility for ROK post war reconstruction, can be used with many variations for many purposes, easily moved from place to place and altered by subdividing or supplementing as situation demands. Where Bailey trusses temporarily span short gap in long bridge permanent repairs can be effected and Bailey spans used elsewhere to rebuild permanently entire bridge of shorter length. Quantity requested represents small percentage of post war requirements. With supplemental construction and proper maintenance Bailey bridge can become permanent type bridge. Disadvantages are high initial cost and continual maintenance required when used as permanent bridge. Military erection normally provides for only one way traffic. Cost estimated at double cost of material for same length permanent bridge.

Under present circumstances factors favoring procurement two hundred Bailey bridge sets now for ROK permanent use outweigh factors opposing it. End Ketchum analysis. Recommend conference with Lt. Colonel Joan Cole, Eighth Army Engineer Troop to initiate formal requisition. End Signed Dunge.

Recommend breakdown your procurement request medical supplies except for vaccines into packages applicable to 100,000 persons for one month in order to simplify distribution and use by ROK public health teams. Such breakdown on basis 6 million persons for three months would necessitate some variation in quantities and packaging as suggested. Request concurrence this plan.

2. Following items unobtainable at present in Japan:

- Iodine ampules (12 AMP per box) 3,000 boxes;
- Plasma human (500 cc) 50,000 units - small quantities only;
- Tetanus toxoid serum (30 cc) 100,000 vials.

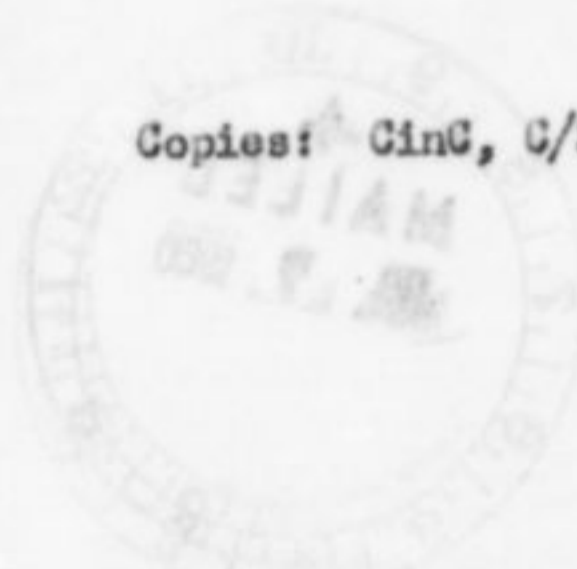

Bunce to Loren. This is Korea No. 1. Subject: Tentative operational and procurement procedure.

1. Representatives ECA Tokyo, FSS Tokyo and GHQ met this AM and mutually agreed to tentative plans to permit effective coordination with GHQ with respect to ECA procurement contribution to effort government ROK during present emergency.

2. Tentative plan outlined below for your consideration and discussion with General Dean. GHQ states it is sending separate instructions this subject to General Dean. Request your comments subsequent discussions in field. Tentative plan: ECA field representatives to be returned Korea will make arrangements with General Dean's headquarters under direction Muccio and Loren to coordinate handling requirements in field for transmission to Tokyo. GHQ suggests ECA furnish liaison personnel to General Dean for this purpose. Coordination arrangements to be made by you as mutually agreed Army ECA State.

3. Requirements from field will be transmitted to ECA Tokyo. ECA will make review of requirements received from field to determine those requirements which ECA can legally finance. Army communication channels to be utilized when needed for this purpose.

4. Requirements which ECA Tokyo determines cannot be financed by ECA will be returned to Eighth Army for Army financing. Requirements which ECA Tokyo determines can be financed with ECA funds will be forwarded to FSS Tokyo with authorization to procure with ECA funds. Concurrently ECA Tokyo will advise Chief ESS SCAP that ECA has authorized FSS to take procurement action in Japan on subject requirements. This intended to keep ESS SCAP advised of ECA demands on Japanese economy in support activities in Korea.

5. Subsequent completion negotiations contract FSS will advise 8th Army pertinent information with respect to expected delivery dates for outshipping to Korea. Eighth Army will make arrangements with MSTs for lifting.

6. Request you discuss and advise ECA Tokyo markings to be placed on ECA FINANCED cargoes to differentiate them from Army cargoes and set up designations to be used in communications to distinguish ECA financed shipments. Request also you advise designation of consignee of ECA financed cargoes.

7. Above plan tentative agreed to by representatives GHQ. Request coordinated State ECA Army comments soonest. Signed BUNCE.
