A 3 day conference in Tokyo of major command repairs and utilities chiefs is planned at conclusion of visit of Colonel Forney and party from OCE, Washington to Far East Command. Conference now estimated to be sometime during last 10 days in May. You will be advised by radio reference firm date when definitely established. Request radio advice of your concurrence in attendance of Lt. Col. W. J. Teberg, Office of Engineer, your command. Desired that he present 30 minute talk on "Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting and Means of Securing Maximum use of Native Fire Departments."

Memorandum for Record:

1. GHQ, FEC, radio ZX 34851 dated 10 Jan 1948 advised major commands of proposed visit of Col Forney, Chief of Repairs and Utilities Division, OCE, Washington, and associates to the Far East Command. This group will leave Washington on 17 April 1948.

2. GHQ, FEC, radio 44407 dated 9 March 1948 advised major commands that trip had been postponed to April.

3. GHQ, FEC, radio 44138 dated 2 April 1948 advised major commands that departure of party would be on 17 April 1948.

4. The party will visit all major commands and conclude their visit here in Tokyo in the Office of the Engineer GHQ, FEC. Along with Colonel Forney will be Mr. A. C. McCaskey, Chief of Utilities, OCE, a budget specialist from OCE, and a representative from the Office of the Director of the Budget.

5. The proposed conference will enable the major command repairs and utilities chiefs to take advantage of Col. Forney's summation of the result of his trips and his observations. It is anticipated the conference will enable the budget representative from Washington to greatly aid our major commands in presenting our budget requirements to the maximum advantage of the Far East Command.

6. No general conference of repairs and utilities chiefs has as yet been held by the Far East Command. Major command repairs and utilities representatives from outside the Tokyo-Yokohama area will be only three officers and one civilian.

This is G-2 Highlight 11y, 15 Apr 48. Reference G-2 Highlight 11b dtd 14 Apr. Kim Kiulsic, after long conferences with members of the National Independence Federation, has decided not to send the very strong conditions which he had originally drawn up in connection with the North-South Conference and instead he has drawn up the following:

1. The independent state shall not permit monopolistic capitalism but shall guarantee the rights of private property.
2. We oppose dictatorship.
3. The government shall be established by free elections held throughout Korea.
4. Any power that desires to establish military bases in Korea is unfriendly.

Apparently Kim Koo and one of Kim Kiulsic's advisors are going to Pyongyang. Kim Kiulsic has apparently not yet made up his mind whether to go.

An F-3 source states that 7 Soviet soldiers crossed the 38th parallel near (coordinates 1024.2-1696.5) at 122230 Apr and went to a Korean house about 50 yds south of the boundary.

1132300 Apr 7 Soviet soldiers allegedly abducted a Korean south of the border and took him to a Soviet outpost near (coordinates 1023-1698.0).

The Korean was questioned in regard to the nbr of US troops at outpost 18 (coordinates 1023-1697), and the nbr of police in Yangmun-Ni (coordinates 1023.5-1696.3). The Korean was released 14 Apr.

This is G-2 Highlight 117, 15 Apr 48. At 141457 Apr a US C 45 flying over UPO-RI (coordinates 935-1693) was "buzzed" by a Soviet fighter aircraft. The fighter was not identified but was described by crew members as definitely not American. The unidentified aircraft was dark blue or black in color and the US pilot said it looked like a P 40. Crew members described the fighters as a P 39, P 40, MIG 3 or YAK 9. The Soviet aircraft dived 3 times at the C 45 and then disappeared to the North. There was no firing.

Kim Kiunic and Hongmyong Hi are still undecided although Kim Kiunic's Aid Hu would not go to the "first conference."

He also said that he had been advised (presumably by Kim Koo and his advisers) that his proposed letter (mentioned Para 8 of Seoul POLAD 240) was too strong and that therefore he might have to tone it down.

Reference DEPTTEL 108 Apr 9th, only additional information on restrictions to listening to radio broadcasts in North Korea is decree broadcast by radio Pyongyang on 21st Feb which requires persons desiring to listen to radio to apply for permit at nearest radio station. Anyone found listening without permit to be given unspecified penalties. Decree also includes provisions for discontinuance of reception and for notification of change of address. Decree indicates some fee would be required in order to procure permit. Complete details contained in G-2 W/S Nbr 128, Feb 27th this year.

This is G-2 Highlight 115, 13 Apr 48.

Emissaries of Kim Koo and Kim Kiusik returned to South Korea on night of 10 Apr. According to Kim Kiusik the emissaries were very warmly received by Kim Il Sung and Kim Doo Byong. When the Northerners were asked for agenda, they replied that all they were concerned in was Korean independence. Kim Kiusik and Kim Koo requested a postponement of meeting to 20 Apr but Kim Il Sung urged that the Koreans come up for meeting on 14 at which time postponement could be arranged. The Southerners also requested that the first meeting be simply preparatory and that a plenary session later be held in Seoul. Kim Il Sung replied that he would be glad to come to Seoul if guaranteed safe conduct. Southerners also requested that newspaper men from South Korea be permitted to attend conference and after some discussion the Northerners agreed to 3 coming up.

Kim Kiusik, when interviewed again today, said that he had tried to persuade Kim Koo not to attend the meeting but that Kim Koo had rejected his proposal. Final discussion will take place tonight.

Kim Kiusik says that he intends to present the following 6 conditions to be met before he will attend any conference:

1. Stalin's picture must be removed all public places in North Korea.
2. Meeting in Pyongyang will be only preparatory, with first official meeting being held in Seoul.
3. Elections must be held in North Korea to elect 100 delegates to sit with 200 delegates elected in South Korea.

CONTINUED:

4. UN Commission must be invited to send at least 1 member to observe North Korea elections.

5. Conference shall have power to discuss only methods of training independence and not to adopt constitution or set up a government and adopt a flag.

6. North Koreans must stop their agitation for joint withdrawal. Instead, they are to persuade the Russians to request joint Soviet American conference on that question.

Kim Kiusik is to deliver his letter to the Soviet Liaison Officers in Seoul and possible he will have it announced on radio.

Kim Kiusik says that Cho So Ang has been in Pyongyang for 3 days. This is the first information we have received to that effect.

Kim Kiusik says that if Kim Koo insists on participating in the conference without the proposed conditions, he (Kim Kiusik) will break with Kim Koo.

Command here considers that Kim Kiusik's conditions are fine except that the command will not even give lip service to any conference in Seoul prior to the elections on 10 May. The command will insist that any conference meeting recognition must be one made up of representatives which have been elected.

New subject: Pyongyang radio last night stated that the commander of the Soviet Army promised full support and protection to those who come to North Korea from South on invitation and that if the US Hq will notify him one week in advance, the Soviet Army will furnish necessary conveniences to pass the train into North Korea.

Following is further information from two reliable sources regarding visit of Kims Koo and Kim Kiunic emissaries to Pyongyang (See also Seoul POLAD Nbr 234, April 12):

1. When emissaries stated that two Kims wished to come to conference with open mind and asked Kim Il Sung and Kim Doo Bong for their views, they replied that they had no program or agenda. They said their only interest was Korean independence and that Russians had no part in conference which would in no sense be convention or assembly as conferees would be free to discuss best means of attaining independence.
2. In reply to request for guarantee of safe conduct, oral pledges of fullest kind were given.
3. In reply to request for postponement of date to about April 20 Kim Il Sung demurred and urged that it was of greatest importance that two Southern Kims arrive by April 14 and discuss postponement in Pyongyang.
4. In reply to proposal that Pyongyang Conference be considered preliminary and that plenary session be held later in Seoul, the two northern Kims said they would be glad to come to Seoul if they could be guaranteed safe conduct.
5. In reply to request that South Korean press representatives be allowed to come to Pyongyang, it was agreed, after argument, that three reporters would be permitted to do so.
6. A source other than one who gave foregoing information reports that unacceptability to South Koreans of proposed Pyongyang Constitution was also discussed and that two Northern

Kims did not insist too strongly that their constitution was final and could not be changed.

7. Accordingly points taken up by emissaries having been dealt within liberal spirit, Kim Koo and Kim Kiusic feel they are duty bound to proceed Pyongyang but Kim Kiusic now seems very reluctant to do so and is casting about for excuses not to go. While Kim Koo and his camp seem to be perturbed, they are not so much so as Kim Kiusic. Both Kims confer frequently and they have issued a communique saying they are studying problem thoroughly.

8. Kim Kiusic seems to have had change of heart due to successful results of registration which have been surprise to many people. This leads him to believe that UNFCOK must go on with observation of election and that Jackson-Patterson-Mughir clique of UNFCOK, who incidentally gave much encouragement to both Kims in their conference project, does not now seem enthusiastic over the North-South Conference. Kim Kiusic also seems to have noted particularly his emissaries reference to pictures of Stalin everywhere in Pyongyang which in his mind does not auger well for "Independence." He is therefore considering a letter containing pointed requests which he feels sure the Northern Kims will reflect and he can thus "save his face" by not going and then "retire" to the country. These requests, which would follow recital of successful registration results in South Korea, would be:

A. Removal of Stalin pictures in North Korea as they are symbol of Soviet control.

B. Proposed conference in Pyongyang should be exploratory only and the first plenary conference should be held in Seoul for which Kim would seek safe conduct from American authorities for those wishing to attend.

C. Preliminary conference at Pyongyang cannot appropriately adopt constitution or establish a govt since govt so established would never be recognized by United States and other Western Powers and if recognized only by USSR and its satellites, there would be division of Korea which is Kim's primary motive in proposing North-South Conference.

D. Election should be held in North Korea for 100 delegates to join with 200 to be elected in South Korea to constitute only body which will have authority to decide upon constitution and establish govt.

E. North Korean authorities must invite at least 1 United Nations Delegate to observe North Korean Election.
F. If North Korean authorities agree to foregoing, Kimm Kiusic would request that UN postpone election in South Korea or at least not permit those elected to meet until the 100 delegates from North Korea have been elected.
9. While General Hodge and I naturally are most reluctant to see Kim Koo and Kimm Kiusic go to Pyongyang because of immense propaganda value it would give Soviets, we feel we cannot do anything directly to influence them (We are doing all we can through indirect channels) for reasons that in true Oriental style the two Kims would expect something in return and our intervention, becoming public as it must, would give rise to outbursts from Rhee and Kim Seung Soo and probably make them forget their differences and thus destroy the healthy rivalry which now exists among rightists as described in Seoul POLAL's 215 April 7.

Two emissaries of Kim Kiusic and Kim Koo returned from Pyongyang evening Apr 10th. Which details yet unknown reliable source advises that North Korean authorities accepted "conditions" laid down by Kim Koo and Kim Kiusic and that both (having expected that some of their "conditions" would be refused) are now in quandary because they have no excuse for not proceeding to Pyongyang. Will report further details later as soon as reliable info is available.

One local (neutral) carries alleged account of trip given by 1 of emissaries, somewhat as follows: "We left Seoul Apr 7th and returned evening Apr 10th. After entering North Korea we found Russian guard about 10 meters from Russian border to whom we gave our credentials written in Russian whereupon he turned us over to Koreans who helped us on our way to Pyongyang. We saw pictures of Stalin and Kim Il Sung everywhere. Although we had heard before arriving that placards were displayed in Pyongyang announcing that Kim Koo and Kim Kiusic would come to North Korea to surrender themselves, we found nothing of the kind. On contrary people of North Korea praised the 2 Kims highly and expect to receive them enthusiastically. We arrived at Pyongyang at 2 PM and after resting several hrs at our hotel, we met Kim Il Sung and

Subject is electric power supply for South Korea. On 12 Jan 48 1 of the 222,000 KVA transformers at Chung Pyung Electric Power Plant burned out. Transformer was dismantled and inspected by Mr Miamoto (representative of the Japanese firm which built the plant). A list of equipment to put the unit back into operation was drawn up by Miamoto. After informal arrangements for procurement of parts in Japan, a confirmatory Spot Requirement 4 B 4 B 18 was dispatched 19 Mar 48. This requested immediate shipment of parts known to be available and ready for shipment to Japan. Shipments of these parts are being held up by the embargo now placed upon shipments to Korea, other than coal, for which immediate dollar payment cannot be assured.

This command is faced with a critical shortage of electric power. Chung Pyung capacity is cut $\frac{1}{4}$ by the operational loss of the damaged transformer. The sole remaining transformer is leaking badly, and its failure would eliminate the largest source of hydro-electric power in South Korea. Skilled personnel to make the repairs will arrive 15 Apr. Renewed indications from North Korea that power will be cut off 15 Apr make it imperative that all speed be used in dispatch of the parts. Attention is invited to your Para 1 and 2 A, 1st Indorsement AG 463 (10 Feb 48) CE, dtd 12 Mar 48, to our MGNEB 412.5, dtd 10 Feb 48, subject: "Emergency diesel-operated electric generating equipment to prevent disease and unrest in South Korea" which indicates your realization of seriousness of situation.

Ordinance 182, signed by Military Governor on 7 Apr 48, requires that all 100 won banknotes printed by Japanese Government Printing Bureau and bearing Paulownia flower, be exchanged at par for notes printed by Chosen Book Printing Plant and bearing Korean Everlasting flower. Exchange must be made between 12 April and 24 April 1948. After 11 April notes with Japanese features will no longer be legal tender except for deposit. By 26 April all banks shall notify head office Bank of Chosen of amounts of Japanese-feature 100 won notes on hand at close of business 24 Apr. Between 26 Apr and 1 May all banks shall transfer withdrawn notes to nearest branch of Bank of Chosen.

After 24 Apr no person, natural, juridical or governmental may possess withdrawn-notes, and any such person submitting for exchange Japanese-feature 100 won notes which there is reason to believe may have imported in violation of existing laws which permit import of 1,000 won per repatriate, shall be subject to following restrictions. In such cases the bank will accept proffered currency but pay out no legal tender in exchange for deposit funds in a blocked account to credits of depositor, notify SKIO Dept of Finance, and permit no withdrawals without permission of Dept of Finance. Penalty clauses provide fines ranging from 1,000 to 50,000 won and/or penal

Part 1: Reference para 1 urad, completion of study is contingent on action on South Korean Interim Government budget and tabulation of quarterly fiscal figures. Expected date of completion is 1 May 1948. Summary will be forwarded by radio and copies of study will be sent by air courier. Study was originally requested by Dept of State and is being completed for information of interested agencies in Washington. However, circumstances have obliged USAMGIK to abandon plans for currency conversion during anticipated duration of Military Govt. While substantial improvement is being made in increasing revenues and reducing deficit spending, previous hopes for stabilizing Korean economy prior to establishment of independent govt now appear wholly unrealistic in view of continuing deficiencies of production and distribution. Moreover capital levy originally contemplated as integral part of currency conversion program would necessarily be administered through Korean officials and banks whose cooperation cannot be expected in view of widespread opposition certain to be aroused by institution of such major reform on eve of inauguration of independent govt. Current program of withdrawal from circulation of all 100 won Bank of Chosen notes printed prior to liberation, necessitated by accelerated flow of such notes from North Korea during present period of pre-election political activity, has virtually wiped out Bank of Chosen currency reserve, renewal of printing of 100 won notes of current series has unavoidably postponed capacity

Every effort will be made, however, to prepare new notes for early issuance by the Korean Govt. It is expected that Korean Govt, particularly if dominated by Rightists parties, whose members would be most affected by blocking and capital levy, may not wish to undertake drastic measures to reduce circulation.

Part 2: No significant revision of quantities of notes has been made except that supply of 10 won notes printed in US is now regarded as inadequate in respect to present circulation of that denomination and in relation to quantities of other denominations printed in ZI. It is also felt that either in event of assumption of responsibility by Korean Govt as planned or possible continuation of US responsibility in South Korea, currency replacements can be more economically printed in Seoul than in ZI. Paper and ink will be available for such printing since decision to effect exchange about September would permit use of supplies ordered from Japan and otherwise required for production of current series to meet anticipated seasonal increase. It is the view of this command that multiple conversation under present conditions or conditions likely to prevail in the immediate future would cause great discrepancy in price and wage relationships without corresponding beneficial results of permanent currency contraction.

1. In view of urgency created by rumors (Seoul POLAD 220 Apr 8) which were causing increasing bewilderment among Koreans, Gen Hodge and I decided that it was desirable that I issue a statement which we prepared along lines indicated in deptel 101 even though Gen Hodge had released his statement of Apr 5 only few days previously (Seoul POLAD Nbr 214 Apr 6). Text my statement was transmitted in Seoul POLAD 225 Apr 9.

2. After careful consideration of how we might make further efforts to persuade Kim Koo and Kimm Kiusic to be reasonable about Pyongyang conference, Gen Hodge and I reached conclusion that little, can be done. Both Kims are stubborn men and having made up their minds there is little we can say or do, except through our public statements, to dissuade them or to suggest what they might suggest as counter proposals when they arrive in Pyongyang. Kimm Kiusic seems to be going through very "Anti-American" phase only partially revealed in translation of his remarks communicated in Seoul POLAD 226 Apr 9.

While on surface, hue and cry of both Kims is "Unification of Korea" in reality basic cause of their proposal for North - South Conference and acceptance of Pyongyang invitation is realization that they have no real fol (insufficient at least to insure their election or apmt to high office) and they "don't want to play ball." They prefer to seek better prospects elsewhere. Communism

flourishes upon such dissidents. However, both Kims are also trying to keep toe hold in South Korea in case things do not turn out well at Pyongyang.

We have had reports for several days that Kimm Kiusic has secretly (because he is openly boycotting election) told his friends to nominate candidates and campaign for them in hope of getting few at least of his supporters win National Assembly.

3. Indication of how little support Kim Koo and Kimm Kiusic and Leftists have in South Korea, results of registration are revelation. About 85% of eligible voters have registered to date. Assuming that Leftists and Moderates have boycotted election and failed to register (We can so assume on basis of their public statements), it is apparent that Leftist and Moderate strength may be as low as 10 to 15% of all eligible voters. Last summer, we estimated it to be from 30 to 35%. Thus Leftist and Moderate strength has dropped considerably or they are registering spite of their public boycott.

4. At one time Patterson, Jackson and Djabi favored and even fostered North - South Conference but idea was not apd by other delegates. At present time, insofar as can be ascertained, none of delegates is particularly interested although indicated in Seoul POLAD Nbr 204, Apr 3, Patterson, Jackson and Mughir conferred with Kim Koo on subj and may secretly favor it. It has been suggested that these three may raise question after election May 10.

5. Insofar as can be ascertained no delegate is talking at present of referring Korea Problem to special session General Assembly. All seem to be pleased with registration results and for once are not agitating anything, apparently happy or resigned, depending upon their views, to observation of election May 10.

"The leading news is summary of Kim Kiu Sic's speech before new society known as 'United Independence Movement Society' which had its opening meeting in the Ho Kuk Yoky Yang Won temple on Apr 3d, at which both Kim and Kim Koo spoke. Dr Kim said: 'If we cannot unite, independence is impossible. Our present movement is a continuation of the independence movement which was initiated in Mar 1919. We must reap a more abundant harvest than that of 1919-this movement must continue until the final goal is obtained. In trying to obtain this independence we must know a few facts. First, our independence cannot come either from war between the big powers or from peace among them. After World War II we have been under military administration. We are in a situation which is worse than 30 or 40 years ago. That is the net result of our emancipation. The only independence that we can obtain is through our own hands. Within a few days we will send 2 or 3 liaison agents to the north in order to promote the North-South conference. They will fix the date, means of transportation, hotels, agenda, etc. Now, those who want to give us independence by conducting a general election say

something else-America is going to send to Korea a high commissioner and they are now looking for this commissioner.

Those who maintain that after the general election, supervised by the UNTCOK, Korea may be able to take part in the UN are mistaken and haven't read the UN Charter. A separate govt by a separate election in South Korea alone would never allow Korea to be a member of the UN. For the election they are talking about 'free atmosphere.' Considering the present situation, such a thing cannot be guaranteed. It is not a 'free atmosphere' but 'airy freedom.' I told this to the UNTCOK. If we were the Philippines it would be a different matter if America contemplated sending a high commissioner. But in Korea such a thing cannot be tolerated even for a day. Another party has said that there would not be any high commissioner but an 'ambassador.' The North-South conference is the last attempt for our independence. The Russian proposal at the UN Assembly is principally correct. If we are going to be destroyed let us be so with our own efforts and if we are going to be prosperous let us be so by our own efforts."

In addition to obvious Soviet propaganda now current here such as Pyongyang broadcasts and conference that city, there is undercurrent of more insidious propaganda at work. Following are some examples:

1. It is being bruited about that US really intends abandon Korea and that therefore Soviet cause is best to espouse. Attn of Koreans is being invited to fact that Pres Truman did not mention Korea in his message to Congress on ERP and his other message of Mar 17. Dept may wish to bring this to attn of those who draft speeches for Pres, the Secty and other high officials so that when reference is made by them to countries where Communists are active and where US help is needed, Korea will not be overlooked.

2. Attn is being invited to our especial interest in Japan at this time in a manner which questions why we are seeking to put Japan on its feet. Rumor mongers pose as the answer that US intends use Japanese manpower in coming war with USSR and that Korea will again fall under Japanese domination. North Korea should join up with USSR.

3. A third rumor spread by Kim Ki-unic himself at meeting on Apr 3 of his unification independence movement is that US intends to stay in Korea and send "high commissioner" to Korea. As Kim alleges as his "source" an American official whom he refuses to name and as his statement has appeared in local leftist newspaper, I propose to issue statement denying that US has any such intention. I also propose use some or all

While the siren call of Pyongyang for conference has South Korean Leftists and Middle Road's eyes with preparations for that conference, this shifting of their interest from forthcoming South Korea elections has left vacuum in South Korean political areas which is producing repercussions in Rightist camp. As Rightist, as least for moment, have clear field, their own differences are now causing cracks to appear in their hitherto united front. Both Rhee and Kim Seung Soo appear to have lost some control of their groups, the society for rapid realization of independence and Hankook Democratic Party, respectively.

As regards Kim Seung Soo, he is having difficulty in maintaining party discipline, especially with respect to candidates which his group will nominate. Thus Kim wants 1 candidate, the Youth Section another, Labor Section still another for a given voting area. Kim himself in his own district declined to be candidate in order to find a place for Yi Yun Yung, head of a strong Rightist group of North Korean exiles in South Korea (also head of chosen Democratic Party of North Korea) but Kim cannot put that across in his own district. Another fundamental difficulty arises (and this is also true in case of Rhee's group) from fact that a struggle is now beginning between Conservative and Liberal elements of Rightists, former consisting of older and wealthy members and latter of younger generation who are more socialistically

inclined, though not Communists.

As regards Rhee and his group, we know that he has issued public statement that various people have been claiming to represent him and to speak for him whereas he has only 2 secretaries who have such authority, namely, Lee Ki Poong and Yun Suk Oh.

We also know that Rhee recently told newspaper correspondent enjoying his confidence that he did not want any more lambasting of State Dept and Gen Hodge as he was going to need all help he could get. Rhee has also hitherto declined to be candidate for Constituent Assembly, his reason being that he fully expected sufficient number of own followers to be elected to Constituent Assembly and from there offer him presidency. In view however of ferment going on among Rightist group he seems to have some misgiving about that development and he is now considering announcing himself as a candidate.

Another reason which moves Rhee to consider announcing himself as candidate arises from growing divergencies of views among Rightist group as to form of govt which will be set up when Assembly convenes. Hitherto, Rhee has anticipated that provisional constitution which Skila attempted adopt would be approved by Constituent Assembly but it now appears that there are 2 other constitutions in offing. Sentiment seems to be crystallizing into 2 groups:

One that would establish a democracy in which strong powers would be vested in hands of president, the plan which

Second that which would establish a democracy in which power would be centralized in Prime Minister and his Cabinet with a weak Chief of State, the plan favored by Rightist Liberals. Rhee fears that if Constituent Assembly should adopt second plan he, Rhee, would become Figurehead President with power in hands of Prime Minister (probably Kim Sueng Soo) and Cabinet.

Rightist Police Chief Chough is said to be pursuing middle course between Rhee and Kim Sueng Soo factions hoping thereby to enhance his own ambitions in even of maj collision between those 2 groups.

This ferment in Rightist ranks is of great importance to US and will be watched with care. If Leftists and Middle Roaders continue boycott elections, it will become more acute as time goes on. If on other hand Middle Roaders, or even Leftists as it is still possible that they may do, participate in elections, this inevitable struggle among Rightists will be postponed to some later date.

According to Police Chief Chough, nbr of persons registering as of Apr 4th was approximately 5,600,000 out of estimated 8,000,000 eligibles, which is excellent showing as 4 days remain for registration.

Also to date, there has been comparatively little violence in connection with registrations. Only 9 registration places have been attacked, 7 in Cholla Namdo and 2 in Seoul. Attacks on police boxes, especially on Cheju Island by Leftist "Goon" squads (believed to be perpetrated largely for purpose of obtaining arms) continue but this is considered to be coincidental to registration and not as result thereof.

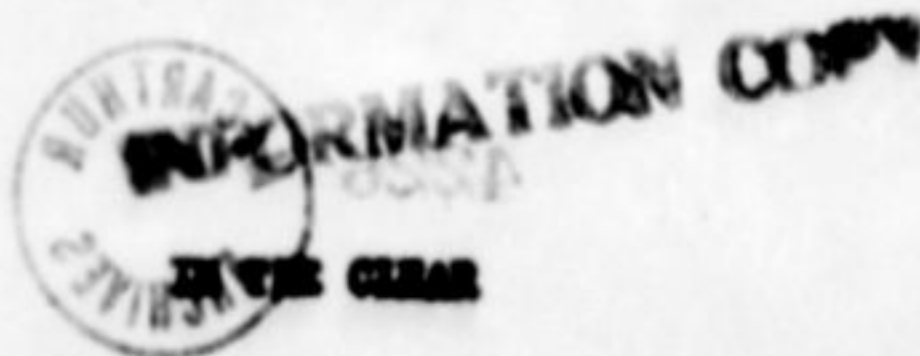

This morning Lyuh Woon Hong, head of Social Democratic Party (coalition) and brother of late Lyuh Woon Hung called on Gen Hodge requesting, so he stated, on behalf of Liaison Group chosen to make exploratory trip to Pyongyang for Kim Kiunic and Kim Koo:

1. Credentials.
2. Assistance in getting to Pyongyang on one of command's trains supplying US liaison officers there.

This liaison group consists of Choi Wonz, former Vice Chairman of SKILA who resigned when Coalition Group bolted that legislative body; Kwan Tai Yung, Kim Kiunic's secretary; and Ahn Kyung, Kim Koo's secretary.

Gen Hodge declined either to give credentials or to permit group to travel on US military train. He told them it was policy of command neither to assist nor to obstruct departure and travel of representatives invited to attend proposed conference of North-South Korea leaders at Pyongyang.

Gen Hodge added that invitees were free to leave South Korea at any time if they traveled by ordinary public facilities.

Also if he were advised in advance when they expected to cross border, he would give instructions to our military and to South Korean police that they should impose no obstacles to their crossing the border in either direction.

According to reliable informant Jackson, Patterson and Mughir, Australian, Canadian and Syrian delegates respectively, conferred with Kim Koo at his residence between 1800 to 1900 hrs Mar 31 and that following was gist of conversation.

Mughir: What is your view of proposed conference of North and South Korean leaders?

Kim: As UN Commission failed to adhere to resolution providing for elections preliminary to establishment of government for all Korea, we proposed to Kim Il Sung and Kim Doo Bong conference of North and South Korean leaders.

Jackson: You are a proverbial enemy of the Communists. Might they not arrest you upon arrival in Pyongyang?

Kim: I do not believe Soviet authorities will arrest me after I have been formally invited to Soviet Zone. If that should happen, I am an old man of 70 and would consider it an honor to be taken prisoner to Siberia. I am convinced that through sacrifice of myself the day will come when the Korean Communist Party will be closed down and Korean Nationalists will win the victory. I have never dreamed of being arrested but I do not shrink before possibility.

Patterson: UN Commission came to Korea to assist in realization of Korean independence. We must admit now however that it is next to impossible to carry out faithfully UN resolution on Korea under existing conditions. As Canadian delegate I welcome proposal for North-South conference and sincerely wish for its success. In order to facilitate progress of that conference do you not think that commission should move out of Korea?

The info will indicate a definite expenditure of about 600,000 yen since Dec. The purchases were of jewelry, camera, clothing and misc luxuries. It is expected that the South Korean Communists will suspect that Zudin has been using funds intended for them. It is expected that other South Koreans will think that Zudin is looting their economy. It is believed that the Russians will be very displeased with the attendant publicity.
