Effort is being made to equalize amount of rice in general ration for all provinces during balance of current rice year ending 1 Dec 48. This is believed to be extremely important for Korea in order to maintain a cooperative attitude towards fall rice collection program on part of farmers and government officials. Import grain is being used to level off total general ration for all provinces. Any delay in the receipt of imports disrupts our ration pattern and undermines our collection programs. Meantime Party officials are canvassing public in Taegu, capital that province, showing list of those candidates and asking for signatures on document stating they are acceptable. Aim of SKLP is to collect as many signatures as possible to present impressive "statistics" when they begin "free" Korean election propaganda compaign.

Recently discovered SKLP directive (Plausible But Liability Uncertain) outlines following as timetable for Communist activities in South Korea:

25-29 Jul: Guerrilla Corps to distribute handbills and mobilize labor leaders. Information section must report strategic points in each district.

1-6 Aug: Underground work to be mobilize factories and schools.

7-9 Aug: Underground work to mobilize govt employees. 10-13 Aug: Continuation of propaganda and agitation.

15 Aug: "Special attacking squads" and "purging squads" will attack all industrial sections when signal fires appear. Guerrilla Corps will begin their activities.

Ref POLAD's 602 Jul 27, Assembly met this morning with Shin Ik Hi as chairman to consider situation created by Assembly's refusal confirm Rhee's choice of Lee Yun Yung as Prime Minister. Various members began to criticize Rhee who was not present (as President he is no longer member of Assembly). He was informed of developments and appeared before Assembly. Chairman Shin asked whether he had another name to submit. Rhee said that he was not ready to recommend anyone and made speech urging members of Assembly to forget their partisan interests and agree upon some policy which would enable him recommend new name. Upon conclusion Rhas's speech, Lo Il HUN (Hankook) began criticize Rhee stating that he was dictator worse than Emperor of Japan. This provoked protests from other members and demands that Lo be disciplined for making such statements. Yun Chi Yung (member Liaison Committee) in particular tock Lo to task and called him traitor. Rhee quieted tumult by stating that no disciplinary action should be taken because Assemblymen should be entitled criticize President if he liked. Rhee then left Assembly which adjourned until afternoon.

During afternoon session three motions were made. First called for disciplinary action of Lo Il SUN. There was much argument which was finally settled without vote through intercession of Cho Bong Am and Chairman Shin Ik Hi who suggested that both Lo and Yun apologize for their remarks, which they did. Second motion to have Assembly meet as a committee as a whole to consider what should be done was defeated by vote of 133 to 20 (29 abstained).

15th meeting Main Committee held Jul 19 to confer with National Assembly's Liaison Committee. First matter discussed was request of Assembly that it's resolution on unification be cent North Korea through UNTCOK and UN. Paul Boncour argued that UNTCOK could not assist in matter except to send it to Lake Success as indicated in itr be addressed Chang Myun on Jul 16. Second matter discussed was Valle Resolution read when UNTCOK visited Assembly. Paul Boncour took pains point out that this resolution did not constitute recognition of "National" Assembly. Third matter was Rhees speech in which he is alleged to have said we shall fight Russia." Chang Myun replied that regardless of what Rhee had said, he was speaking to congress of his party (Narrki) and Assembly could not be held accountable for Rhee's remarks. Liaison Committee got very unfavorable opinion of UNTCOK's willingness to cooperate because it seemed to want to avoid all questions.



Reference is made to effort of Roger Thomas Oliver to come Korea which is subj Army's WCL 42715 Jul 23, to which Gen Hodge is replying, info to State, to effect that clearance should not be given until after Aug 15 and only then upon request of Korean auth that Oliver should be informed that logistical support cannot be accorded him by Army.

Rhee has told reliable command informant that he has not asked for entry of Oliver although he did not say definitely

that he might not do so later.

During conversation with me on Jul 25, Rhee said he hoped to find highly qualified person to act as his general adivsor, mentioning fact that Siam had utilized American advisers for many years. He said he did not know of anyone who could fill position he had in mind and inquired whether I could help. He remarked that since I was not remaining here as State Dept representative (it is now generally known through AP report published here that Msncio will be State Dept representative) whether I would be interested in such position. My reply was that I was remaining in Foreign Service. From his remarks I inferred that he cannot have Oliver in mind as one of his chief advisers and, taking his remarks to informant mentioned above into consideration, it may be that he does not expect to ask for Oliver at all.

My reason for going into this matter in detail is simply that I feel Dept should give consideration to its policy of

It is present understanding that the US \$2,700,000 is to pay for 90,000 tons of coal per month for delivery during Aug and Sep, but allocated in Jul and Aug. Jun allocation, for delivery in Jul, presented no problem, since it consisted of normal non-reimbursable 00,000 tons; and the extra 20,000 tons requested pursuant to ZMGNEB 154 was covered by adequate USAMGIK credits.

Anderson's report indicated that for Jul and Aug allocations, the payment for the normal 60,000 tons was to come from GARICA Project 112 and payment for the extra 30,000 was to come from other funds available to Voorhees. This relief was being afforded because Korea's FY 49 GARICA and Economic Rehabilitation Funds are so limited as to preclude absorbtion of the cost of coal. At conference with General Fox and Colonel Binns in Japan, General Helmick stated: "It should be understood that GARIOA Funds for FY 43 barely meet requirements for disease and unrest. Rehabilitation funds meet definite programs and do not contemplate payment for coal. As pointed out in Jul radio ZMGNEB 183, Korea request for funds to procure 435,562 tons of coal in FY 49 over and above the normal allocation of 60,000 tons per month, was refused at Washington level. Therefore, payment for coal imported from Japan without add tional appropriated funds being made available would vitiate the entire GARICA and Rehabilitation Programs. In any event, and whatever decision is reached concerning reimbursement to Japan after the cut-off date it is requested that payment by Korea for the normal allocation of 60,000 tons per month from Japan not be required prior to the date that the new Korean Govt assumes full responsibility for its own affairs."

It is requested that the US \$2,700,000 be used to pay for the extra 30,000 tons of coal allocated from Jul through Dec for delivery from Aug through Jan and that payment for the normally non-reimbursable 60,000 tons per month not be made to Japan prior to 1 Sep 48 or the date that new Korean Govt assumes responsibility for its affairs, whichever is later. In view of Korea's meager appropriations in FY 49 it is further requested that whenever the normal 60,000 tons is made reimbursable, the DA provide such additional funds as may be necessary to continue payment for the 60,000 tons to and including 1 Jan 49. Payment for Korea's coal requirements between the dates of 1 Jan and 30 Jun 49 should be examined on its merits prior to 1 Jan 49. In preparation for such examination, Korea will again study its coal requirements to insure substantial reductions through strict conservation measures and increase of indigenous coal production. It is possible that the present embargo of electric power from North Korea may be resolved by that time, making unnecessary the extra 30,000 tons per month.



Week or 10 days ago we learned that Chinese CONGEN had interview with Kim Koo. At time, I tried unsuccessfully to ascertain reason for call. We have now learned from reliable source that he called not only on Kim Koo but also on Kimm Kin Sic and Syngman Rhee as well as to leave with them special message from Chiang Kai Shek. According to informant, Chiang Kai Shek in this message upbraided Kim Koo and Kimm Kin St rather severely for their attempt to deal with Communists in North Korea and all 3 for their failure to join forces in joint effort to make successful attempt at govt in South Korea. Note is also supposed to have contained veiled threat that China might disavow all 3 leaders if they did not get together.

This message may have been partially instrumental in persuading Kim Koo and Kimm KiuSic issue statement which was

communicated to Dept in POLAD's 585 Jul 22.

In commenting on this message to informant, Phee is said to have remarked that he is personnaly willing take Kim Koo and Kimm Kins Sie into govt, but he cannot do so until they have completely disavowed their North Korea venture. He does not consider statement of 2 Kims referred to above as adequate disavowal in itself and in light of other remarks which Kim Koo has made subsequently to Korean rerorters.



Rhee made speech in which he explained why he could not appoint Kim Seung Soo, Shin Ik Hi or Cho So Ang, although he had high regard for them. He then named Lee Yun Yung citing as his chief reason that as North Korean, Lee would exercise great influence in bringing about unification. However, when vote was taken (by secret ballot), Assembly (193 members present) voted 132 "10" and only 59 "yes" with 2 votes declared invalid.

This was first refusal of Assembly to go along with Rhee and therefore, such blow to his prestige that, at continuance of session this afternoon, he stated that it had taken him one week to decide upon Lee Yun Yung and requested weeks adjournment to enable him to make another choice. He also said he hoped Assembly would reconsider its refusal to accept Lee Yun Yung. He then left Assembly which, after some argument and consideration several motions, adjourned until Friday Jul 13 when it is expected some agreement will be reached.

Apparently adverse Assembly reaction was not due so much to objection to Lee Yun Yung himself, but to arbitrary manner in which Rhee selected him without consultation even with leaders his own followers.





Following message received from Burinterna Geneva: "The Secretary General with reference to decision of the radio conference Atalntic City (see Article 6a page 27 Annex to resolution concerning directions to PFB) and with resolution No. 11 of Administrative Council, has the honour to send you following communication "An informal meeting ofrepresentatives of 11 countries region 3 attening ITU conferences in Geveva recommends to members of that region that a region 3 conference preparatory committee take place in Geneva commencing 4 October 1948. 1st purpose will be to effect coordination of frequency requirements to assemble such technical data as is available and to draw up a suggested agenda for the regional conference. The informal meeting further recommends the submission to BURINTERNA Geneva by 4 October 1948 of all additions and alterations to these requirements for all services already submitted to the PFB which are to be satisfied in the frequency bands 150-2850 kilocycles, 3155-3400 kilocyles and 3500-3900 kilocycles including medium frequency broadcasting requirements. The concensus of opinion of the members of the informal meeting is that the preparatory committee will require one month and that the regional conference should be held two weeks later in Geneva. The reassons for recommending Geneva are "1. The coordination of the work and results of this conference with the PFB can best be effected there; 2. most of the necessary technical information is assembled there; 3. technical principles on the allocation of frequencies are being studied by the PFB and aeronautical conference and results will more readily be available there." The informal meeting when making the above recommendations was aware of the invitation extended by the Government of China for this regional meeting administrations are requested to advise EURINTERNA by 15 August whether they agree to the preparatory committee and region three conference being held in Geneva on the dates indicated and if in agreement to arrange appropriate representation."

If you are agreed please reply to BUR-INTERNAS Telegram stating plans are satisfactory and that SCAP delegation to PFB will attend Region 3 meetings representing SCAP to theinterests of Japan and that I will represent the interests of Ryukyus and South Korea. Signed Marden Cooke."

Copies of air mail letter and minutes of informal meeting of representatives of Region 3 countries held 8 July mentioned in letter message cited above will be forwarded immediately upon receipt.

Views of SCAP - CINCFE delegate that he cover Region 3 conference, Geneva in the interest of Japan and Ryukyus, in addition to present duties as observer at Provisional Frequency Board considered satisfactory and BURINTERNA is being advised. In interest of South Korea suggest similar action by CG USAFIK with copies to Civial Cumminications Section GHQ SCAP. Reference Deptel 250'Jul 21, my comments on US UN proposals correlated with info contained in Deptels 251, 252, 253 and 254 Jul 21, are as follows:

1. While suggestions of US UN have merit and might possibly have been tried if made several weeks ago, they are now too late. Weakest point in these suggestions is that they fail to take into account disastrous position in which we should find ourselves if, as seems inevitable, they did not produce desired results. Present is no time for vacillation or any other sign of weakness. Rhee and his "govt" will be ready for business next week, they will notify UNTCOK and CG of its formation, and they expect start receiving substance of power on Aug 15. After several false starts during past 3 years they and South Korean people are so enthusiastic over prospects of early attainment of long-frustrated desire to have their own govt, that any attempt postpone realization of that desire at this late hour would be disastrous. Moreover, news from North Korea reveals that people there are restive under rule of Soviet stooges and happy over results in South Korea. Rhee has received smuggled letter from Choman Sic under house arrest in Pyongyang congratulating Rhee and urging him to carry on without regard to developments in North Korea. Even Kim Koo and Kimm Kiu Sic are somewhat repentant since Constitution was proclaimed in North Korea and election ordered there. (Seoul POLADs 585, Jul 22).

2. Accordingly, we must go on with plans we have had in contemplation for so many months. I feel we can do so in manner that should not be or become offensive to those powers whose support we are seeking at UN, at least if I understand Dept's

We can accomplish our purposes by exchanging Tabs "A" and "B" sometime next week and shortly before Aug 15, or even at time aforementioned Tabs are exchanged, issue statement referred to in Para 6 of DEPCIRTEL July 10, 1 AM, modified somewhat as follows (following is only intended as a longer statement which would recite how

we arrived at present situation);

"The Govt of the US regards the new govt recently formed in Korea as a result of an election held on May 10, 1948, under the observation of the UNICOK, as representative of the express wishes of the 20,000,000 Koreans in South Korea, who constitute 2/3 of all the Korean race. Accordingly, pending consideration by the General Assembly, under the provisions of whose resolutions this govt was formed, of such problems as remain unsolved as a result of the inability, due to the boycott attitude of the USSR, of the UNTCOK to carry out its functions in North Korea, the President of the US is sending a special representative, Mr John J Moccio, with ambassadorial rank, to Korea to negotiate, in consultation with the aforementioned Commission, concerning the transfer to the new govt of governmental functions now performed by the USAMGIK and concerning the implementation of further provisions of the resolutions of the General Assembly of Nov 14, 1947 and of the resolution of the Interim Committee of Feb 27, 1948."

3. It seems to me that the aforementioned qualified recognition of the auth of new govt should satisfy objections of British Govt (London's 3188, Jul 15, 6 PM to Dept), especially if we stress fact that we are doing no more than USSR has already done in North Korea (ie, transferred governmental functions to local authorities-see this connection Moscow's 1319 Jul 14). This should also satisfy India-see Deptel 252 Jul 21. China and Syria would be on our side-prepared to agree even if we accorded greater degree of recognition. (Deptels 253 and 254 Jul 21). While I am not certain of attitude of France, I believe France would approve our action and I am certain that Philippines and Salvador will approve. Therefore, of 9 Powers most directly concerned, there remain only Australia and Canada and I have feeling

that even Canada might go along. As regards Australia, I am afraid it will remain recalcitrant to the end. If foregoing represents true picture of attitudes of 9 govts most concerned (other of course than Russia), I believe we can expect favorable 2/3 majority in General Assembly on Korea question.

4. Only part of our planning which will need contemplating if suggestion in Para 2 above is adopted, is that date contemplated for initiation of troop withdrawal will have to be postponed some date after final decision of General Assembly becomes known. This would probably be sometime in Oct or early Nov, unless we can have Korea placed on agenda for early hearing.

5. I believe that Rhee and his govt can be persuaded go along with policy and plan outlined in 2 above especially if whole matter is made clear to him. See Rhee on recognition 8th.

Mis inaugural address transmitted POLAD 593 Jul 24.
Possible in circumstances outlined herein he may wish go to
Paris to head his delegation and there assist in pleading Korea's

6. In submitting these comments, I wish to add that I am not unmindful of dangers inherent in proceeding with policy as we have planned but there is, in my opinion, far less danger in pursuing that course at this juncture than trying something else.

7. In view rapidity with which developments are crystallizating here, Dept's instructions soonest are becoming imperative. In this connection we suggest that Gen Hodge and I be directed confer immediately with Rhee and UNTCOK in order give them gist of our plans and solicit their cooperation.

8. Gen Hodge concurs in views stated herein and adds that in his opinion any material backtracking in our policy decisions will render our position here untenable.

The Electra is operated by a combined crew of Americans and Koreans. It is assigned to KBC for small supplies, evacuation and other housekeeping responsibilities. It is assigned to mil govt for operational control, maintenance and training Fuel oil is imported by the petroleum distributing agency, a mil govt agency, and daily costs the US Army \$682.38 CIF Inchon. The Bureau of Utilities, the Mil Govt Agency operating the barge, pays 323,900 won a day for the fuel. This amount is based on daily demand when 8 engines are operating continuously.

There are 2 classes of salaries. The Korean crew costs 3,948 won a day and the American crew costs \$366.52 a day. Dollar figure based on crew of 26 Americans of which 15 are present for

duty at present time.

There are 2 classes of food rations. The Korean ration costs 1,100 won a day and the American rations, drawn from the QM cost \$34.80 a day based on \$1.20 a day per man.

The correct breakdown in won is as fols:

Korean salaries 3,948. Travel expenses 100. Korean rations 1,100. Fuel 323,900. Supplies 10,184. Misc (tools on order) 16,692. Contingencies 60,427. Total won 416,351.

Supplies, misc and contingencies are based on total estimates of these items necessary for rehabilitation reduced to a daily cost. Supplies and tools will be paid for from GARIOA funds. The Bureau of Utilities will pay won to the civ supply acct to cover these expenses.

Following is text of Rhee's in augural speech delivered in front of Capitol Building, Secul, at 10 o'clock this morning:
"Honored by the nation to be its 1st president. I now stand here deeply moved with feelings of gratitude on one hand and on the other with anxieties of heavy responsibilities that are to rest with me.

"It has been often said that when joy reaches beyond the limit, laughs turn into tears. How I experience the truth of the saying. Men and women who come to congratulate turn away their heads to hide their tears. Congratulatory telegrams from various parts of the country express the same emotions. Self-trained as I am, not to be carried away by feelings, nor to show them in public, I myself cannot help being shaken to the core with emotions, being only human, after all. For, the independence we lost 40 years ago is found again; the nation known to be dead and buried has come to its life anew. On this solemn occasion, I vow before my God and my fellow countrymen to carry out my responsibilities to the limit of my ability and strength. You, too, I ask, dear fellow countrymen, to take vow in your secret hearts to put the national interest before your own and thus perform your glorious and sacred duties as citizens of Korea. The responsibilities you delegate to me cannot be carried out successfully by any one was I dare undertake them not on the strength of my own ability but in the sole trust that the concerted efforts of my patrictic countrymen will enable me to discharge them.

"It was the solidarity of the people that made the election a complete success to the marvel of our friendly neighbors. The nonsequent National Legislature is truly democratic in character including soveral perties of different shades, even a few Leftist. Experience disposed some to expect that it would not work, torn by viclent dissensions. True, there were heated debates. But not one when the Constitution and the govt organizations law were enacted by the majority vote, feelings subsided, leaving no ill will behind. This is how the momentous decisions were made in the shortest possible time. The devotion shown by the representatives and the expert commissioners is truly worthy of all praise.

"Naturally I am disabled by this inauguration to retain the Chairmanship of the National Legislature. But the vacancy will be filled when the other seats probably made vacant by the present occupants accepting positions in the cabinet or any other positions are filled by-elections. Meantime the vice-Chairman will do the presiding as they have often dome for me in the past, for which I thank them.

"Rumors are rife as to who will be the Prime Minister, who the cabinet members. You need not pay much heed to them. When everything is made known, they will prove mere surmises, quite beside the mark.

"Two considerations are predominant in organizing the govt. In the 1st place, to make it an efficiently working organization and, in the second place, to make it stand on a firm foundation, not easily to be shaken. Therefore, regardless of party affiliations or personal relations, men best able and best united to administer the enacted laws in accordance with the wishes of the people will be chosen to governmental positions. A man may be either too big or too little for a place. But a truly great man is able not only to cover a big thing but also a small one, and, above all, not to be ashamed of doing a small thing well. With such true great souls coming fwd to fill a place with a will, whether it be high or low, the attainment of our ultimate objects will be made possible. Such men of genuine character alone will make the govt work like a clock, achieving wonders within and enhancing confidence in us abroad. This govt shall thus be representative of the whole nation, not limited to one locality.

As often emphasized in the past, the nation will be endangered, if the administrative power is monopolized by 1 party or 1 gp of politicians. Our bitter experiences in the past 40 years are enough to drive this truth home.

"Good citizens must be protected, while bad ones curbed. Selfishness must make room for justice. Formerly the state used to decline by the monarchs upholding the unworthy and EO AMD estranging the wise. But in these times when it is the people that elect their own officers, it is up to them to exercise the judgment to distinguish between the good and bad, between the

competent and incompetent.

"As regards our recognition, since it lies with our neighbors, not ourselves, nothing definite can be said now except that, if we keep going on as we have so far done, their good will eventually ITHAT. The great task before us is rather to lay the national foundation firm and strong, without troubling about how we shall be received by the world. If we acquit ourselves well and rise to their expectation, they will of themselves recognize and assist us without our asking. So everything depends upon our-

To the UN Gen Assembly to be held at Paris in coming Sep, we shall be represented by a delegation composed of men of diplomatic ability. Though it is yet too early to give out their names the question is almost settled who they shall be. In this connection, a word of thanks is due to Miss Louisa Yim who worked for us so hard at Lake Success, despite the fact that we were not able to support her financially, or even to correspond with her to any sufficient extent. Her services will be long remembered.

"A word for the Communists among our Northern brethren in the Soviet Zone. Those who want to sell their country to a foreign power in the name of Communism, undoing their own nation, cannot but be condemned as traitors by the whole people. I earnestly appeal to them to stop their traitorous activities and come back

to the unified national fold, ready to conform to the form of govt the people will decide in the democratic way, whatever chape it may take We are not so much against Communism as against the treason of its devotees. Let me once more urge them to come back repenting their past ill conduct and peacefully unite the bisected country into one so that they, too, may share the blessings therefrom. If they should persist, however, in their mistaken path, their doom is unavoidable both before man and God.

"In international relations we will uphold peace, parity, unity, free commerce on principles of equality and co-prosperity. If there be any differentiation of attidude on our part, it will be because it was forced upon us. To a friendly neighbor, we will require their friendliness with our own. But from an unfriendly one, we shall be compelled to hold ourselves aloof.

"For the past 40 years we simply did not exist in the eyes of the world. The world judged us by what others said about us, not by anything we did. But now when we are being helped to our feet by our well-meaning neighbors, we can have our own say, and show to them what we are doing. We should like to ask our neighbors, from now on, to weigh us not by what they hear about us but by what they see we are doing.

"To make much of the impression we make on the outside world, to make actual facts known as they exist here to all the peaceloving free individuals abroad is not for pushing our own interests

alone, but also as a means of safeguarding world peace.

To build up a new nation, a new constitution, a new govt is, of course, necessary, but what is far more needed is a new people. We cannot make a holy state out of a corrupt people. rejuvenated national spirit blasting away all the old corrupt precices, we can possibly make up for the last 40 years, catching up with the times. My beloved 30,000,000 brethern, let us all strive to be worthy members of the new rising nation whose Coundation should be on the Rock of Ages never to be washed away by the torrent of world events.





Following is summary of National Assembly Activities between Jul 17 and Jul 20 inclusive, as Assembly djourned on afternoon Jul 20 until morning Jul 27 when President Rhee (elected Jul 20) is expected to present names of his Prime Minster and Cabinet:

- 1, 28th Session morning Jul 12: Syngman Rhee presided. Lee Han Bal Chairman Communications Committee reported that according to rumor Koreans in Japan were having difficulty retaining title to their properties. Assembly then considered polished draft of constitution and with some minor change final draft was adopted by unanimous standing vote (Seoul POLADs 545 Jul 12 and 559 Jul 15). Upon statement of Chairman of Committee on Law of Governmental Organization that draft of law would not be ready for several days, Assembly adjourned until Jul 14.
- 2. 29th Session morning and afternoon Jul 14: Kim Dong Won presided. First reading Law of Governmental Organization. Some provisions discussed were:

A. Placing police under Dept of Home Affairs instead of having separate Police Ministry.

B. Placing Bureau of Budget under "Office of Planning" instead of Ministry of Finance.

C. Explanation of use of term "Dept of Social Affairs."
D. Absence of provisions for provincial organization.

E. Reason for no separate Dept of Labor.

3. 30th Session morning and afternoon Jul 15: Syngman Rhee presided. Second reading of Government Organization Law began. Various minor changes were made through 1st 18 Articles. 64368

4. 31st Session morning and afternoon Jul 16: Kim Dong Won presided. Chief Clerk announced there would be ceremonial signing and promulgation of constitution on morning Jul 17. Second reading of Law of Governmental Organization continued. Much discussion of Ministry to control Marine industry with decision that it should be under Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry. Office of Parliamentary Vice Chief for each Ministry was deleted from law. After concluding all articles it was decided by vote of 107 to 2 (18 abstaining) that law would be accepted without 3d reading (see POLADs 556 Jul 17).

5. 32d Session morning and afternoon Jul 17. Syngman Rhee presided. Ceremonial signing and proclamation of new constitution took place morning session in presence of officers of command, members Consular Corps and 2 minor UNTOCK officials. During afternoon session it was decided after much discussion that election of President and Vice President take place on Jul

20 to which date assembly adjourned.



Chang Myun of Liaison Committee reported failure committee's efforts to deliver to North Korean authorities letter re unification. Syngman Rhee was elected President and Lee Si Yung Vice President with details reported POLADs 579 Jul 20. "There is no independence without unity. It is Heaven.'s rule that without independence the people are bound to face destruction. In Nov last year we supported the UN resolution on Korea, although we were not fully satisfied with its contents, because it had provision for the united independence. But Soviet Russia refused to admit the UNTCOK and on 26 Feb the UN Little Assembly made an amendment to the original resolution which included the principle for dividing our fatherland. This amended resolution strengthened Russia and she turned a deaf ear (to the world opinion and to us). At the same time we Koreans have been sed at this juncture, the real patriots must do only one thing, that is by the unification of the people we should fight for righteousness. For this reason we sponsored the conference of North and South and as a result of it, it was decided that the American and Russian troops must evacuate and the political and social parties that participated in the conference should convene the nation wide political convention for the purpose of uniting the country and setting up a Provisional Govt.

"We promised it very firmly; then the future of our fatherland seemed to be so bright. But later the newspapers reported that there is a so called 2d conference of South and North going on in Pyongyang. We cannot help feel that it is a

strange thing because in the first place, the conference is a one sided, dictatorial one and, in the second place, the parties and social organizations that represented South Korea in the first conference were somewhere around 41 but now in the second conference the representation South Korea is very meager. In spite of it they insist that this is the united will of the people and through the People's Congress they adopted a constitution by unilateral action and proclaiming the Peoples Republic, and changing even the national flag.

"There might be some difference of time, territory and means and ways, but the mere fact of dividing the country in two and establishing a separated govt is just the same. By this the South and North of Korea are divided and they are going forward to civil war. We declare to the world with due consideration that for the democratic, soverign unity of Korea we must strengthen our holds and struggle to the last minute.

"We request North Korea that if they still have any time for consideration they must correct the mistake that they are committing now and must materialize the joint communique issued on 30 Apr as a result of the South-North Conference.

"We request Hong Myung Hi to come back to Seoul and report the latest developments in North Korea. Dear fellow countrymen, we earnestly appeal to you to struggle and die together until the complete sovereign independence of our fatherland is achieved. Dtd 19 Jul 48. Signed Kim Koo and Dr Kimm Kiusic."

Reference last paragraph POLAD's 542 Jul 12 concerning attendance Korean representatives at General Assembly session at Paris, have learned that members Assembly's Liaison Committee conferred thformally with members of UNTCOK. Committee suggested that Rhee as chairman might address letter to UNTCOK inquiring or requesting advice concerning desirability of national govt dispatching representatives to Paris and, if mission is to be sent, character and composition thereof. UNTCOK advised informally that if such letter were received it would be referred without comment to Sec Gen Lie at Lake Success. As this is probable course this development will take, and as Liaison Committee is likely soon to seek our views in more formal approach, any instructions which Dept may wish to give, in light of its plans for participation in discussion of Korea problem at Paris, would be greatly appreciated.

General thought here, both among Koreans and ourselves, is that if Korean Mission is sent to Paris its principal delegates should be "elected representatives" as contemplated in Resolution I Nov 14, 1947. There are however, only 3 members of assembly, namely, Yun Chi Yung, Chung Ki Yung, and Chang Myung, whose English is adequate to represent Korea. Rhee himself has hinted that he may go to Paris but we are inclined to believe that it would be undesirable for him proceed there in view of complicated and important negotiations regarding transfer of authority etc, which must be completed, or at least be under way, at same time assembly is in session. Rhee would probably not be willing delegate authority to

handle such negotiations.

This is G-2 Highlight 218, 15 Jul 48.

B-2 sources states that at 150400 Jul South Korean Police were at coordinates (935.45-1696.7) and North Koreans were at coordinates (934.8-1697.0). The North Koreans started firing and 10 rounds of rifle fire were exchanged. The observation point from outpost 10 was located at coordinates (935.25-1696.7). Of the 10 rounds exchanged 1 bullet hit an estimated 20 ft in front of observation point and ricocheted overhead. Two more rounds struck about 20 ft away but did not ricochet. Rounds that struck near observation point were fired from North Korea.

At 0415 hrs firing ceased. At 0430 hrs the South Korean Police in same position and the North Koreans were at coordinates (934.9-1697.7). The observers had returned to outpost 10. At this time 6 rounds were exchanged between the NKC and South Korean Police. Five more rounds were fired presumably at the guard shack at outpost 10. Shots came from the north.

Comment: In the last month there have been 4 incidents involving the village of Uchong Dong coordinates (954.3-1696.2). The probable reason for the activity in this location is due to local border incidents.






