



Reurad G24260GSXRP, 12 April 1946 Judge Advocate General has ruled that the provisions of Public Law 301, 79 Congress, excludes personnel of the Army of the Philippines from any rights, privileges, or benefits afforded by the missing persons act. It is the further opinion of the Judge Advocate General that under the provisions of the Military appropriation act for 1946 and Public Law 301, 79 Congress, The Commanding General, Western Pacific, is authorized to pay accrued arrearages of pay to personnel of the Army of the Philippines. Opinion of Judge Advocate General is

quoted in part:

"The extent to which pay has accrued to the mentioned personnel during periods in which they were missing, missing in action, or captured is a question of Philippine Law as to which this office cannot render an authoritative opinion. Unfortunately, only limited source materials are available, and these have revealed no Philippine Statute or decision directly pertinent. Attention is invited, however, to section 27 A, Commonwealth Act number 569, dated 7 June 1940, which provides in pertinent part All enlistments in force at the outbreak of the War, or other grave national emergency, or entered into during its continuation, shall continue in force until 6 months after its termination unless sooner terminated by the President". It is suggested that the Commanding General, AFWESPAC, be advised to make request of the Judge Advocate General of the Army of the Philippines for opinion as to the pay status under Philippine Law of members of the Army of the Philippines in appropriate cases."

"What we Koreens went is that the occupational forces, at present, about 3000000 Russians in the North and 300000 Americans in the South be withdrawn with the exception of 1000 of each forces soldiers should be edded 500 each from both the British 2.000 Porces and the Chinese Nationalist troops, making a temporary Joint Commission Army which could supervise a General Election in Kores as soon as possible. We feel that in all fairness this election should take place within 3 to 6 months in order to afford a proper expression of the desires of the Korean people and to enable them, without outside influence or inside pressure, to determine upon the Government of their own choice.



(This message has no bearing upon Army service clubs which is separate program) WD has been notified by Red Cross that fund limitations will require extreme curtailment of Red Cross overseas club and recreational program unless cost of local civ labor, facilities and equipt can be supplied by WD.

Accordingly following tentative agreement between Amer Nat Red Cross and WD is submitted for your study.

Such Red Cross Club and recreational facilities as may be needed by the theater that continue to use any such present distinctive names as "Low Point Inn", "Cups and Saucers", et ceteza, and the Red Cross insignia will continue to be used in such establishments. They will, however, be redesignated "Recreational Clubs for Military personnel-operated under Red Cross management' or some similar designation, and will be maintained as army activities and operated by Red Cross under management agreement with the Army. Professional Red Cross pronnel will be supplied by Red Cross without charge and Red Cross policies for club operation will not be disturbed. For example, no alcoholic beverages will be served and no charge will be made for food or refreshments served in clubs except meal service. Red Cross will bear expenses of refreshments and food to be served without charge. Army will be responsible for all other operating expenses and will handle pay rolls of requisitioned civ labor as in case of any other Army activity.





Since Japan considered "Enemy territory" under US trading with errang regs, trade and com between US and Japan prohibited.

State, War, Treasury and PO Depts considering restoretion of 1td postal serv between Japan and outside world except Gormany with fol limitations:

A. Serv to include postcards 1 ounce lets and print-

ed matter.

Contents of coms to be restricted to personal and family matters only. Business, financial and comcl coms would still be prohibited, incl all transactional coms such as those which contain instructions or authorizations to effect property and financial transactions, and those which contain currency, securities, checks and drafts, payment orders or other filmncial instruments.

Since there are no censorship controls in US and most other countries, it would be necessary for required controls to be exercised by you. Principal requirement would be effective censorship of all incoming and outgoing mags to insure that unauthorized mags or those involving undesirable persons in Japan are not passed. Treasury Dept and Off Economic Security Policy of State Dept feel that effective censorship would be 100% censorship. Request your opinion.







"Another failure and deadlock in the effort at genuine cooperation and mutual understanding between the United States and the Soviet Union." Editorial blames Russians for refusing to "Implement either of the main provisions in the prior Rus-American Agreement" and for laying down conditions on the Provisional Government "Which amounted to the exclusion of all native elements except the Communists and those definitely favoring the Soviet Union."

Allan Jackson on CBS noted General Hodges warning to Koreans that "Any demonstrations can only hurt the cause of Korean Independence."

Delegation says the Russians would not deal with any Korean Groups which had opposed an Allied Trusteeship of the country. In other words, Koreans who wanted an immediate independence, quite natural aspiration, will be purged. Thus the world continues to head toward uncertainty, confusion and suspicion."

Raymond Swing on ABC compared Russian stand in Korea with our own policy of seeking to obtain\*\*. Swing seldour maximum duty in Korea is "To make sure that in due course the people have the right to choose their own leaders and take the consequences."

He said "To start out insisting on the recognition of Korean interests which are dedicated to make trouble and to do so in the name of democracy does not seem to be constructive."

Richard Johnson writes in New York Times American Delegates on Joint Korean Commission are pessimistic over prospects for the Commissions success and Koreans are mistrustful of the body. Johnson says... "There are indications that the talks may drag on indefinitely and that it may be July or August before there is an establishment of a Korean Provisional Interim Government, if, indeed such a body can be established at all...." Account further states Koreans fear consultations with local political parties will be "so much shadow play" and eventual Interim Government will be group selected by whichever country (United States or Russia) is able to dominate.

Johnson comments on General Hodges radio address... "To General Hodge has fallen the unhappy task of trying to explain to Eoreans that the Commission is working in the best interest of this country. Today General Hodge went on the radio to explain to Koreans the latest joint communique. With the Moscov decision on the one hand, and the last communique in which the Commission announced its agreement to consult with Korean groups that were not opposed to the "aims" of the decision on the other, General Hodge tried to recordile the two. It was a difficult job."

Johnson also mentions new communist propaganda line which blames failure of 1919 revolt against Japanese on its inspiration by reactionary forces and accuses United States of "trying to dominate the world...supporting anti democratic forces."

Ed Herlihy in news broadcast over NBC mentioned Easter Services held by American troops on Kores in two former Japanese Shrines.

Assuming that Philippine Commonwealth is responsible for printing of emergency currency notes, and that responsibility for the registration and deposit of emergency currency notes now rests with the Philippine Commonwealth, it is desired that you undertake at once such steps as are necessary to carry out intent of W 85012. The recommendations which you supply WD and United States Govt will permit negotiations with the Commonwealth Govt and arrival at a reasonable settlement of this problem. The settlement will probably be a sum of money paid the Philippine Commonwealth, possibly so qualified as to assure that these who served and supplied your forces will receive the maximum benefit therefrom. Without these recommendations from you, the WD cannot act in the best interests of the US Govt. Steps necessary will doubtlessly involve both an analysis of records and data submitted by Commonwealth, and original investigations by officers of your Command. Sufficient priority must be give to obtain personnel necessary to accomplish this mission in minimum amount of time. It is not necessary or advisable to await formal presentation of a final claim by the Commonwealth before measures are undertaken to acquire desired info. The most desirable situation would be to have on hand at the time Commonwealth claim is presented, all data and info necessary for a quick determination of the extent of its validity. The president and I both desire this.

Consequently, before replying definitely to the President, CINCAFPAC was queried on 21 Nov as to what progress, if any, was being made under the procedures cutlined in paras 8 A and B of JCS 1127/3; and there was indicated the info WD would require in order to submit a recommendation to the President.

- I. As far as is known here, no currency registration or redemption has taken place elsewhere; except that a rumor persists that Philippine Army Disbursing Officers have been redeeming currency on the Island of Mindanao. However, on 7 June 1945, under administrative order # 7, the President of the Philippine Commonwealth appointed an emergency currency committee to study and investigate the "bona fide" emergency currency committee to study and investigate the "bona fide" emergency currency committees in the Philippine Islands. This committee rendered its report on 31 Jan 1946.
- Wer, the President stated that: "It would appear that to the extent that this currency was used either directly or indirectly for the prosecution of the war, its redemption is a responsibility of the United States Gowt; and request that the War and Treasury Depts make a careful analysis of this situation and submit recommendations as to the necessary steps which should be taken to discharge the obligations of the United States Gowt."
- W. Paras 8 A and B of JCS 1127/3, DTD 10 Nov 44, suggests, "as a general policy that bons fide emergency currencies issued pursuant to your authority for your military needs by recognized United States and Philippine Commonwealth authorities should be exchanged immediately". Within your discretion you were authorized to restrict the exchange to a limited amount pending a subsquent determination of arrangements for conversion.

organized resistance in the Philippines had ceased. Until 24 Wovember 1945, the date of errival in Manila of the United States High Commissioner to the Philippine Islands, the CINCSWPA, was the Representative of the Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces of the United States and of the President of the United States. By executive order 9616, 14 September 1945, the President defined some of the duties of the High Commissioner as prescribed in the act of 17 Jamuary 1933 as amended (48 VSC 1237), and made the High Commissioner "Responsible for the representation, administration and coordination of the suthority and policies of the United States Government in respect to the Philippine Islands". The CINCEMPA, without question (in exercising his authority as Military Commander of the United States and Philippine Forces during actual combat and when it was impossible for a high commissioner to be present or to exercise his legal authority since the Phillippines were held by the enemy exercised these responsibilities prior to the arrival of the high commissioner.

currency and supplies were procured by requisition and by payment in emergency currency. The emergency currency was secured by area, district and other leaders from agencies which printed and issued emergency currency notes.

- E. In many countries agencies of the War Department have secured from the issuing government currency with which to carry on the prescribed missions of the Theater Commanders. In each Allied and neutral country the United States has assumed responsibility for compensating the issuing government for the currency its Commanders legitimately received and expended. The President has definitely stated that he wishes to do this in the case of the Philippine Commonwealth.
- F. On 23 October 1944, 3 days after the landing on Leyte, CINCSWPA at Tacloban at a ceremony attended by the President of the Philippine Commonwealth and others, announced that he was restoring to the Filipinos a constitutional administration by countrymen of their confidence and choice and declared that the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippine Islands was subject to the supreme authority of the Government of the United States. What actual authority the President of the Philippine Commonwealth assumed at that time is not clear; but in reality it was subject to overriding military necessity and the right of the military to exercise governmental control as long as that was necessary to accomplish the mission of CINCSWPA.
- G. Subsequent to the landing on Leyte, the campaign to drive the Japanese from the Philippines continued; and on 5 July 1945 the CINCSWPA announced that

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

C. As previously indicated, all organized military forces of Philippine Commonwealth were ordered into the service of the Armed Forces of the United States by President of the United States on 26 July 1941. After the formal surrender, the operation of guerrilla forces under immediate American and was encouraged. Prior to the reoccupation of the Philippines, Area and District Commanders with their troops were recognized by the Commander in Chief Southwest Pacific, as an element of his Command. Under the provisions of executive order No 21 issued by the President of the Philippines on 28 October 1944 all persons of any nationality or citizenship actively serving in recognized military forces in the Philippines were "Conceded to be on active service in the Philippine Army;" temporary grades and ranks were confirmed, and a recognized military force was defined as a force under a Commander who had been appointed, designated or recognized by the Commander in Chief of the Southwest Pacific Area. This executive order came to the attention of the War Department early in December 1944. The act of 21 March 1934, 48 Statute 456, Section 7 (2), provides that the President of the United States has authority to suspend the taking effect or the operation of any executive order of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippine No action was Islands under certain conditions. taken by the War Department or by the President to suspend the taking effect of this order. Consequently under the provisions of the military order of 26 July 1941 of the President of the United States, the recognized guarrilla forces came into the service of the Army of the United States.

B. By military order of 26 July 1941 President of United States called and ordered "Into the service of the Armed Forces of the United States for the period of the existing emergency, all the organized military forces of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines." Funds for the "Mobilization, operation and maintenance of the Army of the Philippines including calling into the service of the Armed Forces of the United States the organized military forces of the Commonwealth of the Philippines were first appropriated in 3rd Supplemental National Defense Appropriation Act, 1942 approved 17 December 1941 and thereafter in annual appropriation acts and the 1st Supplemental Surplus Appropriation Rescission Act, 1946, approved 18 February 1946.

New York Times story from Secul reports breaking up of huge counterfeit ring, reported to have been supplying funds to the Korean Communist Pirty. The ring was smashed with the arrest of 1, men, including the Assistant Financial Director of the Communist party. With the assistance of US Army CIC agents, Korean detectives raided a printing shop in the building that houses Communist party Headquarters and made the arrests. The ring had printed 3 million Yen in 100 Yen denominations, most of which are still circulating. AP also reported story.

Mew York Times Editorial places blame on Soviets for breakdown of the United States Soviet Commission meetings. Times said "our representatives could not have reached agreement with the Russians without surrender of one of the principles on which our country is founded-the right of an individual to express his opinion freely. To make the prolonged conference at Seoul successful it would have been necessary for our representatives to have agreed to the "arring from a provisional Korean Government of all leaders who had protested United States-Russian occupation of their country, who had opposed the proposition to establish a trusteeship or who, presumably, had expressed opposition to Communist control of Northern Korea, where no political opposition is permitted."

The statement, said the Times, probably could have been foreseen. There is no such thing as "The loyal opposition" in the Communist Lexicon.



- 4. The invitation contained in paragraph 1 above is transmitted for such action as the Joint Chiefs of Staff consider appropriate. The Supreme Commander for The Allied Powers concurs in the designative to attend Paris Conference as representative of Japan on the International Meteorological Committee under the conditions set forth in paragraph 2 above.



the Commission will act and consider the document after final approval by the Diet but before promulgation or approval by the Emperor, which I assume is essential before the new constitution becomes operative.

Such a solution would in my judgment not do violence to your principles and argument outlined in urad C 59896 that changing the Japanese draft before its approval by the Diet is a departure from the Potsdam Declaration providing for the establishment of a peacefully inclined and responsible government "in accordance with the freely expressed will of the Japanese People."

Although the above action could be initiated by the War Department with SWNCC approval by way of instructing General McCoy to propose FEC change its directive, which action I would not take without your concurrence, I believe that a recommendation along those lines from you to the JCS would be more effective since you speak with so much more authority as the Allied executive agent on the spot.

For your information General McCoy thinks this proposal has merit and would probably be acceptable to the FEC. Will you send me your thoughts in this matter? Since the Diet will meet on 16 May, timing is important. Your estimate of the timetable of events would be most helpful.

I am anxious to be of greatest possible assistance to you in composing your differences with Far Eastern Commission on constitutional question. As war member of SWNCC I have followed policy of supporting you to the maximum. However, the limit of SWNCC jurisdiction on FEC matters is by way of instruction to American representative. I am firmly convinced that General McCoy is doing all he can in difficult circumstances to support you and your policies.

I am in full agreement as is the Secretary with the position you have taken on the constitutional question. I can not conceive how the constitution could be considered a "free expression of Japanese will", if in the midst of the legislative or ratification process it is whisked away to Washington for FEC perusal and approval or disapproval. However, I am equally mindful that under the FEC terms of reference it has the right, at some juncture, to pass on the constitution, and it is highly desirable that we do everything possible consonant with the policies you are following to set the stage for easy Allied approval of the document when the Japanese have met your requirements.

In my search for a solution-which might satisfy the Commission and still not interfere with your administration and the policies your are following I have the thought that the Commissions policy sent to you by the Joint Chiefs of Staff in W 82394 should be reopened and the Commission requested to reconsider its statement that: "The Far Eastern Commission must be given an opportunity to pass upon the final draft of the constitution to determine whether it is consistent with the Potsdam Declaration and any other controlling documents before it is finally approved by the Diet and becomes legally valid," and substitute in its stead a provision

This radio in two parts. (C-61060) Part One. Commanding General AFWESPAC was radioed this headquarters as follows: "Existing legislation (Philippine Independence Act of 24 May 1934) authorizing admission of Filipino Nationals to US for permanent residence expires 3 July 1946. This apparently means that not withstanding provisions of PL 271 enacted 28 December 1945 dependents of 50% or more Filipino or Asiatic extraction are no longer admissable under basis immigration laws into US or its territories after 3 July 1946 regardless of date of application for transportation under provisions of War Department circular 83. 1946. If above understanding is correct this situation constitutes serious problem imagmuch as it will be impossible to transport all such dependents to ports of entry by 3 July for following reasons: (A) Current pregnancy (B) Late submission and incompleteness of applications for transportation (C) Shortage of shipping spaces suitable for women and children. It is recommended that this matter be taken up with the War Department with a view toward securing special legislation. American consul General in Mamila is now presenting same problem to State Department Washington with recommendation that dependents of all US citizens be considered." Part Two. Concur here in AFWESPACK views. Shipping spaces for women and children should be available in numbers after 10 July when dependents from US start arriving in Philippines. AFWESPAC being directed to motify you direct of estimated date that all dependents can be shipped from Philippines and also estimated numbers by month from July 46 on, which should

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


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
