 finance AFAC motion picture service until self supporting and to maintain sub-
 ordinate welfare funds at their prescribed capital limitations (amount of transfer
 is based upon figures included in AFAC application for grant from ARMY GENERAL
 WELFARE FUND referred to in Urac WCL 43396). Part two: To place AFMDEAC non-
 appropriated funds under the direct control of the AFAC Central Welfare Fund and
 provide for payment to latter fund of all current and future excesses of AFMDEAC

M/R: Subject rad advises that State Dept has received from Ryukyus, lists concerning 573 persons claiming citizenship other than U.S. or Japanese. Info received from Ryukyus has been transmitted to appropriate Governments to establish validity of nationality claims made, however, have not requested repatriation of persons named, even though info passed stated varied desires of individuals in this regard. Foreign Governments involved have requested State Department for additional information including dates and places and births, info as to family affiliations and names and addresses in Chinese characters regarding China claims. State Dept advises that no emphasis has been placed on repatriation and asks that if this is not satisfactory to so inform State Dept.

2. Ourad Nov C 66878 was in answer to WARCOS rad requesting info on citizenship claims of persons other than American or Japanese in Ryukyus. This rad advised that appropriate information had been transmitted to State Dept by DS.

3. This problem was discussed with Rykom representatives by Mr Overton during recent visit to Ryukyus.

3. G-2 Check Sheet, 18 Oct 46, stated CCD able to effect 100% censorship and recommended expansion of postal service subject to prohibitions cited. G-2 check sheet, 21 Oct 46, recommended addition of Portuguese to authorized languages.

4. Determination of financial settlement procedures requisite to expansion of telecommunications service may entail delay. In view of WAR statement "Favor opening service telegrams or extending postal service include first class letters as soon SCAP feels either type traffic can be censored effectively", it is deemed advisable to expand postal services without avoidable delay.

5. 2. C-66990, 4 Nov 46, is interim reply to W-84683 which requested information as to when reply to W-80825 could be expected.

3. Ourad C-65772, 30 Sept 46, to CG AFWESPAC quoted W-80825; suggested terminal delivery credit of 16 centimes per pound be allowed Okinawa on parcel post and requested comment and feasibility of resumption of International Mail Service; also comment as to shipping available and the necessity of and arrangements for censorship.

4. Radio S-43047, GSXPO, 17 Oct 1946, CG AFWESPAC to SCAP, advised Ryukyus have civilian postal service which can deliver mail; that such mail should be routed via Japan; that censorship not considered necessary except for spot checks but no mention was made of terminal credits or the method to be used in liquidating postal obligations.

5. Ourad CX 66504, 22 Oct 46 to AFWESPAC suggested routing mail via Japan, explained labeling of sacks and requested advice whether Naha, Okinawa, would be designated as International Exchange Office. Concurrence on previous recommendations, including proposed terminal credit, requested with advice as to symbol number or other identification of account through which international postal obligations would be settled.

6. SX 43219 NGSTO, 28 Oct 46, from CG AFWESPAC, concurred with our recommendations and stated that Naha would be designated as International Exchange Office. No symbol or other account identification was given but it was stated that symbol number or other identification of account would be furnished by Post Office

Dept., Washington, D. C. Unless Okinawa is to be treated as U. S. possession, U. S. P. O. Dept. cannot identify account through which Okinawa as independent government would settle international postal obligations. Establishment of import-export trust fund dollar balance account for Okinawa is anticipated by EFS and no alternate means of financing service is known.

7. Based on W-80825, 20 Sept 46, ourad C-65772 to AFWESPAC referred to post cards and one-way parcels only. Subsequently, we received W-82429, 7 Oct 46, and W-84553, 2 Nov 46, stating Wash. views that postal service with Japan should be expanded to stimulate trade but that such expansion should be simultaneous with expansion of services with Korea, a friendly country. Authorization of service for Okinawa, in line with Wash. policy, should therefore be not inferior to service recommended for Japan and should preferably be consistent with that authorized for Korea.

8. Censorship is a minor feature in Okinawa. Increasing the scope of postal service beyond that first suggested by Wash. will not impose any greater administrative burden on Okinawa. Unless we recommend for Okinawa service at least equal to that recommended for Japan, Wash. policy would preclude the desired expansion for Japan. Resubmission of the matter to AFWESPAC to obtain further views would entail objectionable delay in expansion of services for Japan. For the reasons stated, recommendations herein without further inquiry of AFWESPAC are deemed warranted. Information copy of this radio with appropriate explanation to AFWESPAC is contemplated.



BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

1. In C-64484 WARCOS was informed that SCAP desires National City Bank of New York be authorized to accept and pay out remittances to and from authorized personnel in Japan. WAR-80684 outlines conditions and procedures for such authorization subject to our concurrence. Such concurrence was given in C-65662. W-86109 announces that Treasury has granted license to bank and requests that copy of agreement between bank and SCAP according to procedures outlined in WAR-80684 be forwarded to Washington. Copy of this agreement is inclosed.

2. One aspect of the procedure is that yen be deposited in bank in the name of SCAP for making out-payments to other than authorized personnel. SCAP will get the dollar proceeds for the export-import account. The details of handling the yen deposit and dollar proceeds will be worked out by a conference to be called by ESS Finance.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Tokyo Branch of the National City Bank of New York hereby agrees to hold the dollar proceeds of remittances from The National City Bank of New York, New York, to persons and/or organizations in Japan subject to the positive direction, control and distribution of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or his designated representative, and to make out payments in Japan either directly to the remittee in indigenous yen supplied by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or in dollars to the account of a designated army finance officer who will deliver a corresponding amount of military payment certificates to the remittee, according to the following procedures:

1. The National City Bank of New York, New York will receive dollars by direct payment and through banking channels for remittance to Japan. The dollar amounts will be credited by the National City Bank of New York to the account of the Tokyo Branch and cable or mail advice of the remittances will be sent to Tokyo.
2. The Tokyo Branch will establish a special suspense or control account for the purpose of holding incompleated remittances. This account will be credited and the account of the Tokyo Branch with the National City Bank of New York, New York, debited at the time the Tokyo Branch receives notice of each remittance. The National City Bank in Tokyo will also open two special accounts in the name of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The first of these will receive yen deposited by SCAP. The second account will be a dollar account.
3. In cases where the remittee, on being advised of the remittance held for him by The National City Bank in Tokyo, is to receive payment in indigenous yen, the payment will be made in yen directly by the bank, the SCAP yen account being charged therefor. Simultaneously, the dollar amount of the remittance will be transferred from the control account to the dollar account in the name of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. SCAP will exercise complete control over the dispositions of all dollars in the SCAP account with the Tokyo Branch.

Dec. 2, 1946

4. Out payment of the remittances in Japan in military payment certificates will be made only by crediting the dollar amount of such remittances to the account of the Treasurer of the United States with further official credit to the disbursing officer making the out payment, with an appropriate debit to the control account.

5. No remittances will be paid out by The National City Bank, Tokyo Branch, directly to the beneficiary of a remittance in any medium other than indigenous yen or indirectly by payment of dollars to the credit of a U. S. Army disbursing officer.

6. The Tokyo Branch will advise the head office of The National City Bank of New York of the foregoing procedures and further advise that:

a. Remittances to other than U.S. authorized personnel in Japan must be authorized by specific Treasury license.

b. No currency other than U. S. dollars may be accepted by The National City Bank for remittance to Japan.

c. Remittances to an individual in Japan are limited to \$1,000.- per month unless prior approval from SCAP for the remittance of a greater amount is received. Remitters should be advised that out payments in Japan in any amount are subject to the approval of SCAP.

d. No remittances may be made from a blocked account.
