(C-67678) Subject is Use and Administration of Japanese Export Funds.

Reulet AGAO-C120 (15 August 46) WDSCA dated 30 August 46 and Urad W-81805.

1. Agree with reference letter and radio as regards Japan, subject to following proposals and understandings. Reply as regards Korea will follow.

2. Reurlet, Paragraph 3 is currently acceptable, but is not considered to establish an inflexible priority in use of available funds.

3. Disbursements in ZI should be made either from any depository used by SCAP or from Trust Fund, at discretion of SCAP. Procurement effected by WD in ZI at request of SCAP would be paid for from Trust Fund per procedure outlined Urlet and Urad.

4. In addition to Monthly Airmail Statement from USCC mentioned in Paragraph 3, URAD W-81805 and information to be furnished by CAD per paragraph 10 Urlet, request summary thereof by radio each month similar to Urad W-84687 with details following by airmail.

5. Reference Paragraph a Urad W-81805, propose to open an account in National City Bank of New York, Head Office, for deposit of (a) any US dollar proceeds of Japanese exports to countries other than US except those handled by USCC, and various other US dollar funds arising from current foreign trade of Japan. (b) Other US dollar funds, as may be designated from time to time, except such proceeds of remittances as are entered into SCAP dollar account in Tokyo

Branch per Urad WAR-80684.

6. Request assurance that treasury is willing to issue promptly a foreign funds control blanket license, if necessary, authorizing all disbursements from such account, domestic and foreign, that are ordered by SCAP or by WD at SCAP request. Since such disbursements will only be ordered in connection with execution of approved foreign trade of Japan and other transactions in line with basic directives and policies, believe that Treasury review should be waived, and that any deposits should remain free and unrestricted. Request notice of any other arrangements that should be made for convenient and expeditious operation of the account and for use of future exchange contracts, commercial letters of credit, and other foreign trade banking facilities.

7. Presume procedure Urad and letter would permit transfer of funds from Trust Fund Account to Bank Account promptly upon routine SCAP request to CAD, for purpose of effecting foreign disbursement or for other transaction wherein use of commercial banking facilities desired.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. The War Department, in signal WK-84746, directed that no new construction, including interim, be initiated in the vicinity of Manila. This signal also directed the suspension of construction, including interim, in the vicinity of Manila excepting Nichols Field, Parcels 1 and 2, and Fort McKinley, Parcel 4.
2. In WK-85499, the War Department lifted the restriction on interim housing construction at McKinley Village, PMA, and Headquarters, MANED. Restriction on other construction in the Manila area remaining in effect.
3. In CX-67486, AFPAC transmitted the provisions of WK-85499 to AFWESPAc.
4. In CX-67486, AFPAC recommended to the War Department, continuation of all interim construction deemed essential by the Theater for interim forces in the Philippines. Reply from the War Department to this recommendation has not been received.
5. In SX-43402 (GSTC), AFWESPAc requested authority to authorize the Philippine Consolidated Shipyards to proceed with construction of the necessary building for performance of work under contract. Construction contemplated consisting of 10,000 square feet office building, 20,000 square feet warehouse, and 15,000 square feet engine overhaul repair space to be of prefabricated type from available engineer stock.
6. In signal CX-67658, AFPAC advised CG, AFWESPAc this headquarters did not have authority to authorize requested construction and requested additional information upon which to base a request to the War Department for the necessary authorization for such construction.
7. S-43632 (GSTC) gives information to the effect that the TC entered into contract with the Philippine Consolidated Shipyards on 2 November for operation of Engineer Island on a cost plus fixed fee management contract for long range program of repair of ships for U. S. Army, FEC, Philippine Government, and private owners.
8. The essential construction required to make Engineer Island operational to be performed by Philippine Consolidated Shipyards - cost to be included in contract cost and such materials as available to be furnished by U. S. Army. Exception to provision WK-85499 is requested in light of special benefit of this contract to Philippine shipping facilities as well as U. S. Shipping.
9. This signal to the War Department requests special authority for this construction at Engineer Island in view of its mutual benefits to U. S. and Philippine shipping.
10. Transportation Section concurs (Col. MacNabb).

3. Justification. Troop bases and responsibilities are not being reduced in direct ratio. Furthermore, in the integration of civilians, the lower grades to a great extent are being replaced. Most key jobs, executive, supervisory and policy making must still be filled with military personnel. These positions call for experience found only in the top officer grades, hence the proportion of higher grades requested. Therefore, in order to adequately staff the overhead installations of the theater with experienced personnel for efficient operation

Total overhead figure is not accurate (G-3 Troop Control) but could be adjusted easily if request per part 2 is approved. Chief Surgeon's Office (Captain Jacobs) estimated nurse requirements.

As the only appreciable difference between the present theater spread and that requested in above radio is in the Colonel and Lieutenant Colonel positions, justification for those top officer positions is all that is considered necessary.
