Reurad W 88575 (WDSCA GO) to CINCAFPAC. Postal Convention weight limit for letters approved. Text of directive to Imperial Japanese Government follows:

" 1. Reference is made to memorandum from SCAP (SCAFIN 1177), file AG 311.1, (5 Sept 46)CCS, dated 5 September 46, subject: "Resumption of International Postal Service between Japan and all other Countries except Germany".

" 2. Paragraph 1 of the reference memorandum is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"1. International postal service between Japan and all other countries is authorized effective 2 January 1947 subject to the following provisions:

a. The service will be restricted to postal cards (including reply cards) and letters to and from Japan; one-way gift parcel post to Japan, and the mailing from Japan of such scientific and professional publications as plain text of this nature as correspondence may be approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. has been authorized by the War Department in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs 15-C, 18-E, 33-B

b. (1) (2) (3) (4) (5) (6) AR 380-5, 6 March 1946 Communications on postal cards and in letters will be restricted to personal and family messages, and to business, financial, and commercial correspondence,

limited to ascertainment of facts and exchange of information, and subject to the following prohibitions:

- (1) Letters authorizing or effecting specific financial and commercial transactions.
- (2) Letters containing instructions or authorizations which effect property and financial transactions.
- (3) Letters which contain currency, securities, checks, drafts, payment orders or other financial instruments.

c. Communications on postal cards and in letters must be written in Chinese, English, French, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, / Russian, or Spanish.

d. Gift parcels to Japan will be limited to eleven pounds in weight and contents will be restricted to relief items such as non-perishable foods, clothing, soap, and mailable medicines. End quote.

1. Reurad 39710, 27 December 1946, the alleged criticism of Ephraim E. Sinn of personnel and policies of Legal Section, GHQ, are the views of a disgruntled employee of this Section, who refuses to recognize or accept the basic principles of staff procedure. He will not accept administrative or professional advice even though he knows full well that the proper function of an office of this kind and character can only operate with complete unity. There is no doubt that Sinn has sought to embarrass both the War Crimes program and the Legal Section, SCAP, by the submission of his "criticisms". This is apparent from the distribution of his paper which was evidently effected simultaneously.
2. Allegation that Major King is acting Chief of Legal Section is untrue. King is executive officer whose duties are of an administrative character, and has never been acting Chief of the Section.
3. Re paragraph 3 page 3 of Sinn's paper. The presence of the Chinese witness was desired by Lt. Col. Browne, Eighth Army Judge Advocate, even after deposition was taken. Col. Blackstock consented to retain witness and advised King thereof who informed Sinn.
4. Re paragraph 2 page 4 of Sinn's paper. The defense of "superior orders" was involved, and under the SCAP war crimes regulations such defense is considered as a mitigating circumstance and not as a defense. Therefore, action against the guards is still under consideration.

5. Re paragraph 1 page 5 of Sinn's paper. The Chinese witnesses are provided billets, clothes, and Army rations within the Eighth Army Stockade. However, they are not treated as prisoners nor are they worked. The Chinese witnesses have complete freedom of liberated individuals and Sinn knows it. Several have been assigned for duty with the Chinese Mission in Tokyo and information is that they now desire to return to their former Stockade quarters. In recent talk with Sinn on this topic, he stated that the Stockade quarters were the most suitable and desirable for the Chinese witnesses. The Chinese War Crimes Prosecution team of this Section is aware of the arrangement and insist upon it, inasmuch as the Chinese authorities can provide no other facilities for them.
6. Re paragraph 2 pages 5-6 of Sinn's paper. The assignment of a prosecutor to a case does not guarantee that he will remain with it to the end, although every effort is made to accomplish that result. In rare instances such as Sinn describes, personnel assignments and other factors beyond our control require changes.
7. Re paragraph 1 page 6 (The Chinese Cases). The statement of Sinn are opinions which require no comment, since his views concern high level policy.
8. Re the alleged "unfair rating" of Sinn, pages 8 to 13. The efficiency rating was not pre-dated. It was prepared by Mr. Blackstock and submitted to Major King who checked the rating for form and sufficiency. The rating was recommended to the Chief, Legal Section, who passed on it finally, both

in form and content. The rating is subjective to a large extent and represents an overall appraisal of Sinn's efficiency based on daily contacts and personal observation by his Chief, as well as the views of the Chief, Legal Section. Sinn's attitude has been one of complete indifference to instructions which did not suit his personal tastes. He has adopted an air of independence, assuming unwarranted authority in his relations with representatives of a foreign nation, often to the embarrassment of the Legal Section. In short his smugness, his airs of superiority, and his failure to fit, have made him undesirable.

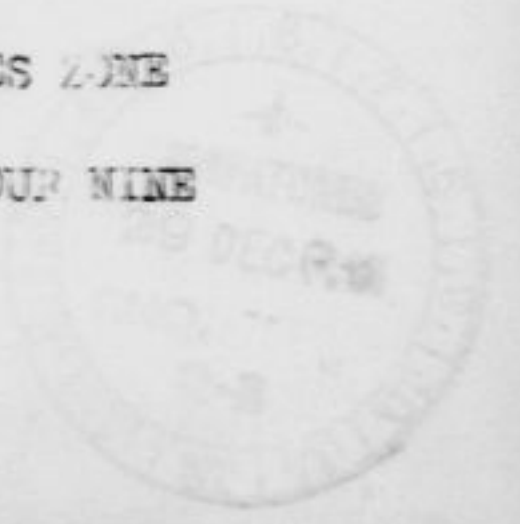

Memorandum for Record :

1. War Department Memo 210-20-1 provides for the submission of a report of construction requirements for permanent base development to arrive at the War Department not later than 1 May 1947.

2. WED, in radio 210745/Z advises Chief of Engineers has directed suspension of permanent base construction and planning in the Philippines and requests that WESPAC be instructed to cease asking HANED for assistance in assembling data for the report of permanent construction requirements in the Philippines which WESPAC is now assembling in accordance with provisions of War Department Memo 210-20-1.

3. Radio W 87345 (not to WESPAC) advises the War Department is considering amendments to the 6 August plan for overseas bases to include only a token force in the Philippines of a Composite Air Group and a Ground Force element from a regimental headquarters, and small infantry element to a division less two regiments.

4. Radio WH 87769 (info to WESPAC) indicates draft of Philippines base agreement, Annex "A", now includes Clark Field, Fort Stotsenberg, Mariveles, Bataan PCL and Training Area, Camp John Hay, and Army Communications Systems outside the Manila area; Del Monte Cemetery #2, Angeles General Depot, Quezon City Transmitter Area, and associated sites in the Manila area; various naval facilities.

5. If conclusion of Philippine base agreements and subsequent amendments of the War Department plan for overseas provide for the permanent garrisoning of the bases listed in Annex "A" to the agreement, permanent construction requirements will result.

6. If War Department desires subject report on 1 May 1947 to include Philippine requirements, planning of such permanent base installations as would result from amended War Department plan must continue.

7. This signal requests instructions on permanent base planning desired by War Department be furnished WESPAC and GCR, War Department.

Records of property declared surplus to the Department of Interior in the Hawaiian Area indicate, up to the 15th of October, the following:

a. Total amount declared - \$96,000,000

b. Withdrawn - \$22,000,000



Of the net amount of property declared surplus, \$74,000,000, the disposal agency has sold as of 15 October only \$18,000,000. Of the \$56,000,000 balance \$52,000,000 has been accumulating and available for disposition by the disposal agency for not less than 60 days with the major proportion available for 6 or more months. Records here show that disposal action by the disposal agency has averaged only approximately 5% per month of the net total property available for disposition during the period April to September 46 inclusive.

Breakdown, by Services, of surplus property available for disposal follows;

Medical - \$448,000 — Engineer - \$13,908,017 — Quartermaster \$6,460,352
Ordnance - \$20,345,493 — Chemical - \$2,341,055 — Transportation \$3,777,685
Signal - \$5,106,720 — Total \$52,367,322.

It is estimated that additional declarations totalling approximately \$30,000,000 will be made to the Department of Interior in the near future, divided as follows: Ordnance, \$18,000,000; Engineer, \$11,000,000; and the remainder divided among the other services.

In face of continually shrinking personnel and funds there is a compelling necessity to exercise utmost economy of resources. Commanding General AFMIDPAC is exercising every economy in resources to meet the problem of a continuing responsibility for the care and custody of the above property with diminishing means. Unless some relief can be realized through more rapid disposal of mounting surpluses the problem will shortly assume unmanageable proportions.

In this connection Commanding General USAFIK desires to acquire approximately \$8,000,000, in sales value, of property already declared and to be declared surplus in Hawaii to augment selections already made, for military government requirements, from surplus property in the Philippines and in Japan. This program is in lieu of new procurement for Korean Military Government requirements. In addition Commanding General USAFIK desires certain excess and surplus property for purely military purposes in Korea. Sufficient details as to firm estimates of requirements for Hawaii excesses and surpluses by classes of property are not immediately at hand to enable a comprehensive plan to be submitted at this time for the acquisition of such property. However, responsible representatives of Commanding General USAFIK are now en route to Hawaii for the purpose of making selections. Within near future a detailed plan will be submitted to include:

- (1) Request for authority for CG AFMIDPAC to withdraw from surplus such property as CG USAFIK may require over and above selections from excesses in Hawaii;
- (2) Shipment of all selected property, as excess, to Korea;
- (3) Declaration as surplus in Korea of that portion of shipped property not required by military forces;
- (4) Sale to USAMGIK, of such declared surplus, by Foreign Liquidation Commissioner under current foreign liquidation commissioner credit agreement. The comprehensive plan to be submitted as soon as adequate information is available will include a transportation program.

It is recommended that the above proposal be favorably considered and

approved in principle. If approved it will provide the means to promptly reduce the backlog of unsold surplus property in Hawaii.

Approval of the above proposal will afford some relief, however, it is recommended that, in addition, action be taken to stimulate activity on the part of Department of Interior to accelerate disposal of Hawaiian surpluses so that Commanding General AFMIDPAC may obtain relief from the expense in personnel and funds involved in the continued care and custody of property available for disposition or that Department of Interior assume full responsibility for care and custody of surplus property.

Request that CINCAFPAC be advised, info Commanding General AFMIDPAC, of action taken on the above proposal and recommendation.

"Following conclusion of Ehrhardt Bureau Trial in Shanghai about December 20.

It will be highly desirable to repatriate all defendants plus witnesses from China as soon as possible. Chinese Government has already requested exemption of 6 Germans including 2 defendants from repatriation and this type of pressure likely continue. In addition maintenance of group Shanghai following trial creates problem for Army. Can you supply information concerning date arrival of ship Japan or Shanghai, including capacity of ship and space available? If repatriation Germans in Japan is to be delayed it will be desirable to have ship en route Japan diverted Shanghai to embark this group. Embassy would appreciate early reply. "

OURAD CX 66517, 22 October 46, to WARCOS advises that there is no objection here to stated plan for repatriation of War Criminals from China provided they are processed and outloaded from China and security guards are provided for trip from China to Germany and recommends that shipping scheduled for repatriation of Germans from Japan be routed to China to pick up War Criminals.

G-2 Security report on Mr. Conde, dated 19 Dec 46 states that as an employee of C I & E as Chief of the Motion Picture and Theatrical Unit, Mr. Conde was accused of conducting a campaign to foster production control by unions on strike. Further that Mr. Conde consistently gave his support to Japanese leftists in the moving picture industry and encouraged them to produce leftist moving pictures and newsreels.

M/R: 1. This radio verifies WD figures, confirms our inbound shipping estimate, and states our enlisted replacement requirements through June 47.

2. Ourad CX-67542, 25 Nov gave shipping requirements for next 7 months - Dec through June 47.

3. At G-1 conference we presented our personnel needs and the WD proceeded to set-up personnel to meet these needs and anticipated needs resulting from the release of 1945 inductees.

4. In ourad C 67473, 22 Nov, referred to in subject radio, we stated numbers allocated were adequate to replace the 13,778 selectees inducted in 1945 to be returned in late December and early January. We pointed out delay in shipment of personnel allocated for November and December would leave a shortage after departure of 1945 inductees which would be eliminated and an overstrength would exist after arrival complete allocation. It was suggested maximum advantage of existence of overstrength in late January and February and delays due to inadequacy of shipping be taken to give replacements maximum training possible prior to shipment.

5. WD subsequently allocated an additional 2,000 and in subject radio advises that an additional 12,000 for January shipment is to be allocated.

6. Figures as presented by the WD are essentially correct after elimination of some entries including FS personnel.

(C-68306) Reurads WGL-30315, 25 July 1946, and W-89712, 30 May 1946, Netherlands Government has filed claim for approximately fifty gold bars and sixty seven silver bars produced in the Netherlands East Indies during the Japanese occupation, and Chinese Government for silk produced in China during Japanese occupation. It is anticipated there will be other claims for diamonds, tin, quinine, cinchona bark and other property produced during Japanese occupation of Pacific area. Question: Are the following categories of property which are found in Japan and are identified as having been produced, repeat produced, in an Allied country during the Japanese occupation of that country subject to restitution or should they be held for disposition as part of the general reparations program:

- A. Industrial and transportation machinery and equipment;
- B. Gold, other precious metals, precious gems;
- C. Agricultural products and industrial raw materials.

In view of the difficulties involved in identifying such properties, it is recommended that properties in the above categories receive same treatment accorded rubber in urad W-89712: That is, restitution to claimant Governments would not be permitted if properties were produced during Japanese occupation.

Full and comprehensive reports on Japanese external assets to include war booty, with particular reference to fuller data on distribution by geographic areas, should arrive War Department in several days.
