

- 2. Financial statements of operation of individual news agencies in Japan from date such agencies commenced operations in Japan have been requested. Purpose of such requests is to review operating costs, accumulation of yen belances, and overall scope of past operations news agencies. Such statements will indicate size of yen belances and will enable estimate of mbr of months in the future which will lapse before dollars could commence accruing to export import account as a result of news agencies buying their jen with dollars for normal operating expenses for collection of news for export.
- 3. Position here now tentatively that yen balances of news agencies should not be used for current operating expenses relative collection of news for export if such balances are relatively large, inasmuch as such use of these balances results in the dollar equivalent not accruing to the export import trust fund. 

I'wded for wour info and guidance:

"Flt of any foreign acft into Air Domain of China without previous auth is regarded as violating Chinese Air Sovereignty. In such cases Chinese authorities will take adequate measures to make acft in question land on Chinese airfld and should this be ignored action may be taken to destroy acft in air. Since it is difficult to make distinction from ground, all foreign acft whether mil or civilian will be treated on same basis in such cases of violation."

This has been tempered by info cable from Alusna Nanking China NCR 6753 dtd 18 Apr 47 which states "under no circumstances would they fire on any American acft whether they had been cleared into airfld or not." Extreme caution advised until

dissemination confirmed and situation cleared.

Reurada XYMP 483, TFYMP 515 and rad XTFYMP 523 CG XXIV Corps Kores. Customs has seized 2 lots of merchandise illegally sent into US about Jan 46 by Gordon, 1 lot sent to Alyce Smythe includes several diamond rings, jade, furs, silks and other items appraised by customs in excess of \$3,000. 2nd lot sent to Gordons parents near Pittsburgh includes skins, silver, lacquer work and other things not yet appraised but expected not to exceed \$1,000.

Alyce Smythe has talked freely but Gordon has made only a few informal admissions confined to his shipment of the goods into this country. Case against him for violation Customs Laws is clear.

Gordon has retained civ counsel and stubbornly refuses to make any statement or answer any further questions whatever even those in no way incriminating. This attitude tends to confirm suspicion that he is hiding something of a serious nature.

Progress reports for Mar show very unsatisfactory performance in the progress being made in turning over surplus to China and the Philippines. Reference the Philippines, indications are that notices of availability as of 21 Mar are only sufficient to cover that property which had been declared surplus before the first of Jan. With respect to China, Mar progress reports show only an additional 4% declared and 5% made available over corresponding totals as of 28 Feb and for the Philippines 7% additional declared and 11% placed on notices of availability during the same period. As the end of Mar, less than 30% of the total and less than 50% of that declared has been made available to the Chinese. Further, no appreciable progress was made in declaration of surpluses for the Chinese account.

Such progress as that achieved during Mar can only result in unduly prolonging period of transfer with attendant increased cost to the WD. It is essential, therefore, that every possible action be taken immediately to accelerate notices of availability and subsequent transfers to the maximum extent. Subject is radio broadcast by Bob Stewart, Mutual Broadcasting System from Manila received here 3 April 1947.

The following are excerpts from broadcast:

"One of the greatest scandals of graft and corruption since the end of the war is now in full swing here in the Philippines. In less than one year more than 523 million American dollars worth of Army surplus equipment and foodstuffs which were turned over to the new Philippine Republic has been stolen here. Today, on the streets of Manila, American Army trucks are pilfered, highjacked and stolen. At Army depots professional thieves are pilfering quantities of American surplus Army equipment amounting to as high as \$300,000 daily. Both American and Filipino Army men, as well as American Civil Service employees, are receiving huge sums of money and payoff allotments if they allow 'even trucks' to leave Quartermaster areas heavily loaded with high priced contrabrand. The best example of that is the profitable market of dynamite caps which sell for \$8,000 per case."

The Secretary of War desires information as to the veracity of these reports and actual facts as to stated conditions. It is realized that your representatives on supply plan for evacuation of the Philippines due here 7 April will undoubtedly have some information on the subject. Request you provide such additional information as you consider may

not be in possession of representatives.

"1. Participation by Japanese nationals in aviation activities. During the period of occupation, Japanese nationals should not be permitted to engage in flight operations. enterprise operated by Japanese or by non-Japanese.



1. Provision of food, fuel and clothing for Philippine Army for Fiscal Year 1947 now being provided from WD budget because Congress did not authorize special appropriation for that purpose. WD budget for FY 1948 does not include money for this purpose, nor is the WD requesting such an appropriation because of the bazard of having Congress repeat last years action; therefore, after 30 June this year the problem of providing these items for FY 1948 at a cost estimated herein as approximately \$12,000,000, will rest on the Philippine Government. WD is interested in determining what logistical planning Philippine Army has undertaken looking toward provision of food, fuel and clothing and what provision the Philippine Government bas made for the assumption of this responsibility.

2. This matter has been discussed with the Dept of State which is communicating with its Embassy in Manila,

pointing out that:

A. The WD has not requested appropriations for the above purpose. The State Dept has no adequate basis at the present time for believing that consideration need be given to any aid after 30 June 47 for the above purpose since no request has been made either through Military or Governmental Channels.

B. It would be unfortunate if the Philippine Govt is now proceeding on the basis that the US is now contemplating continuation of the aid at present being extended. Such continuation could only be considered on the basis of a formal request through Governmental Channels.

3. For your information any request for continued aid appears unlikely to be granted by the present economy minded Congress. Certainly it would need to be based on a detailed justification and would have to be submitted promptly.

Summary:

1. Presently no indications of any basic changes in Soviet intentions are evident. USSR will continue to maintain largest armed forces of any nation but will lack capability of prosecuting successful Global War until Soviet Air and Waval arms can be built up and Soviet economic situation can be improved. While Soviet economy has approximated its prewar level it is, as in the past, deficient in production capabilities for Global Warfare. Lack of production facilities for long range aircraft, deep sea fleets and general backwardness in technology will require time to overcome. Basic Soviet objective remains the continued expansion of the Soviet system, with no evidence of any self imposed limitations.

2. While there has been no official Soviet reaction to President Truman's March 12th speech on Greece and Turkey, USSR now has much clearer conception of US Foreign Policy. Soviets will undoubtedly adopt policy of watchful waiting to see how US implements proposed aid for Greece and Turkey. It is possible that Soviets may even test US reaction by "safe" diversionary tactics such as concentration of greater group of troops in Bulgaria on

Greek and Turkish borders.

3. Little progress has thus far been made at conference of Foreign Ministers in Moscow. Same delaying and obstructionist

tactics are pursued by Soviets as in previous meetings.

Soviet armed forces are currently engaged in carrying out their scheduled reorganization. Fifth phase of demobilization is being conducted in occupied countries as well as in USSR. Reduction of Soviet troop strength in occupation areas of Europe and Balkans continues except in Bulgaria. Combat units which have been withdrawn are for most part being stationed along western borders of USSR --- a normal Soviet practice. Soviet troop strength

in Bulgaria is being maintained at an estimated 140,000 if not being slightly increased. It is likely TQYUMJMMUCWVKCWY spring maneuvers in southeastern portion of that country will commence in April as they did in 46.

5. Possibility of war resulting from incidents:

A. For some time anti Communist leaders in Balkans have reflected increasing optimism that Soviet Satellite regimes will collapse as result of their inability to stem progressive economic disintegration and of Soviet failure to render economic support. This ill timed optimism has been markedly strengthened by recent stiffening of US policy toward USSR. One should not ignore possibility therefore of an increase in active resistance to puppet regimes, particularly in Yugoslavia, which might be made an excuse for transfer of Soviet forces to points near Greek frontier. A further slight possibility exists that Anti Communist elements in satellite states or in Greece might deliberately create an accident intended to provoke US Military action.

B. In Hungary strenuous efforts of local Communists, supported by Soviet authorities, to achieve dominance prior to departure of Soviet forces could lead or resort to force by either Communists or strongly Anti Communist Hungarian majority.

C. In western Europe, Spain. France and Italy offer only potential tinder which might precept war. There seems little likelihood of trouble in Spain this spring but in France the spark could be applied by successful Rightist action against Communists setting off an Anti-Soviet reaction throughout Europe. Rightist solidarity and optimism were enhanced by President's speech but have been tempered by doubts concerning American military strength. Recent events indicate that Communists Party and the all

important Communist controlled orderation of Labor Unions are adopting defensive attitude designed to avoid danger of further provoking the Rightist elements. In Italy possibility exists that Anti Communist elements may take some positive action to secure control of Government after Allied Forces are finally withdrawn.

D. While calling attention to these possibilities and recognizing that they might create situations highly embarrassing if not dangerous, it is believed that Soviet interest in avoiding general war at this time, as well as our own efforts, make it highly unlikely that such a war may develop as result of incidents or local uprisings. In fact Soviet determination to avoid war may conceivably lead to modification of Communists tactics destined to lessen international tension.

Conclusions:

1. Factors which hitherto have operated to develop Soviet determination to avoid war with United States in near future continue to be decisive.

2. Recent amplification and hardening of US policy in respect to USSR should cause policy of Soviet leaders to be even more

carefully directed toward avoidance of war. 3. While it is highly unlikely that explosive potentialities may lead to general war, critical areas and situations should be

watched carefully. 4. It is possible that USSR, though determined to avoid war, may seek to ascertain strength and character of US policy

by some show of force, either directly or through her satellites.



Reoured Feb WX 91119 and urad Mar S 45341 situation concerning civilian attorneys engaged in War Crimes activities at Manila is causing considerable embarrasament to WD.

Previous incident is covered by ourad and msgs referred to therein. It was considered advisable to retain at least I defense attorney who has worked on Sadaaki Konishi case pending outcome of appeal which is expected. Cable S 45341 from CG PHILRYCOM, shows Konishi defense consisted of 3 attorneys. 2 of these 3 attorneys have been separated for cause and reraining I has submitted resignetion, leaving no attorney at Manila who was involved in that case. Most recent incident which is source of emberrassment is charge in congressional record, 17 Mar by congressman George F. Schwabe of House Appropriations committee, who states in part:

"Have recd numerous rumors of extravagance on part of WD and our Armed Services generally. The men who served in World War II can tell you of many unnecessary and extravagant expenditures during days of hostilities. Those who were still in Army when shooting ended can tell you of multiplied instances where waste and extravagance were direct results of our Armed Forces. These observances and experiences are on lips of thousands of boys who have returned since war, and they do not like it because they know that eventually they will have to pay bill. Worst feature of this situation is that it continues and is going on at an inexcusable rate even to this late day."

Congressmen Schwabe cites as an example case of Emerson R Phillips, defense attorney at Manila, charging Phillips was declared surplus immediately upon arrival at his place of duty. Ltr from Mr Phillips is quoted in congressional record. Phillips states that since learning foregoing every transport has brought add attorneys until now there are some 8 or 9 to be repatriated without ever reporting for dy. He stated head man at pers office told him there were 15 or 16 more attorneys en route, all of whom would be declared surplus upon arrival. Phillips further states "there are so many officers over here (about 90% seem to have little if anything to do) that it is almost situation of all chiefs and no Indians "extravagance and waste here is actually beyond comprehension--particularly by Army officers." Report by your Hq is desired covering over all situation with respect to War Crimes at Manila.

WD feels War Crimes Trials at Manila have not progressed satisfactorily. We understand large number of cases are on hand in early stages of preparation and believe consideration should be given to using any surplus attorneys for investigation and preparation of these cases with view to completing at an early date such trials as it is necessary to conduct at Manila. In view of apparent diffi ulty in developing satisfactory arrangement at Manila, WD considers it extremely desirable to close Manila War Crimes office in May this year or as soon thereafter as possible, transferring remaining activity to Japan where closer supervision and more effective use of pers can be had.

Your comments concerning this proposal desired. With reference to Konishi case, believed advisable to appoint defense counsel acceptable to defendent or recommended by attorney Ransom. If Ransom will not continue, or take such other measures as are nesessary to prevent criticism of WD for discharging defense

counsel prior to action on appeal.
