New York Times 9 Jan: Dr Syngman Rhee, first Provisional President of Korea, issued a statement in Wash last night calling on the US and Russia to resume negotiations on withdrawing their occupation troops and establishing an independent Korea. His statement was in part: "Russian and American Forces now occupy Korea, according to a secret agreement, the nature of which has never been fully revealed. Since Korea lies in the heart of the vital strategic triangle of North Asia, bordered by the Siberian Maritime Province, China and Japan, Korea should not be controlled by any one or combination of them, or by any other outside power, without grave danger to the others and to the peace of the Orient. For this reason, as well as for justice to Korea, negotiations must be renewed between Russia and the US to get their armies out of Korea and to live up to the Cairo Declaration promising Korean independence."

While Korea is not on the Moscow agenda, Washington observers would not be at all surprised to learn that the Soviet and American Foreign Ministers at some point during their coming weeks of discussion in the Soviet capital have worked the conversation around to that subject... The reasons and pressures for having such side discussions are believed here to be too overwhelming to be ignored. For one thing, Sec of State Marshall has become something of an expert on the Far East problems as a result of his peace making efforts in China. Foreign Minister Molotov and even Generalissimo Stalin have every reason to be curious about his assessment and reactions to developments in Asia. But, ever more, as regards Korea, Moscow and Washington have failed so far to carry out their promises to organize a democratic united country there. In fact they have been deadlocked for eight months over differences in procedure... In such a situation only some effort at a higher level contains the prospect of a solution. Knowing Sec Marshall's ability to cut through red tape and get to the point of a disagreement, Washington observers suspect he will try, some point during his Moscow stay, to unscramble the Korean issue... It is no secret here

The warning, it was explained, was directed against Rightist rather than Leftist Grps. These grps, Gen Hodge said, planned wide-spread demonstrations

Washington Post carried essentially the same story today, in addition, the Post reporter says: Some authorities in Wash believe the situation calls for Congressional action in the form of a Korean Rehabilitation Act, providing loans and technical assistance along the lines of the Philippines Rehabilitation Act of last year. No move has yet been made, however, to seek the help of Congress in the grappling with Korea's long term economic problems.

Summarizing American Military Govt activities in Korea during Oct, MacArthur noted "Violence and disorder in widely scattered places during the early days of the month." He accused "Agitators and propagandists" of promoting riots, attacking police stations and stealing arms and ammunition. "Highest auth sources yesterday reported FEC has misgivings about recently promulgated, war-outlawing Japanese constitution and will review it within 3 years after it becomes effective in May these informants said. FEC, which decides occupation policy for Japan, ruled Japanese Diet will review constitution also and Japanese people may be called upon for their opinion. Constitution, adopted by Diet a few months ago, was praised by Gen MacArthur who never has denied having had a hand in writing it. FEC and Gen MacArthur still disagree, informants said on these points:

1. FEC recently said retention of emperor system was not in keeping with broad aim that Japanese people should possess sovereignty. It presumably fears emperor might be a symbol around which non-Democratic form of government could rise. Gen MacArthur wants to retain Hirohito as an agent through whom he can reach Japanese people.

2. FEC looked askance at constitutional method of selecting prime minister. It suggested House of Representatives alone should do that. Gen MacArthur is satisfied with constitutional provision that prime minister be named by Diet, comprising House of Representatives and Councillors, with former body having deciding voice in case of disagreement.

3. FEC suggested that its review of constitution be made public. Gen MacArthur holds that any suggested reforms---such as proposed in FEC review--- would indicate Allies were attempting 'To force something down Japanese throats.' Gen MacArthur and FEC also haggled over cabinet, sovereignty and suffrage clauses in constitution. FEC diplomatically rapped Gen MacArthur for failing to carry out one of its policy study drafts of constitutions other than one they adopted. High officials here say that MacArthur-FEC disagreement appears to center on these two points:

1. Gen MacArthur feels FEC is striving to attain immediately in Japan ultimate in Democracy. He believes Japanese must work out their own problems and thus at least become acquainted with Democratic practices and process of attaining Democracy.

2. FEC would suggest to Japanese certain revisions for constitution. Gen MacArthur fears this would imply a threat of Allied force against Japanese if they didn't comply. He contends this would nullify any leanings toward Democracy inoculated in Japanese since occupation began."

UP Seoul 16 Jan: Koreas 3 major right wing political parties in the American Occupation Zone will hold a mass demonstration Saturday to protest Allied Trusteeship of Korea as conducted under the Moscow Agreement, a US Army spokesman said today. It will be the first concerted right wing opposition to the Mil Govt, and US Army sources said that, if physical violence breaks out, "There no longer will be any basic difference between the extreme right and extreme left."

AP Seoul 16 Jan: Lt Gen Hodge, US Occupation Commander, issued a statement today charging "Extensive plans are underway by certain Korean groups to instigate widespread demonstrations in South Korea." He said the demonstrations would be against the Moscow decision for a so called trusteeship coupled with attempts to discredit the American Govt in Korea. This appears to be tied in with ill advised propoganda that if South Korea is given separate Govt it can itself unite all Korea and solve all international problems without out side help, he said.

Hodge assured the Koreans that efforts are being made to resume negotiations with officials of Russian occupied Korea to set up a Korean Govt.

It is easy to list the reasons for failure: Military Govt in Korea faces an almost impossible situation. Korea is nearly devoid of experienced leaders. The Koreans don't want us here. The people are uneducated and emotionally unstable after 35 years of Japanese domination. They resent all authority. Communists are active and well trained. The country is split in half into American and Russian Zones. American Occupied Korea has little industry. Inflation is so bad that Koreans will follow any leader who promises them rice and clothing. The lack of experienced leaders dwarfs all other problems...Koreans wanted to run things. Not be trained. American industrial managers, railroad operators, college presidents have had to deal with an overly sensitive, overly emotional people who don't like to be told what to do ... (Cromley has quoted numerous Army and civilian occupation officials in this article, the following excerpts are quotes by these officials).
A Regular Army Colonel: The situation is not helped by Occupation officers and enlisted men who treat educated Koreans as flunkies. An experienced American Provincial Governor: Our ambiguous American policy for Korea neither lets Military Govt run the country nor lets the

A Captain, bitterly: According to our present hazy policy, Koreans are equals and allies. But after a generation of Japanese rule, this country is more totalitarian than Japan and less able to stand on its own feet. An ex Major: So Military Govt is half running Korea, half pretending not to be running it. A dozen officers: Americans don't give _____ what is being done in Korea. A Colonel: Korea is only a pawn Washington may sacrifice any day as a concession some international deal. A Captain from Central Korea: It is impossible for the few thousand officers and men in Military Govt to actually govern South Korea's 20,000,000 people, a job that required several thousand technically trained Japanese, all of whom spoke a language Koreans understand. Korean official: Even our interpreters don't know enough English to tell your American officials what we really mean. We're certainly glad to have you here because you can speak Japanese and we can explain ourselves in Japanese. Korean business man: You tend to appoint Koreans to positions of trust simply because they speak English, dress well and comb their hair neatly. An American Colonel, asked if that were true: I'm afraid so. Korean official: Military Govt is likewise hampered because you are attempting to reform Korea with American amateurs, who know little of their jobs and who are inept at handling men. Korean official, ex Chinese Army Major: If you Americans would only send us specialists, technicians, experienced administrators. American Lieut: Military Govt is not effectively telling Koreans what we are trying to do, and why. That is why Koreans believe such wild rumors as that we are collecting rice from starving Koreans to send to Japan and the US. Most Koreans want to know about America and democracy-but we are doing little to tell them. We work hard at selling them our ideas; we put up signs and write pieces for the papers. But Koreans pay little attention to that; most of what they believe they learn by word of mouth. That's where the Communists shine; they're sending trained men out in the country districts, doing the word of mouth campaigning well-but we're not. A Colonel: Make up our minds what we are going to do in Korea, and set about doing it. A Major: Limit our job to what we can do competently, not try to do everything. Let Koreans do the rest; let them make their own mistakes. A Lt Colonel: Adopt a down to earth policy. Do those things Americans are best at, building railway lines, highways, telephone and telegraph networks, getting industry started, showing Koreans how to do things more efficiently. This would create respect and the economic basis for democracy. A civilian: Abolish most of the economic controls. A Colonel: Remove all officers and men not interested in their jobs, even if it means a large reduction in forces. An Airborne Unit in Japan could take care of any possible uprising; the present troops would be unable to prevent invasion by a foreign country. A Captain: Bring in more administrative and technical experts in govt, industry, railroading, education, medicine and research. A Lieut: In the absence of Korean language officers and enlisted men bring in men who can speak Japanese. A Second Lieut: Tell the Koreans why we are here, how long we will stay, what we are trying to do and what democracy is.

Section 4 C (C) of the National Defense Act provides as follows:

"Limitation of Foreign Service. No officer or EM of the Army shall, except upon his own request be required to serve in a single tour of duty for more than 2 years in the Philippine Islands, on the Asiatic Station or in China, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, or the Panama Canal Zone, except in case of insurrection or of actual or threatened hostilities and except in the discretion of the Secretary of War for temporary emergencies; provided, that the foregoing provision shall not apply to the organization known as the Philippine Scouts."

The proclamation of the President of 31 Dec 46 placed the above act, which had been suspended by wartime legislation, once more in effect. However, the existing 2½ years overseas tour is continued in effect as a result of a subsequent declaration of a state of temporary emergency by the Secretary of War.

It is the desire of the War Department to return to a 2 year tour of Foreign Service in all theaters. Accordingly, your comments and recommendations on the following proposed plan are desired as soon as practicable:

A. A normal 2 year tour of foreign duty for all personnel in all theaters.

B. Voluntary extension of 1 year only for

AP 8 Jan, Philadelphia: The people of Korea resent their exclusion from the United Nations, Dr Han So Jeai, a Korean woman physician, said today. Dr Han, who came here to study the Girl Scout movement, said Korean women in particular feel badly because they are seldom invited to international conferences.

Christian Science Monitor 6 Jan, Washington: Some officials in Washington are deeply concerned that the American people should begin to learn actually the costs of being a world power and the rewards of sustaining such a position. These officials feel it would be unfortunate if the public, suddenly seeing only the cost side of the picture, should jump at the conclusion that the effort is not worth it. In several ways, lately, these top ranking officials have tried to put on the record, without alarming the public, the heavy investments that must be made by the United States as an occupying power. Their dilemma demands choosing between being so brutally frank as possible to frighten the public away from fulfilling American international commitments and being so restrained as unintentionally to deceive the public regarding its cost....

Take the case of Korea. The United States is running a deficit in occupying Southern Korea over and above the basic costs of Military Government. Because Korea's rice crop failed this year, the United States has to see to it that Koreans don't starve. The southern zone needs 650,000 metric

tons of grain and rice imported next year. It needs half a million tons of fertilizer to get agriculture back on its feet. It needs imports of all kinds for which Korea can not pay. American officials say quite frankly that for the next year or so the bulk of Korean reconstruction costs will have to be paid for by the United States, out of Congressional appropriations. Also, Korea has secured \$18,000,000 worth of Army surplus material. Coal, textile machinery parts, yard goods and silk worm eggs have been shipped to Korea by the United States. This has all been "on account." But, should and will Korea ever pay for these items? Should this help be written off as gifts or collected as debts? If the United States is successful in building up Korea's economy, that country may be able to pay some share of the cost of reconstruction. But-as one American official has said: "We can't count on much though, as it would defeat our whole purpose to leave Korea saddled with an internal debt which would be a millstone around its neck."

Christian Science Monitor 7 Jan, Seoul: Appointment of four women to the interim legislative group of South Korea marks the beginning of the end of male domination of social, political and economic affairs in this country. Actually, the appointment of four women conservatives to the first democratic governing group in Korea by Lt Gen John R Hodge was not so startling as might be expected. With the advent of American Military Government and inclusion of western fundamentals in the native government, there has been a slow but steady surge of women to the fore....

Perhaps the outstanding women educator in Korea is Miss Helen Kim, president of Iwha College for Women. Miss Kim is probably the most optimistic leader of the lot. From her vantage point, she has noted a strong upswing in the

hunger for knowledge of the rising generation of Korean women. She now has the backing in the Legislature of Mrs Hwang Sin Dawk and Mrs Bak Hyawn Sook. On the opening day of the legislature, both of these women asserted their determination to win better educational opportunities for women....

Termination of the Kiisan Rule over social activities is one needed improvement....

Christian Science Monitor, Seoul 7 Jan: Public opinions polls conducted by the Military Government here, as well as Korean newspaper comment representing both Right Wing and Leftist groups, indicate that the Korean people are not growing in their enthusiasm for "American Democracy." An essential problem is that the Koreans interpret occupation policy as a mirror of the kind of govt the occupiers wish to see established. It seems impossible to convey to them the impression that occupation has many difficulties. The Koreans themselves are inclined to judge every step as a matter of policy; actually many of the measures undertaken are only justified by their sponsors as the best that could be achieved under difficult circumstances....

Most Koreans arrested cannot afford lawyers; consequently one American officer often acts simultaneously as judge, prosecutor, and defense counsel-with power to impose sentences up to five years at hard labor.

However, cases involving sentences from five years to life imprisonment, such as inciting a riot or killing a Korean policeman, are tried before a Military Commission, consisting of five American officers sitting under an American flag with two or three prosecutors and defense counsels. Almost daily, lists of convicted Koreans are released to Korea newspapers. Typical announcements from the Military Government's Public Information Department

Koreans, who read convictions like these in the papers, have told this correspondent they wonder why there have been no publicized trials of traitorous collaborators, corrupt Korean officials in Military Government, or brutal police who have been seen performing tortures....

Despite this emphasis on United States short comings in Korea, however, it is plain that not all this country's troubles are attributable to the Military Government. At least a portion of the blame admittedly rests on the Koreans themselves, who persist in dividing themselves into two irreconcilable camps.

And another portion of the trouble derives from the Russian occupation forces in North Korea, which have made fairly plain their desire to swing Korea into the Soviet sphere of influence....

On Oct 21, when the Korean American Conference to investigate the causes of the riots met to discuss "the presence of former pro Japanese collaborators in Military Government," the official statement on the proceedings, carried in the Korean press, read: "Members of the Conference, particularly several of the Korean conferees, stressed the fact that the objective of the Conference is to act neither as a court of law nor as a prosecuting agency. Magnanimity in dealing with those of the Korean people who are guilty of collaboration with Japanese on technical ground was urged before the Conference. The Conference recognized the final solution of the problem will have to be made by the Korean people themselves."...

Lt Gen John R Hodge, commanding American Forces in Southern Korea, issued a statement today denying "assumptious" that the US was working toward a separate govt for its occupation zone.

These "are incorrect and dangerous conclusions," fostered by "certain elements," Gen Hodge said.

He did not elaborate on this reference but he and other American spokesmen in the past have blamed Communists for disorders, sabotage and other unrest in Southern Korea.

US State Dept officials in Washington last week conceded that the tug of war between the US and Russia had almost hopelessly stalled any prospects of early unification of that country. Gen Hodge said, however, that he and his staff were following the American policy as expressed at the Cairo and Potsdam conferences and last week by the State Dept:

"To continue to work for democratic Provisional Govt which will lead to the independence of Korea as a united North and South into one."

The Interim Legislature for the American half of Korea, which opened 12 Dec, "is not a govt within itself, nor is it the governing body of Southern Korea, it is exactly what the name implies, an Interim Legislative Assembly with legislative powers to make laws for enforcement by the Executive Branch of the govt," pending establishment of a Provisional Govt, Gen Hodge declared.

As executive head of the govt of Southern Korea, Gen Hodge said he had been "progressively drawing Koreans into governmental responsibility pending establishment of

1. Sec Treas has proposed to Sec State removal of trading with enemy controls administered by Treas over current transactions between persons in US and persons in Germany and Japan. Treas would, of course, continue to block German and Japanese property presently blocked in US pending vesting by office of Alien Property Custodian. Technique proposed is to include Germany and Japan in treas gen license number 94. Effect of Treasury action would be to make it unnecessary for treas licenses to be obtained to communicate with or to carry on current dealings with Germany and Japan.

For example, Americans would no longer need treasury licenses to enter Germany or Japan. Entry of persons would, however, still be controlled by necessity of acquiring passport and theater clearance. Treasury licenses would no longer be necessary for persons in the US to purchase materials from Japan and control over foreign trade and proceeds thereof would rest entirely with SCAP and its designated agents.

2. Elimination of controls adm by treasury would not mean that persons in the US would be free to enter into uncontrolled dealings with person in Japan but would mean that the only approval hereafter required would be that of SCAP and that any restrictions on dealings would be imposed and enforced by SCAP. At time of lifting controls administered by Treasury, State and Treasury would publicize fact that your controls remain operative and that financial and commercial dealings with persons in Japan would continue subject to theater controls.

3. Before concurring with Treas proposal, State and War urgently desire your gen views as to whether you foresee any serious difficulty in the enforcement of your controls by reason of removal of treasury controls in the US. Your specific comments on the fol are requested:

A. Do you consider that dropping of treas controls will seriously impair your ability to enforce by internal censorship, Ordinances of Japanese Govt and otherwise, restrictions relating to property in Japan owned or controlled outside Japan, and contracts between Japanese and foreign concerns?

B. Keeping in mind that in any event, import, export, and foreign exchange controls must be exercised in Japan, do you consider abolition of treas controls will have serious undesirable effects to necessitate additional supervisory measures in adm of foreign trade program?

C. Understanding here is that SCAP prescribes an internal standard of conduct paralleling those in treasury licenses under which US business interests are presently operating in Japan. Do you foresee any serious difficulty re supervision standards of conduct in accord your occupation policies? In this connection, special reference is made to stipulations in trees licenses, respect to inconvertibility yen balances accumulated in Japan and need for maintenance in full of policies expressed in such stipulations as gen occupation policies applicable to all foreign interests operating in Japan and not merely to US interests.

D. In view of fact your controls referred to in A and C above are principally exercised through directives to and regulations of Japanese Govt, do you consider elimination of treas controls likely to seriously impair supervision activities US nationals and organizations in Japan?

4. State considers that reliance on controls exercised in Japan instead of on controls exercised in the US is desirable as your controls apply equally to external commercial and financial dealings between Japan and all other countries, while controls administered by treas apply only to dealings between persons in the US and persons in Japan. In addition the elimination of the controls exercised by treas will make it possible for you to put into effect more expeditiously any overall relaxations such controls as may be required. It will also dispense with the necessity of persons in the US desiring to do business with Japan obtaining official authorization both in Wash and in Japan, and will enable them to deal solely with SCAP.

Will you prepare and cable soonest a proposed itinerary for group newsmen scheduled depart Statewide 22 January for tour Pacific as guest Secretary of War. On basis your suggestions we will schedule teleconference to work out all details. Plan is to provide full 30 day tour from San Francisco to San Francisco including travel time. Schedule should provide for time in Japan, Korea, Philippines, Okinawa and Hawaii with possibility stop over day in Guam or Saipan if you recommend. Program must allow certain amount free time with no activity scheduled so newsmen can carry on unrestricted personal projects, for individual research, or write material if desired.

Suggestions based upon similar trips to European Area are: Such parties not greatly interested seeing great number troop unit due similarity everywhere. Major interests in occupation difficulties, government, industry, reorientation of Japanese people, treatment of press. They undoubtedly will want to see effect atom bomb at scene. Elaborate entertainment has received criticism. Small amount of essential and official entertainment functions essential. US Army ration has proven adequate for majority meals. Meetings with officers allied nations and indigenous officials have always been sought by such newsmen. Experience in Europe is that matters treated in confidence will be so regarded. Special cable-President Truman today officially terminated the period of hostilities of the Second World War effective at noon, Eastern Standard Time. Following is text of President's Proclamation:

By the President of the United States of America. A Proclamation. With Gods help this nation and our allies, through sacrifice and devotion, courage and perseverance, wrung final and unconditional surrender from our enemies. Thereafter, we together with the other nations, set about building a world in which justice shall replace force. With spirit, through faith, with a determination that there shall be no more wars of aggression calculated to enslave the peoples of the world and destroy their civilization, and with the guidance of Almighty Providence great gains have been made in translating military victory into permanent peace. Although a state of war still exists, it is at this time possible to declare, and I find it to be in the public interest to declare, that hostilities have terminated.

Now, therefore, I, Harry S Truman, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim the cessation of hostilities of World War II, effective 12 o'clock noon, Dec 31 46. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States of America to be affixed. Done at the City

Statement by President accompanying proclamation:

"I have today issued a proclamation terminating the
period of hostilities of World War II, as of 12 o'clock noon
today, Dec 31, 46. Under the law, a number of war and emergency
statutes cease to be effective upon the issuance of this pro-
clamation. It is my belief that the time has come when such a
declaration can properly be made, and that it is in the public
interest to make it. Most of the powers affected by this
proclamation need no longer be exercised by the Executive Branch
of the Govt. This is entirely in keeping with the policies
which I have consistently followed, in an effort to bring our
economy and our Govt back to a peacetime basis as quickly as
possible. The proclamation terminates Govt powers under
some twenty statutes immediately upon its issuance. It terminates
Govt powers under some 33 others at a later date, generally at
the end of 6 months from the date of the proclamation. This
follows as the result of provisions made by Congress when the
Legislation was originally passed. In a few instances the
statutes affected by the proclamation give the Govt certain powers
which in my opinion are desirable in peacetime, or for the remainder
of the period of reconversion. In these instances, recommendation
will be made to Congress for additional legislation.

It should be noted that the proclamation does not terminate the states of emergency declared by President Roosevelt on Sept 8, 39, and May 27, 41. Nor does today's action have the effect of terminating the state of war itself. It terminates merely the period of hostilities. With respect to the termination of the national emergency and the state of war I shall make recommendations to the Congress in the near future."

President Truman officially proclaimed the termina-
tion of the period of hostilities of the Second World War,
effective at noon, Eastern Standard Time, 31 Dec 1946. While
this action does not terminate the state of emergency de-
clared by President Roosevelt on 8 Sept 1939 and 27 May 1941
nor the state of war itself, it does affect some 20 statutes
immediately and some 33 others at a later date, generally
six months from the date of the proclamation.

A study is being made of those statutes affected by
the termination of hostilities and information will be furn-
ished in the near future. Preliminary study indicates statutes
affected do not in general have material application to War
Dept administration and operation.
