Reurlet 30 Jun 47 to Mr Earle M Sawyer acting manager Veterans Administration Manila PI, Administrator of Veterans Affairs has presented to WD problem of tpn from Philippines to US for ill and indigent American Veterans. Because they are in a foreign country and are suffering from other than service connected disability, existing legislation prohibits Veterans Administration from providing either treatment and care while in Philippines or tpn to US. Veterans Adm has funds to hospitalize them after arrival in US.

Request remark and recommendation relative free tpn for these veterans from a port in Philippines to a port in US by Army vessel on space available basis without expense to govt, cost of subsistence to be collected from each veteran. When required American Consul Philippines will loan sufficient money to each veteran for cost of subsistence. Under no circumstances would either military and WD civ pers and their dependents or persons traveling under WD travel authorities in interest of WD be displaced. Responsibility of WD would begin when individuals actually embark on Army vessel in Philippines and will cease immediately upon debarkation at port in US. They will not be permitted to return to Philippines by Army vessel. Request reply soonest.

Compensation for unused leave credit upon separation of personnel from the military service.

1. Public Law 350, 80th Congress, approved 4 Aug 47, which amends the Armed Forces Leave Act of 46, provides for the lump-sum payment to military personnel for any unused accrued leave standing to their credit at time of separation from the service under honorable condition. 1 Oct 47 is established as the effective date for compensation for unused leave upon separation as provided herein.

2. Personnel processed on or after 1 Oct 47 for separation from the service under honorable conditions, except for personnel who are required to carry leave forward (see para 4), will be compensated for unused accrued leave standing to their credit at time of separation, in cash on the basis of base and longevity pay and allowances, applicable to such member on the date of discharge, relief from active duty or retirement. Items of additional pay as distinguished from allowances will not be used in computation of amount due for unused leave. Personnel will not be placed on terminal leave on or after 1 Oct 47.

A. In computing leave credit at time of processing for separation all computation shall be through the date of completion of separation processing which will also be the date of discharge, relief from active duty, or retirement, as the case may be. Total credit at this time cannot exceed 60 days. WD Forms 372, 372 A and 384, appropriately modified, may be used as payment vouchers. Payments through 30 Sep will be as prescribed heretofore.

B. Allowances for enlisted personnel, when making this cash settlement, shall be computed at the rate of 70¢ per day for subsistence, plus, in the case of such enlisted members of the

all Koreans be allowed to vote in an internationally supervised election on what kind of government they want. Today Col Gen Terenty F Shtikov heading the Russian Delegation countered with the people's assembly idea, but specified that the Commission appoint it from Korean groups, of over 10,000 membership "which fully uphold the Moscow Decision and do not oppose the Commission and the Allied Powers." There was no immediate American response, but Gen Shtikov's proposal obviously contained the seeds of the same old dispute.

UP Washington 29 Aug: The US today abandoned efforts to reach agreement with Russia on creation of a provisional govt for Korea. But it proposed a formula whereby the Koreans themselves would set up a government. This was disclosed in a note from Acting Secretary of State Robert A Lovett to Soviet Foreign Minister V M Molotov. Copies of the note were sent to the British and Chinese Foreign Ministers. Lovett suggested that the Pacific Big Four (Britain, China, Russia, and the United States) meet here Sept 8 on the Korean problem.

first three pay grades with dependents at time of discharge, an allowance computed at the rate of \$1.25 per day for quarters.

3. Personnel being processed for separation and placed on terminal leave prior to 1 Oct 47 will continue on leave and be separated in accordance with orders then in effect. However, if an individual should revert to a duty status through hospitalization or in compliance with competent orders, such leave shall be considered as ordinary leave and upon being reprocessed for separation on or after 1 Oct 47 such individual shall receive cash settlement as indicated in para 2, above, for any remaining leave.

4. When service of an individual is continuous, as indicated below, leave accrued and not used prior to separation shall not be compensated for but shall be carried over to the latter service.

A. Non regular officer to commissioned officer in the Regular Army.

B. Warrant officer to commissioned officer.

C. Enlisted personnel who are discharged for the purpose of accepting a commission or an appointment as a warrant officer.

D. Non regular commissioned officers and warrant officers relieved from active duty for the purpose of immediately reenlisting (enlisting) in the Regular Army, or for the purpose of reentering (entering) in a warrant officer status, the day following the effective date of relief from active duty.

E. Military personnel retired and immediately recalled to active duty.

F. One enlisted term to another, except that enlisted personnel being discharged who reenlist the following day may be authorized a cash settlement or may elect to carry over unused accrued leave credit into the next period of service. (The above becomes effective 1 Oct 47 except that the provisions of A, B and E are currently provided for in AR 600-115).

5. Personnel transferred or returned to inactive status with retired pay on or before 30 Sep 47, or personnel on leave 30 Sep 47 who will upon expiration of such leave be transferred or returned to an inactive status with retired pay, shall not be entitled to a cash settlement for unused leave standing to their credit at the time of such action.

6. Personnel honorably separated after 31 Aug 46 and prior to 1 Oct 47 will be compensated for unused accrued leave standing to their credit at time of separation, in cash on the basis of base and longevity pay, and allowances, applicable to such member

on the date of separation, except when such individual is required to carry leave forward to next period of service and as provided in para 5, above. Where settlement has not previously been made and person was separated after 31 Aug 46 and prior to 1 Oct 47, Finance Officer, US Army, St Louis, Mo, will make settlement, including settlement to mentally disabled former members.

7. Personnel who are eligible for separation subsequent to 1 Oct 47 but whose accrued leave require that they be processed for separation and placed on terminal leave prior to that date will be processed and placed on terminal leave as heretofore. Processing for separation of such personnel will not be delayed for the purpose of enabling them to receive a lump sum payment in lieu of terminal leave in kind.

8. Due to the discontinuance of terminal leave, effective 1 Oct 47 overseas commanders, major force and major command commanders, and chiefs of services may, at their discretion after that date retain officer personnel within authorized ceilings so as to complete their category commitment, but in any event such personnel will be released so as to complete processing for separation within the period specified in their category. Otherwise, an officer will be processed for separation at the time he would normally be processed for terminal leave. Para 3 C, AR 615-360 is applicable for separation of enlisted personnel for expiration of service.

9. Officers eligible for promotion under the provisions of Cite 140, 46 and WCL 23722, 6 Jun 47, will be promoted on the effective date of relief from active duty. Promotion orders will be issued not later than the date of separation orders. Orders directing separation will show officer in the higher grade in those cases where the individual has been so promoted.

10. Unused leave settled in a lump sum in accordance with Public Law 350 shall not be considered as service for any purpose.

11. AR 600-115, TM 14-501 and 14-502, and AR 35-1400 and other pertinent regulations are being revised. WCL 39681, 28 Aug 46 and WCL 46459, 3 Jan 47 are rescinded effective 1 Oct 47.

AP San Francisco 25 Aug: The Chinese Communist radio today violently attacked the Wedemeyer Mission and American policy in China, charging that the US had obtained a series of military bases covering all of China and the Island of Formosa to fit into an American "program of expansion and aggression."... it compared Gen Wedemeyer with the 1-time Japanese agent, Gen Kenji Doihara, and said he had obtained from Chiang concessions that "far exceeded the infamous 21 Demands of Japanese Imperialism."...

from China will come as a severe shock to the Nanking Government. But whether it will achieve its intended purpose of bringing about a wholesale house cleaning in China is far from certain... Nowhere in it does he hold out any conditional or unconditional promise of American aid. On the contrary, his contention is that despite years of war and revolution, "China still possesses most of the physical resources needed for her own rehabilitation... The very circumstance that Gen Wedemeyer took the trouble to speak so bluntly of conditions he found in China shows the enormous interest and the grave concern we have in what is happening in that country. There is no possible way in which the US can safely wash its hands of China...

NY Herald Tribune editorial 26 Aug: The highest American officials, however unwilling they are to do so, must now consider the possibility that the present Govt of China will collapse and that Generalissimo Chiang Kai Shek will lose the position as China's leader he has held so long... The reforms sought by Gen Wedemeyer have been urged upon the Generalissimo again and again, and the urging has been futile... therefore there must be consideration of what will happen if Chiang falls. One possible result would be the conquest of most of China by the Chinese Reds, who would not be equipped to govern the country because they have so few experienced administrators. The Reds, to obtain help, might try to ally themselves temporarily with liberal members of Chiang's Kuomintang Party and with leaders of the minor parties. They also, because of their devotion to Moscow, might call upon the Russians for assistance... The Reds however might not win China if Chiang fell. It might turn out that Chiang's Government would be replaced by men from the better elements in the Kuomintang, but this seems almost too much to hope for, as no leader is in sight around whom these men could gather. It would be more probable that China south of the Yellow River (the Communists control much of the north end) would be split up into areas ruled by local governors and war lords. The Reds could pick these off one by one unless foreign intervention prevented the process. The possibilities in China are thus so grim that Gen Wedemeyer and other

Radio commentator Joseph Alsop (ABC) 25 Aug : ... For months, American and Russian representatives have been trying to agree on how to establish a Korean Government and how to bring the occupation to an end.... The Soviet representatives have been extremely provocative. Today Maj Gen Albert E Brown said that his Russian colleagues had failed to follow the normal dictates of common courtesy. He charged them with propaganda and with creating a smokescreen to obscure their own blunders... He blamed the Russians squarely for the failure of the current negotiations. "The truth is that the Russians will take nothing less than a puppet Korea. And we will take nothing less than a free Korea. Thus, there's no ground for real compromise and since there can be no real compromise, negotiations are bound to produce more heat than light.

Radio commentator Albert Warner (MBS) 25 Aug : 3 Americans held by Russians in Korea bring back a story which tends to show that there was some excuse for at least their initial questioning by the Russians if the tension on the boundary is taken into consideration. Of course the Russians, by initiating originally the tight segregation of Korea zones, have contributed heavily to the existence of that tension...but the end of this small incident by no means terminates international difficulties in Korea.

1. Public Law 365 which authorizes additional payments to certain medical and dental officers was approved on 5 Aug 47. Additional \$100 per month becomes effective 1 Sept 1947. In order to qualify for benefits volunteer officers must volunteer and be accepted for extended active duty for 1 year or more subsequent to passage of law.

2. Following data to support pay vouchers is necessary:

A. Regular Army medical and dental officers need submit no supporting data.

B. All other eligible officers will be named in WD orders, copies of which will be forwarded to officers for submission with first voucher. Payments may not be made without such orders.

3. The following officers will qualify for additional benefits only after completion of 24 months active commissioned service provided they subsequently volunteer and are accepted for extended duty of 1 year or longer:

A. Graduates of Army Specialized Training Program.

B. Officers who held MA-AUS commissions which were converted to MC-AUS.

C. Medical and dental officers who were neither ASTP graduates nor conversion appointees who were commissioned at their request but ordered to active duty under war-time power without their specific request.

Chicago Daily News and Washington Star correspondent Keyes Beech, Tokyo 22 Aug: "US occupation policies in Korea came under attack yesterday by Burton E Martin, former Chief Education Adviser for the American Military Govt in the capital city of Seoul. Mr Martin, who now is serving as Corps Education Officer with the AMG here said that he had been forced out of his job in Seoul, not withstanding the fact that he had the support of practically every teacher, student and parent there. The reason, he declared was that he had protested mass arrests and torture of students by Korean police 'what happened in my case is symptomatic of our fumbling occupation policy in Korea,' Mr Martin averred. Seoul's mayor and police chief, Mr Martin declared, had demanded his removal after his complaints against police brutality toward students had touched off a series of student strikes. When he sought the support of American occupation officials, Mr Martin said, they suggested that he "take a holiday in Japan until the storm blew over." But after he reached Japan, he was informed that his job in the Korean capital had been filled..."

"UP 22 Aug: The US has virtually abandoned all hope of ironing out its 20 month dispute with Russia in Korea, and is rushing plans to bolster the economy of the American controlled zone, it was learned today. Such action, diplomatic officials said, appears to be the only recourse left to combat Soviet delays on unifying the 2 zones. These officials also voiced their growing concern over other troublesome US Soviet issues in the Far East rapidly approaching a showdown stage. These include the proposed Japanese Peace Treaty and continued Soviet control of the Chinese port of Dairen. The temper of the economy minded 80th Congress, coupled with a faint hope that an agreement could

be worked out with Russia, caused postponement of a multi-million dollar Korean reconstruction program under study earlier this yr. They said the administration now would speed plans to present to Congress early next yr an economic program for the reconstruction of Korean transp facilities and industries. The project may cost up to \$100,000,000 for the 1st year. The WD was authorized by Congress to spend \$137,000,000 in Korea during the current FY for occupation cost, food and some reconstruction. In the light of the current stalemate, the Army Reconstruction Program might be increased pending Congressional action on more economic assistance, authoritative sources said. It was learned, meanwhile, that a search is being made for a top flight civilian to serve as American High Commissioner to Korea, to take over from Lt Gen John R Hodge, who now controls the zone."

19 Aug: The events of the last few weeks, it is believed here, finally have disclosed Russia's grand design for Eastern Asia. With the American-Russian talks on Korean unification a failure, only a few optimists now believe Russia ever will permit the severed halves of the nation to be reunited under anything but a Moscow sponsored Communist Regime. North Korea, it is believed, plays the central role as a Pacific Yugoslavia in the Soviets Asiatic Plan which includes these points:

1-Permanent control of North Korea, already thoroughly Communized thru the puppet ruler Kimil Sung.

2-The integration of North Korea as an individual member of a bloc consisting of Manchuria, Eastern Siberia, Sakhalin and the Kurile Islands, and outer Mongolia. Inner Mongolia and Sinkiang Province will be added when favorable conditions permit their det from China.

3-Acquisition of South Korea as soon as the Americans tire of supporting the area which, although predominantly agricultural, is incapable of feeding even itself.

4-Intimidation of defenseless Japan, surrounded on 2 sides, and its bloodless incorporation into the Soviet orbit to outflank China... Since the post war Russian stripping of Manchuria, North Korea is the most heavily industrialized area in continental Asia. It has abundant water power, Asia's largest fertilizer plant at Hungnam, and the Far East's greatest iron deposit at Mussen. A base on Tsushima would militarily isolate Korea and menace Japan. This was quickly recognized by the British, who ejected the invaders... With the Joint Commission leadlocked by the Russians return to the viewpoint which torpedoed last years talks, it now is believed that the Russians never had any intention of permitting the Commission to succeed except on their own terms. Many observers believe Korean unification now is impossible without a bloody civil war, similar to China's current conflict.

AP Seoul 20 Aug: Three US Army EM have been held by the Russians in Northern Korea since Aug 12 despite official American protests, Army Intelligence Officers disclosed today. They said the Russians have refused an explanation and have ignored two protests from Lt Gen John R Hodge, American Commander in South Korea, demanding their release... Intelligence Officers said the three went to the Russian occupied town of Yohyon Ni to inspect telephone lines connecting American Hq here with Russian Hq at Pyongyang... In a letter telephoned to Russian Hq Aug 13, Gen Hodge asked Lt Gen C P Korotkov, Soviet Commander in Northern Korea, to return the three, Intelligence Officers related. This letter was ignored as was another msg 5 days later in which Gen Hodge expressed "Grave concern" over the detention of the three American Soldiers, who crossed the parallel boundary line between the zones, in daylight and in uniform."

NYGT Moscow 16 Aug: The Soviet Union blamed US today for a new breakdown in the Joint Soviet-American Commission on Korea and attributed the American decision to establish an independent govt in its Zone of Southern Korea. Tass, the Official Soviet News Agency, said the US intends to establish an independent govt in its half of Korea immediately after Joint Commission adjourns. It made no reference to the announcement by Washington Wednesday that Secretary of State George C Marshall sent another note to Soviet Foreign Minister Viacheslav Molotov, suggesting that both govts adopt new measures to carry out the 1945 Moscow Agreement for the restoration of an Independent Korea. Tass said the return of the American Commander to Seoul from a visit to Washington was followed by "feverish preparations for the creation of an Independent Govt in Southern Korea." It said the govt would be composed of "extreme reactionary elements," headed by Le Syngman as President.

Washington Post Editorial 17 Aug: Secretary Marshall's blunt note to Molotov on Korea calls Russia's hand on what has been a flagrant evasion of the Moscow Agreement... The blame for the present breakdown belongs solely to Russia. The Soviet Mil Commander, Gen Shtikov, has persistently disregarded Molotov's pledge last May not to drag up the old sticking point-namely, the Russian insistence that no Korean parties other than the Communists be consulted on the Trusteeship... In our opinion it would be a grave mistake, however, to accede to the demands of Koreans. Even if we attempted to redeem our promise of independence by establishing a separate nation of the Southern Zone, Korea as a whole may be for the moment blighted, there are certain important moves we can make to improve conditions in our Zone. The first essential is reestablishment of law and order... Secondly, we ought to civilianize our Mil Govt as rapidly as

possible, both through the infusion of non-military American Administrators and through turning over more functions to responsible Koreans... Finally, we can establish a definite set of policies and stick to them. Nothing confuses the Koreans more or harms our cause so much as vacillation. Incidentally, these 3 points, if put into practice, would demonstrate to the Russians that they cannot hope to capitalize on chaos promoted by the small coterie of communists. Underlying our Korean policy should be the realization that it only serves the Soviet cause to blame Russia for our own administrative shortcomings.

It represents the judgment of Professor Y T Pyuh of the University of Korea, which I fully indorse: The American Military Command in Korea is now openly trying to stigmatize the Rightist in Korea as "Anti-American" This false. The fact is that the Koreans admiration of and faith in the people and Govt of the US are as strong as ever. They merely distrust the American Military Command in Korea, which definitely is not carrying out the fundamental policy of the American Govt. Investigation will prove this fact. In any case, we fail to see the point of this propaganda about an "Anti-American" feeling. We are pro American because we know we can be pro Korean at the same time; not because being Anti-American is fundamentally a crime, as if we were born to be pro American. When real Korean National interests are in danger we have to do things to protect them, even if certain short sighted people happen to falsify them as Anti-American. . .

Reurad Z-17054 dtd Aug 6 1947 request for authority to exempt your command from current requirements in connection with mil and diplomatic clearances for mil pers desiring to visit foreign countries on leave is not favorably considered as a blanket condition. No objection interposed, however, to deviation from the policy to the extent requested, when appropriate American agents such as referred to in above quoted radio have indicated no clearance necessary beyond the possession of passports and visas.

Last clause of your radio infers that you consider clearance necessary for passengers of ships touching foreign ports en route to US, even when her passengers go ashore only for short visits. In cases of this nature, and provided personnel are merely on "shore leave" from the vessel on which traveling, such personnel are the responsibility of the ship's captain and clearance in the sense used here is not required.

Any agreements which you are able to make with the proper American agents of foreign countries of a continuing nature will alleviate the situation pointed out in above referred to radio or reduce the administrative workload of your headquarters in this respect is acceptable to the WD.

Baltimore Sun Editorial 15 Aug: Mr Marshall's letter to Mr Molotov about the statement in the negotiations of the Joint Commission working on the Korean Question deals only with the present bone of contention in that Commission...Still, it has to be admitted that issues still to be discussed are more likely to arouse feeling and suspicion on both sides. These other issues have to do with the unification of Korea and the withdrawal from the divided country of the American Troops in the South and the Russians in the North. As a matter of fact, we have not yet faced up to any of the more serious questions involved in the occupation of Korea, presumably a friendly country. Some of these questions are outlined, however briefly, in the article by Hamilton Owens printed elsewhere on this page today. Maybe we should never have gone into Korea in the first place. But ignorance is not our only handicap. By the deliberate decision of Mr Roosevelt, acquiesced by Mr Truman and implemented by the State Dept, Korea is a divided land...The line makes no sense geographically or administratively...The 38th Parallel, then is the Eastern extremity of the Iron Curtain which begins in the northern tip of Europe, above the Arctic Circle, meanders all across the Eurasian Continent, through the wastes of Sin Kiang and Mongolia, seethes into Manchuria, leaps the Yellow Sea and comes to earth in its most illogical form in Korea...The Potsdam Declaration calls for an

independent and united Korea "in due course." Nobody knows what the phrase means...The man charged with responsibility for our part of the country is Gen John R Hodge...Here is a man of action forced by circumstances to think like a political philosopher...The Russians are only part of his problem. Gen Hodge's troops, assigned to a country which they cannot hope to understand and which offers little to interest even the resourceful among them, need his constant ministrations to keep their morale from deterioration...It seems almost absurd to talk of politics in connection with Korea. Save for the grubby capital city, Seoul...Assassination seems to be a usual, if not legal, political weapon in Seoul...They are Orientals, and the Oriental mind, in political matters at least, does not move in the groove to which we are accustomed...The Communists are active, they are well organized and they never miss an opportunity to gum up the works...The prospect of unification under Communist domination creates the chief fear in the minds of the Southern Rightists and impales them on the horn of their most painful dilemma. They all want independence and they want it quick. The very word trusteeship, which is used in the Potsdam Declaration is hateful to them...We agreed to the division with Russia when we were in a more trustful mood with relation to that country than we are in today. We are still committed by the terms of the Potsdam Agreement...We also have to ask ourselves whether strategically we can afford to let the Russians create another puppet state on the Asian Mainland just a few miles away from Japan...

Albert L Warner (MBS) 13 Aug: Another note to Moscow. Another pointing up of one of the many areas of friction between the US and Soviet Russia. Reurltrs Seoul 12 Aug: The United States Military Governor in American occupied Southern Korea, Maj Gen Archer Lerch, has ordered Korean police to arrest all leaders of the extreme left wing parties in the United States Occupation Zone. 2,000 were arrested during night raids in Seoul. The arrests were interpreted as a preventive measure to avoid riots on Tuesday, 2d anniversary of the end of the war against Japan.

Difficulties have been encountered by the United States Russian Commission in trying to work out a Provisional Govt for Korea. The 2 nations disagreed over the Korean parties to be invited to take part in the consultations leading up to a Provisional Govt.

South Korea will be delivered to the Communists as a reaction and resentment of the majority of Koreans to these abuses . . . Instead of fighting Communism intelligently, the command seems to be frozen by its communist phobias. Some able American officers and civilians understand the intolerable situation and are endeavoring to correct the existing conditions, but they have neither the power nor the authority to act . . .

Unless drastic measures are taken immediately to correct the dangerous state of affairs and to restore law and order, Korea will be lost to Democratic civilization, America's purpose will have been defeated and hundreds of millions of American taxpayers' money will have been wasted. This is exactly what the Communists want in South Korea.

American success at the meeting of the United States Soviet Joint Commission now in session at Seoul is highly doubtful. To all outward appearances the Russians tightly control North Korea while the American Command has no organized support in South Korea . . . A farmer told me that although the Japanese oppression was unbearable, a Korean could get redress from police if, by another Korean, he was unjustly beaten or his property was damaged. But now he gets protection from no one. He asked me, "Is this the way America is run?" The American Policy must be revitalized to maintain law and order so that Democracy may survive in South Korea. Unless this is done, South Korea will be surrendered either to Communism or Hitlerism. A civilian High Commissioner should be despatched to Korea immediately to take over the functions of the Mil Govt. He should be a man of high caliber and integrity with the rank of an Ambassador, and he should have full authority, even to declaring Martial Law if necessary. Otherwise, he will be a piece of wax in the hands of Korean politicians and cunning profiteers . . .

UP Seoul 7 Aug: Maj Gen Brown announced today that the US had flatly rejected a Russian proposal that 15 South Korean parties suspected by the Russians of opposing Interim Trusteeship of KORN DVOL called before the Joint American-Soviet Commission for questioning. Brown said the Soviet proposal was the result of a letter recd by the Commission on 31 Jul and signed by 15 Rightist parties belonging to the "United Council for Establishment of Provisional Govt." The letter said that the 15 parties had never "actively opposed the work of the Joint Commission," which is trying to decide upon the form of an interim, unified govt for Korea.

UP Washington 8 Aug: Secy of State Marshall has quietly assumed responsibility for all civil affairs in Korea as the first step in his plans to take over from the Army in former enemy states. This was disclosed last night by authoritative sources who said Lt Gen Hodge, Commander of American Forces in Korea, henceforth will report directly to Wash on all political, economic and cultural affairs. It was emphasized that the change does not affect mil matters and Gen MacArthur remains Hodge's superior in all mil affairs. The Army long has sought to turn over to the State Dept full responsibility for mil govt and civil affairs in occupied areas. Disclosure that

UP, 8 Aug: Top American officials in Korea have advised Secy of State George C Marshall that there is little if any hope of reaching agreement with the Russians for bringing an end to American-Soviet division of that country... Reports from Seoul where the US and Soviet Russia have been trying since spring to reach agreement on setting up a provisional Korean govt, are that the situation appears hopeless. The conferees cannot agree on which Korean groups to consult. The Russians want to consult only Korean Communists and refuse to consult any group which opposes Korean trusteeship. All Koreans except the Communists oppose it in one form or another. When Gen Marshall and Soviet Foreign Minister V M Molotov agreed after the Moscow Conference to resume Korean negotiations, they also agreed to review progress of the Korean Commission's work on a high level this summer. AP Seoul 6 Aug: 8 employees of the South Korean Broadcasting Co were arrested by Korean Police today in connection with a purported plot to inject Communist propaganda into programs of the station network in the American Zone... James Browitt, Greeley Colorado, American adviser for the network, reported that those arrested and sought included script writers, announcers, engravers, business clerks and janitors. Mr Browitt said that acting on a tip from an employee, he discovered a plot which originated last Jan to write propaganda into programs, disrupt Right wing political speeches, spy on the American staff, foment strikes within the system and sabotage equipment. Mr Browitt said the plot never got beyond the planning stage.

Robert T Oliver, Director of Economic Research, Korean Commission, Wash DC (representative of Dr Syngman Rhee in US) in letter to editor, Wash Post 6 Aug: The Russian American conference on Korea is at last officially admitted to be "Deadlocked" according to the Wash Post of 1 Aug... the blame clearly lies upon the Soviet Union. Despite Molotov's assurances to Marshall before his conference convened on May 21, the Russians have insisted that only Koreans who favor trusteeship could be consulted on the formation of an all Korea Govt. Once again, the American Delegation refused to yield on last issue that would have turned all of Korea over to Soviet control through formation of a puppet Communist regime. Some superficial observers have laid part of the blame for the deadlock upon Dr Syngman Rhee, Nationalist leader who has led the anti trusteeship movement... If Americans are really trying to apply the Truman Doctrine of stemming the further expansion of Communism, Dr Rhee has rendered the US a great service by his

dramatization of the fact of Korean opposition to trusteeship and to Communism. Dr Rhee made it easy for the American Delegation to insist that a Communist coalition govt was contrary to the wishes of the great mass of the Korean people, and therefore could not be accepted by the US...The continuance of the division has serious political and psychological evils for Korea, but the economic miseries it causes are more tangible and bear more heavily upon individual lives. There are positive steps the US can take to help mitigate the evils.

1. We can proceed immediately to hold an election in South Korea to set up a Govt of, by, and for the Korean people.

2. This Govt should be aided economically by the US to help it offset resources now sealed off in the Russian occupied zone.

3. A small security force of American troops should remain in South Korea until a Korean Army has been trained and equipped to counter balance the Soviet trained and led troops in North Korea...

4. The New South Korean Govt should be recognized as the De Jure Govt of all Korea. Russians will not like it, but why should we continue to sacrifice principles of justice and decency in the vain hope of winning Soviet approval?

5. The US should support the application of this New Korean Govt for membership in the United Nations...

6. Efforts should be continued, as a part of the General Asian Peace Settlement, to secure Russian withdrawal from North Korea. These efforts should be fully predicted upon the fact that Russia participated in only the last 22 days of the Asian War, during the whole of which period Japan was already seeking to apply the machinery of surrender.

Christian Science Monitor correspondent Gordon Walker, Seoul 2 Aug: ...Korea appears openly hostile to the troops which billet in its arid countryside and to the United States Government which, it erroneously believes, is blocking Korean independence...Koreans look upon American troops with sullen stares. They saunter aggravatingly in front of honking jeeps. And on more than one occasion, Korean patriots have attacked American troops in minor frays. Fraternization between Koreans and Americans is strictly prohibited...American Military Govt officials have been ordered to carry pistols when driving around the streets of Seoul at night...An observer in Korea, therefore might easily come to the conclusion that all Koreans dislike the United States and that American prestige in Korea is at its lowest ebb...The United States faces a powerful challenge in maintaining its prestige in Korea...General Hodge and his staff have made every effort to convince Koreans that trusteeship does not carry the same connotation as in 1905. General Hodge made this statement: "I am fully aware of the misunderstandings and misinterpretation of the word trusteeship which in the minds of some Koreans has even a connotation of national strangulation and complete subservience to foreign nations. I wish I knew how to cause all Koreans to understand and to place full confidence in the allies, who sacrificed so much to liberate Korea and who have pledged Korean independence."

South Korea today is divided into two camps-the Extreme Rightists...and the Leftists...What middle ground there is could be characterized only as insignificant and transitory...Between the two groups, the United States faces a two-horned dilemma. Unless some method can be devised for "Winning over Koreans" to American oriental objectives, it is possible that Korea may be swallowed up ultimately by interests which have a closer geographical proximity.

2 Aug:...Over the period of 22 months of occupation, American authorities in South Korea have watched with growing anxiety as many of the Korean leaders in whom they originally placed hope have dropped out of what might be termed the "American Orbit."...When the American command brought back to Korea such nationally known exiles as Syngman Rhee and Kim Koo, it was felt that their close association with America-or at least allied objectives-in the past would be good insurance for the future. However, Rhee and Kim bolted from the American command camp on the issue of their opposition to the Moscow Decision of the Allied Powers and particularly their violent opposition to trusteeship in any form...Kimm Kiu Sic, who as Deputy Head of the Korean Provisional Govt in exile in China was returned at the same time as Kim Koo, is a political leader of considerable note. But his usefulness to the American occupation has been limited...Faced with a barrage of fire from Extreme Right and Extreme Left, however, Kimm has found himself in a somewhat deserted middle group. American Military Govt authorities are finding it increasingly difficult to prevent Kimm from moving into that limbo of oriental retirement wherein physical maladies are held to be the face saving excuse for political failures. Another prominent political leader is An Chai Hong who serves in the official capacity of Civil Administrator of Military Government...Nominally a Rightist, An believes in the policies of the American occupation. And he has been extremely useful as an instrument for their implementation. His future, however, may be complicated by the fact that in the tense atmosphere of black and white politics in South Korea, An has been sharply criticized by Extremists in his own Right camp, who in their growing dislike for American Military Govt even whisper among themselves that An is a "Collaborator." A dark horse in Korea is Cho Man Sik, a homegrown philosopher popularly known as the Gandhi of Korea...The occupation caught him in the Russian Zone in North Korea where he was permitted to form the Chosen Democratic Party. Cho however refused to follow Moscow party line dictates...In January of last year he was placed under house

"A far reaching change in the permanent organization of the Med Dept of the Army went into effect today following President Truman's approval of legislation creating a Med Sv Corps in the regular establishment.

This legislation makes it possible for the first time to give RA commissions to specialists in the scores of fields now closely allied to medicine-to bacteriologists, entomologists, psychologists, sanitary engrs, pharmacists, chemists, electronics experts and the like. These will be grouped together in a new corps under the Med Dept of the Army.

The need has been evident for a long time. Up to now the Med Dept has been made up of 6 corps-Medical, Dental, Veterinary, Pharmacy, Nurse, and Women's Medical Specialists. It has been possible to commission specialists in other fields only in the Reserve from which they could be called to service in a national emergency.

It became increasingly evident during the two world wars, with the enormous ramifications of medical science that came about in this period, that greater and greater reliance must be placed on these other specialists for the proper treatment of sick and wounded. They could relieve the Army Medical Corps, in which only physicians can hold commissions, of a great deal of the increasing burden of clinical lab and sanitary engineering activities, psychiatric social work and clinical psychology, pharmacy, supply and hosp administration, certain phases of training and field medical service, and in special

fields of research requiring specialized skills and training. Availability of the services of non-medical specialists freed the physician from an enormous load of responsibilities not strictly in his field and enabled him to spend more of his time in direct treatment of patients. It relieved him especially from arduous administrative duties.

During World War I, half the commissioned pers of the Med Dept were physicians. In the last war this percentage had fallen to about 1/3d, with the difference taken up largely by specialists in fields allied to medicine. This is bound to be more and more the situation in the future as the ramifications of medicine extend into other sciences and new problems arise.

It would have been impractical to have created a multiplicity of separate corps-such as a psychologists corps or a bacteriologists corps. This would have involved a difficult administrative problem and probably much duplication of effort. Furthermore, such corps would have been set up with necessarily arbitrary restrictions in the form of educational requirements and the like. It is impossible to predict what kind of a specialist will be needed tomorrow.

Under the present legislation the Surgeon General is free to use his discretion, as the need arises. An expert in enzyme chemistry, for example, can be given a regular commission in the new Med Sv Corps with no more complications than would be involved in commissioning a brain surgeon in the Med Corps.

The strength of the new corps will be prescribed by the Secy of War. Grades will range from second lieutenant to col."

UP Seoul 2 Aug: Col Gen Shtikov said today that the US was unnecessarily delaying the Commission's work by insistence upon consultation with "Bogus and Non Social Groups." In the 2d Soviet Press Conference in Korea since 45, Gen Shtikov said acceptance of the American position would force the Commission to consult any party or social organization the Americans deemed advisable. His statement was in reply to an accusation by Maj Gen Albert E Brown, American representative on the Commission, that the Russian proposal would result in a govt dominated by the left wing "Democratic Peoples Front."

INS Seoul 3 Aug: The assassination of a middle of the road Korean leader was termed "Useless and pointless" today by Lt Gen John R Hodge, as authorities disclosed that they have the alleged assassin in custody. Mil officials announced that Han Chi Keun, 19, a recent arrival in South Korea from the Soviet Occupation Zone, has confessed to the murder Jul 19 of Lyuh Woong Heung, Chairman of the Laboring Peoples Party.

Washington Post Columnist Drew Pearson, 3 Aug: . . . Maj Gen Archer L Lerch, Mil Gov of Korea, gave an off the record talk to reserve officers recently expressing great pessimism regarding US relations with Russia in Korea. Latest efforts to get together with Russia, Gen Lerch said, may as well be written off as failure. What caused the deadlock was recognition of political parties, since Russia would not recognize any Korean parties not controlled by Communists. Gen Lerch also revealed:

1. Russian Agrarian reforms in Northern Korea have backfired. Northern native farmers, oppressed by a 50% tax on produce and strict control under the "Cooperative" system, are drifting south across the 38th parallel.

2. Border incidents have been reduced along the Russian American line. However, 2 Russian soldiers, prowling for rice

below the border, were shot and killed by Korean Police.

3. Only 53 Japs are left in Southern Korea, all hospital cases.

4. Russia, which controls the industrial half of the country, is permitting a smooth flow of electricity into the American Zone without interference. Gen Lerch said he was not worried about too many Koreans becoming converted to Communism. "Koreans, he said, could never be regimented into Communism, I am sure."

NY Times Columnist Hanson W Baldwin, 3 Aug: Changes in US policy in some of the occupied areas--and particularly major changes in the administration of those--area are forecast by recent events. Within the next few months the administration of Germany and Korea may be transferred from Mil to State Dept Authorities, and in Japan and Austria--if peace treaties can be arranged or even well started--major alterations in the structure of military govt are expected to take place. . . but some statement of the problems and an approximate definition of our objectives as they are seen today are possible. Continued attempts to reach some agreement with Russia about all these problems will be made, but there is now not much hope that any such agreements are possible in the near future. Therefore, barring the possibility of wider agreements, minimal or alternative objectives probably will be: . . . Korea--attempts to find a formula that will permit reduction or withdrawal of American forces without turning South Korea over to Communism and without adverse psychological or political effects throughout Asia. Some of our objectives are as yet only partially defined, but there is firm determination that Russian intransigence must not be allowed to stultify and stalemate all solutions of these world problems. If Russia will not participate we shall work toward our own solutions.

See your Z 16511 and your Z 16651. In view your Z 16511, re Marjorie Woods of Washington Post and your Z 16651 Genevieve Reynolds of Denver Post believe you may wish reconsider unfavorable decision on entry Miss Reynolds.

According records available here Mrs Woods, wife of Navy officer, personally requested her trip and under Navy auspices recd permission from NEC to visit Japan for period of 3 days. Washington Post made no request for her visit. Reference application Miss Reynolds, Palmer Hoyt, Publisher of Denver Post, formally applied by letter to WD followed by personal phone call asking Army cooperation and clearance. He did the same with Navy and she will journey as far as Guam under Navy auspices on much same basis as Mrs Woods. Hoyt asked Army clearance into Japan for period approx 2 weeks. Reynolds under assignment to do specific series of feature stories on Pacific including Japan if permission is granted for her entry.

In many respects cases of Woods and Reynolds are similar in that both are journeying into Pacific under Navy auspices and then desire Army clearance into Japan with difference the fact Denver Post has asked Army cooperation and apparently is getting unfavorable answer while Woods secured entry without any such application. If there is specific objection to limited visits WDGBI believes such policy must be impartially administered. There appears adequate precedent for short term acceptances, particularly when such visits are at no expense to WD or to FEC. We will not advise Denver Post of action pending further communication from your Hq.

Dissemination A Par 1, WD radio WCL 38642, 29 July 47 is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"1. The enactment of PL 239 on 25 July 47 stops the accrual of veterans benefits under the so called GI Bill of Rights at 12 o'clock midnight, 24 July 1947. Men enlisting or reenlisting in the RA after 12 o'clock midnight, 24 July 47 will not accrue veterans benefits under the GI Bill of Rights. Men extending 1st enlistments contracted prior to 6 October 1946 will continue to accrue veterans benefits for the duration of that 1st extended enlistment. Men extending enlistments contracted on or after 6 October 1946 will accrue no further veterans benefits under the GI Bill of Rights after 12 o'clock midnight, 24 July 1947. These benefits include the following: Education and training, guarantee of loans, unemployment compensation, and vocational rehabilitation. All personnel engaged in enlistment, reenlistment or extension of enlistment activities will insure that enlistees are so informed."

NY Times correspondent Richard J H Johnston, Seoul 31 Jul: Abandonment of the US position and acceptance of Soviet proposals regarding consultation with Korean political groups would "Bring about a future govt of Korea predominantly of the People's Front," Maj Gen Albert Brown said today. Issuing another unilateral press announcement, Gen Brown revealed that the Commission has held 49 sessions and is still unable to break the deadlock.... "Although the Soviets deny that it is their intention to eliminate the Rightists from participation in the govt and also deny that they intend by such elimination to bring about a future govt of Korea predominantly of the People's Front, acceptance of their proposal by the American Delegation would, nevertheless, inevitably lead to this result because the People's Front groups would be given an overwhelming majority," General Brown said in a prepared statement. "I don't care what the Soviets are trying to do," he added.

AP Seoul 30 Jul: The 2 chief delegates to the Joint US Russian Commission today told Koreans they hoped to settle their differences concerning what Korean groups will be consulted by the Commission in laying the groundwork for a Provisional Govt for all Korea. Speaking to a crowd Gen Brown reiterated the American view that the Korean Provisional Govt will belong to all people and all political parties. To deny to a large group, and to parties representing them, the right to participate "would be an injustice to which the American delegation can never agree," he said. Col Gen Shtikov said that "Every day of struggling against the Moscow Decision is 1 more day separating the Korean people from creation of their own Democratic Govt." The Russians have objected to consultation of Rightist South Korean groups which have opposed the Allied Trusteeship.
