



Pronouncement is one of the secrest official indictments of Soviet duplicty and chicanery yet issued by a high spokesman for the Western Powers. It is thoroughly warrented by the facts. . . The Supreme Commander evidently thought it was high time to call the turn on such tactics, which he did in his reply to the Soviet compliant, without mincing his words. . . . Gen MacArthurs riposte is calculated to strike a responsive chord in Japanese public sentiment, which has been naturally embittered by the holding of war prisoners and their bad treatment. "The Depts of State, Interior and the Army jointly and nounced today that a consv program for the Japanese Fishing Industry, developed by Gen MacArthur's Hq, is progressing toward eliminating the basis of objections on the part of some nations to the ret of Japanese fishing fleets to some portions of their prewar fishing areas.

2. The program being carried on under Gen MacArthur as the SCAP calls for the Japanese to maintain surveillance over fishing and other aquatic life and to disseminate such info to other interested nations. It also calls for the Japanese to cooperate with other nations in the use of common fishing grds, and to obsr the customary work of other nations using the same areas.

3. Japanese fishing since the end of the war has not been authorized outside certain areas, generally in the vicinity of Japan and eastward to the 165th Meridian. Japanese fishing oproprior to World War II did not always obsr internationally accepted practices, particularly regarding consv of resources.

4. The consv of open-ocean and near-shore resources has been a concern of the SCAP orgn from almost the day the occupation began. Progress has already been made in the reorganization and redirection of research for this purpose as well as in making the Japanese conscious of proper fishery consv methods. The US considers it important, however, that Japan count and intensify this program in order to sup in these flds of activity specific assurance of Japanese wish and intention to participate in world affairs in a responsible manner."



Recent investigation has disclosed that, in requests for civilian personnel for service in occupied areas, the practice has been to use the word "unemployable" as a catch-all phrase to describe various situations.

Recent newspaper stories have emphasized that this is a bad practice because the word if naturally subject to a con-struction reflecting upon the individuals. In fairness to many people concerning whom this term has been used, it is imperative that Army records should not be left indicating that persons are unemployable when in fact there may be, as there was in the case currently in the newspapers, nothing whatsoever reflecting upon the individuel. All persons potentially affected by such practice are entitled to immediate protection of their reputations by correction of the records to that there will be no continuing reflection upon them. You are accordingly directed to have made a prompt examination of all files of such cases, and to have the records corrected by removing the word "unemployable", in appropriate case substituting the word "unavailable". This action is necessary in order that there will be nothing in the files unjustly reflecting upon these individuals. Theater commanders of occupied areas who have requested an individual for civilian duty and have received a reply indicating that the person in question is unemployable, should, if they still desire such persons services, renew the request. An entirely new inquiry will then be made to determine whether such person is suitable, and if so whether his or her services can be obtained.

"The US Govt announced on May 12 in a statement read by Good McCoy to the FEC that it had decided to terminate removal of reparations fr Japan under the Adv Trf Program instituted by US Interim Directive on 4 Apr 1947;

To withdraw its proposal of 6 Nov 1947, on the div of

Japanese reparations shares;

To take no further action under its interim directive powers to make possible add reparation removals fr Japan;

To submit new policy proposals to the FEC which would have the effect, if adopted, of precluding further industrial

reparations removals fr Japan during the occupation.

"On May 19 and 26 the Philippine and Chinese representatives on the FEC read to the Com and released to the press statements disagreement with the US pos. These statements appear to this govt to be based on a number of serious misconceptions both as to US policies toward Japan and the fundamental nature of the Japanese problem. Before exam the specific points advd by the Philippine and Chinese representatives, it is desired to clarify beyond and ques doubt the considerations underlying the US pos announced on May 12.

"Because of its leading role in the war against Japan and relatively stronger mil and econ bos at the close of the conflict, the US has fr the outset assumed a primary role in the occupation of Japan. Its policies and actions in this capacity have been determined not by considerations of sp advantage but on behalf of and for the benefit of all Far Eastern

and other concerned nations. It early recognized that the programs of Democratization and reform prescribed by the FEC for Japan could succeed only in a tolerable econ environment, and for nearly 4 years has assumed unaided the responsibility of prove assistance to Japan to make such an environment possible, at a cost to this govt of over a billion dollars. The US has naturally been reluctant to assume this burden, not merely because the American taxpayer is already carrying a heavy load, but also because there is a limit to US resources. Funds spent in Japan are unavailable for other vital purposes at home and aboadd. It has nevertheless been willing to prov this aid so as co make possible the success of the FEC programs and basic policy objectives, on which the emergence of a peacefully inclined and responsible Japan depends. The aid has been given as a matter of hard necessity in the interest of all beace loving nations.

"Clearly, however, the US cannot indefinitely bear the burden of Japan' spt. It must therefore assist the reattainment by Japan of a self-sustaining econ at the earliest possible time. Further reparations fr the deficit Japanese econ would obviously be inconsistent with this objective. Nor, are further reparations for purposes of demilitarization and disarmament. Japan has been completely disarmed and the US is determined that its war-making capacity shall not be permitted to re-emerge. In those rare instances where Japan, in its efforts to spt a population 15,000,000 larger than pre-war, cannot put to productive use for peaceful purposes facilities previously used in the war effort not already destroyed as specialized war equip, it is the US view that the facilities

should at the aprob time be scrapped.

The US position announced by Gen McCoy on May 12 derived fr these fundamental considerations and stands on its merits as a nec stp for the achievement of basic Allied policy object-

"Turning to the Philippine and Chinese representatives

specific points, there is no conflict between the US pos and
the Potsdam Declaration. Para 11 of the peclaration provs that
"Japan shall be permitted to maintain such industries as will
sustain her economy and permit the exaction of just reparations

and ememphasized in the FEC reparations decisions. Since the Japanese equotomy, today is a heavily deficit economy, and since the exaction of further reparations would increase that deficit and defer the achievement of self-spt, the US is fully consonant with the above-quoted Potsdam prov and with the pertinent prove of the FEC basic post-surr policy for Japan, the clear intent of which is that reparations shall be restricted

to resources surplus to Japan's peaceful needs.

"The claim that the US pos is incompatible with the FEC interim removals and other FEC reparations decisions in the sense that the pos in any way contravenes these decisions, is equally unfounded. The FEC dicisions have been nullified not by any action to the US but by the failure of the FEC, notwithstanding every assistance and encouragement by the US, to adopt a sch of reparations shares which would give the decisions practical effect. The Philippine representative charges the US with impatience in proposing that the reparations act now be closed. One may wonder, as we approach the end of the fourth year of the occupation, how long the US, bearing the burden of the inadequacies of Japanese economic revival, was expected to wait before actg to remove the impediment which the reparations issue has interposed to the attainment of Japanese self-spt.


"No conflict is percieved between the US reparations pos and effective and cont Japanese disarmament and demilitarization. On the contrary, this pos accords with the only course offering real hope of elimination of the Japanese mil threat. Japan, it was earlier pointed out, has been completely disarmed. It should be apparent to all Far Eastern nations that Japan faces most difficult in developing its agriculture, industry and trade to a point where they can spt its population, and that if Japan again threatens the peace of the Far East it will in all probability be because it failed in that objective rather than because it was permitted to retain existing indust-

rial plants for peaceful, productive purposes.

"The assertion by the Philippine and Chinese representatives that the US reparations pos indicates that the US feels

greater concern for the welfare of its late enemy than for the just reparations claims of its allies tould arise only fr a profound misunderstanding of US desires and intention. As earlier states, US policies and actions in Japan have been dictated by hard necessity to permit achievement of the basic FEC policy objectives for Japan. These objectives cannot be accomplished by permitting the Japanese to starve or by depriving them of industrial equip needed for their peaceful economy. The US must point out that the Allies have assumed a joint responsibility in their common interest in Japan and must bear their proportionate measure of sacrifice if the agreed and vital end of a peaceful, Democratic and self-supporting Japan is to be attained.

The charge that the Japanese under the direction of the former Zaibatsu Class are deliberately sabotaging economic recovery is not borne out by rpts fr The Supreme Comdr or fr other competent observers in Japan. There are of course elements in Japan which seek to take advantage of their country's plight for their own benefit. All reliable evidence indicates, however, that the Japanese Govt and the Japanese people as a whole desire to regain a self-sptg status at the earliest possible time. The Philippine representative's statement, 'help themselves', before a solution is sought through Allied that the Japanese must first abstention fr further reparations ignomes the fact the US in Dec, 1948, directed the institution of an Economic Stabilization Program to this very end, which is now being vigorously pursued in Japan. If there are any meas to enable the Japanese better to help themselves which are not being pressed in Japan under this program the US Govt is unaware of them.

"The US repudiates the contention of the Philippine representative that the US Govt implicitly undertook in the Philippine Rehabilitation Act of 1946 to act as agent for the Philippines to collect reparations fr Japan at least to the extent of the balance of Philippine war damage claims not met by the \$520,000,000 aprop for the Philippines under the act. The Philippine Rehabilitation Act was, as its name implies, designed to promote the early rehabilitation of the Philippine Islands' economy, and not to prov for gen compensation of Philippine war damage. It did not in any sense purport to settle, or to prescribe mach for settlement, of Philippine

reparations claims against Japan. It does not prov, nor do its terms and prov imply, that the US should claim reparations fr Japan on acct of war damage to Philippine prop. To avoid any cossibility of misunderstanding on this point the US Govt instructed its ambassador at Manila on 1 Nov 1946, to inform the Philippine Govt that the US would not claim reparations for Philippine war damages or losses. At the same time, the act does not in any way limit the auth of the Philippine Govt to claim reparations. The fact that the Philippine Govt has fr the outset advd its own reparations claims in the FEC, and has requested and recd its own percentage share of reparations in all shares, proposals considered by the com, would indicate that the Philippine Govt has never previously had any doubts as to its right and responsibility to submit its own reparation claims.

"It is noteworthy that Sec 106 (B) (1) of the Rehabilitation Act prove that the US shall reimburse itself for outlays under Titles 1 and 3 of act solely out of money or bullion recd by the US fr Japan for Philippine reparations. Since it was fully recognized at the time of passage of the act that Japanese reparations would consist in major part of capital equip, and only in very small degree of money or bullion, this fact is a further indication that the US never expected reimbursement fr reparations of the \$520,000,000 expenditure author under the act, and has never considered itself in the role of agent for the collection of reparations for the

Philippines.

"The Philippine representative in his statement of May 96 quoted a press rpt of May 24 alleging the formation of a "Japanese National Defense Force" to be under 'vigorous study' in Wash. On the same day, May 24, a spokesman of the Dept of State announced at a news conf that, There is absolutely no intention of forming or allowing the formation of national defense force for Japan. The press rpt is quite obviously a speculative story based on the well known fact that the present police force in Japan is inadequate for the ordinary internal police tasks of the country.

A. Definition of pay patient-the term "pay patient" as used herein is that patient who is furnished inpatient or out-patient care or physical examination by an Army medical facility with full reimbursement to the DA for the cost thereof, in accordance with DA directives. Examples of pay patients are beneficiaries and personnel of other faderal agencies. A patient paying only

Rates applicable to pay patients during the Fiscal Year 1950-in accordance with the provisions of para 4, DA Memo 40-590-15 10 June 48, the following rates are established for pay patients for the fiscal year 50 (1 July 49 to 30 Jun 50) when treated in Army medical facilities inside and outside Continental United States (except in Army and Navy general hospital):

(1) Inpatient (hospitalization) rate-the per diem rate of charge for patient care, including immunization which is an actual part of treatment, will be \$10.75, of which \$1.35 is est-

ablished as the subsistence rate.

(2) Outpatient rate-\$1.75 is established as the rate of charge for each visit to the outpatient service or dispensary for outpetient treatment, including immunization which is an actual part of treatment.

(3) Immunization rate-a charge of \$1.00 will be made for each dose (or injection) 'n connection with immunizations except

as indicates in (1) (2) above and (4) below

(4) Physical examinations rate-a rate of \$7.00 is estab-Lished as the charge for a physical examination including all necessary procedures or immunization, except that a physical examination rendered a beneficiary of the civilian components of the Army or the Air Force, including all immunizations required in connection with the physical examination will be at the rate of \$1.75.

Reference-rates for pay patients in medical facilities of the DA during the FY 49 were published in DA Circular Number

182, 18 June 48.

2. Dependents of Armed Forces personnel-rates of charge.

A. When hospitalized in Army hospitals inside and outside Continental United States under directives implementing the policy of the Secretary of Defense, the rate of charge will be \$1.75 per diem, to be disposed of as follows:



Chicago Tribune Editorial 30 May: The Army has envolved a WPA plan for excess brass by which at least 40% of American civilian officials serving in the Japanese occupation will be replaced before the end of the year by Army officers, principally those relieved from European duty. These officers can hardly be of very imposing quality, otherwise it would not have been so easy to dispense with their services in the occupation of Germany. But the Army well knows that it is a lush existence living off a defted who can object; so occupation assignments are at a premium, and Japan offers a change of scenery. This program will further hamper the work of Gen MacArthur's occupation, Commander in Japan. He will have forced upon him a lot of misfits who have very little understanding of the complicated economic and social problems which plague Japan .... The conclusion is that the American public is being afflicted by the Army occupation to quite as great a degree as are the Japanese people.

Radio Commentator Drew Pearson, ABC 29 May: Paris exclusive. The Western Powers have secretly agreed to call a peace conference for Japan. This conference is due to be held in Washington some time in October. Sen MacArthur has been urging this conference for 2 years on the grounds that American troops should get out of Japan. Just 2 days before Acheson left for Paris MacArthur sent him a long memo suggesting that Japan be discussed at Paris.... If and when that peace conference takes place I predict that the Shief American delegate will be Douglas

MacArthur after which he will retire to private life.

MacArthur's current headache is that the Jarenese Kamikaze Suicide Corps have joined the Communist Party. All rank militarists such as the Nazi like Black Dragon Society are now seeking alliance with the hammer and sickle for the day when Nagasaki is avenged.

Nadio Commentator H Kaltenborn, NBC 27 May: American Vice Admiral Badger said today that the United States Navy probably would not use Formosa as a Naval base, even if the Chinese Nationalists offered it. The Commander of the United States Naval Forces in the Southwest Pacific told a US conference, "We don't need Formosa, the fleet can maintain itself at sea as it did during the war." That is true, but sen MacArthur once told me that the islands off the coast of China represent the new American frontier in the Pacific. In the hands of an enemy, Formosa would be worth a good part of our Navy. For some reason, our Army commanders in the Far Fast have been more far sighted on the Pacific situation than the leaders of our Navy.
