Gen Frank R McCoy staunchly defended the United States
policy in Japan before a morning meeting of the 11 Nation
Far Eastern Commission....

Gen McCoy, who represents the United States on the
commission said Japanese authorities had "exercised care
and restraint" in handling demonstrations that resulted
from economy dismissals of railway and other workers by
Japanese Govt enterprises....

Washington News 14 Jul:... Gen Douglas MacArthur lifted restrictions on the operation of Japan's Pacific coast oil refineries closed since 45. The action will conserve Tokyo's foreign exchange and also ease the burden on the United States which has been using aid funds to finance importation of gasoline and other petroleum products....

New York Times Reporter Hanson W Baldwin, 14 July: Political and military thunderheads hang above the Orient, and the present outward calm precedes a coming storm. Events of the past 2 weeks reveal clearly that Communism is still on the march in Asia and that the Western world is still fighting a losing battle to contain it....

In Korea Theater is a dangerous dichotomy between our foreign and military policies. At the very time our occupying troops-the only stabilizing influence in Korea-have been withdrawn Congress is asked to provide \$125 million for economic aid. But dollars will not stop the bayonets of the Communist dominated North Korean Army on the 38th Parallel. The days of the South Korean Govt probably are numbered unless there is a drastic change in our plans and policies....

In Japan the Communists have gained steadily in strength in the past year of the military phase of our occupation ended long ago. Gen Douglas MacArthur now is coping with economic, political and psychological problems of immense magnitude. He is working in fields in which he has no particular competence and his usefulness in Japan-great in the initial phase of the occupation-has come to an end. A new and bold policy and a civilian governor to administer it are needed....

Text folo 3d statement by Ambassador Carlos P Romulo Chief Delegate Philippines on Far Eastern Com on problem of Japanese reparation, released to press noon 13 Jul 49.

"The US Dept of State, in a statement of 10 June 49, replying to the Philippine and Chinese Representatives on the Far Eastern Com who had expressed disagreement with the US pos on the problem of Japanese reparations, made the folg observation:

"These statements appear to this govt to be based on a number of serious misconceptions both as to US policies toward Japan and the fundamental nature of the Japanese problem."

"I believe it only fair to state that if there had been any misconceptions as to US policies toward Japan, they arose not out of prejudice in our minds but rather as a reaction to the uncertainty that has hindered the efforts of the Com during the past 2 years. If the discussion that has taken place in the Com has served no other useful purpose, it has at least brought into focus a number of agreed facts and principles.

"Accordingly, the Philippine Govt is pleased to take note of the folg declarations contained in the statement of the US State Dept of 10 June 1949:

1, that "Japan has been completely disarmed and the US is determined that it's war-making capacity shall not be permitted to re-emerge;"

2, that is is not true "That the US feels greater concern for the welfare of it's late enemy than for the just reparations claims of it's allies;"

3, that "there are elements in Japan which seek to take advantage of their country's plight for their own benefit;"

4, that, by inference, the US would welcome any "Measures to enable the Japanese better to help themselves," short of compelling the Allies to abstain fr further reparations;

5, that the Philippines, like any of the Allied countries, continues to have the "The auth to claim reparations and "The right and responsibility to submit its own reparations claims;"

6, that the US has "Absolutely no intention of forming or allowing the formation of any national defense force for Japan."

"To the extent that it has made these affirmations, the US statement has contributed a certain measure of clarification which is most welcome. However, with all due respect, the Philippine Govt is constrained to state that it cannot accept certain interpretations of established policy set forth in that statement.

"In particular, the Philippine Govt takes exception to the US interpretation of Para 11 of the Potsdam Declaration to the effect that it gives 1st priority to a self-sustaining Japanese economy, and 2d to reparations. We consider this interpretation to be an after-thought. The Potsdam Declaration was punitive in spirit and intent, and understandably so, since it was promulgated in the heat of the conflict. It was a call issued by the principal Allied Powers, then at the threshold of imminent and certain victory, upon the Japanese Govt to surrender unconditionally and avoid further useless destruction of life and prop. It was, to be sure, a demand for the enemys surr radically different in character fr similar proclamations issued by less gallant victors. Despite the magnanimous spirit of that declaration, it was nonetheless a statement of the victors terms. The concern for Japanese economic revival was a generous and humane consideration, but it was not and could not have been the primary one. The primary consideration at that time was properly the determination to make Japan pay for her criminal act of aggression, and this was to be done by depriving her of her overseas territories,

by destroying her war-making capacity, and by exacting fr her just reparations in kind.

"It would be a patent distortion of the stern purpose of the Allies to suggest at this late day that Para 11 of the Potsdam Declaration gives Japanese industrial recovery priority over reparations. Since reparations were destined to be a primary source of asst in the economic reconstruction of the countries devastated by Japan, that would have been like saying, in a document laying down the terms for the unconditional surr of the enemy, that Japanese industrial recovery would take precedence over the economic rehabilitation of the Allies. That would be a logical absurdity.

"Let us examine the language of Para 11. The word 'permit' occurs twice in that para, but into quite different senses. Japan's right to maintain certain industries is carefully qualified by the 1st use of the word in the 1st part of the sentence: "Japan shall be permitted" meaning, the Allies would grant Japan the privilege of maintaining such industries. No such permissive meaning attaches to the use of the same word in the clause: "and permit the exaction of just reparations in kind". Here it means, simply, in order to enable Japan to pay reparations in kind. The grant of the privilege of maintaining certain industries was an act of generosity and, hence, permissive with respect to Japan. The right of reparations, on the other hand, was subj to no such permissive qualification; it was a right that inhered in the victorious powers under the iron laws of war.

"Under this interpretation, if the US wishes to relinquish her reparations claims against Japan, nobody can stop her. But her decision to do so would be an individual act of self-denial which it would be unfair to ask the devastated Allies like the Philippines to emulate. The US can be as magnanimous towards Japan as she pleases; she has reasons of her own for choosing such a course, and she can afford it. But the Philippines is not so fortunate; with the best will in the world

we must confess that we have not the means to match America's unprecedented gesture of renunciation.

"The US has pointed out that the Allies 'must bear their proportionate measure of sacrifice' for the sake of a peaceful, democratic and self-supporting Japan. Although we continue to share in the stated objective, we must emphatically declare that we cannot share in the means proposed. The call for further sacrifice cannot possibly apply to the Philippines, although it may apply to countries that suffered little or no direct damage or to those which, having suffered such damage, have in substantial part recovered their losses through the seizure of considerable war booty or valuable territories. It cannot possibly be suggested that the Philippines, which suffered such utter devastation in the struggle against Japan, must now again bear its 'proportionate measure of sacrifice' for the sake of Japan. Our share of that sacrifice is minus 0.

"It is a truism to say that economic want is the enemy of peace and democracy. That would be true not only in Japan but everywhere else including the Philippines. The US considers herself committed to a peaceful, democratic and self-supporting Japan. Because of the special ties between the US and the Philippines and the special character of their alliance in the war against Japan, one may wonder whether the concern for the survival of a peaceful, democratic and self-supporting Philippine Republic is not at least equally deserving of consideration.

"Many of the Allies are not themselves self-supporting and the consequent menace to their internal order and democratic institutions is fully as grave as that which is said to confront Japan. Is it demanded that the victims of Japanese aggression, if confronted by the choice of their own self-sufficiency and the self-sufficiency of Japan, should nobly renounce their interests for the sake of Japan?

"A more reasonable proposal would be to declare that Japanese economic recovery can only be achieved within the total framework of a reviving Far Eastern economy. It is true, as the State Dept has asserted, that "the programs of democratization and reform prescribed by the Far Eastern Com for Japan could succeed only in a tolerable economic environment." But it is evident that such an environment cannot be created for Japan under hothouse conditions, but only in the context and milieu of the Far Eastern economy as a whole. Any attempt to develop Japanese economy independently of the countries of Southeast Asia would be short-sighted and unwise, and the Philippines, for one,

is determined not to revert to its pre-war pos, with all the attendant risks, as mere supplier of raw materials to Japan and dumping ground for its cheap manufactured products. If this aspiration is unreasonable, we would like to know why. The US has disavowed any intention of showing greater concern for the welfare of its late enemy than for its allies. However, its latest statement contains no hint whatever of its intention to prove the contrary. It was compl silent on the representations of the Philippine Govt to the effect that the expected reparations fr Japan form an essential part of the Philippine economic rehabilitation program, and that we need reparations or their equivalent to enable us to develop a modest industrial base before Japanese industrial power has a chance to fully re-establish itself and menace us once more.

"The US statement was also silent on the argument that Japan is being treated, in the matter of reparations, altogether too leniently as compared to Germany, to the disadvantage of those countries that have claims against her and none against the latter. Yet, we have reason to believe that Japanese economic cond is not as critical as that of Germany. We have the authority of Gen MacArthur for the statement that Japan has achieved a greater post-war economic recovery, largely by her own efforts, than many European nations, and that Japanese production has doubled in two years while Japanese exports for the same period are about to be quadrupled.

"In the face of these facts, we are asked to abstain fr Japanese reparations even while the occupying powers in Germany other than the US cont to exact reparations and are still trfg industrial plants fr their respective zones of occupation inclg the Ruhr.

"Nor did the US statement make any re to the argument that the Philippines has a preferential claim to reparations as one of the worst devastated countries in the war against

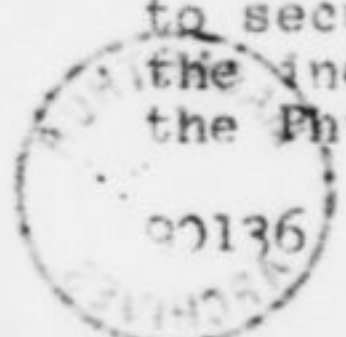

Japan. There is an established obligation that must be satisfied, and the concern over the economic difficulties of Japan, whether real or fancied, cannot cancel that obligation. We maintain that Philippine entitlement to reparation infeasible, and that such entitlement would stand as a matter of simple justice even if the concept of a punitive peace were discarded. Japan must pay in some acceptable form for the damage she has wrought in the Philippines. If it is now suggested that Japan be relieved of this obligation, then we have a right to know by whom the outstanding obligation shall be assumed and by what means it is to be satisfied.

"The US State Dept in its reply denies that the US implicitly agreed in the Philippine Rehabilitation Act that it would undertake to act as agent for the Philippines to collect reparations from Japan at least to the extent of the balance of the war damage claims not paid for by the US. The term "agent" was used in our previous statement in a special technical sense. The relationship suggested arose from the special ties between the US and the Philippines in the unusual circumstances obtaining at the time of the passage of the Rehabilitation Act, before the Philippines became independent, and there was not to the ordinary kind of agency involving profit but rather to an agency involving moral trust.

"It was implicit in the Rehabilitation Act that the US would not allow the discontinuance of Japanese reparations to the Philippines until the Philippine war damage claims are paid in full; on the contrary, that the US would cooperate to the fullest extent with the Philippines in securing reparations from Japan to rehabilitate its economy.

"The discussions of the bill in the Congressional Committee hearings, and particularly a ltr of the State Dept itself in connection with the reparations aspects of the bill, give additional support to this contention. The State Dept ltr was submitted to the House Committee on insular affairs and set forth its views in connection with Sec 106 of the Act (see Page 143 of the hearings of said committee). That ltr stated in connection with Sec 106: "It may be assumed that the Philippine Govt, with the support of the US, will be able to secure a fair share of reparations, including probably all the industrial equipment of the type available for reparations which the Philippine economy can absorb."

"Another excerpt from the discussions of Sec 106 of the House Committee which makes clear this implicit intention of Congress appears in a statement of Mr McNutt, the then US High Commissioner to the Philippines. In connection with an amendment of Sec 106 proposed by him (which was adopted by the committee and by Congress and is now the present Sec 106 (B) of the act), he stated (Page 76): "Now the reason for the suggested amendment is this: The amounts authorized to be approved, or surplus materials to be utilized, under this act are recognized as insufficient to fully rehabilitate the Philippines from losses and damages incurred in the war. It appears that this Sec 106 was to provide for full rehabilitation, provided sufficient reparations and indemnity could be obtained from the Japanese Government and the Japanese people.

"Congress accepted this proposed amendment, and it is therefore clear that it agreed with Commissioner McNutt that the purpose of Sec 106 was to provide for full rehabilitation of the Philippines by means of reparations and indemnity, both physical assets and money and bullion, sufficient to cover the balance of the war damage claims not paid for out of the US Treasury. In such an intention, there is necessarily implied an undertaking by the US to assist the Philippines in obtaining sufficient reparations to cover the unpaid balance of its war damage claims.

"The Philippine Government has acted in its own behalf within the Far Eastern Command in respect of its own reparations claims precisely because the Rehabilitation Act did not purport to settle completely the question of war damage to Philippine property. The enactment resulted from the peculiar relationship between the US and the Philippines, and it sought to provide a means whereby the young republic, which had been created by American magnanimity, would be able to secure the equivalent of immediate partial reparations instead of awaiting protracted settlement by an international commission.

"As early as 21 May 1947, the NY Times reported that US had claimed the greatest share of reparations fr Japan with the stipulation that it would keep none of the proceeds but would distribute them among the Philippines and other ravaged countries, and in consequence of which the percentage share of reparations allotted to the Philippines would be decreased proportionately. On 6 Nov 1947, Gen McCoy declared in a statement to the Com on behalf of the US Govt: "The US Govt proposes that if the Com will accept the schedule now submitted by the US, the US Govt will relinquish 18 of the 29 percent which it claims, and will allot this 18 percent as a fund to be distributed by the other states among themselves in any proportion which they deem advisable."

"It, therefore, appears that the principle of agency as a moral trust arising fr the American solicitude for the Philippines and other war-devastated countries, which was implicit in the re to reparations in the Rehabilitation Act of 1946, was subsequently reaffirmed in an ofl US statement before the Com in 1947.

"In conclusion, the Philippine Govt desires to request the US Govt to define in clearer terms the exact extent of its decision to discont reparations. It is important to the interests of the Philippine Govt that it be made a matter of record at the present time whether or not this discont is intended merely as a temp suspension of reparations until a later date, either before or after the Japanese Peace Treaty is concluded, since it is an established rule of international law that a sovereign state has an inherent right to reparations of which it cannot be deprived by another state. Finally, the Philippine Govt desires to be infod whether the US Govt contemplates a compensatory formula either as an interim measure before the Peace Treaty is signed or as final settle-ment in lieu of reparations in kind."

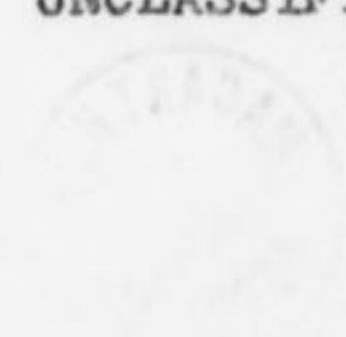

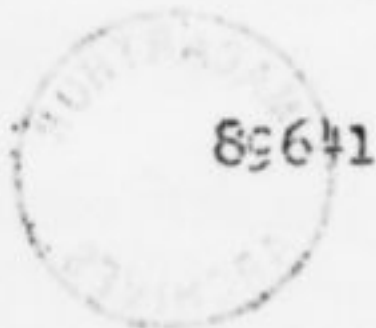

New York Times correspondent Lindesay Parrott, Tokyo 6 July: The allied occupation and the Japanese Govt today faced what is ever more clearly becoming the first case since the surrender of political assassination-an old familiar device whereby the Japanese Army's junior officers in the prewar period forced the nation into a totalitarian regime by murdering opponents. The present case is the death of transportation minister Sadanori Shimoyama. . . . What many Japanese and Americans now are awaiting is some expression on the case from Gen Douglas MacArthur's Hqs. While it is evident that Gen MacArthur has nothing to do with ordinary local crime, the Shimoyama case is stated as follows by many Japanese.

"If the transportation minister was murdered it was because he was following the MacArthur Program. We assume he was killed by elements which resist the occupation. Therefore what is the Supreme Allied Commander going to do about this defiance?" . . .

Radio Commentator Lowell Thomas, CBS 6 July: In Tokyo emergency conferences at Gen MacArthur Hqs, likewise anxious meetings by the heads of the Japanese Govt, all reflecting concern over rising discontent in Japan following the mysterious death of the head of the state owned Japanese railroad. . . . His death is attributed to elements opposed to the discharge of the railroad employees. And today there was a surge of popular discontent in Japan. Hence those top level emergency meetings in Tokyo.

Radio Commentator Larry Leseuer, CBS 6 July: We are told that unrest is mounting in Japan tonight following the finding of the body of the Chief of the Japanese state owned railroads. . . . At any rate the resulting unrest presents the American occupation with its most serious challenge to date. MacArthur is said to be following the case very closely for it may wind up as the greatest threat to his authority since the occupation began.

Radio Commentator George Hicks, NBC 6 July: . . . Mr Shimoyama disappeared after he had ordered 30,000 Jap railway workers fired under directions from Gen MacArthur. . . . Gen MacArthur had ordered the discharges to cut the cost of occupation to Americans. This in itself brings up a mighty important point-is it advisable to fire that many people in a land which is just tottering on the edge of recovery-and

In one of the most blistering denunciations of Communism ever made by a man of world importance, MacArthur said the movement had emerged as an instrument of force to permit minorities to seize power by "stealth, infiltration and deceit". . . . MacArthur made his statement in a July 4th message to both the American and the Japanese people. . . .

New York Times Correspondent Lindsey Parrott, Tokyo 3 July: . . . Gen MacArthur's statement came at a time when Communists have been increasingly active here, almost openly inciting violence and strikes against the Allied policy of retrenchment and rationalization aimed at the economic reconstruction of Japan. . . . New York Times Correspondent William S White, Washington 1 July: The Republic of Korea will fall within 3 mos, presumably to the Communists to the north, if Congress rejects the Administration's Recovery Program for that little country, Sec of State Dean Acheson has declared.

New York Times Correspondent Lindsey Parrot, Tokyo 4 July: Spokesmen for the Japanese Govt and Conservative sections of the Japanese public today expressed approval of Gen Douglas MacArthur's July 4th statement that hinted Japanese Communists might soon be denied the protection of law. . . . While there has been no time yet for much editorial comment on Gen MacArthur's statement, the ordinary middle class, job holding Japanese today is inclined to believe that the occupation finally is getting around to a realistic view of the Communist problem here. . . . Gen MacArthur's statement. . . is considered by many Japanese as the most important utterance he has yet made as Supreme Allied Commander.

Baltimore Sun, AP Tokyo 4 July: Japanese Communists and Russian indoctrinated Repatriates from the Soviet Union started new disorders today. . . . The Communists appeared determined to cause the occupation as much embarrassment as possible in the next few months.

New York Herald Tribune, UP Tokyo 4 July: The Japanese Communist Party replied today to Gen Douglas MacArthur's scathing attack upon it yesterday with an announcement that it will strengthen its propaganda machine in order to "accomplish our revolution".

Washington Star Columnist Constantine Brown 3 July: A 40 page report dealing with "strategic implications of the Russian domination of the Asiatic mainland," was received recently by the Joint Chiefs of Staff from Gen MacArthur in Tokyo. The Supreme Commander of the Allied Powers in Japan put clearly before his superiors in Washington the political and military consequences of our "do nothing" policy in China.

New York Correspondent Burton Crane, Tokyo 2 July: If he were solely responsible for Japan's economic policies, Takayoshi Aoki . . . declared in an interview today, he would remove all controls over raw materials, allocations and prices as rapidly as possible. . . . This statement from Mr Aoki assumes added significance because of widespread rumors that the occupation will celebrate its 4th Anniversary in mid August by returning the economic administration to Japanese hands retaining merely supervision to make sure that Allied objectives are not seriously contravened.

Washington New Editorial 5 July: . . . China is a better risk than Korea, and indefinitely more important. Moreover, if China is lost, it is absurd to think that Korea could hold out. No area in Asia will be safe if China falls.

Chicago Sun Times Editorial 2 July: The Russians have given another indication of their steadily increasing interest in Asia. They released 2000 additional Japanese prisoners of war the other day. . . . Communists in Japan have been given a lot more leeway than Communists in the American Zone of Germany. Gen MacArthur has allowed Japanese Communists to vote, hold office, organize labor unions and publish newspapers. But he isn't at all likely to turn this potentially dangerous 5th Column from Siberia loose on the Japanese people. . . . At all events it appears that the battle for Japan will be one of the big engagements in the cold war. . . .

New York Times Editorial 5 July: Gen MacArthur in his 4th of July statement to the Japanese was obviously moved by the need to meet the threat of disruption that is part of the Communist program in East Asia. . . . In Japan we are trying to win a contest for men's minds to offset the conquests of territory that have already been made by the Soviet Union and its satellites. The Tokyo statement is a vigorous move in that campaign. . . .

Radio Commentator Henry J Taylor from Tokyo, ABC 4 July: . . . For the execution of the policies laid down here on the spot by Gen MacArthur, the Far East officials in the State Dept in Washington are still playing cat and mouse with the Communists in the Far East as if America won the war to help Communism spread all over Asia. . . . but to see American men and women in this land standing up for our country, behaving well, setting a fine example-not one American soldier the victim of violence by a Japanese in this former enemy country since Gen MacArthur first put foot on Japanese soil-is a stimulating thing. Any task of occupying a foreign enemy country is an ugly and distasteful task at best. Here it is being done with a minimum of friction.
