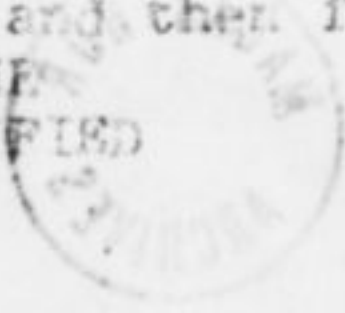

IBD/NY Script No. 21 follows: Here is today's "Report from America". The Communist-inspired aggression in Korea has brought about a rather surprising reaction in the part of the American people. Before the dastardly attack on the Korea Republic late in June, the average American actually knew little about Korea or her people. A few Americans knew that Korea had for many years been under the domination of the Japanese, and that she had been given her freedom and had formed her own government after World War II. To most people--however--Korea was one of those "far away places." Many had to look it up on a world map when Korea suddenly became the focal point of world news.

There are several reasons for this wide-spread interest in Korea. In the first place, Americans naturally are sympathetic with the "under dog" in a fight. They admire the courageous stand that the Korean Republic has made against tragically heavy odds. But the Americans also know that the peace of the world may very well depend on the outcome of the fighting in Korea today. If Korea should fall to the Communist forces, it will be just that much harder for the United Nations to stop the aggression wherever it might occur.

We have already told you how the reporting of the Korean crisis and the editorial discussions of the problem now take up a large part of the daily and weekly press in American. And that the aggression against the Republic of Korea holds the top spot in radio and television broadcasts.

You may be interested to know that Korea within the past few weeks has become the major topic for discussions at countless thousands of organizational meetings throughout the United States. These organizations range from small weekly or monthly womens

discussion groups in towns and villages to gigantic nation-wide organizations with memberships running into the many thousands. They include businessmen organizations, veterans groups, womens clubs, youth groups, religious discussion classes and service clubs, as well as high school and college debating and discussion groups. Those we have listed are only a few of the organizations which have shown their interest in the Korean situation. It is significant that those groups which have publicly expressed an opinion on the Korean problem have indicated a very strong support in favor of the United Nations action in Korea and against the Communist invaders.

One of the most prominent of these organizations is the American Association for the United Nations. The American Association for the United Nations is important not only because its work deals directly with the United Nations itself, but also because it is National in its scope and has the support of many other large National organizations.

The Association was founded back in 1923 as the "League of Nations Association". The League of Nations, as you know, suspended activity during World War II when it became apparent that it could not halt the aggression of the Nazi powers in Europe. Shortly after the United Nations was founded, the American Association for the United Nations was reorganized to serve a two-fold purpose. First, it seeks to serve as a clearing-house for information on United Nations activities, so that the American people may be kept fully informed on world developments as they are affected by the International Organization. Second, it seeks to provide a ready source for the United Nations itself on the reaction of the American public in world affairs.

The Association--which incidentally, is a non-profit and non-Governmental organization operating entirely on funds donated by its members--accomplishes these goals through a well-integrated plan for disseminating information.

It maintains a vast public information service, which is ready at any time to furnish information on new developments. For instance, within a week after the Communist invasion of Korea, the Association sent out thousands of copies of what it called a "fact sheet on Korea". This contained a brief but complete analysis of developments in Korea from the time of its annexation by Japan, through the years it fought for its independence, through the war years and leading up to the Communist attack in June and the subsequent action of the United Nations in seeking to restore peace. The paper was sent to all daily and weekly newspapers, as well as to leading radio and television commentators. It was used in a great many of the papers and on the radio and has been of great help in keeping the American people informed on Korea.

The Association also provides other informational services, such as motion pictures, posters and stating the aims of the United Nations, and various topics for discussion groups on university campuses, member clubs and in its various chapters in the larger cities. Immediately after the Korean conflict broke out, the Association asked member chapters for an expression of their own reactions to the United Nations Security Council action on the problem. Here is a typical reply. It comes from the North California Regional Office of the Association--which has its headquarters in San Francisco, California. The resolution states--"we earnestly commend and support the prompt action of the Security Council...in calling upon members states to aid the Republic of Korea...to the end that International Peace by law is maintained. Such action is consonant with the...purpose of the United Nations' Charter. We also commend and pledge active support to President Truman in the decisive steps he has taken under United States obligation to the Charter to contain the aggressor."

Similar letters are being received from chapter organizations throughout the country every day. The Association also sent out a questionnaire to many of its individual members. It asked two questions--"What do you think of the United States' part in the United Nations police action in Korea?" and "What effect will this action have on the future of the United Nations?" Hundreds of answers to these questions are being received every day. We have time to read you only one of them, but it is a typical reply. It comes from Mrs Olive R Grover of Peterborough, New York. She says, "I think the action of the United Nations in Korea has strengthened its position of leadership among the nations of the world. When all member nations become strong enough to assist militarily, the United Nations will be a formidable force for peace. May God hasten that day!"

Here is today's "Report from America."

"One picture is worth a thousand words" That expression, which is frequently quoted, has incorrectly been called a Chinese proverb. Actually, the expression was coined by an American advertising man, Fred Barnard, and was used by him in the magazine, "Printer's Ink", in 1927. Barnard himself dubbed it "A Chinese proverb," in order, he said, that people "would take it seriously." It was immediately -- and erroneously -- credited to Confucius.

Whatever the case, Americans love pictures -- and American newspapers give plenty of pictures to their readers. The impact of a picture and particularly a newspaper cartoon -- often conveys an idea much more dramatically than any number of words could. This is strikingly illustrated by the many serious cartoons that American artists have drawn to bring home to the American people the true situation that exists in Korea. Scores of cartoons dealing with the invasion of the ROK appear every week in the newspapers of the US.

Although all Americans are great readers of newspapers and radio listeners -- even if a person did nothing but look at the newspaper cartoons he could get a fairly clear picture of the nature of the aggression in Korea. These cartoons hammer home the truth -- that it was the Communists who launched the brutal aggression -- that the Soviet Union supplied the arms which made that aggression potent -- that the international Communists in spreading their so-called "peace" propaganda are being super-cynical.

Last Sunday's issue of the New York Times reprinted a number of cartoons from other papers. One of them drawn by the Cartoonist Bimrose of Tiortland Oregon, shows a map of Korea, with flames and smoke arising from the southern end. In the background looms the bulking figure of a Communist soldier, with the typical Red Star Insignia. He is making notes in a book labeled "Future Aggression." And the title of the cartoon is "Experiment."

Another cartoon in the same issue illustrates the cynicism of the Communist peace petition scheme.

This one, in the Washington Post, shows a tank with Soviet markings crushing a soldier in Korea. A soldier leans from the tank. He is holding a long sheet of paper, and is saying to the crushed Korean soldier: "By the way, have you signed our petition to outlaw new weapons?"

Another cartoon from the Washington Post deals with the preposterous Soviet claim that the Northern Communists are simply repelling aggression on the part of the Korean Republic. This 1 shows a teacher in Soviet uniform pointing to a map of Korea. He is explaining to a puzzled man standing before him that "you can see how Korea was invaded." The point of the cartoon is that the map is upside down -- just like much Soviet "logic."

A cartoon in the Chicago Daily News shows Uncle Sam -- the character used by cartoonists to depict the United States -- running with 2 buckets of water labeled "Arms Aid." His destination is a sputtering bomb tagged "Korea Crisis." In the background are 2 bombs which have already had their fuses extinguished. They are labeled, respectively, "Berlin Crisis" and "Greek Crisis." The title of this cartoon is "Dangerous But Necessary."

Another cartoonist had a similar idea. The artist Summers, in the Buffalo Evening News, drew a picture of a sphere labeled "The World". Attached to it is a sputtering fuse and at the end of the fuse appears the label, "Red-inspired Korean War." The title is "Put Out That Fuse".

The New York Times in a recent issue printed an interesting cartoon by its own staff cartoonist, Marcus. This one shows a tank which looks remarkably like a dove, the cannon in front forming the bill and the aperture in the turret forming an eye. This is the "Communist Dove of Peace."

"Although the Army says the new instructions will not cover every eventuality, its list does deal with general subjects involving security.

"The instructions list bans giving out info on the arrival in Korea of new units-also their destination, strength, composition, location and possible time of employment in battle-until released by Military authorities.

"The list also puts under wraps the arrival and assumption of command by Generals, and regroupings of forces.

"The instructions say that casualties should never be reported, except on proper authority."

IHD/NY Script No 17 follows: Here is today's "Report from America".

The peoples of the free world all know by now the speed and certainty with which the United States Government responded to the United Nations appeal to drive the Communist invaders from the Republic of Korea. However, a fact which must be as widely known is the degree to which the American people, as individuals have applauded the decision made by their governmental leaders.

Throughout the United States, in many forums where Americans gather to express their individual and collective opinions, the wholehearted endorsement of the Korean cause has found expression. Resolutions expressing this view have been adopted by women's clubs, War Veteran Associations, farm groups, labor unions, religious organizations and groups composed of those who have a common nationalist origin. Reports of these sentiments appear daily in the free press of the United States.

The Associated Press--an agency which supplies a large part of American newspapers with national and international news--reported the action taken by the National Farmers Union at its recent meeting in Denver, Colorado, a city in western United States. President James Patton pledged the farm groups support to the United Nations in its fight against what he called "the North Korean aggressors", who were "trained and agitated into waging war" on the Republic of Korea by the Soviet Union. Patton explained that he made the statement because the farm group had often been critical of other Government policies--but stood solidly behind the administration in its present course.

Another farm group, this one in the southern United States, called upon the United States to aid all its allies in combatting

the Communist menace. This resolution was adopted by the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation at its annual conference in Alexandria.

Religious groups have been especially outspoken in rallying moral support for the Korean women's struggle. Spokesmen for the three major faiths in the United States recently issued a joint statement condemning Communist aggression in Korea as "The greatest menace to world peace." At the same time the religious leaders condemned the spurious peace petition drive that International Communism had been conducting as a screen for its actual intentions. This resolution as signed by officers of the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America, the National Catholic Welfare Conference and the Synagogue Council of America. It was the first statement on an international matter to carry the signatures of spokesmen for the three leading faiths of the United States since the end of World War II.

One third of a million members of B'Nai Brith--one of America's largest Jewish organizations--have pledged support of the United States policy in Korea. President Frank Goldman expressed their sentiments in these words: "The Jewish people always side with Democracy and oppose totalitarianism. Our country has taken the leadership in joining with the free nations of the world."

The knights of Columbus--the leading order of the Catholic Church--also has pledged its "unreserved support" of the defense of the Republic of Korea. Its officers, meeting in New Haven, Connecticut, also pledged support to "such mobilization of resources as may be necessary to check and destroy the power of the Soviet Government to harass and brutalize the captive Russian people and to make war upon the peace and security of the free people of the world."

Organizations of workers in the United States have been especially outspoken in their condemnation of the aggression against the Republic of Korea. For instance, the Free Trade Union Committee of the American Federation of Labor recently adopted a strong declaration condemning what it called the Soviet-inspired war of aggression against the Korean people. The AF of L is America's largest association of trade unions, numbering over 7,000,000 members. It called upon the United States to set the pace in aiding the United Nations in driving the aggressors from the soil they have invaded.

These are but a few of the many American groups that have so expressed themselves. The list is far too long to give here, in full. It is understandable that the people of the United States should react in such a wholehearted manner. They are fully

A Philadelphia paper asked AF last wk to ascertain why Pohang situation was allowed to develop. AF referred question to Tokyo but apparently recd no reply. Today Aug 14 the Philadelphia paper notes New York Times story from William H Lawrence to the effect that AF Commander had warned the Army for 3 wks that Pohang Strip was in danger but that the Army refused to believe AF warning. Philadelphia paper now asks what the Pentagon Command has to say about the report of Lawrence who was at Pohang and would seem to have known the background of the situation. In case story by Lawrence not avail to you fol pertinent extracts quoted. Story follows:

"Headline: Army Ignored the AF in Warning on Pohang Fld. By W H Lawrence. Advanced US Hq in Korea, Aug 13--The US AF abandoned the Pohang Ptr Base and moved out it's bombs, rockets, planes and pers today before the North Koreans dropped a single bomb, artillery shell or mortar upon the airstrip itself.

"The decision to do so was carried out on the basis of information that the North Korean Column driving south from Yongdok possessed artillery that could bring the fld under fire.

"The Army still holds the territory on which the airstrip is situated, and indications are that it intends to keep it. US Inf and tanks are still deployed in defensive posns around the perimeter of the airbase, and South Koreans have dug in on a small river line facing high ground held by the enemy.

"But this was too close to be certain that the AF could operate without the threat of an artillery by day and night. There were indications too, that flight efficiency inevitably would fall off if flying pers and maintenance men had to participate in AF activities by day and help defend the strip by night.

"While there is a censorship rule in this theater that 'unwarranted criticism' will not be tolerated, it seems warranted to say that the loss of the airfield probably could have been

avoided if the Eighth Army High Command had taken adequate precautions long ago.

"AP pers headed by the Pohang Base Commander, Col Robert W Witty of Cleveland have been warning the Army for 3 wks that the Pohang Strip, the only fully operational US Base in Korea, was endangered by a concentration of Red Guerrillas in the high area just inland from the Japanese Sea.

"But the Army refused to believe the Air Force warnings or word brought by South Korean Police that this force, which had slipped through a big hole in the South Korean Line was a formidable one. The US Intelligence Service chose to believe instead that this was a gp of small Guerrilla bands that probably was foraging for food and no serious threat to the airbase.

"Col Witty kept warning that there was nothing between his base and the en except mountains. If the Army had acted even 12 hours before it finally rushed US trps to try to stop the Reds from reaching the fld a line might have been established that would have kept the en out of artillery range.

"It can be stated on the highest authority that 4 days ago Lt Gen Walton H Walker Eighth Army Commander asked Gen Farrel, Commander of the Korean Mil Advisory Gp, who was responsible for defense in his sector, whether any US trps were absolutely necessary to protect the airfield. Gen Farrell said that the fld in his opinion could be defended by Korean Forces then at his disposal.

"Eight hours later Gen Farrell told the Army that he needed a US Armored Force and Inf and Col 'Little Tiger' Kims vaunted South Korea 17th Regt, all of which were in the Army Res. He said that South Korean defenses had completely collapsed and that it was a race against time to get new forces in front of the airstrip." Rqst information which to base reply to AP query.

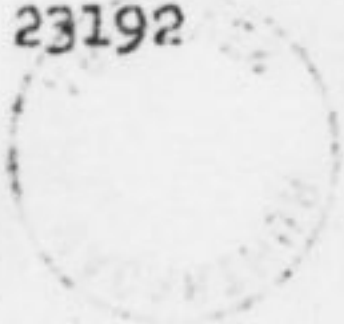

The penetration, classed as a definite United States victory, was the deepest and most daring sower in the Korean war. It occurred yesterday and last night in the crucial Chingju area.

Washington Star, AP Tokyo 3 Aug: Japanese publishers have acted in agreement with Gen. MacArthur's views in firing Communists and suspected Communists from their staffs, his top civil information officer said today. Lt Col D. R. Washington Star Editorial 2 Aug: MacArthur's flying visit to Generalissimo Chiang on Formosa has been made at a time when the Chinese Communists have big Armies and a makeshift but very large fleet of invasion craft massed in the vicinity of Amoy along the southeast coast of the mainland. The visit may therefore indicate growing concern over the possibility that an amphibious assault may be attempted before the summer ends. For his own part, Gen MacArthur has expressed it as his opinion that such an attack-carried out across 100 miles of water against the combined opposition of our 7th Flt and Chiang's well trained defending forces on Formosa-would "stand little chance of success."... It is for that reason-and presumably also for the reason that he does not want to give the Chinese Reds any kind of excuse to intervene directly in Korea-that Gen MacArthur has declined the Nationalist Govts renewed offer to send 33,000 of those troops to take part in the Korean War on the side of the UN....

Washington News Columnist Fred Othman, 2 Aug: In the middle of the South Pacific Ocean is a pimple of red sand called Kwajalein.... As possessions go it isn't much. No trees, no fresh water, nothing except bored troops in beaten P barracks, plus some tanks of gasoline to refuel passing airplanes.... In mentioning all this at some length because our air conditioned Congressmen... are considering a \$2,300,000 appropriation to make life a little more bearable for the occupiers of Kwajalein. Some of the statesmen seem to think this is too much. I hope maybe this dispatch will help change their minds. Even as a taxpayer I hope it....

Washington Post Columnist Drew Pearson, 3 Aug: It is important that the American public know the rules of news censorship laid down by Gen MacArthur for covering the Korean War. Theoretically, there is no censorship... However, Gen MacArthur has issued a definite directive to newsmen which is highly important and which, as reported by the CBS, states that "criticism of command decisions or the conduct of Allied soldiers on the battlefield will not be tolerated." Also significant is the fact that his new directive was issued 1 day after Homer Bigart of the New York Herald Tribune cabled a dispatch analyzing the conduct of United States troops, reporting that they were untrained, and that top officers had to remain with them under fire to keep them from breaking. Bigart reported that this was the reason why there were such heavy casualties among officers.... Perhaps if there has been more newspaper scrutiny and criticism of the entire defense setup, including tanks and our EAA training schedule for American troops in Japan, things might now be better in Korea. Criticism of the United States military in Japan, however, has always been difficult. MacArthur just did not tolerate it....

Washington Star Columnist Constantine Brown, 2 Aug: One of the many lessons taught by the Korean War is that campaigns are still won by sound tactics, the weight of arms and the courage and skill of fighting men. Bold statements of confidence at theater hqs and attempts to control unfavorable news reports do not convert the simple fact of defeat into victory. Our reverses have stimulated enlistments in this country, where the prospective soldiers know only too well what to expect.

New York Times Correspondent Lindesay Parrott, Tokyo 3 Aug: United States forces pulled back their defense lines in Korea yesterday and today in what was officially called a "general planned withdrawal." This action was taken to trade space for time while newly arrived reinforcements from the United States piled up behind the fighting front for an eventual counter blast against the North Korea Communist invaders. Just when that blow could be struck remained for the future to decide but yesterday the 1st Marine Division, veterans of Guadalcanal and the South Pacific poured down the gangplanks of the troopships that had brought them from the United States...

Washington Post, AP Tokyo 2 Aug: An American Intelligence Officer today said that no Red Korean officers above the rank of 2d Lt had been captured. "They invariably kill themselves before we can grab them" he explained. This was the first high official evidence that Koreans in the face of capture are committing Hari-Kari, a former traditional practice of suicide among Japanese who considered themselves disgraced....

Washington Post Correspondent Homer Bigart, NYHT News Service Pusan 2 Aug: The 1st Marine combat units to reach Korea landed today ready for instant action and soon were streaming toward the front, probably in the Southwestern sector.... Their appearance gave embattled forces the greatest morale boost since this ugly

Here is an instance of bungling of a type which could lose the whole war if repeated on any scale.... The winning of any war depends not only upon the soldiers in the field but upon the whole fighting and security organization supporting them. In this case the latter fell down tragically.

Lack of fan belts costs US 3 badly needed tanks. By Hal Boyle. With US troops in South Korea, Jul 31 (P) an American sergeant who felt Red captured Chinju said today 3 American tanks badly needed for defense of the city sat on a railway siding for 4 days because they lacked fan belts. "The tanks never got into action or fired a shot," he declared, "and when I left Chinju 15 crewmen were waiting in hopes flat cars would arrived on which they could get the tanks out. They were under orders to destroy the tanks if a train didn't arrive." A general officer later confirmed that orders had been given to destroy the tanks rather than let them be captured, and said he felt sure the order had been obeyed.

An investigation is under way to determine why the tanks were without belts despite 2 emergency air shipments.

A headquarters officer said one shipment of belts turned out to be the wrong size and a second box that was flown to Chinju was found to contain pistols instead."

.IBDNY Script No 2 follows:

Here is today's "report from America."... Ever since the day the Communist troops of the North invaded the Republic of Korea on Jun 25th the American people, in common with other free peoples of the world, have been avid for news from the battlefield. Under the American system of freedom of information together with its comprehensive system of communications this demand has been lavishly satisfied. Millions of words have appeared in the farflung American network of news papers, periodicals and upon the radio and television sets in American homes. Also upon the screens of motion picture theaters where newsreels are shown. Thousands of pictures of activity at the front have appeared in the American press. The progress of the struggle to rid the republic of the invaders has been the one thought uppermost in the collective American mind since the aggression started.

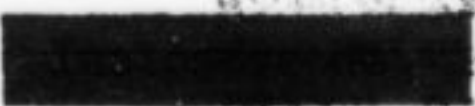
It is only natural that the most immediate interest of Americans at home should be centered upon the welfare of their fathers, husbands, sweethearts and brothers who are fighting shoulder to shoulder with the Korean Republican troops under the United Nations banner. But the Americans, too, are also kept well informed of the heroism shown by the Republican troops and the good showing they have made since equipment and troops began arriving under the sponsorship of the UN.

The leading US weekly news magazine, "Time", printed an appreciative account of the good showing being made by Korean

Republican troops, and it contained special appreciation of the skilled leadership demonstrated by the Commander of the 1st Div, Col Paik Sun Yup.

The dispatch came from Time Correspondent Frank Gibney, who had spent several days with units of the Korean Republican Army. On the page upon which the article appeared there was a large picture of a group of Republican troops taking a rest during a lull in the fighting.

At the opening of his dispatch, Correspondent Gibney reported that: "By this week it was evident to all US officers that the Korean Republicans were fighting well. . . In mountainous country where the invaders were hard put to it to use their armor the underarmed Korean Republicans more than held their own. They had badly mauled several Red columns and they had cut one regiment to pieces. Among the proofs and trophies of victory were captured Russian machine guns, rifles, antitank guns and armored cars. One division had sent back to headquarters 20 captured Russian jeeps, almost all brand new, and some with only 500 kilometers on their speedometers."

The American Correspondent then told of making a visit to the headquarters of the Korean Republican Army's 1st Division. Gibney expressed amazement at the expert manner in which the troops had used straw and foliage to disguise the headquarters buildings and vehicles from air recognition.

As he entered the farm house that served as headquarters, Gibney reported, he was greeted by "smiling, round-faced Col Paik Sun Yup", who shook hands with him and gave a greeting in English. The Correspondent wrote that "at 30, Col Paik is rated the best Field Commander of the Korean Army. His younger brother 27 year old Paik In Yup, Commander of the 17th Regiment, was wounded in fighting farther north after successfully leading his regiment out of the precarious pocket." It is men like these, the Correspondent declared, who are commanding the troops in the Korean Republican Army.

The dispatch in Time magazine said that Col Paik always had taken seriously the advice American advisers had given on such matters as patrols, flank security and taking cover. One officer commented that in training his men he drove them "harder than the enemy did."

As for the Republican troops in general, Correspondent Gibney had this to say: "With proper leadership the basic assets of the Korean soldier quickly asserted themselves. He was the

good qualities of the soldier--fierce courage, tenacity, obedience, and ability to live and fight on a shoestring." What is even more important in the present conflict, Gibney went on, is that the Korean Republican soldier "is animated by the strongest urge known to military men--defense of one's own land against an invader." . . . Listen to this station tomorrow at the same time for another "report from America item".
