Reurad WCL 38599, dtd 19 Nov 47 concerning conditions on Okinawa. Subject radio not fully understood. General Staff action referred to unknown here. However assume action taken by Under Secretary of Army and General Staff refers to intensified recruiting program discussed in urad WCL 30930.

It is emphasized that the lack of facilities on Okinawa is fully appreciated here and every effort is being made by commanders concerned to improve conditions. Improvement in conditions on Okinawa is severely handicapped by the lack of means, particularly funds and personnel, to provide new facilities and to maintain and improve existing temporary facilities. Troop effort is being fully exploited but the magnitude of the problem is greater than the available effort. The critical nature of the problem has been pointed out in CINCPAC radio C 56723 of 17 Nov 47 and in letter General Headquarters, Far East Command, File AG 600.12(28 Oct 47) CE; Subject: Master plans and construction program, forwarded by airmail on 24 Nov 47. Immediate improvement and maintenance of existing facilities is dependent on the recruitment of civilian employees with certain skills such as carpenters, plumbers, electricians, and supervisory repair and utilities personnel.

Civilian and military relationships on Okinawa are sound, without partiality being shown to either. Conditions on housing and sanitation are similar to both and inconveniences due to climate, weather and ruggedness of the area are met as promptly as possible by administrative corrections. Conditions are improving but, due to factors referred to in the above communications and lack of civilian personnel, it will be some time before the conditions on Okinawa are on a par with other overseas areas. Therefore, emphasis must be placed on recruitment of individuals with character and fortitude who will accept the challenge of conditions with the principal advantage being the ability to save money at that station.

Part 1. Proposal of NEMA to sell yen to NMA and to permit NMA to sell dollar imports into Japan on a yen basis considered undesirable for following reasons:

a. Licenses of all concerns authorized to do business in Japan provide that locally acquired yen may not be reitted or exchanged. Establishment of precedent of nature proposed would provide basis for logical demands from other licensed firms to effect exchange of currencies or importation of materials or supplies utilizing locally acquired yen.

b. Authorization of this type of transaction would, in practice, negate effective implementation of foreign exchange controls since, in final analysis, such transactions would be subject to private interpretation and would invite illegal activity in the purchase and sale of yen on the part of licensed and accredited personnel.

c. It is anticipated reaction of Occupation personnel would be most unfavorable upon realization that wide rate differences would exist between private exchanges of this nature and official transactions at the current military conversion rate. This would undoubtedly further react to encourage black market yen transactions. Until this problem can be resolved on an overall basis, relaxation of controls is considered unwarranted and establishment of exceptions thereto would only result in large-scale confusion and illicit activity.

Part 2. The loss of NEMA supplies and services admittedly would be detrimental to the achievement of reorientation phases of Occupation objectives. Japanese thought has been influenced greatly as a result of contributions by American films and discontinuation thereof would probably cause misunderstanding and resentment among the Japanese. Further, opportunity would be provided to other nations with different ideological intent to capitalize on the situation. A proportionate impact would be felt by the Japanese Government which now realizes one billion yen annually in revenues from admission taxes.

Part 3. Full recognition is accorded difficult position of NEMA and value of its service. Analogous to current situation is that of Readers Digest where a solution was effected by Washington by procuring raw paper

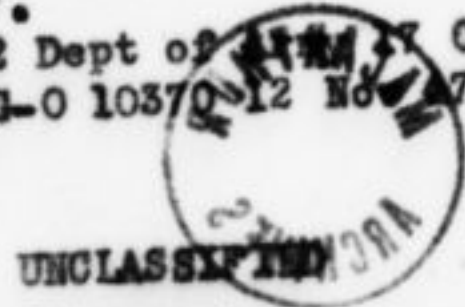

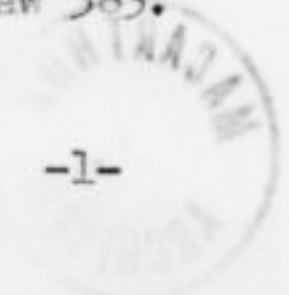

MEMO FOR RECORD: On CINCPAC radio 3 Nov 47 re WCL 40796

1. Instant rad completes the info required by Warad WCL40796 dtd 7 Aug 47. Remaining query to cited Warad was: War requested info as to knowledge at hand regarding the desires of the Philippine Government in accepting remains of Philippine Nationals now buried in Pettit Barracks, Fort Mills, and Fort McKinley cemeteries, not eligible under Public Law 383.





2. a. In PHILRYCOM radio G 27085 GSQMM, 2 Oct 47, reply to above was given as follows: "Part 1: Ourlet GSQMM, subj Public Law 383-7, 79th Congress as published in Sec 3, WD Bulletin Nbr 13, dtd 3 Jun 46, dtd 9 Jun 47, info copy fwded you 23 Sep air mail refers." Comment: This reply is irrelevant to cited Warad query. Public Law 383 deals with removal and final disposition of American World War II dead and not related matter to subject query.

b. Further info from PHILRYCOM was requested by CINCFE rad Z 24389, to properly reply to Warad query. Further, PHILRYCOM was informed that the retention of Fort Mills and Fort McKinley cemeteries as historic cemeteries would require negotiations with the Philippine Government. CINCFE rad also requested the basis for PHILRYCOM's recommendation (PHILRYCOM rad G 27085, GSQMM, dtd 2 Oct), that Fort Mills and Fort McKinley be retained and their views and appropriate procedure for the accomplishment of the negotiations. CINCFE rad also stated that no formal approach to the Philippine Government was desirable at this time.

3. PHILRYCOM rad G 29932 GSQMM, 29 Oct 47, reply to CINCFE rad Z 24389, in part, stated that the attitude of the Philippine Government was not known (Par. 1 above.) Further that study by PHILRYCOM indicated that it would be unwise to retain any one of the three proposed cemeteries - Fort Mills, Fort McKinley and Pettit Barracks as historic sites. PHILRYCOM rad also informs CINCFE that the cemetery at Pettit Barracks remains in possession of the U. S. Government by agreement with the Philippine Government in its note accepting title of this property. Further that it is considered advisable that remains of members of U. S. Armed Forces and American Nationals be removed at earliest practicable date to Post Cemetery Fort Stotsenburg.

4. Instant radio informs Department of Army, info in Part 3 above, and closes CINCFE action as required by Warad WCL 40796.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. WCL 25184 advises that freight contracts with steamship lines carrying cargoes of cotton to Japan are drawn with provision that port expenses including discharging, loading, berthing, and other incidental expenses are for account of steamship companies. USCC advises steamship companies willing to refund such port charges as determined by SCAP. Large amount of money involved and steps should be taken to bill steamship companies accordingly.

2. a. A rate schedule, dated 1 August 1947, was developed and concurred in by ESS foreign Trade, ESS Fiscal Control, ESS Shipping Branch, M.RITCOM and Commanding General, Eighth Army, as a result of conferences beginning in April 1947. This was based on 1941 rates in Japan, increased by 25%.

b. A sliding scale was developed, but never adopted because of inequalities that may have developed in cases where vessels were not fully loaded, and that this type of schedule is applicable only to fully-loaded vessels.

c. That the sliding scale of from 25¢ to 50¢ per ton was based on the original schedule prior to the 25% increase, and the sliding schedule should be increased accordingly.

3. A study is being made to determine the tonnages and shipping companies involved. Upon completion thereof, appropriate shipping companies will be billed.

4. Interests of USAFIK are not concerned with this particular account.

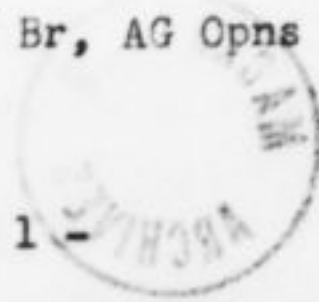

2. Considered inadvisable to concur in suggestion of DOA that military permit be issued for reentry of private trade reps from U.S. without prior clearance from CINCFE. Adoption of the suggested procedure would entail the necessity of forwarding to the DOA any derogatory information which had been obtained on any private trade representative subsequent to his initial clearance by CINCFE, if the knowledge of such info required denial of reentry. Submission of names for final clearance before reentry by DOA will permit a rapid check in FEC and will not unreasonably delay final clearance for reentry.

3. Reentry into Okinawa (to date, isolated cases) should be governed by the same procedure.

4. Entry or reentry of private trade reps into Korea is a matter which has been handled by direct communication by the CG USAFIK and the DOA. This procedure should be continued.

5. G-2 (Lt Col Koster) states no objection to inst action.

6. ESS (Dr. Kenney) concurs in instant action.

7. DS (Mr Maynard) states that in view of the reasons advanced by G-1 concerning the desirability of instant action he does not object to it. However, he wishes to have it stated for the record that he feels it desirable that the suggestion of the Dept of Army in WCL 46641 be concurred in as soon as considered practicable in the FEC.



1. Repeated is SX-4119 MAGX of 5 December 47 from Chief, USMAG to CINCFE, info CG, PHILRYCOM and FLC Manila:

"Part 1. Rad WX-90615 of 19 November 47 and WX-90014 of 7 November 47 received.

"Part 2. Interpretation these radios by FLC, Manila and Philrycom is that explosives desired by Philippine Army for training (See rad SX-4033 MAGX) cannot be supplied without demilitarization clause under terms of Radios W-96058 and 87218. Demilitarization of explosives obviously implies total destruction and total loss to the recipient. Grouping of these explosives with ammunition desired by Philippine Government for demilitarization in this case appears erroneous in view of different use to which each is to be put.

"Part 3. Philippine Army proposes to expend these explosives for training purposes which amounts to demilitarization. Confirmation requested that transfer of explosives can be made to the Philippine Government through FLC for use by Philippine Army in training programs resulting in the eventual destruction of all explosives."

2. Urad WX-90615 of 19 November citing conditions for transfer of explosives includes requirement that demilitarization be effected. Recommend that requirement that explosives be demilitarized be waived for items transferred to Philippine Government for Philippine Army retaining in effect other requirements of WAR-96058 and WAR-87218 which govern transfers under WX-90615. Request decision earliest.

MEMO FOR RECORD.

1. PHILRYCOM G 31742 GSDRE (8 Mar 47) requested authority to transfer surplus explosives, (block, propellant, TNT, dynamite, nitro starch, cord detonating cratering explosives, and blasting caps) to Phil. Govt. under bulk sales agreement for construction and mining operations incident to rehabilitation of Philippines. WCL 31732 (22 Mar 47) stated that explosives were by definition combat material and not transferable under the bulk sale agreement. Suggested FLC Manila be consulted and if Phil. Govt. wished to purchase a proposed sale may be negotiated and submitted to WD or OFLC for State Dept. approval.

2. SX 4033 USMAG (10 Jul 47) recommended serviceable excess explosives and demolition equipment at Eng. Depot Las Pinas be turned over to Philippine Army without cost. (Approx. 20,000 tons).

3. WX 90615 (19 Nov 47) to CINCPAC, info PHILRYCOM and FEAF repeats WAR 90014 (7 Nov 47) to Manila FLC which

a. Authorized Manila FLC to accept declarations and proceed with sale to Phil. Govt. explosives listed in SX 4033 (10 Jul 47) from USMAG.

b. Very nominal pricing authorized. Disregard pricing schedule in W 87319.

c. Stated conditions of transfer in WAR 96058 (11 Apr 47) for avammo and WAR 87218 of 26 Sep 47 for ground ammo apply.

4. WAR 96058 (12 Apr 47) Wash FLC to Manila FLC authorized acceptance, for negotiation of contract with Phil. Govt., 4000 tons serviceable avammo and 30,000 tons unserviceable avammo for transfer on non-reimbursement basis subject to following conditions: (same condition in WAR 87218 authorizing transfer of 75,000 tons ground ammo.)

a. Phil. Govt. agree to demilitarize.

b. No portion be turned over to third party or Govt.

c. No claims against U.S. in case of mishap.

d. Phil. Govt. take possession within 90 days after notice of availability for transfer.



M/R(cont'd)

5. SX 4149 MAGX (5 Dec 47) states that interpretation of WX 90615 and WX 90014 (both para 3 above) is that explosives cited in SX 4033 MAGX (10 Jul 47) para 2 above cannot be transferred without demilitarization. Requests confirmation that these explosives may be transferred to Phil. Govt. without demilitarization.

6. Engineer proposed radio to Chief USMAG concludes that transfer without demilitarization for a very nominal consideration is confirmed.

7. WAR 96058 and WAR 87218 each state that demilitarization of ammo is required. Inasmuch as these 2 radios are cited for the conditions under which explosives may be transferred to Phil. Govt. it is felt that CINCFE is not in position to make a decision to the contrary.

8. This action to DA recommends that the requirement for demilitarization of explosives be waived for the items transferred to Phil. Govt. for the Phil. Army.

9. Interests of USAFIK not involved.

10. G-4 Supply Division Suspense Date: 2 Jan 48.

11. Action G-4 Journal No. 52315 suspended to 2 Jan 48 pending DA reply.

1. Dept of Army rad WCL 39558 proposed that documentation for intransit passengers on civil airlines thru Japan be abandoned. Ourad ZX 30195 concurred.
2. Dept of Army rad WCL 43950, 10 Dec 47, assumed that similar procedures applied to Okinawa and Korea and rqstd confirmation.
3. Ourad ZX 32076, 12 Dec 47, rqstd views of CG USAFIK and CG PHILRYCOM in the premise.
4. In rad GAP 11595, 18 Dec 47, and GX 14670 GSASP, 15 Dec 47, CG 24th Corps and CG Philrycom respectively concur in abandoning above described documentation. Both attached certain conditions which are already covered by ourad ZX 30195.
5. Rad fr CG USAFIK raises point that if billets are required, 24 hour notice will be necessary. Only billeting envisaged in this procedure would be when aircraft is held up owing to adverse weather conditions or mechanical failure. It would be extremely difficult to provide 24 hours notice of either of these contingencies. Not believed necessary to send radio covering this point since it has been adequately cleared up in telephone conversation with Korea.
6. Rad fr CG Philrycom mentions a CINCFE rad as being policy in force there. This rad, C 54689, was our directive to Philrycom and other major subordinate commands to institute customs and immigration control. It is unnecessary to mention this in body of inst rad since customs & immigration controls are now standard in all areas of FEC and Korea as matter of course.

(ZX-33463) For ENGKM. Reourad ZX-32273 which covered immediate emergency repair of damages caused by typhoon Dora 7-8 November 1947 to Fort Stotsenburg, Clark Field area, Philippine Islands. Additional projects estimated to cost \$558,114, consisting of \$316,576 for labor and \$241,538 for materials, have been reviewed and reduced to absolute minimum. Projects include repairs to utility systems, roads, hospital and living quarters, and replacement of warehouses totally destroyed by the typhoon. Living quarters for nurses and civilian labor camp have been so damaged that unless proper repairs are made deterioration will be extremely rapid. Other structures requiring repair or replacement are: Garage buildings, civilian personnel office, storage shed housing supplies for oxygen generating plant, motor pool shop, Mechanics School Shed, shed housing generators, and C-54 maintenance dock. The above repairs will provide only the minimum buildings and utilities necessary for normal operation of the post and for protection of Government property which would suffer deterioration and probable total loss if left exposed to the elements. Movement of supplies and materials for Nichols Field to Fort Stotsenburg, Clark Field area, adds to the need for storage facilities. Repairs and utilities materials now on hand could be used on these projects if replaced from the Zone of Interior within 6 months. No funds are available in this Command to pay for labor to do this work and the deficit in port procurement credits previously cited in Radio C-56723, dated 17 November 1947 precludes use of materials presently on hand. Request approval of the projects and the provision of necessary funds.

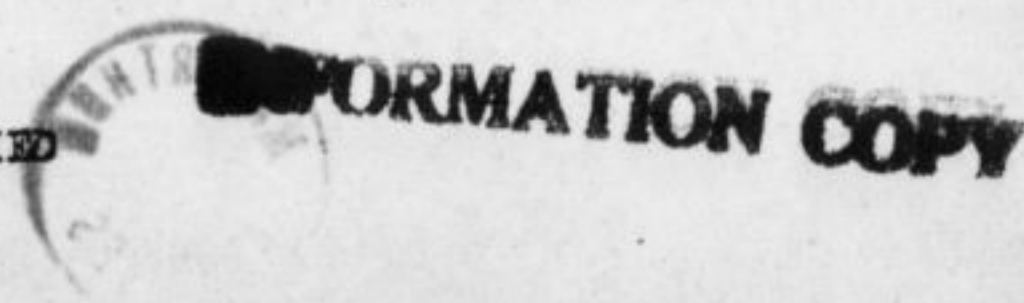



EX 32560 For SIGOL. Proposal received from RCAC Okinawa, through CG PHILAYCOM who recommended approval for purposes of morale, for the activation of commercial transpacific telephone service directly between Okinawa and San Francisco. RCAC representative Okinawa states that arrangements have been made with AT&T in the U.S. to provide the San Francisco terminal and to extend the service throughout the U.S. CINCPAC is desirous that this service be provided. Proposal was made to CINCPAC on 28 January 1947 by Washington in radiogram T-90627 that a radio circuit be provided from San Francisco to Okinawa. At that time CINCPAC did not concur for reasons outlined in C-69761 dated 31 January 1947. Objections are now withdrawn by CINCPAC as RCAC proposes that frequencies 14505 and 17700 recently cleared and assigned for A-3 emission from Korea to San Francisco be extended to include Okinawa-San Francisco A-3 emission and utilized on a scheduled basis. Observe that frequencies 14505 and 17700 are temporarily assigned for use by RCAC Seoul, Korea pending clearance suitable 12 and 16 mc. frequencies required to fill a transitional operating period used recurrent EX-16688 August 1947 after which it is proposed to retain 14505-17700 for permanent assignment Okinawa to San Francisco A-3. Proposal for supplementary frequencies in the 9 and 19 mc band will be made in separate radio. Reference is made to WAR 92728 dated 25 February 1947 to which no objection was made by WAR (FACUSJCB) to A-1 emission Okinawa to San Francisco and interpretation by FEC as to the policy in regards to A-3 emission from Okinawa to San Francisco. Request early approval.

NOTE FOR RECORD:

1. Tech channel svc note 797C dated 19 November 1947 from PHILBYCOM signed Conrad requested comments on the following:

a. Desire by RCAC to make A-3 (telephone) tests between Okinawa and San Francisco on present telegraph frequencies.

b. Establishment of voice circuit Okinawa to U.S. as a permanent measure for accommodation of personnel Okinawa, believing the facility would benefit Armed Forces.

2. Our Tech channel message 2649J dated 28 November 1947 replied giving recapitulation and limitations of present frequencies authorized for use by RCAC between Okinawa and Manila and Okinawa and U.S. (San Francisco) and further suggested that command channel request be submitted for activation of such facilities inasmuch as approval by Washington required. Clarification on the use and scope of circuit was also queried.

3. Command radiogram G14093 dated 9 December from CG PHILBYCOM indicates the following:

a. Recommended approval of proposed RCAC telephone circuit Okinawa to San Francisco directly.

b. Justification given as morale factor for IA personnel in Okinawa.

c. That AT&T San Francisco indicated willingness to cooperate fully to provide the San Francisco terminal and extend the service throughout U.S.

d. That routing of such telephone service through Manila impractical basis overloaded Manila-San Francisco circuit during its useful hours and the inferior results in combining both radio circuits.

e. That proposed telephone circuits would be in addition to present Okinawa-Manila telegraph circuit.

f. Request for authority for RCAC Okinawa to utilize frequencies 14505 and 17700 kcs currently assigned Korea (RCAC) to San Francisco on a scheduled basis with 3 kw power.

g. That two additional frequencies be cleared and authorized for this service. Bands indicated are 9 and 19 megacycles.

h. Until such time that it becomes feasible and desirable for RCAC to furnish their own equipment for the operation of this circuit it is proposed to permit RCAC to use the military transmitting and receiving equipment which is already available and which has already been loaned to them for use in their telegraph service.

4. a. This radiogram addressed to Dept of the Army with information copy to CG PHILRYCOM indicates CINCPAC concurrence in the proposed facilities and restricts the contents of the message to substance of paragraphs 3a, b, c, f and g above.

b. Paragraph 3d above not deemed necessary to include in our radio since the technical aspects of combining two radio circuits and the unsatisfactory results that would be obtained are well known.

c. Based on our interpretation of policy question indicated in Washington classified radiogram R92726 February 1947 in addition to substance of paragraph 3c which was included in this radiogram no mention was deemed necessary of substance of paragraph 3e above.

d. In view of the fact that military transmitting and receiving equipment already on loan to MCAC is proposed for use in providing telephone service it is considered desirable that Signal Section, Supply Division, take separate action necessary to insure the military property retained for use by MCAC in Okinawa is on a proper basis and that no mention required in this radio to Washington.

5. a. Assuming favorable consideration by Washington in the activation of transpacific telephone service direct from Okinawa to SF (ATT) and since the military equipment now on loan to MCAC Okinawa is to be made a matter of separate action by Signal Section, Supply Division, the major problem concerned is frequencies transmitting Okinawa.

b. Activation of the proposed telephone service will require 4 frequencies for full time operation; to expedite, the arrangement of joint use of two frequencies assigned to Korea (MCAC) is looked upon favorably however extension of the two frequencies proposed to include Okinawa will require coordination as well as the two additional frequencies required. The frequencies proposed for joint use are 14505 and 17700 currently cleared for Korea to SF, A3 telephone emission. This will satisfy test and probably part daytime operation. Action to clear the remaining 9 and 19 megacycle frequencies will be initiated as soon as possible.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. In radio WCL 41457 dated 29 November, War (CSBUD) advised CINCPAC that Department of Army will issue allocation advice for 3rd quarter funds in such amounts as will bring total allocations as of 1 January 1948 to 80% of annual funding program.

2. A few named appropriations were excepted from the above procedure and requirements are to be submitted in usual manner under those appropriations.

3. Requirements are to be submitted also under any appropriations in which the needs determined by FEC exceed the amounts which should be made available under the 80% allocation.

4. Instant radio advises Department of Army (CSBUD) that 3rd quarter requirements will be submitted under paragraph 2, above, for two appropriations, namely Government and Relief in Occupied Areas and Cemeterial Expenses, No Year. Requirements will also be submitted in two cases under paragraph 3, above, namely Finance Service, Army, subappropriation claims of military and civilian personnel, and Medical and Hospital Department, Army, 100 project series. The 80% allocation in all other appropriations will be sufficient.

1. ACL 40138 rqsts views on entry of Robert Cisneros as an official trade representative from Mexico.
2. a. Enrique Bravo was cleared by ourad ZX 20819, 6 Sep, to DOA, as the official trade representative of Mexico.
b. Jose Calero was cleared by our ZX 25352, 16 Oct, to Amembassy Nanking, in connection with a study of trade conditions in Japan. At the time of clearance of Calero it was pointed out to the U.S. Embassy Nanking that Bravo had already been cleared as the trade representative from Mexico and that it was felt that some of the duties which would be performed by Bravo would obviate the necessity for entry of Calero. Clearance, however, was granted for Calero at the discretion of the Embassy if that office still felt with the additional info furnished from here that entry of Calero was desirable.
3. The request for clearance of Bravo came from the Dept of the Army as has the instant request, whereas the request for entry of Calero came from the Amembassy Nanking. There is a time lag of approximately 3 months between the above requests from the Dept of the Army. It would appear, therefore, that a lack of coordination by Mexican authorities in submission of clearance requests may have resulted in a request for the entry of Cisneros by the Dept of the Army without consideration or knowledge of the fact that both Mr. Bravo and Mr. Calero had already been cleared for much the same purpose.
4. Inst rad furnished the Dept of the Army with this info with the request that the entry of Cisneros be reconsidered. DS (Mr Poole) and ESS (Dr. Kenney) concur.
