- 1. Except for UK agreement to release to general public the terms of the Sterling Overall Payments Arrangement, and French Government agreement to release terms of French Financial Arrangement, no government has as yet agreed to release the terms of any Frade or Financial Arrangement negotiated on behalf of such government in trade conferences with SCAP acting in respect of Occupied Japan.
- 2. Although conference documents are not classified here, they are regarded as "Confidential". Representatives of foreign governments are informed of this and have empressed appreciation since in their view general publication of the conference details might possibly embarrass their governments. All conferees are advised, however, that conference papers are passed to Japanese Government since information contained therein is vital to successful implementation of the arrangement in order to achieve the goals established in the trade conferences. Since it is considered necessary to pass the documents to the Japanese Government no classification of conference documents is formally established, but the Japanese Government is informed that all such documents are to be treated as if marked "Confidential".
- 3. Under the circumstances outlined above, it is requested that all holders of conference documents be advised of this procedure and that they retain any such documents in confidence until authority is obtained from the respective governments concerned as to general release. DA will be advised from time to time as such authority is obtained.
- 4. View here is that quantitative and value data regarding specific commodities as set forth in various Trade Plans is market information that should not be released in view of possible adverse effects on markets in which prospective procurement would be accomplished. Yo objection from SCAP **Hewpoint to release of total values of Trade Plans without specific mention or breakdown of commodities stated therein.
- 5. Subject to views expressed in paragraph 4, this radio, SCAP seeking clearance with various governments to obtain agreement as to release of text of trade and financial arrangements.

ANALYSIS OF ELECTION:

The election was a smashing conservative victory. It gave practical assurance that the Government would remain unchanged for the next four years, with a decisive mandate to one political party controlling a safe majority of the Diet seats. The most impressive result of the election was the gain of 112 seats by the Democratic-Liberal Party — to a lesser degree the sharp reduction in the Socialist strength from 142 stats in the 1947 election to 49 seats resulting from the present election, and the Communist gain of 31 seats. Although even with such gain the Communist party, in a strong one-party government, has not even a legislative bargaining position.

The Democratic-Liberals drew their increased strength from the Democrats, the People's Cooperatives and probably to some extent from other smaller groups with conservative leanings, while the Communists

ment long anticipated. The extent of Communist gains from this source is largely reflected in the reduction of 28 in the Socialist left wing representation from its pre-election strength. Both the Damocratic-Liberal and Communist parties garnered strength from the disrepute into which the center parties had fallen as a result of the scandal investigations, which each vigorously exploited.

The Democratic-Liberal party campaigned effectively, urging voters to support a strong single party qualified to lead the nation during the period of economic rehabilitation ahead, stressing the weaknesses resulting from past ineffectual coalitions. The party pledged itself to eliminate unnecessary economic controls, to reduce government personnel, to eliminate the sales tax, and to adopt measures which would stimulate the introduction of foreign capital.

The Communist party was benefited by external circumstances pecultarly advantageous to the party. Developments in China, for example, were exploited by the party, which insisted that only a Communist Japan could live profitably in harmony with a Communist China. Chiang Kai Shek's sudden retirement on the eve of the election gave dramatic support to the Communist campaign propaganda. Communists also won support by their promises to ease food collection requirements and eliminate taxes of lower income groups as well as their attacks upon the economic stabilization program of the government. The radical elements in the ranks of labor gave strong support to Communist candidates not because of ideological preference but by way of protest against the ineffectual labor support of the Socialist party and fear of suppressive measures by the Yoshida Government. In some measure the result was probably affected by the influence of the hundreds of thousands of Japanese servicemen intensively trained in Soviet indoorination centers prior to their repatriation.

In assessing the extent of the conservative victory, it is necessary to take account of the support accorded the slightly more moderate but essentially conservative Democratic party and the smaller conservative groups and individuals with conservative tendencies, all of which edd up to over 75 percent of the total number of seats in the House of Representatives. Four successful Independents have already formally announced their intention to join the Democratic Liberal Party.

The Communist gain, under existing extraordinarily favorable conditions, should reflect the high water mark of its political support, unless conditions alter even more in its favor. The danger should not be discounted, however, from the unrealistic

and undue overemphasis which will undoubtedly be given the Communist political strength through ill-conceived propaganda efforts to be expected from Moscow and elements of American journalism or individuals either irresponsibly inclined or directly within the orbit of Communist sympathy. Such propaganda, especially any from seemingly reliable and responsible quarters, may be expected to be fully exploited by the local Communist party in the uncensored Japanese press.

GENERAL MAGARTHUR'S COMMENT ON THE ELECTION:

The Supreme Commander issued the following statement on 24 January:

'Peoples of the free world everywhere can take satisfaction in this enthusiastic and orderly Japanese election which at a critical moment in Asiatic history has given so clear and decisive a mandate for the conservative philosophy of government.'"

Work during 1948 definitely points to certain species of mosquitoes as probable vectors. For your information. Following Associated Press despatch received here under date of January 16: "General Holland M. (Howling Mad) Smith says in his war memoirs that General MacArthur failed to publicize the contribution of the United States Marine Corps to the Pacific Campaign.

Portions of his book, "Coral and Brass", coming out tomorrow were published before in magazine form. In the full text, the retired Marine Commander raises new issues including the award of a medal to the late President Roosevelt's son, James.

Although Marines were active in the recapture of the Philippines,

Smith says, 'you can search MacArthur's communiques describing the Philippines

fighting and you will be unable to find a single reference to the Marines.'

In 1941 and 1942, Smith declares, MacArthurs communiques also failed to

mention the role of the Marines in the defense of Bataan and Corregidor.

Smith, who led landing forces at Tarawa, Makin, Saipan and Iwo Jima, adds: 'After a period of the MacArthur silent treatment, the Navy Department became somewhat nettled to read of the exploits and presence of virtually every Army and Philippine unit, while seeing othing of the Marine Regiment on Corregidor.

'Finally, after tactful representations had fallen on deaf ears,
the Navy in Washington began issuing its own communiques in simple justice
to the Marines who were silently sharing the perils and privations of Bataan
and Corregidor beside much-publicized Army comrades.'"

Upon request for comment following statement given to Associated Press
by General MacArthur:

"General Smith's statements that Marines were active 'in the recapture of the Philippines' and that I neglected to mention them in my communiques seems incredible. There were no Marine ground Units whatscever engaged in the recapture of the Philippines. The only ground forces involved were the Sixth and Bighth Armies, neither of which possessed Marine units. His statement with reference to the Marine Regiment in the Bataan-Corregidor Campaign is equally unrealistic. This regiment up until the time I left Corregidor to proceed to Australia was not engaged in the Bataan fighting, having been stationed by me in reserve on Corregidor and having had no opportunity therefore to demonstrate its efficiency in close combat. The only other Marine ground unit under my command during the entire war until the Japanese surrender was the First Marine Division which was temporarily assigned to me in Australia after the Guadacanal Campaign and which was employed in the New Britian operation making the landing at Gloucester. It was shortly thereafter relieved from my command over my protest. It was a magnificent unit as, indeed, were all other Marine units with which I have had any professional contact, and my reports as to its conduct during its service under me were completely laudatory and fully publicized.





"The Subreme Commander today announced the appointment of the Foreign Investment Board to validate, for SCAP, proposals and agreements for the conduct of foreign business and investment activity in Japan. The Board is composed of:


"The Subreme Commander for the Allied Powers also announced standards and criteria for validation of acquisition of Japanese properties and rights by non-Japanese during the Occupation. The standards are quoted as follows:

"Purpose: The minimum standards which follow have been established in order to guide and encourage acquisition of and investment in Japanese properties and rights by non-Japanese nationals and foreign controlled firms in such a manner as to:

- 1. Assist in and promote the rapid rehabilitation of the Japanese economy to the end of ensuring self-support and national independence.
- 2. Protect the Japanese people and economy in the conservation of their national resources during a period of military occupation.
- 3. Stimulate the restoration of sound international peacetime economic relationships as between Japan and the rest of the world.

"Standards: Detailed criteria of standards for investment for approval for validation under the provisions of Circular No. 2, SCAP, 1949, are as follows:

'l. Application must demonstrate that the investment or acquisition of property is necessary:



- a. To care present business activities in the case of persons continuously resident in Japan since 2 September 1945 or
- b. To resume a specific prewar activity in the case of those with a legitimate restitution claim or
- c. To carry on a new activity which will improve Japan's foreign exchange position, or positively aid in Japanese economic rehabilitation or otherwise further a specific expressed SCAP objective.
- 2. Application must demonstrate that alternative means, such as short term lease or rental, purchase of bonds, expansion of non-Japanese enterprises, acquisition from non-Japanese, etc., are not practicable to achieve the purpose desired.
- 3. If yen is to be used for investment purposes, the application must show that yen was legally obtained from foreign exchange after the date of Circular No. 2 or that yen funds to be used for such acquisition were acquired by business operations in Japan during the Occupation and were not excessive in view of the goods or services furnished in connection with the acquisition thereof or yen acquired in lieu of restitution.
- 4. An application for acquisition must show that the property or right will be used in a manner that will add constructively to the Japanese economy.
- 5. Acquisition will not be validated where there is reasonable ground for belief that it is being acquired on behalf of a foreign government.
- 6. Acquisition of property interest or right in the following will not be validated:
- a. An enterprise, a material amount of the assets of which have been or are likely to be designated for reparations removals, until such removal has been effected.
- b. An enterprise which is or is considered by competent authority to be subject to dissolution, liquidation or reorganization under the economic reform program until the final adjudication of such dissolution, liquidation or reorganization.
- 7. The terms of any contract for acquisition must be fair to the Japanese seller or, in the case of a share of an enterprise or of its profits, production or sales, fair to the Japanese enterprise or its Japanese shareholders.
 - 8. Investment in existing Japanese enterprises may only be made if the investment creates additional assets for the Japanese enterprise in contradistinction to the purchase of stocks or securities from other investors.

9. Notwithstanding paragraphs 1-8 above, acquisition of properties or rights by those receiving yen in lieu of restitution of property which was formerly owned by them and was treated as enemy property under Japanese wartime regulations will be validated automatically, providing only:

MACAR THUES

- a. Total yen expended in each case under this exception does not exceed yen received in lieu of restitution.
- b. Property or right acquired is similar in nature to formerly owned property.
- 10. Transactions will not be validated where there are reasonable grounds for suspecting fraud, duress or undue influence."
