For CSCAD. All property of Japanese war criminal suspects has been blocked and impounded pending decision of War Crimes Tribunal regarding property forfeiture in each case. Of these properties, over 1,000 estates have been released. No forfeitures or fines have been adjudged in Japanese war crimes cases. Several hundred estates still held in custody pending court decision. Some war criminal suspects have been transferred to Allied Nations for trial. Records of trial from other Allied Nations delayed and incomplete thereby delaying authorized return of many blocked estates. War criminal suspects still being apprehended, consequently more properties being taken into custody.

Current policy (FEC 204/11, 22 May 47) has prescribed that war criminal property forfeited be used to defray occupation costs, however, no property has been forfeited and no forfeitures expected.

It is therefore no longer deemed advisable to continue present policy of blocking, administering, and returning Japanese war criminal property. Recommend that all properties of Japanese war criminal suspects currently hold in custody be released and returned to such suspects or to persons

~~2-4712~~ A message has been received by General MacArthur from President Quirino, of the Republic of the Philippines, referring to the removal by early part of May of a U.S. Army 100-ton floating crane from Manila. The message states that the crane is the only one of its kind in the Philippines and is absolutely indispensable for loading and unloading heavy equipment such as locomotives acquired by the Manila Railroad Company and requests retention of the crane in the Philippines as surplus, or thru purchase by Philippine Government or any private firm.

Reply has been made to President Quirino that the crane will go into Subic for overhaul and repair following which it will return to Manila and that prior to any decision to finally remove it from Manila the Philippine Government will be given an opportunity to present a proposal for its acquisition.

Inasmuch as there are only a total of 3 U.S. Army owned 60-ton cranes in the FEC, located at Okinawa, MARBO and Yokohama, and since subject crane is the only 100-ton equipment in the theater, it is not considered surplus to the needs of the Far East Command. While it is no longer required to carry out the FEC mission in the Philippines it is desired, after subject crane has been repaired and overhauled at Subic Bay, ETC 30 June, to place

it in the FEC operational reserve fleet in Japan for use at various ports in this theater when needed and to meet possible emergency.

The retention of the crane in Manila by the Army for an extended period after Army requirement there has ceased is not repeat not recommended. Dependent upon desire of Dept. of Army to assist Philippine Government in meeting a recognized requirement three alternatives are apparent:

- a. Sale of crane to Philippine Government at appraised value.
- b. Sale of crane on bid basis subject to rejection of any or all bids below reasonable value.
- c. Lease at adequate rental for a limited period with provisions guaranteeing maintenance and recovery by U.S. in event of emergency prior to expiration of lease. During period of lease Philippine interests can make arrangements to procure replacement equipment from commercial sources.

1. Doctor Marshall Harvey Stone, currently Chairman of Department of Mathematics, University of Chicago, has indicated a desire to stop in Japan enroute to the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research in Bombay, India. Dr. Stone's visit would be of two to three weeks' duration and would take place some time in September 1949.

2. Dr. Stone is a mathematician of world renown. See American Men of Science and Who's Who in America for details of career. Particular attention directed to work as Navy Consultant 1942 to 1943. The various scientific missions which have thus far visited Japan have not included any mathematicians. It is considered highly desirable that Dr. Stone visit Japan in order to provide an opportunity for worthwhile liaison between Japanese and American scientists in this important field as well as to provide SCAP personnel an opportunity of obtaining significant advice regarding mathematical sciences.

3. Dr. Stone is being advised that he will be permitted entry as a visiting expert consultant without cost to the government for assignment to Scientific and Technical Division, Economic and Scientific Section on arrival in Japan. His activities will include advisement to SCAP concerning general policy questions relating to mathematics, discussions of current mathematical problems with leading Japanese mathematicians and lectures on current topics in mathematics.

4. Logistic support to be provided by two methods:

a. While in Tokyo, Dr. Stone to be house guest of Dr. B C Dees, Economic and Scientific Section.

b. While away from Tokyo, Dr. Stone to be provided with billeting and messing facilities by military government authorities on reimbursable basis.

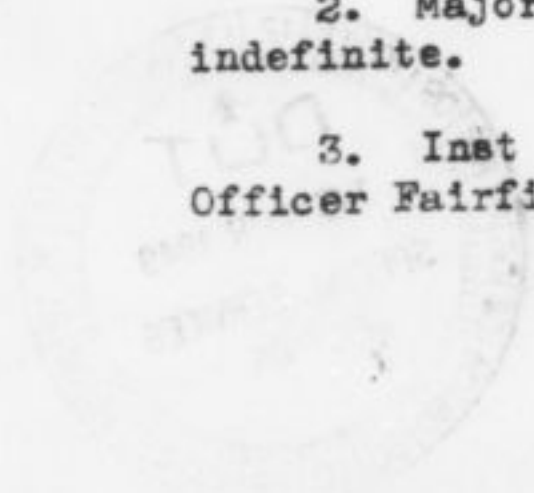
