For CSGLD. The lack of available surface transportation and commercial air transportation to and from Saipan, together with the lack of satisfactory recreational facilities on Saipan, has created a morale problem in that command of deep concern to this hqs. Existing regulations do not permit this hqs to authorize military air transportation for the travel of dependents except for PCS or in an emergency. However, space is frequently available on presently scheduled military flights between Saipan and Guam for the movement of dependents.

C-1n-C

1. It is requested that under the provisions of par 13, AR 95-20, 23 Aug 49, CG MARBO be delegated the authority to authorize dependents of military personnel, to the extent space is available, to travel on military aircraft on a non-reimbursable space available basis between Saipan and Guam when accompanying their principals on or returning from leave.

2. In the event the request in 1 above cannot be approved, request authority to airlift dependents of military personnel, space available, traveling with their principals in ordinary leave status as revenue passengers at special rates authorized government agency traffic by CG MATS msg CL 1411, 18 Jun 49, since no commercial air or adequate surface transportation is available between Saipan and Guam.



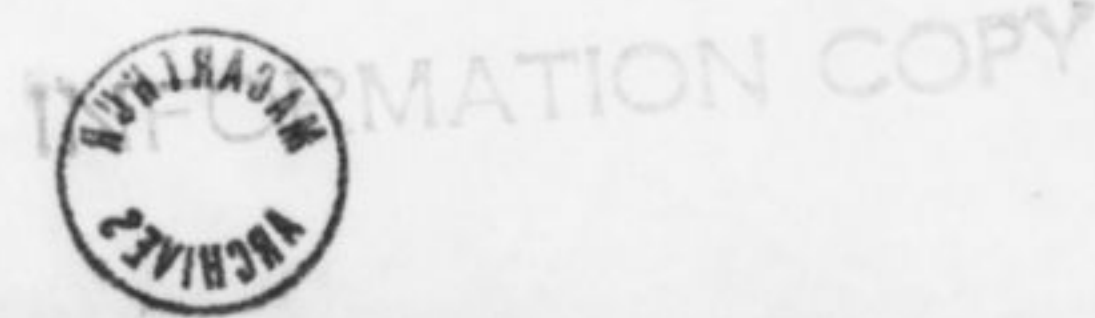

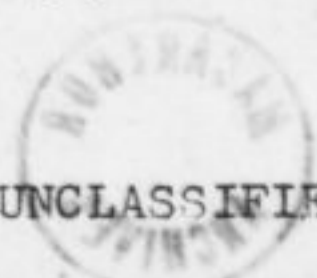

PAA assumes responsibility for full logistic support; therefore no other concurrences necessary. In this particular case the dependents of Mr. Matriscianna were cleared prior to the time that the message was received from CGMDW requesting his clearance. This probably resulted from a delay by the PAA home office in requesting his entry. If accommodations are available to accommodate an employee's dependents, it is customary for PAA to request the dependents' entry upon receipt of information from their home office that entry has been requested for the principle. This procedure results in concurrent travel of the dependents and principle.
