"General hacArthur today announced that a Trade Arrangement expected to total 143 million pounds Sterling (about \$400 million) in trade during the period 1 July 1949 to 30 June 1950 has been consummated between Japan and the Sterling Area. The Sterling Area countries included in the new Arrangement are the United Kingdom and Colonies (excluding Hong Kong), Australia, India, New Zealand and South Africa. The approval of the new Trade Arrangement has been indicated by each of these Governments. It is expected that the documents will be formally signed in Tokyo at an early date.

In general, the new Arrangement adheres to the previously established policy calling for balanced trade between the two areas at the highest practicable level. As of June 30, 1949, there was a balance of trade in favor of Occupied Japan to the extent of approximately 10 million pounds which amount, it has been agreed, is necessary working capital to carry on trade with the Sterling area.

The Trade Plan which deals with commodity exchanges and which was previously expressed in U.S. dollars is now written in pound Sterling.

Estimated new purchases by Japan during the twelve months period July 1949 to June 1950, from the Sterling area countries which subscribe to the Arrangement will be valued at approximately 55 million pounds. The estimated new purchases by these countries from Japan will total approximately 45.5 million pounds, the difference of 9.5 million pounds being accounted for by the excess of orders placed by the Sterling Area in Japan before 30 June and unfilled at that date over the corresponding orders placed by Japan in the Sterling Area. In addition, provision has been made for trade with Sterling area countries which subscribe to the Sterling Fayments Arrangement but which did not participate in the current negotiations. Estimates for trade with these countries, which include Burma and Pakistan, total approximately 27 million pounds. Estimates of invisible trade in both directions, as distinct from commodity exchanges, have also been included.

Commodities to be purchased from Sterling Area countries include cereals, cotton, wool, iron ore, rubber, salt, petroleum, hides and skins, and tanning materials. The Sterling Area countries will purchase from Japan a wide range of manufactured goods including textiles, machinery, canned fish, lumber, metals, electrical products, chemicals and some pottery and glassware. The new Arrangement provides for a considerable expansion of trade and will permit increased purchases by Japan of foodstuffs and basic raw materials necessary both for domestic consumption and export trade".





Considerably larger expenditures would be reported except for the fact that some essential military government construction projects of high priority are being flammed from GARICA appropriations in FY 50. The available (50,000,000 in each and contract withorisation will be utilized to cover anticipated obligations to be incurred in FY 50 and early part of FY 51.

Part 2. Note that while (14,000,000 is only approximately half of the \$23,000,000 appropriated this represents actual asymmitures during this fiscal year of which there remains only seven menths in which to let bids, eward contracts, purchase anterials and complete some construction projects. Increased tempo of work as menths progress is expected to expend the total \$23,000,000 at an early date in FY 51 and necessitate further appropriations in each in order to pay off expenditures which will be contracted for under contract authorizations within the \$58,000,000.







For CSGLD. Re CSUSAF msg AFMTP 4227, 28 Oct, Nov allocation, Channel 34-US, for passengers and cargo will not rpt not meet minimum essential requirements of this command. Of the 297 spaces allocated Army and Air Force, 180 must be used for medical evacuation. Attention is invited to DA msg WCL 47780, 13 Oct, which advised that the final voyage of USAT Hope would be 5 Nov 49, and CINCFE msg ZX 26398, 18 Oct, which requested 100 additional spaces on MATS to accommodate these increased requirements. The remaining 117 spaces available will not provide airlift for persons qualifying for urgent emergency leave (minimum 120), personnel on TDY in the US (normally 40), and return TDY from the US (normally 75).

By CINCFE msg ZX 24276, 26 Sept, a total of 580 spaces for all three services for Nov was requested for Channel 34-US. This figure was predicated upon continued operation of the USAT Hope during the month of Nov. Upon notification that the Hope would make its last inbound voyage on 5 Nov, this has was faced with an additional requirement of 100 spaces. In reply to urmsg WCL 38998, 2 Sept 49, ourmsg ZX 23306, 16 Sept 49, suggested the lay up of USAT Hope be delayed until sufficient additional airlift is available to accomplish all medical evacuation.

Urmsg WCL 42839, 21 Sept, stated estimated date withdrawal USAT Hope, 1 Dec, and that "air evacuation requirements being considered". At that time the Hope was due to arrive Yokohama 3 Dec. In view of the fact that CG MATS has had timely warning of these additional requirements for medical evacuation, which would become existent on the lay up of the USAT Hope, CINCFE urges that the stated requirements of 608 spaces be provided for on Channel 34-US for Army and Air Force.

Cargo allocation of 17.4 tons on Channel 34-US is inadequate to move even Air Force repairable items which alone amounts to 22.5 tons. In view





- 1. In C/N to C/S, 11 Oct. D C/S SCAP advised that the Undersecretary desired SCAP'S views on desirability of sending DA consultative group to Japan to furnish advice on: (a) Public health in Ryukyus; (b) Land ownership in Ryukyus.
- 2. C/S approved D C/S SCAP recommendation that RMGS make recommendations on proposal to C/S.
- 3. Public health operation in the Ryukyus is considered by RMGS to be less in need of outside assistance than any other field of MG activity at this time. Gen Sams offers no objection to the mending of a group of consultants by DA, but agrees with RMGS that assistance is more urgently needed on other problems.
- 4. Public finance problems are at present particularly pressing due not only to lack of capable personnel in the islands, but because increased demand for this type personnel in SCAP HQ is limiting the assistance which would normally be available from that source.
- 5. Land ownership problems are currently under comprehensive study, and consultative assistance could be helpful.
- 6. Inst msg to DA suggests substitution of public finance consultant group for one on public health and the furnishing of a second group on land ownership, the latter to include qualified advisor on property custody affairs.
- 7. Concurrences: G-1 (WAB), FRAW (CSM for: CFS), WRS (HGS). Coordinated with Col Babcock, O D C/S, SCAP.


