GHQ FEC has consistently enforced this policy through the application of similar wage schedules and rates to employees paid from appropriated and non-appropriated funds alike. Complete uniformity of treatment in practically all phases of personnel administration exists between these groups of employees in the Far East Command and must be maintained due to identical living and working conditions. Employees supported from both funds frequently work alongside each other, particularly in Special Services and TIE activities. Occasional changes occur which require transfer of employee from non-appropriated to appropriated funds. Unless permitted to convert at the same step rate, employees with the longest service would lose advantage of accumulated within-grade promotions.
